JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

First Session

The twelvth annual District Conference of Wisconsin Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:15 a.m., May 6, 1967, at the Pardeeville Church. The reverend W.N. Miller, General Secretary of Church Extension presiding.

The congregation was led in singing by Rev. M.W. Twining, and hearts joined together as Rev. J.W. Johnston led in prayer.

The host pastor, Rev. M.W. Twining gave a warm welcome to the conference and invited all to attend the dinner provided by the Pardeeville Missionary Society immediately following the conference.

District Superintendent, Rev. C.L. Walker, introduced Rev. W.N. Miller to the conference, and turned the floor over to him.

Rev. Miller gave an inspiring and challenging message using as a basis of thought, Titus 1:5 "For this cause I left thee in Crete, that thou shouldest set in order the things that are wanting,..." The main theme of the message was that we are all missionaries. Many around us are in need of the gospel that we hold. We should be faithful to our calling, realizing that this is not just the work of a few, but a work involving everyone of us.

The roll was called by Secretary Rev. D.K. McKenzie. There was seven ministers and six laymen listed on the roll; all were present and all answered the roll call.

Rev. F. Paul Bittick, veteran minister of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and Rev. Lynard E. Sanders, visiting minister from the Wesleyan Methodist Church, were seated as honorary members of the conference and admitted to the bar.

Rev. C.E. Woods, representing the reception committee, presented to the conference the newest member of the district, Rev. Paul Twining, pastor of the Sheboygan Church. He was warmly welcomed and seated in the bar. Rev. J.W. Johnston was seated in the bar.

The front four seats on one side of the church was set as the conference bar.

The District Superintendent's report was given by the District Superintendent, Rev. C.L. Walker. It was accepted with appreciation.

The following reports were given and accepted: Treasure's report read by Rev. M.W. Twining in place of Mr. W.A. Blann, district treasure who was not able to attend.

District Camp Report, also given by Rev. Twining in place of Mr. W.A. Blann. It was given as incomplete, but shown to have a balance of over \$300.00.

District Sunday School Secretary's report given by Rev. Woods.

District Youth president report given by Rev. Paul Twining.

District Missionary Society Report given by Mrs. Elsie Brossmann.

District Statistition report given by Rev. McKenzie.

Memorials report given by Mrs. Clinton Woods.

The resignation of Mr. William A. Blann as district treasurer, was received, and appreciation for a job well done was extended by Rev. Miller.

Rev. Woods was elected to attend the first General Conference of the newly organized Wesleyan Church as the ministerial delegate. Mr. Willaim A. Blann was elected as the lay delegate.

A motion was made and seconded, we turn all unfinished business over to the District Council. Unanimously approved.

The conference adjourned at 11:38.

LOCAL CHURCH

The Church at Exeland is planning on drilling a well so as to have safe drinking water.

The Milwaukee Church has improved their church by painting the exterior, redecorating the interior, refinishing the pews and installing a new organ and a new public address system. Most of this work was accomplished by donated labor by the membership and friends of the church.

The Pardeeville church has built 6 folding tables, purchased 24 folding chairs, kitchen supplies, perculator, dinnerware, new bookcase for office, new mimeograph for office, door closers, new communion rail, improved basement floor with new coat of paint. The church parsonage was improved by installing vinyl floor tile in the living room, kitchen and bathroom.

The Sparta parsonage basement was redecorated, also, parts of main floor, furnace and plumbing repaired, and a new sidewalk put in and a lawn mower purchased.

During this year the Sheboygan church has purchased a new organ.
