JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Third Annual Conference of the Capital District convened at Arlington, Virginia, at 8:45 p.m. on May 24, 1955.

- Rev. T. M. Weir led the conference in the singing of, "My Jesus I Love Thee," and "Whisper a Prayer."
 - Rev. R. Lewis Adams led the conference in prayer.
- Rev. T. M. Weir, District Superintendent, introduced Rev. R. C. Hawkins, Secretary of Church Extension, as President of the Conference.

Rev. Hawkins read from II Timothy 4 for the Scripture Lesson and addressed the conference with a stirring message, "Contemporary Religious Trends." After pointing out the contemporary religious thought Rev. Hawkins strongly urged the conference to be vigilant for this is the day for the Pilgrim Church, for the Pilgrims have the message that will lead men out of darkness and gloom into the plain paths of salvation.

The conference was then called to order by Rev. R. C. Hawkins and the District Secretary proceeded to call the foll.

There were twelve ministerial delegates and five lay delegates responding.

The motion carried that the center section of the church constitute the Conference Bar.

The motion carried that this sitting adjourn at 10:00 p.m. to convene on May 25 at 9:00 a.m. and recess at 11:15 a.m., convene at 1:00 p.m. and continue until business is finished.

The President of the Conference called for the District Superintendent's report. The District Suberintendent's report was read and accepted with an expression of gratitude.

The Statistition's report was called for:

The motion carried that the minister's report not be read and that it should be posted.

The motion carried that only the membership, last report and this report, be read of the Church Statistical Report.

The motion carried that the property statement be posted.

Rev. John P. York was introduced to the Conference.

The sitting was adjourned by expiration of time.

SECOND SITTING

The motion carried that the statistition's report be accepted.

The Treasurer's report was called for. The Treasurer's report was accepted with an expression of gratitude to God for making this report possible and appreciation to the District Treasurer for preparing the report.

The President of the Conference called for the transfer letters of ministers coming into the District.

. The motion carried that $\mbox{\rm Rev.}$ John P. York be received by the Conference.

The motion carried that Rev. J. W. Kraus be received into the conference pending the receipt of his letter from the Virginia District.

The report of the Eastern Pilgrim College board of representatives was called for. The motion carried it be received.

The President called for the report of the Educational and Examining Committee. Deferred until afternoon sitting.

The President called for the Resolutions Committee report.

Resolution II Adopted (Journal #4)

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was called for.

Sitting adjourned by expiration of time.

THIRD SITTING

Ways and Means Committee report:

The motion carried that the conference express gratitude to Miss Naomi Floor and Mr. & Mrs. Raymond Campbell for their untiring labor on the Statistical Report.

The President of the Conference read the appointments of District Officials:

The District Superintendent appointed for the conference year 1955-1956; The Examining and Educational Board, Sunday School Board, Youth Executive Secretary, and the committees listed on page 3.

The motion carried that the District Treasurer's books be turned over to the Auditing Committee and said committee report their findings to the District Council.

The following District Trustees were elected:

- E. L. Howard for three years
- C. W. Beach for two years

Raymond Campbell for one year

 $\mbox{Rev.}$ R. C. Hawkins addressed the conference concerning the Easter offering.

Capital District portion should have been \$548.00, and the District only gave \$150.00. The Easter Offering amounted to 50 to \$55,000; \$21,000 was realized from the sale of some stock which the Department inherited. The Church Extension Department has paid off all of its debt. Praise the Lord!

The General Board passed a resolution that the Church Extension Department not be allowed to run a deficit.

The report of the Educational and Examining Board was given:

The following recommendations were made:

For third year District License: Robert W. Darsch, John Foster, Joseph Rogers.

For second year District License: Charles W. Beach, George R. Orme, J. D. Pence, and John York.

The motion carried that the Conference grant the licenses as recommended by the committee.

Resolution No. 4 presented by the District Supt. Pilgrim Pension Plan, Inc. was adopted. (Journal #6)

The District Superintendent asked Rev. R. Lewis Adams to explain the new monthly report blank.

The motion prevailed that the conference give an expression of appreciation to Rev. Adams for his work on the new report blank.

 ${\tt Rev.}\ {\tt R.}$ C. Hawkins addressed the conference on the importance of filling out monthly reports and also the sending in of human interest articles.

The motion prevailed that we express our appreciation to Rev. R. C. Hawkins for his kind, efficient handling of our Conference, by a rising vote of thanks.

The motion prevailed that we express our appreciation to our District Superintendent for his untiring labors among us.

The motion carried to adjourn.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

TO THE 3RD. ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE CAPITAL DISTRICT

PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH

May 24 - 25 1955

To the brethren of the conference:

Greetings in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

I come before the conference this year with a profound sense of gratitude. As superintendent, I need not point out to you the very evident attestations of God's approval within and upon the district as a whole.

We cannot adequately explain the growth and expansion of our district without acknowledging fully the intervening grace and providence of God.

As we see the handiwork of the Lord in our midst, we cannot escape our obligation nor feel that it has been discharged until we have met the full demands of a deeper sense of dedication and consecration.

The past year has reflected the same steady growth and expansion that has characterized the Capital District since the first annual conference. We have had many problems and no doubt there will be many more as we continue to grow and expand. These, however, are the healthy signs of a wide awake district.

The enlarged ministry is therefore the work of all of us laboring diligently under the blessing of God. The hard work and deep devotion of the pastors of the Capital District is not surpassed by any other group in our church. Many of our men find it necessary to work in order to support themselves, and some receive nothing whatsoever for their faithful labofs. Going beyond this, they even pay their own expenses. This, however, is not as it should be, for the hearts of our men are with their churches. They long for the day when they can give their full time to the work of the Lord.

- a- Alexandria, Va. has added a new parsonage
- b- Yorkshire, Va. is fast bringing to a conclusion the first section of their new church.
- c- Arlington, Va. has developed the basement of their new church building and now have Sunday School rooms adequate for 300 scholars.
- d- Woodridge has found it necessary to turn the parsonage into a Sunday School department. The pastor had to find accommodations in an apartment building.

- e- A new church is needed for Temple
- f- College Park, Md. has purchased an additional lot and is anxiously awaiting the time to build a new church and parsonage
- g- Thanks to the christian love of the Franconia Pilgrims, we have been able to re-finance the capital district camp at a great saving. A mortgage on the Foster Pilgrim chapel made this possible.
- h- A lot has been secured and a district parsonage is planned for the near future.

Our Capital District Camp at Franconia was a glorious success. The Youth Camp held in the beautiful Blue Ridge Mountains of Virginia was a spiritual feast for all. Victory was evident on every hand. Our district has been incorporated in order to better serve the interest of the work. Numerical gains have been noted in each church.

Thus a year has closed successfully only to be followed by a new one filled with greater opportunities. May God give us courage and wisdom to meet these new and larger obligations. The extent to which we shall exploit, and be faithful to the opportunity which is ours can be realized only thru our decisions. We must face up to the full facts and make such decisions as we believe to be to the glory of God.

My personal report is as follows;

I have preached 128 times. I have officiated at 11 weddings and held 3 funerals. I have visited each church several times and have held 5 annual meetings. I have held 2 revivals and was privileged to attend the District Superintendent's Conference in Indianapolis, Ind. As a member of the Eastern Pilgrim College school board, I have attended 2 meetings. For the Eastern Pilgrim College and in the interest of Rees Hall, I traveled for one week end and raised \$1,700 in cash and pledges.

For my services, I have received 3000.00 in cash, and parsonage rent from the Department of Church Extension. The District parsonage utilities were supplied by the district.

Capital District Conference Ways and Means Committee Report

Be it resolved that the District Budget for 1955-56 be raised as follows:

- 1. Each church in the District shall pay to the District treasurer 5% of all offerings received by the church except those offerings designated for a specific purpose or activity (other than the local church) such as: missions, Church Extension, Sunday School Extension (Rally Day), colleges, and District projects.
- 2. All regular offerings of the church, tithes, (building fund offerings) Sunday School and Young Peoples offerings shall be subject to this assessment.
- 3. Two per cent (2%), of 2/5 of this budget, shall be credited by the District Treasurer to the District Revolving Fund.
- 4. The remainder of the budget shall be credited to the District General Fund, for use as required for District Administration.
- 5. All offerings received at District rallies, conferences, and other meetings shall be credited to the District General Fund unless otherwise specifically designated or directed by the District Council.
- 6. The District budget shall be paid to the District treasurer by the 10th day of the following month.

CONFERENCE RUTES

Standing Rules

1. Time of District Camp

The Annual District Camp Meeting will be held over a ten day period including the fourth of July.

2. Pastors! Vacation

Each church is encouraged to give their paster a two weeks? vacation.

3. Work program for District Camp Grounds

The District Council shall determine the number of man hours required to prepare the grounds for camp meeting, and that each year the council request each shursh to supply an equal share of man hours to complete the works

General resolutions

1. Time of District Youth Meetings

The third Friday of each month shall be reserved for District youth rallies and functions. This is subject to change if conflicts should arise.

2. District Minutes

Whereas the District Minutes are a very important record to the church.

Be it resolved:

That the editing committee meet and have its work complete by June 30, each year.

3. District Parsonage Work Program

Whereas economy is necessary to all of our work in the Capital District.

Be it resolved:

That the District Superintendent with the pastors and other ministers organize a work program to build a District Parsonage.

4. District Evangelistic Team.

Whereas the Scriptures teach us in the words of Christ to "Go into all the world and preach the Gospel", and inasmuch as God has blessed us with an abundant talent, both ministerial and musical.

Be it resolved:

That the District Superintendent organize an evangelistic team to be used in the organizing of new churches.

Ways and Meaner Resolution

1. District Budget

Be it resolved, that the District Budget shall be raised as follows:

a. Each church in the District shall pay to the District

treasury 5% of all offerings received by the church

- d. The remainder of the budget shall be credited to the District General Fund, for use as required for District administration.
- e. All offerings received at the District Rallies, conferences and other meetings of the District shall be credited to the District General Fund unless otherwise specifically designated or directed by the District Council.

f. The District Budget shall be paid to the District by the

10th day of the following month.
