Conference organized with 24 preachers and 16 delegates pres-

Moved and carried that we have a Committee on Worship. S. M. Stikeleather and M. A. Baldwin were duly elected. Moved and carried that we have a Nominating Committee.

The following were duly elected: S. M. Stikeleather, Cruse, H. B. Barger, M. A. Baldwin, W. A. Way.

Moved and carried that the election of officers for the coming

year be the order of the day for Thursday afternoon.

Upon request of the District Superintendent, the Conference, after motion, made and carried, elected a committee to assist him in passing upon the recommending of ministers' credentials for renewal. The committee follows: P. H. Greeson, O. L. Ruth, W. R. Cox, S. M. Stikeleather, W. C. Cruse.

Moved that this Conference elect a committee whose duty it shall be to arrange for the publishing of the Minutes at the earliest possible date and to prepare said Minutes for the printers.

Motion carried.

J. F. Nance, M. A. Baldwin, W. C. Cruse, were elected on this

Committee.

Moved and carried that this Conference elect a committee to confer with the Trustees of the Apostolic Holiness University. with the end in view to make said school a church school. Committee elected:— S. M. Stikeleather, S. S. Nelson, O. L. Ruth, W. A. Way, W. C. Cruse.

Moved and carried that the sessions of this Conference be limited to two hours each, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon and from 2 to 4

4. p. m. as nearly as possible.

A Resolution Committee was elected as follows:— O. L. Ruth. W. R. Cox, P. H. Greeson.

Moved and carried that all resolutions be presented through and with the approval of the committee.

A motion was carried to appoint a committee to choose a man or

men to preach to the preachers from time to time.

Committee appointed:— W. R. Cox, M. A. Baldwin, S. M. Stikeleather.

Moved and carried that the work of this committee be consolidated with that of the Committee on Worship, and that the last elected committee be discharged.

The resignation of W. C. Cruse as a member of the Committee

on the Minutes was formally accepted.

Third Session opened by singing "Blessed Assurance" followed with prayer by B. H. Vestal.

Conference was called to order by the District Superintendent,

and the reading of church reports continued.

Madora Hatcher, Geo. Bourgaize, Brother Schoombie and John Hutcheson, being Apostolic Holiness Ministers were given the privilege of voting.

Logan Brower was given the courtesies of the floor.

Geo. B. Kulp, our General Superintendent, spoke at some length urging every pastor and evangelist to influence their converts to join our church at once after conversion.

Thursday, Nov. 16, 1916, 2 P. M.

Fourth Session opened by singing, "My Jesus I love Thee." Scripture lesson, John 15, read by C. A. Lain; prayer by W. C. Cruse.

Election of officers being the order of the day, the Nominating Committee submitted the following report:—

"For District Superintendent, S. S. Nelson, W. R. Cox; for Assistant Superintendent, O. L. Ruth, W. C. Cruse; for Secretary, J. F. Nance, P. H. Greeson; for Treasurer, J. L. Crouse, W. A. Way."

Balloting proceeded, Brothers Way and Schoombie acting as tellers and the following were duly elected:

District Superintendent, S. S. Nelson. Assistant Superintendent, O. L. Ruth.

Secretary, P. H. Greeson. Treasurer, J. L. Crouse.

A ballot was then cast for the three remaining members of the District Council and resulted in the election of the following:-W. R. Cox, S. M. Stikeleather, W. A. Way.

The Missionary Board of last year was re-elected by acclamation: W. R. Cox, S. S. Nelson, M. A. Baldwin.

Church reports were then continued and when finished Sunday

School reports were read.

Moved and carried that Ministerial reports be the order of the day for the next session.

Friday, Nov. 17, 1916. 10 A. M.

Religious service in charge of J. E. Shaw. Minutes of last session read and approved. Ministerial reports were read (See page ten).

Some belated church reports were read.

W. R. Cox, treasurer of the District Missionary Board reported (See page thirteen).

Said report accepted subject to report of auditing Committee. Report of the District Treasurer was read by the Secretary and was accepted subject to report of auditing committee.

The Sunday School Board reported as having done work as individuals toward encouraging Sunday School work.

The Resolutions Committee was asked to frame a resolution

in regard to Henry Horton's work, R. F. Lynch and C. E. Allen from Mt. Carmel, were formally excused from the Conference,

Adjournment to 2 P. M.

Friday, Nov. 17, 1916, 2 P. M.

Sixth session opened with devotional service. Minutes of last session read and approved. Capt. Talbert of High Point Corps of Salvation Army was made an honorary member of this Conference.

The Resolutions Committee reported as follows:

Resolution 1: RESOLVED, That none of our pastors or evangelists shall hold a revival meeting or do Christian work of a public character in the territory of our pastors or those having charge of a Mission, without the

consent and full fellowship of the pastor and the majority of his people in that territory. Resolution adopted.

Resolution 2: RESOLVED, That our State Superintendent be put on the same basis for his support as our pastors.

Resolution adopted.

Resolution 3: RESOLVED, That all of our circuits take steps as soon as possible to build a parsonage for its pas-

Resolution adopted.

Resolution 4: RESOLVED, That none of our pastors shall leave his charge to do evangelistic work or anything that takes him away from his charge without supplying his pulpit in his absence to the satisfaction of the Church which he serves.

Resolution adopted.

Resolution 5: RESOLVED, That no pastor shall leave a part or all of his circuit without full knowledge of the State Superintendent, and that none of our preachers shall accept a pastorate thus left without consulting the State Superintendent.

Resolution adopted.

Resolution 6: RESOLVED, That since this Conference has taken the support of Sister Mattie Buchanan, and fallen short in her support, definite steps be taken to raise the deficit, and that we continue her support. Resolution adopted.

The necessary amount was raised in a few minutes.

Resolution 7: RESOLVED, That the placing of pastors on the different charges shall be the subject to the confirmation of the State Council. Resolution adopted.

Resolution 8: RESOLVED, That our pastors and delegates emphasize the importance of keeping a close record of their financial business concerning the Church. Resolution adopted.

Resolution 9: RESOLVED, That the State Superintendent meet the Advisory Board of each church, call a meeting of themselves and decide as nearly as they can what their pastor shall receive per month, and appoint a Finance Committee to see that the decided amount comes up regularly each month.

Resolution adopted.

Resolution 10: RESOLVED, That this Conference elect a Sunday-school Board, consisting of three members, who shall look after the interests of Sunday-school work in our conference.

Resolution adopted.

O. L. Ruth, S. M. Stikeleather and W. R. Cox were elected to serve on this Board.

Moved and carried that said Board work in harmony with the District Superintendent.

Resolution 11: RESOLVED, That the Conference recommend that all members tithe and that the tithe be paid into the Church treasury and handled as directed by the Church Board.

Resolution adopted.

Resolution 11: RESOLVED, That the resolution in regard to the Loan Fund be amended in such a way as to allow the interest to be charged on all money loaned and that the interest be set apart in a separate fund for the support of the permanently disabled ministers of this Conference.

Resolution adopted.

Resolution 13: RESOLVED, That the District Superintendent be allowed to give examinations to any of the licensed ministers any time during the Conference year and return same for entry on the examining grade books. Resolution adopted.

Resolution 14: RESOLVED, That a Board of Education be elected by the Conference to forward the interests of Education.

Resolution adopted.

Resolution 15: RESOLVED, That care be taken to choose effcient officers to serve on local church boards. Resolution adopted.

Resolution 16: RESOLVED, That ministers and church secretaries be implored to keep a correct record of all business actions pertaining to their work.

Resolution adopted.

Resolution 17: RESOLVED: That pastors be recommended not to neglect visiting members, also non-members in the vicinity of their charge.

Resolution adopted.

Above resolutions signed by O. L. Ruth, W. R. Cox, P. H. Greeson.

Moved and carried that Committee elected to confer with the Trustees of the Apostolic Holiness University be made a permanent Board of Education,

Moved and carried that a committee be elected to frame a reso-

lution defining the powers and field of action of said Board.

The following were duly elected:— W. R. Cox, M. A. Baldwin, P. H. Greeson, O. D. Park, Geo. B. Kulp.
Adjournment to Saturday, 10 A. M.

Conference convened and religious services conducted by Bro. Eagle. Paul H. Greeson elected Secretary for remainder of Conference. Several church, Sunday-school, and Ministerial reports read.

Moved, Seconded and carried that an auditing committee be appointed for the Conference year. Committee: Paul H. Greeson, O. D. Park, W. C. Cruse. A Resolution concerning the reception of missionaries promiscously was recommitted.

High Point was selected for the Annual Conference for next

year. Committee on printing minutes reported.

Moved, seconded and carried that Minutes contain tabular re-

port.

Moved, seconded and carried that necessary money for printing minutes be placed in hands of committee, and that committee hold minutes from printer till necessary amount be handed to them.

Madora Hatcher, John Hutcheson and Geo. Bourgaize were rec-

ognized as members of the Southern District.

Moved and carried that the resolution committee be asked to frame a resolution to get a better attendance at Quarterly Meetings.

Conference adjourned to 2 P. M.

Saturday 2 P. M. Nov. 18th, 1916.

Religious services conducted by Sister Conway. Minutes read and approved.

Resolution Committee to define the powers of Board of Educa-

tion reported as follows:-

Resolution 18: Resolution defining powers and field of action of Board of Education. RESOLVED: 1. This Board shall investigate all propositions appertaining to the establishment of schools under the auspices or name of the International Apostolic Holiness Church, and shall have power to either sanction or refuse to sanction such proposition.

Appeal from their decision may be made to the Annual Conference, but if an appeal is taken no action may be

taken by either party to the proposition until such appeal shall be heard and settled.

2. This Board shall investigate the work being done by each school conducted under auspices of the I. A. H. C. and

shall report on same to the Annual Conference.

3. This Board shall have power to confer with the authorities of any established school desiring to enter into affiliation with the I. A. H. Church of this District.

4. This Board shall have power to enter into

4. This Board shall have power to enter into contract with any school for the board and instruction of any worthy young man or young woman of this District

any worthy young man or young woman of this District.
5. This Board shall also have the power to make such terms as they see fit with the recipient of instruction and other school expenses; being careful to make as certain as possible that said recipient will devote his or her life to

active Christian work in our Church.

6. This Board shall investigate the cases of any likely young men and young women in this district who, through lack of means, are unable to secure the education and training necessary to their greatest usefulness, and shall as far as possible assist them to obtain this: (1) By rendering them financial assistance, or (2) by procuring for those well able to work, an opportunity to work their way through school, and shall direct and insist, that all, who receive such aid, attend the school deemed best suited to their needs by this Board.

7. Be it further Resolved, That this Board be made Trustees of a Student Loan Fund, said fund to be raised as follows: (1) Each pastor shall, once a year, preach a sermon on Christian education and shall at that time take or cause to be taken an offering for this fund. (2) Each evangelist shall, in each meeting held by him within the bounds of this District, take at least one offering for this purpose, except that when laboring with another denomination there may be objections, in which case he is

excused.

Moneys raised for this fund shall be sent to the Treas-

urer of this Board.

Further, That said fund be loaned to young men and young women, members of our church in this District, without interest, on such terms and payable in such manner as this Board may see fit.

Moved and carried that the North Carolina District be incorporated. Trustees: S. S. Nelson, S. M. Stikeleather, O. L. Ruth, J. L. Crouse, W. R. Cox, Paul H. Greeson, W. C. Cruse.

Vote of thanks for the hospitality of the Greensboro church

during the Annual Conference, was was unanimously voted.

Resolution countroling missionary meetings passed. as was follows:---

Resolution 19: Be it Resolved, That the pastors and churches of this Conference be recommended to refrain from granting the use of their respective churches and pulpits to any person or person, purporting to be raising funds for religious work, unless such person, or persons are members of the International Apostolic Holiness Church, or some other evangelistical Church; (whose doctrines are not antagonistical to Wesleval Holiness) and have the endorsement, and are working under the direction of, and are sending their offerings through Missionary Board of the Church, to which they belong, except such person or persons as shall have written endorsement of the District Superintendent of the District.

Be it further Resolved, That this Conference appoint a Committee to present the above resolution to the General Council for their approval, with a view to its insertion in

the Manual by the next General Assembly.

Resolution adopted.
