- 2. Secure visitors for the calling.
- 3. Keep the pastor informed as to the conditions in the homes where he can be of special help.
- 4. Keep the Sunday school informed of the work being done, thereby stimulating greater interest.

The importance of the work of the visitors cannot be over emphasized. They should go to each home at least once a quarter and better still once a month. It may be possible for the Home Department visitor to arrange for cottage prayer meetings in some of these homes thereby linking them not only to the Sunday school but to the church.

To become a member of the Home Department the only obligation placed upon one is to study the lesson for a half hour each week. An offering envelope is passed out and offering is not required.

Often some of the members of the Home Department like to contribute to work of the Sunday school. A list of the absentees from Sunday school of the previous Sunday may be given them to call, to phone and turn in information as to the causes of their absence. Again they may help in getting material out for the Sunday school's mailing list.

In conclusion strive to make your Home Department a vitally spiritual asset to your Sunday school. May the Lord help us to be so "spirit filled" that we may be used to help kindle a flame of love for the Master in the hearts of those to whom we minister.
