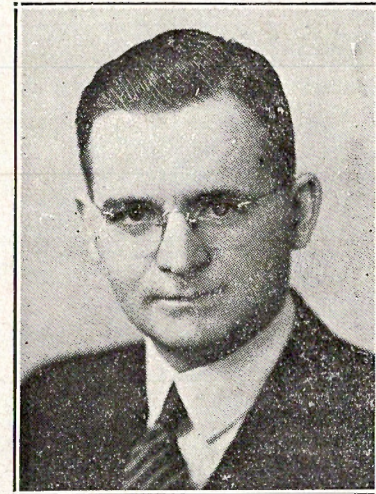

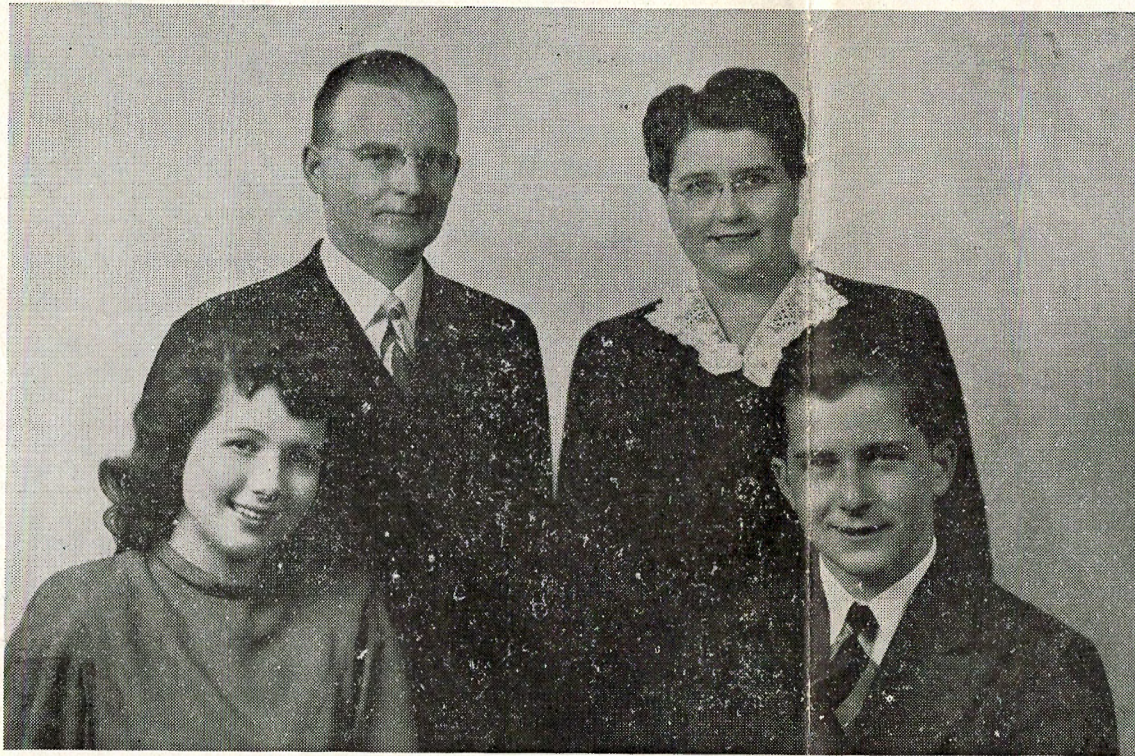

At a lovely fellowship dinner at the Rees Memorial parsonage last Monday night, the pastor, Rev. Carl J. Hahn, asked the Church Board to release him from the next two years of his call to the Church, so that he could accept an appointment for missionary service with the Oriental and Inter-American Missionary Society.

Rev. and Mrs. Hahn, Evangeline and Joseph, came to the Rees Memorial Church in Pasadena two years ago, from Columbus, Ohio, where they had pastored for eight years. Previously they held pastorates in Kansas for eight years—at Fredonia, Argonia and Big Bow.

Feeling definitely that God was calling them to the open door of Brazil, the Hahns will be leaving Pasadena the first week of July, and plan to go to Brazil in the late fall.

The first period of the meeting which begins at 2:30 p.m. Sunday afternoons will be devoted to a study of our missionary activities in the Philippine Islands, missionary offering taken and the needs of the workers presented.

The second period will be devoted to an evangelistic service.

The Pilgrims are urged and the public invited to attend.

Brother and Sister Hahn were both converted in Pilgrim home missionary work in Kansas and were then definitely called to missions, and have lived for the day when God would permit them to go to a foreign field.

They are both graduates of the Colorado Springs Bible Training School, and Brother Hahn also attended Colorado College, Capital University, Winona Lake School of Theology and the University of Southern California

Under his leadership the Rees Memorial Young People have installed chimes on the church, and the Youth Camp was started in the San Bernardino mountains. The church has purchased a public address system with hearing aids. New furnaces were put in the parsonage, and the church buildings painted. Plans were made and a fund started for additional improvements. There are a few hundred dollars in a fund to buy a church bus. Twenty-six new members have been added to the church roll, and others are coming in soon.

The missionary services, which have always been a predominant feature of the Rees Memorial Church, have been greatly blessed of God under Bro. Hahn's ministry.

During the last two years the Pasadena Holiness Association Mid-winter Camp Meeting, which begins annually the first Friday after New Years, was started and entertained at the Church. Also, the church was given over to the Oriental Missionary Society both years for an Annual Convention.

The fall revival with Dr. "Don" Householder proved to be a time of great blessing. Many souls sought and found the Lord during these meetings.

Rosemead Pilgrim Church has come through with flying colors with their Penny-A-Day offering of \$28.30 for the month of March.

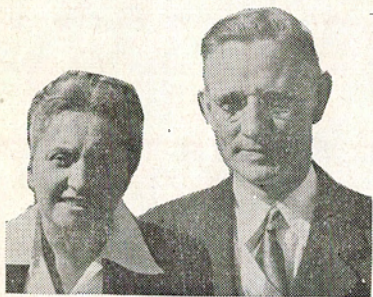
