MINUTES OF THE NINTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE INTERNATIONAL APOSTOLIC HOLINESS CHURCH, SOUTHERN DISTRICT.

The Ninth Session of the Annual Conference of the Southern District of the International Apostolic Holiness Church convened at Winston-Salem, North Carolina, Tuesday, Nov. 11, 1919, at 2:30 p. m. Rev. S. S. Nelson, the District Superintendent was present, also a goodly number of ministers and delegates.

Rev. W. R. Cox was elected Secretary.

After song and prayer the Conference proceeded to business and the following committes were elected.

Committee on Conference Bar: G. H. Butner, W. C. Kirkman.

Committee on Religious Worship: O. L. Ruth, G. H. Butner, P. H. Greeson.

Nominating Committee: O. L. Ruth, P. H. Greeson, H. B. Barger, S. M. Stikeleather, P. R. Thompson.

Resolution Committee: B. B. Bulla, P. H. Greeson, W. R. Cox.

Moved and-carried to have the minutes printed and S. M. Stikeleather, W. R. Cox, and P. H. Greeson were appointed for that work.

Moved and carried that the business of the conference shall be finished before Sunday.

Moved and carried that the conference hours shall be from 8 to 11:30 a. m. and 1 to 4 p. m. and that evangelistic services be held each evening beginning at 7 p. m.

Moved and carried that the Conference of the Southern District put itself on record in favor of the union of the Holiness Christian Church with the Apostolic Holness Church.

Moved and carried that a committee be appointed to draft and present the matter to the General Assembly. Brothers, Stikeleather and Cox were appointed.

Missionary Treasurer was called upon to read the financial missionary report. It was read and accepted subject to the approval of Auditing Committee. (See page 14.)

Financial report of the Printing Press was read and accepted subject to approval of Auditing Committee. (See page 15.)

Moved and carried that the Quarterly Meetings be revived in the District and subject to the arrangements of the District Superintendent.

Adjourned—Noon.

Thursday, 1 P. M.

The afternoon session opened with song and prayer.

The report of the committee concerning the R. R. Car for delegates to General Assembly was called for and the findings were for car of 30, via Asheville, (All the delegates will remember the car).

Report of District Council called for concerning placing of ministers and was read. See page 16.)

Verbal report of Sunday School Board made by Brother Nelson

The matter of the correction of a clause concerning where Apostolic Messenger and the Sunday School Literature shall be printed was decided to be referred to the Board of Publication.

A Committee consisting of S. S. Nelson, S. M. Stikeleather and W. R. Cox were appointed to present a resolution to the General Assembly concerning our General Missionary Board and its election. It is as follows:

Resolved, that our General Assembly Missionary Board shall be elected by the General Assembly or that each District shall elect a man thus constituting the General Missionary Board.

Resolution committee reported recommending the resolutions contained in last year's minutes. They were accepted.

The following resolution was presented and adopted. That no church shall build a church or parsonage without consulting the District Council in regard to their construction and location.

Moved and seconded that the place of next conference in 1920 be decided upon. It carried. It was decided in favor of Roanoke, Va., by 20 to 16 votes.

Moved and carried to reconsider the time for the election of officers.

Moved and carried to proceed with their election at once.

S. M. Stikeleather was elected District Superintendent.

O. L. Ruth was elected Assistant Superintendent.

B. B. Bulla was elected Secretary.

W. R. Cox was elected Treasurer.

Ballots were distributed for the election of three councilmen. S. S. Nelson, W. A. Way, H. B. Barger were elected.

Ballots were distributed for the election of a missionary Board. S. S. Nelson, O. L. Ruth, W. R. Cox were elected.

Ballots were distributed for the election of Board of Publication. W. R. Cox, O. L. Ruth, S. M. Stikeleather were elected.

Ballots were distributed for the election of a Board of

Education. S. S. Nelson, W. R. Cox, P. H. Greeson were elected.

Ballots were distributed for the election of a Trustee to fill the place of the one whose term had expired. S. S. Nelson was re-elected.

The afternoon session was adjourned by the benediction by Brother O. L. Ruth.

Thursday A. M.

The forenoon session opened by singing and prayer at 8 a. m.

The chairman called for further business. Rev W. P. Ware presented a resolution that the conference appoint a committee to draft a statement of its appreciation of the life and service of Estella Cheshier and Rev. W. J. Allred, who had died since last Conference.

The resolution was adopted and Brothers, Andrew and Barger were elected. (See page 12.)

Moved and carried that the committee appointed at last conference to draft resolutions to be taken to the General Assembly concerning our people's bearing arms in war, be re-elected.

A resolution to elect a new committee was carried and B. B. Bulla, R. A. Andrew and S. M. Stikeleather were elected.

2. Resolved: That we believe the spirit of vengeance and carnal warfare comes from Satan and is foreign to the teachings and Spirit of Jesus Christ, and that full salvation takes out the desire for blood and murder and the pomp and worldly desire for power and honor which is the cause of war. Therefore we strongly urge that our members refrain from going to war and that they also use whatever influence which they may have to remonstrate against compulsory military training of our youth.

It was moved and carried that the Southern District invite the General Assembly to be held within its bounds next time. The District Superintendent was elected as spokesman to present the invitation.

Moved and carried that the conference elect delegates to go to the General Assembly as Conference delegates, G. O. Hayworth, F. L. Breden, Mrs. Jno Allred, Mrs. S. S. Nelson, Miss Nellie Carter, J. B. Fulp were elected.

Moved and carried that a committee be appointed to

ence for the splendid hospitality and entertainment accorded the Conference by the people of Winston-Salem.

Moved and carried that a resolution be formed by a committee of this Conference opposing at the next General Assembly the changing of our church name except dropping off of the word "International." S. S. Nelson and O. L. Ruth were appointed.

It was moved and passed that the Conference accept the Apostolic Holiness University, and its present management to close of Spring term, 1920. That it be taken over as Conference property to be owned and operated by the church, with the understanding that the Apostolic Holiness Church at Greensboro, N. C. relinquish its claims against it.

It was moved and passed that a man be elected in the place of W. R. Cox on the Board of Education to act in his place in that he is a member of the Board of Trustees of said school.

S. M. Stikeleather was elected.

Moved and passed that the Board of Education is authorized to handle the matters of details incident to the taking over of the school in the event the Conference offer is accepted and perpetuated the school and work.

Motion for adjournment was made and the Doxology was sung and the benediction was pronounced by Brother Kinaman.

PART II.—RESOLUTIONS

Resolution 1: RESOLVED, That none of our pastors or evangelists shall hold a revival meeting, or do Christian work of a public character in the territory of our pastors or those having charge of a Mission, without the consent and full fellowship of the pastor and the majority of the people in that territory.

New Church Buildings

Resolution 2.—RESOLVED, That it is hereby recommended that no new church buildings or parsonages be built without consultation with District Council in regard to construction and location.

Parsonages.

Resolution 3: RESOLVED, That all of our circuits take steps as soon as possible to build a parsonage for their pastors.

In Regard to Pastors:

Resolution 4: RESOLVED, That no pastor shall leave a part or all of his circuit without full knowledge of the State Superintendent, and that none of our preachers shall accept a pastorate thus left without consulting the State Superintendent.

Resolution 5: RESOLVED, That the placing of pastors on the different charges shall be the subject of the confirmation of the State Council.

Pastoral Support.

Resolution 6: RESOLVED, That the State Superintendent meet the Advisory Board of each church, call a meeting of them and decide as nearly as they can what their pastor shall receive per month, and appoint a Finance Committee to see that the decided amount comes up regularly each month.

Sunday Schools.

Resolution 7: RESOLVED, That the Conference elect a Sunday School Board, consisting of three members, who shall look after the interest of Sunday School work in our conference.

Tithing.

Resolution 8: RESOLVED, That the Conference recommended that all members tithe and that the tithe be paid

into the Church treasury and handled as directed by the Church Board.

Loan Fund and Support of Disabled Ministers.

Resolution 9: Resolved, That the resolution in regard to Loan Fund to be amended in such a way as to allow the interest to be charged on all money loaned and that the interest be set apart in a separate fund for the support of the permanently disabled ministers of this Conference.

Examinations.

Resolution 10: RESOLVED, That the District Superintendent be allowed to give examinations to any of the licensed ministers any time during Conference year and return the same for entry on the examining grade books.

Local Church Officers.

Resolution 11: RESOLVED, That care be taken to choose efficient officers to serve on local church Board.

Resolution 12: RESOLVED, That care pastors be recommended not to neglect visiting members, also non-members in the vicinity of their charge.

Board of Education.

Resolution 13: RESOLVED, That a Board of Education be elected by the Conference to forward the interest of education.

Powers and Field of Action of Board of Education

Resolution 14: Resolution defining powers and field of action of Board of Education. RESOLVED: 1, This Board shall investigate all propositions appertaining to the establishment of schools under the auspices or name of the International Apostolic Holiness Church, and shall have the power either to sanction or refuse to sanction such propositions.

Appeal from their decision may be made to the Annual Conference, but if an appeal is taken no action may be taken by either party to the proposition until such appeal shall be heard and settled.

2. This Board shall investigate the work being done by each school conducted under auspices of the I. A. H. Church and shall report on same to the Annual Conference.

3. This Board shall have power to confer with the authorities of any established school desiring to enter into affiliation with the I A. H. Church of this District.

4 This Board shall have power to enter into contract with

any school for the board and instruction of any worthy young man or young woman of this District.

5. This Board shall also have power to make such terms as they see fit with recipient instruction and other school expenses; being careful to make as certain as possible that said recipient will devote his or her life to active Christian work in our Church.

6. This Board shall investigate the cases of any likely young men and young women in this District who, through lack of means, are unable to secure the education and training necessary to their greatest usefulness, and shall as far as possible assist them to obtain this: (1) By rendering them financial assistance or (2) by procuring for those well able to work, an opportunity to work their way through school, and shall direct and insist, that all, who receive such aid, attend the school deemed suited to their needs by this Board.

7. Be it further Resolved, That this Board be made Trustees of a Student Loan Fund, said fund to be raised as follows: (1) Each pastor shall, once a year, preach a sermon on Christian education and shall at that time take or cause to be taken an offering for this fund (2) Each evangelists shall, in each meeting held by him in the bounds of this District, take at least one offering for this purpose, except that when laboring with another denomination there may be objections, in which case he is excused.

Money raised for this fund shall be sent to the Treasurer of this Board.

Further: That said fund be loaned to young men and young women, members of our church in this district, without interest, on such terms and payable in such manner as this Board may see fit.

Use of Pulpit for Raising Funds.

Resolution 15: Be it resolved, That the pastors and churches of this Conference be recommended to refrain from granting the use of their respective churches and pulpits to any purpose and persons, purporting to be raising funds for religious work, unless such person, or persons are members of the International Apostolic Holiness Church, or some other evangelical Church (whose doctrines are not antagonistic to Wesleyan Holiness) and have the endorsement and are working under the direction of, and are sending their offerings through the Missionary Board of the

Church, to which they belong, except such person or persons shall have written endorsement of the District Superintendent of the District.

Be it further resolved, That the Conference appoint a committee to present the above resolution to the General Council for their approval, with a view to its insertion in the Manual by the next General Assembly.

Missionary Reports.

Resolution 16: RESOLVED, That our missionaries send in a financial report every quarter and also yearly.

Regarding Supply Pastors from Other Denominations

Resolution 17: RESOLVED, That ministers of other denominations pastoring our churches shall join our conference after one year.

In Regard to the Apostolic Missionary.

Resolution 18: RESOLVED, That our ministers urge our people to subscribe for our missionary paper, The Apostolic Missionary.

As to Pastors in Evangelistic Work.

Resolution 19: RESOLVED, That none of our pastors shall leave his charge to do evangelistic work or anything that takes him away from his charge without supplying his pulpit in his absence to the satisfaction of the church which he serves, and that his evangelistic work be limited to not over four meetings per year outside his regular charge and these arranged so as to not keep him away from his charge over three successive Sundays.

The District Evangelists,

Resolution 20: RESOLVED, That our District Evangelists be employed when possible by the churches of the Southern District.

Resolution 21: RESOLVED, That these resolutions passed by this conference remain in force until repealed.

Support of District Superintendent.

Each pastor shall take up an offering for the District Superintendent when he visits the church and shall also take a free-will offering for the District Superintendent once each quarter.

Resolution of Respect.

Rev. W. J. Allred of Pomona, N. C., After a few days illness, Quietly went to sleep in Jesus. For about seventeen years he was a member of the Conference of the Southern
