JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS First Session

Rev. R. C. Hawkins was introduced to the conference and read from Heb. 5:12-14 and Heb. 6:1-3. His message contered around the thought: "Let Us Go On ". We cannot stand still for life has no stopping place, thus we must go and go on with God.

It was moved and seconded that the first four seats of the middle section and the platform constitute the conforence bar. Carried.

A motion was made and seconded, Al Berg be scated

as delegate from the Sparta Church. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that the hour of sittings be from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 Moon and from 1:30 p.m. until all the business is completed. Carried.

The Reception Committee presented to the conference Miss Ethel Jordan, formerly a missionary to Africa who rave her testimony of the goodness of God.

It was moved and seconded that Miss Ethel Jordan be grante an honorary seat in the conference bar. Carried.

It was move, and seconded that Rev. Don Richardson be accepted in the Mascensin District. Carried,

The report of the District Superintendent was read.

A motion was made and seconded that it be accepted.

The auditor's report was given by Mrs. Clinton Woods. A motion was made and seconded the auditor's report be accepted. Carraed.

It was move! and seconded that we accept the Pressurer's report of the District and Camp meeting funds. Carried.

The Sunday School Committee's report was given by Rev. Clihton Woods. It was moved and seconded that the report be accepted. Carried.

The report of the YouthCommittee was given by Rev. Edsel Goins. The Snow Valley Youth Camp was a new project and it was very successful, to which God be given all the praise.

A motion was made and seconded that the report be accepted. Carried.

The District Statistician report was given by Rev. R. A. Pegram. It was moved and seconded that the report be accepted. Carried.

The report of the Conference Action Committee was read. The entire resolution was read and amended to read that a Sunday School offering be taken semi-annually. Carried.

A motion was made and seconded that we recess. Carried.

Second Session

Our District Supt. opened the service by leading the conference in singing "Stand Up For Jesus." Rev. Edsel Goins led the conference in prayer.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins discussed the District Budget for the coming year. He urged all the churches to pay their District Budget in full.

The secretary of the Conference Action Committee presented a discussion of the probability of mortgaging the District equity of all the churches property. Rev. R. C. Hawkins stated that no such action was contemplated and no formal action would be needed to offset such a program.....

The pastors' reports were given, and a hearty "AMEN" was given to receive thes reports. Carried.

Second Sessions (cont.)

Dr. R. C. Hawkins, Church Extension Secretary, reported of the action of the Seneral Board of May, 1961, that the following be appointed for the year:

Rev. R. A. Pegram, District Superintendent Rev. Paul H. Hollmann, District Secretary Rev. C. M. Upton, District Treasurer

The election of officers was the next order of business.

Mr. W. A. Blann and Rev. Edward Hiller were elected to the District Council. Rev. Don Richardson was elected to the Educational and Examining Board (3 yrs)

The council then presented nominoes as delegates to the General Conference of 1962. Hinistorial, Edsel Goins and Don Richardson. Lay, V. A. Blann and Louis Bauer.

Rev. Edsel Goins was elected as ministerial delegate and Rev. Don Richardson as alternate to the General Conference.

Mr. W. A. Blann was elected as lay delegate and Mr. Louis Bauer as alternate to the Genéral Conference.

Mrs. Clinton Woods gave a report of the Memorial Committee. It was moved and seconded that we accept this report. Carried.

A motion was made and seconded that we adjourn. Rev. C. M. Upton led the Conference in the closing prayer.

Be it resolved that each church in the District contribute one of its Sunday School offerings semi-annually to the expenses of the District Sunday School Board. This fund will cover the cost of the following items:

- A. Purchase of reference books and magazines subscriptions for the use of the District Sunday School Board.
- B.Correspondence, report forms, and mailing expense to the churches in the district.
- C. Travel and expenses of the promotional secretary to meetings of the National Sunday School Association within the State of Wisconsin, and to our National Sunday School Leader's Conference.

STANDING RULES

Section I Sunday School and Youth

1.Be it resolved that the offerings taken at District

Sunday School Promotional meetings and District Youth

Zone Rallies, be sent to the Dist. Treasurer. It is to
be expected that these offerings adequately cover the
expenses involved (\$10. minimum ave. per meeting (1960)

Section II Camp Meeting

1. Be it resolved that the Dist. Council be the Camp Meeting Board. (1958)

2. Inasmuch as it is fitting to honor retired Pilgrim Ministers and their wives who have given years of service in the Lord's work, be it resolved that due recognition be given when possible for services rendered to the church. Be it further resolved that they be given any concessions due to the regular ministry; such as reduction of rates during camp meeting, etc. (1959)

Section III Dist. Supt. and Council

1. Be it resolved that a meeting be held each September and called by the District Supt. to familiarize the ministers of the District with the current program of the district for the new year. (1959)

2. Be it resolved that an installation service be conducted by the Dist. Supt., or someone appointed by him, for each incoming pastor to a local church within the district. (1958)

3. Be it resolved that the Dist. Supt. appoint all committees. A list of appointments shall be submitted to the District Council for approval. (1958)

4. Be it resolved that all evangelists within the church and also all Christian Workers that represent works outside our denomination, be approved by the District Council or the Dist. Supt. before conducting services in our churches. (1956)

5.Be it resolved that the Dist. Supt. be chairman of the Educational And Examining Boards. (1958)
6.Be it resolved that an offering be received at the Dist. Supts.visits to the churches. This amount to be sent by the local tre-surer to the District Treasurer in addition to the budget. It is to be expected that these offerings adequately cover his traveling expenses. (1958)

- 7.Be it resolved that all District Officials be paid travel expense at the rate of 3ϕ per mile, plus meals when traveling for District work approved by Council. (1958)
- 8.Be it resolved that the 4% assessment of the Pilgrim Pension Plan for the District Superintendent by paid by the District Treasurer. (1958)
- 9. Be it resolved that no assessment be levied against the District Churches without the consent of the Conference or Council. (1958)
- 10. Be it resolved that 5% of the District Budget be set aside for General Conference Delegate expense. (1958)

Section IV Business Practice

- 1. Be it resolved that each church be required to have adequate insurance protection, including public liability. (1958)
- 2. Be it resolved that the district trustees be composed of three members of the district council, appointed by the council. (1958)
- 3. Be it resolved that the local treasurer balance their books at the end of each month and forward all District and General funds immediately to the Dist. Treasurer. (1958)
- 4.Be it resolved that the Dist. Supt. and pastors of our churches be given two weeks vacation with pay. (1958 5.Be it resolved that our pastors be limited to 15 days away from their respective fields in revivals unless otherwise approved by the Dist. Council. (1958) 6.Be it resolved that all plans for building, remodeling, and financing of any construction to cost in excess of \$500. be submitted to the Dist. Council for approval before construction is begun. (1958)
- 7. Be it resolved that a Pilgrim Fellowship be formed in our unorganized churches. (1958)
- 8. Be it resolved that all unstationed ministers submit annual reports to the Dist. Supt. and the Dist. Statistician. (1958)
- 9.Be it resolved that there be a Conference Action Committee of 5 persons to bring all matters of legislation & Finance to the Conference. They shall meet one month prior to Conference and send a copy of all proposed action to Pastors to be presented to his local Church. (1958)

10. Inasmuch as our District Activities should have the full support of each pastor and his constituency, and whereas there is a possibility of conflicting dates due to local and district planning, be it resolved that the various committees and their district leaders submit to the District Secretary, by September 15th, the dates of planned conventions, rallies, etc.; these and other dates of importance shall be included in a calendar of events which shall be compiled by the secretary and distributed to each pastor. (1959) 11. Inasmuch as publicity is important in church work. especially in the work of church extension, and where we as a district have no formal news agency, be it resolved that the district superintendent appoint a district reporter to provide news coverage regarding district and general church activities. The Articles shall be written in the best form possible and be approved by the District Superintendent. A copy of news articles shall be given to each pastor to submit to his local newspaper. (1959)

12. Be it resolved that in the election of church delegates to the District Conference, specific consideration be given the following objectives:

a. He shall be able to properly represent his local church in any conference action.

b. The local church shall instruct the delegate with regard to any proposed conference action.

13. Inasmuch as it is good business policy, and for the good of all concerned, be it resolved that the district treasurer be bonded. (1958)

Section V Memorials and Memiors

1.Be it resolved that the existing memorial committee also function as a memoirs committee: and in a seperate portion of the district minutes, tribute be paid to those of our membership who have deceased during the conference year. (1958)

Section VI Conference Journal

1.Be it resolved that all district resolutions become standing rules one year after their adoption, and date inserted parenthetically. (1958)

Section VII Special Pastoral Duties

1. Be it resolved that each pastor teach a class in Manual for all new members or other members of his church who have not had the opportunity to attend such a class before. This class to be offered at least once a year. (1953)

Section VIII Budget

1. Be it resolved that the Local Church District Expense Assessment be set at 5% of all Local Church Offerings; this amount not to include Sunday School Offerings, Building Funds, Evangelistic Offerings, or other Special Offerings raised for General Church purposes. (1960)
