Tuesday A. M. Session September 10, 1918.

The Kansas and Oklahoma District of the Holiness Christian

The first session of the conference met Tuesday at 10.00 A. M. with J. Earl Benjamin, the Presiding Elder in chair, in the absence

of the Gen'l Superintendent, C. C. Brown.

The meeting was opened by a good song and prayer service, after which Bro. Benjamin gave an opening address from Ephesians 4th Chapter. Then we were led in prayer by Bro. Webster and all sang "'Tis so Sweet to Trust in Jesus." The Roll Call of conference members was given and instead of reading the last years minutes it was decided to leave the book of minutes open for reference to all.

Conference rules were made as follows:

Thursday A. M. September 12, 1918.

The third session of the conference met at 9:30 A. M. Thursday Sept. 12, 1918 with Bro. Benjamin in chair. Prayer by Bro. Waddel. Roll Call of members. Reading of the minutes of last session were read and accepted.

A long letter from Bro. and Sister Higgs, our missionaries in Central America was read by Sister Webster and appreciated. Their work was discussed a few finutes and the conference agreed to pray more earnestly for their work and help them financially. Adjournment.

Friday A. M. Session, Sept. 13, 1918.

The fourth session of the conference was called to order at 9:30 A. M. September 13, 1918 by Bro. Benjamin.

After the roll call and reading of the minutes of last session, a few more reports were read and referred to the Statistical Committee.

NEW BUSINESS. The Ways and Means Committee's report was read and accepted as follows:

ARTICLE 1. We recommend that this conference hold its next annual

session not later than November 15, 1919.

ARTICLE 2. We recommend that all ministerial members pay one-half their tithe into the conference treasury quarterly to be used for Home Missionary work. ARTICLE 3. We recommend that the Presiding Elder make his

rounds quarterly.

ARTICLE 4. We recommend that the following minimum amounts be paid to the Presiding Elder quarterly:

ARTICLE 5. We recommend that there be held one or more ministerial meetings this year. Time and place to be chosen by the Pre-

siding Elder.

ARTICLE 6. We recommend that the pastors in charge hold a special meeting for the purpose of instructing their members in the business of this conference year.

ARTICLE 7. We recommend that each pastor hold a special service and take a collection for the following institutions: Beulah Rescue Home, Our Foreign Missionary Work in Central America and our Church Paper "Voice From Canaan."

ARTICLE 8. We recommend that each member of conference be assessed \$2.00 in money to be paid into the treasury annually to

defray conference expenses.

ARTICLE 9. We recommend that each class pay apportionment as

follows: Hopeton, Oklo. \$35.00 Avard, Okla. 5.00 Freeport, Kans. 20.00 El Dorado, Kans. 15.00 Osawatomie, Kans. 25.00 Campo, Colorado 10.00

ARTICLE 10. We recommend that this conference elect two Home Missionaries for this district.

ARTICLE 11. We recommend that the conference stand back of these two brethren as Home Missionaries and guarantee each of them \$500.00 per year, this money to be paid out of the Home Missionary Fund. We grant either of them the privilege of drawing out of this fund any amount needed in the work for hall rent, car fare and other running expenses, with the consent of the Presiding Elder and Secretary; also in case of necessity, either of these brethren were permitted to use said money for their personal needs or the needs of their families, but any money so used would apply on this guarantee, and in case the total amount received in the work plus that he draws out of the mission fund for such purposes exceed \$700.00 he shall return the same to the conference treasury at the end of the conference year. In case either of these brethren should fail to work the field or be engaged in active ministerial work this quarantee shall only apply as pro ratio of the time engaged in ministerial work.

ARTICLE 12. We recommend that the Presiding Elder appoint a committee for the annual meeting. Said committee to choose the time and place for this meeting which is to precede the annual conference.

ARTICLE 13. We recommend that the pastors of the different classes take a collection for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the annual meeting and make one or more comforters for the same.

ARTICLE 14. We recommend that the conference minutes be gotten out as soon as possible, and to be paid for out of the conference treasury. Each confrence member to be supplied with a copy. Motion made to have afternoon session at 2:30. Adjournment. Benediction by Bro. Maynard.

Friday P. M. Session Sept. 13, 1918.

The fifth session of the conference met at 2:30 P. M. Sept. 13, 1918 with Presiding Elder in chair. After the song service Bro. Garret led in prayer.

The roll was called and the minutes of the last session were read. Bro. Willis read the Examining Committee's report, as follows:

NEW BUSINESS

It was resolved that we, the Western Wonference, favor the calling of a special session of Gen'l Conference preceding the General Conference of the Apostalic Holiness Church, and that we elect our delegates now for the same, and that said delegates shall act as a committee to investigate and furnish this conference with all the information they can secure concerning the union of the Apostalic Holiness and Holiness Christian Churches. These delegates are to meet with the council of the A. H. Church.

After Bro. Benjamin gave a short talk thanking the brethren for their kindness to him during the past year, he left the chair to be filled by the secretary during the election of a Presiding Elder. Bro. Ewing was asked to take the chair. We then went to prayer that we might seek the Lord's will in the election. Bro. Webster led in prayer. We then voted by informal ballot for the Elder and Bro. Benjamin was elected. He then took the chair and gave us a good talk. All joined in singing "Blest Be the Tie that Binds," and had a general handshake. Then went ahead with the rest of the election. Saturday A. M. Session Sept. 14, 1918.

The sixth session of conference was opened at 9:30 A. M. with P. E. in chair. Devotional exercises led by Bro. Pridgen.

The report of the Resolution committee was read and apopted as follows:

- 1. Whereas Bro. and Sister Burge have been hindered from their work for the Lord the past year on account of his ill health, we, the fifth annual conference do hereby resolve to extend to them our sympathy by asking the secretary to write them a letter in our behalf.
- Be it resolved that our secretary write a letter of encouragement to Bro. Simeon Van Meter who is in camp Funston, and that we as a conference remember him in prayer.
- 3. Whereas the work of the Voice from Canaan, Rescue Home, and that of our missionaries has been reported and presented to us as a conference, be it resolved that we stand by them more loyally with our prayers, our efforts and our money.
- 4. Whereas we have been given such a hearty welcome and such royal entertainment as a conference, by the people of the Pleasant View community, be it resolved that we by a rising vote express our appreciation of the same.
- 5. Whereas our nation has been drawn into the awful world war, we do hereby resolve that in labors as Christian workers, we pledge our allegiance and support to our government in this time of great peril, by our prayers and our influence.

We as a conference are in facor of selling the Bible School and Orphanage property at Carlinville, Illinois.

We are not in favor of emerging the "Voice from Canaan," but in case the other property at Carlinville is sold we are in favor of the press being moved either to St. Louis, Mo. or Frankfort, Indiana.
