Resolutions Passed and Retained by the Thirteenth Annual Assembly of the P. H. C. Kentucky District.

Resolution No. 1

Resolved: That the Secretary mail a copy of the minutes of this assembly to each minister and that he shall remit for same at once. Also each pastor notify the Secretary the number of copies of the minutes he can sell on his charge on or fefore November 15, 1922.

Resolution No. 2

Resolved: That the Secretary send out report blanks ten days before each quarter expires. Further, that all quarterly reports be sent in not later than one week after the quarer expires. Further, that all unpaid assessments be enclosed. All preachers, whether licensed or ordained, will not be excused though they have but few meetings to report, in order that the Superintendent may be able to make out an accurate report to the General Superintendent.

Resolution No. 3

Resolved: That all churches observe the Lord's Supper and that it be administered the first Sunday in each quarter, namely: January, April, July, and October. And all circuits where all churches cannot be reached the Sacraments of said churches be administered as near the time as convenient, and a liberal Missionary offering be taken at close of the service.

Resolution No. 4

Resolved: That we, as a district, raise \$1500.00 for the support of our District Superintendent to be raised as follows: each licensed and ordained minister of the district be assessed \$12.00 per annum. The balance to be raised according to the membership of each church on a basis of \$1.00 per member per annum. Should there be a failure on either the part of the ministers or the churches to pay their assessments, the deficiency shall be raised on the assembly floor. We further recommend that each church raise a free will offering for the Superintendent on his quarterly visit to the churches, for traveling expenses.

Resolution No. 5

Resolved: That we raise a Home Missionary Fund for financing the State work. Said fund to be raised by assessing each church on a basis of \$1.00 per member per annum.

Resolution No. 6

Resolved: That all preachers failing to send in accurate reports quarterly and annually, said reports will not be accepted or placed in the minutes, and said minister to be dealt with according to Paragraph 157, page 59 of the manual.

Resolution No. 7

Resolved: That each minister, including the local preachers, pay \$1.00 per annum to our District Secretary for his services.

Resolution No. 8

Resolved: That no pastor or evangelist of our district refuse to organize churches or to take members into our churches who belong to organizations that are not oath bound.

Resolution No. 9

Resolved: That each pastor collect, or appoint a committee to collect the church assessments. Said assessments to be collected separate from the regular church offerings and a record given to the local church treasurer.

Resolution No. 10

Resolved: That we place ourselves on record as opposed to uniting with any organization which does not stand for a four fold gospel, namely: Regeneration, Sanctification, Divine Healing, and the Pre-millenial Coming of Christ.
