SECOND BUSINESS SESSION

1:30 P. M. AUGUST 16, 1937

Opened with devotional services - Scripture quotations by members of the assembly. Prayer.

Minutes of first business session accepted.

Moved and carried we dispense with the roll call.

First order of business being continuance of Res. No. 2, it was put to standing vote with 19 for and 24 against. LOST.

Moved and carried we hear reports of District Officers.

Superintendent's report heard and accepted, being as follows:

To the 28th Annual Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the West Virginia District in session at Huntington, W. Va., August 16th and 17th 1937.

Greetings:

Again we are gathered together in the capacity of an annual assembly to view the labors of the past year and to take an inventory of our district. How fast the clock seems to go as it strikes the close of another year of labor. It won't be long until our little day's work will be done. I thank you all for the love and cooperation you have shown me in the past year. I have preached 160 times, held three revival meetings, namely, Logan, Berkeley Springs and Bethlehem, Penna., with 60 seekers. Held 90 business and home missionary meetings, and visited all of the churches four times except Williamson and Rawl which I visited only three times, my Assistant Supt. filling the Williamson appointment and Bro. Webb filling my Rawl appointment. I have attended three General Board meetings, conducted two funerals, and traveled 12,189 miles. I supplied the Bramwell Church as pastor a few Sundays while locating a pastor for them.

Financial: Our foreign missionary budget was set at \$1,368.00 and we have raised \$1,621.63, making us overpaid \$253.63. Our general budget was set at \$684.00 and we have paid \$686.92 putting us over the top at a very small margin of \$2.92. Our district budget is paid in full which is \$880.00, making a total of \$3,188.55. The Dist. Supt. is paid in full, with a generous love offering given to me by the council for service in camp meeting for which I am very thankful. There has been paid to pastors for support and donations \$13,812.26. Our total membership is now 773 making an increase of 69. The total amount of money raised this year is \$17,000.81. I want to call the attention of our Ways and Means Committee to the fact that our General Assembly convenes next fall and that there must be provisions made this year to raise the money for this expense which approximately will be \$175.00. For all of our advancement, if there be any, we give the Lord the glory. Wherein we have failed we should profit by it, and do better next year.

Resolutions of This Assembly

No. 1.—Whereas the Independent Holiness Church of God at Susie Chapel, five miles out of the City, have had their Camp Meeting beginning the first Thursday in August the past 25 years or more; and Whereas so many camp meetings are held in August, making it hard to get desireable workers,

BE IT RESOLVED; That the date of the West Virginia District Camp Meeting be set to begin the last Thursday in June continuing over two Sundays, and should the Fourth of July come on Monday or Tuesday, it shall continue over the Fourth of July.

Recommended by the Committee. TABLED and TABLED.

No. 2.—Whereas, It is detrimental both to the District Camp Meeting and the District Assembly to have the Assembly follow the District Camp, because the minds of the people are taken up with the business of the Assembly, and Whereas, the District Assembly is a blessing to the local churches of the District;

BE IT RESOLVED; That the District Assembly of the West Virginia District shall begin on Tuesday night and continue over Sunday at such a date and place as the Assembly shall designate according to Sec. 83, Par. 16 of our manual.

Not recommended by the Committee. LOST.

No. 4.—WHEREAS; Our Camp Meeting has been held for years at Huntington on the Western edge of the State; and WHEREAS; There are many who cannot attend on this account; and WHEREAS; the Southern part of our State has been neglected; Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED: That the Chair appoint in this Assembly a committee of three, whose duties it will be to search for a desirable location, centrally located, for our District Camp Meeting, and further BE IT RESOLVED; That the above mentioned committee investigate and be empowered to lay plans both for a Tabernacle and a District Parsonage for the District Superintendent, and anything else they may deem needful with reference to the Camp Grounds and Buildings, and report to this Assembly next year.

Recommended by the Committee. ADOPTED.

No. 5.—RESOLVED; That the Camp Meeting date be set for the first Thursday after the second Sunday in August and to last over ten days; the Distret Assembly to follow.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY:

W & M No. 1. - 1936, and action in 4th Session 1937. Minimum \$1,300.00. Maximum \$1,500.00 per year and traveling expense at rate of 3c per mile.

W & M No. 2. - 1936, That part not provided for in the Budget, All pastors and evangelists shall pay through their local church treasurer One-half of their tithe, and all licensed and ordained preachers who are not actively engaged in the work shall pay \$8.00 per year. Also, each Pastor shall take up a freewill offering at each of his visits to the church, and all monies the Supt. may receive for his services as a minister of the gospel shall be paid to the Dist. Treas. to be applied on his support.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT-SPECIAL DUTIES

He shall preside over annual church meetings - Res. No. 11 - 1924.

He shall pay expenses of the Asst. Dist. Supt. where it becomes necessary for the Asst. to supply in his stead - 1930 minutes, page 10.

He shall give four quarterly meetings and preaching services to each church during the year - Res. No. 8 - 1935.

He shall make out quarterly reports and send a copy to each church after each quarterly round, showing spiritual, numerical and financial condition of each church - No. 10

1935.

He shall take up pledges on his second quarterly round from each church for Home Missionary Work to be paid in six months. W & M No. 7 - 1936 as revised 1937.

He shall be permanent chairman of the Ministerial Convention. Page 8, 1936 mins.

MINISTERIAL CONVENTION

Adopted - See Res. No. 3 - 1935

PLACE - Invitations to be received at each Assembly and voted on by secret ballot See Res. No. 7, 1936.

TIME - Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday following the Second Sunday in May. See Res. No. 7, 1936 and motion in Third Business Session Assembly of 1937.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR - The Dist. Supt. as Chairman shall appoint three members of the ministerial deligation to serve with him in preparing for this Convention. See Res. No. 4, 1936.

EXPENSES OF - That all preachers and churches over the Dist. bring an offering either in Cash or Provisions, and that an offering be taken during the Conventicate to cover any deficit. See W & M Recommendation No. 13, 1936.

DISTRICT ASSEMBLY

TIME - Following immediately after our District Camp Meeting. See Res. No. 2, 1936. Also No. 5, 1937.

PASTOR'S SALARY - to be paid while attending. See Res. No. 4, 1924 Also Res. No. 4, 1930.

EXPENSES - Pastor's and Delegates to be paid. See Res. No. 3, 1930.

REPORTS - ALL YEARLY REPORTS to be mailed to the Chairman of the Statistical Committee IMMEDIATELY after the Fourth Quarterly meeting. See Res. No. 8, 1936. (THIS IS IMPORTANT)

REPORTS - Reading of same on Assembly Floor abolished. Res. 7, 1936.

FINANCIAL - Assessed as follows: Church membership of 20 or less \$5.00; 21-50 \$15.00; 51-100 \$25.00; 101 and over \$40.00. W & M No. 3, 1936. To be raised in cash or donations or both.

DISTRICT CAMP MEETING

DATE - First Thursday after second Sunday in August. Res. No. 5, 1937.

FINANCING - By pledges taken during the Camp and the Assembly following. See Resolution No. 12, 1936.

SUNDRY RULINGS, ETC.

Resolution, 1921. - "That we, the 12th annual assembly of the IHC of W. Vaurge our churches to give preference to preachers of the IHC when calling workers for their revivals and camp meetings"

Res. No. 5, 1924 - "That no pastor in the W. Va. District shall call for evangelistic service any evangelist of the Nazarene Church without the endorsement of the Dist. Supt."
