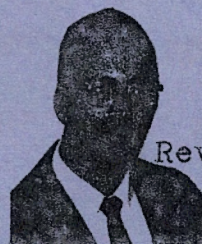

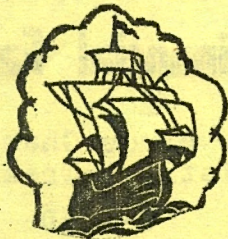

The California District has always been a strong support in the interest of foreign missions. This fact is reflected very definitely in her total giving to the many missionary interests.

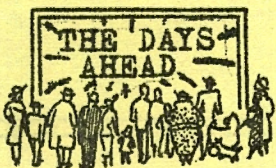
