Brother Kiehl is a real blessing to the saints and we trust that he may have many fruitful years in personal activity for the Lord.


Rev. Richard Miller from Lyndon, Kansas is the new pastor.


AMALGAMATION

In 1945 the Holiness denomination amalgamated with the Pilgrim Holiness denomination. In 1932 the Pilgrim Holiness church of Santa Barbara was founded. Some of its early stalwarts were Rev. and Mrs. Wilson Lee and Jason Lee. Its early beginning was in a store building, later a fine new church was erected and still later a splendid new parsonage.
