

First business in order was the recommendations of Gilbert Anderson and L. D. Sharp for license to preach by the District Council. Approved by the Assembly.

It was approved that our next Assembly be held at Oshkosh. Moved and approved that the District Council shall set the date for our next Assembly.

Moved and approved that we shall not send a Delegate to our extra session of General Assembly.

Moved and approved that Brother Kulp give us a short talk.

Brother Kulp gave us a talk which helped us and gave us courage to press the battle for God and souls.

The Committee on Resolutions gave their report and the following Resolutions were adopted by the Assembly:

- I. Resolved that the following financial plans be adopted for Home Missions for the work of the District.
 - (1) A pledge offering be taken in this Assembly.

- (2) That each member of the I. H. C. of this District, if possible, pay one dollar per quarter.
- II. Resolved that the I. H. C. of this District conduct as annual camp meeting at such place as the District Coucil may designate and the same shall see to the securing of Evangelists and any other matters pertaining to the camp.
- III. Resolved that each local church shall pay their proportion which may accrue for the filing of the Incorporations papers and attorney Fee.
 - IV. Resolved that the minutes of this Assembly be printed.
- V. Resolved that the District Superintendent appoint a committee to attend to the publishing of the Minutes.
- VI. Resolved that a free will offering be taken at the evening service for the publishing of the Minutes.
- VII. Resolved that this Assembly, herein assembled shall show by a rising vote of thanks their appreciation to our General Superintendent for his service and interest among us.

The officers of Church Incorporation formulated the following articles of Incorporation which were approved by the Assembly:

- 1. The name of this Church shall be known as the International Holiness Church of the State of Nebraska, located at Madrid, Perkins County, Nebraska.
- 2. This Church shall be capable of securing for any existing emergency which may arise, the sum of 10,000.
- 3. This amount shall be contracted for by any property, notes, mortgages, which the said church may possess.
- 4. In the event of any vacancies arising from death, removals etc., of officers, the District Council shall be impowered to fill such vacancies.
- 5. The Incorporation of this church shall take place at once and continue indefinitely.
- 6. This church shall administer its affairs through the District Council.
