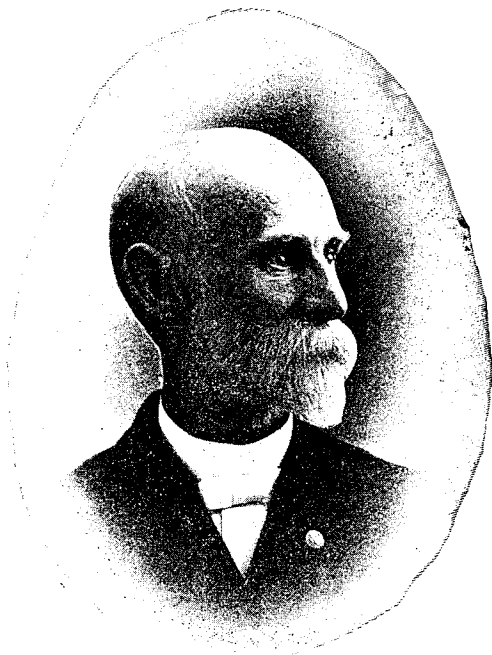

PROCEEDINGS OF THE TENTH ANNUAL ASSEMBLY,
CALIFORNIA DISTRICT

FIRST SITTING, JUNE 7, 1932, 9:30 A. M.

June 7, 1932, 9:30 A. M.

The Tenth Annual Assembly of the California District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in Pasadena, Calif., June 7th, 1932, with General Superintendent, Seth C. Rees presiding. The devotional song service was followed by Scripture quotations and prayer by Rev. J. P. Coleman, senior elder. After prayer, the assembly joined in singing Amazing Grace. God's rich blessing accompanied the singing of this old hymn.

Moved and supported that P. W. Thomas, General Secretary, act as secretary pro tem. Carried.

Roll call followed, with 60 persons answering to the call.

Moved and supported the first 5 rows of seats on each side of the church be designated as the Assembly Bar. Carried.

Moved and supported the following be given seat in the Assembly Bar: Paul Elliott, John Orkney.

Rev. Frieberg, of Salvation Army in Australia, was introduced and given seat in the Conference bar.

Rev. Graham, of Philadelphia, was introduced and given a seat in the Conference bar.

Moved and supported that the chairman appoint a nominating committee of three members. Carried.

The following were named on the nominating committee: O. R. Sickler, John Edwards, Mrs. Edna Neff.

Moved that the closing hour be set at 11:55 A. M. and the opening hour be set at 9:00 A. M. Motion lost.

By common consent the hours set for the morning session are 9:30 to 11:55 o'clock.

Moved and supported to set the afternoon meeting hours from 2:00 o'clock to 4:30, when an afternoon meeting is necessary. Carried.

The following announcement was made relative to the meal hours: Breakfast, 7:00 o'clock, luncheon 12:15, and supper, 5:30 o'clock.

District Superintendent W. R. Cain gave his annual report.

Moved and supported that the report be accepted. Carried.

Moved and supported that we dispense with the usual order of hearing the various individual statistical reports and have oral reports from our ministers inasmuch as the statistical reports appear in our printed minutes. Carried.

The pastors reported as follows:

W. H. Neff, pastor First Pilgrim Holiness Church, Pasadena, reported some gain in church and Sunday school, with all financial obligations paid in full, and the blessing of the Lord attending the services.

Moved and supported the report be accepted. Carried.

Sister Hollowell, pastor at Sierra Madre, reported victory in the midst of struggles with a small group and difficult financial conditions, but with some real spiritual work accomplished.

Moved and seconded the report be accepted. Carried.

Moved and supported pastors be given 3 minutes, and the unstationed ministers 2 minutes in which to make reports. Carried.

The following reports continued:

Rev. Steelhead, of San Diego, reported in Assembly for first time in several years. He stated he found a great open door in San Diego, and that at the present time the tide is rising. Moved and supported the report be accepted. Carried.

PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH

Rev. Scofield, of Keno, Oregon, reported great blessing among the "lumber jacks" in Oregon, and is very grateful for the prayers and fellowship of the saints.

Moved and supported his report be accepted. Carried.

Rev. George Wise, of East Pasadena, reported some improvement in his work, and the blessing of the Lord attending the services.

Moved and supported the report be accepted. Carried.

Rev. Palmer, of Alta Loma, reported finding some gracious saints on his charge, and that the work has been marked by real miracles of God's grace in revival. He also praised the Lord for sending a missionary to the Philippine Islands this past year.

Moved and supported the report be accepted. Carried.

Rev. F. D. Cook, of Ventura, reported having been on the charge a year, with great blessing on his own soul. Although some unusual difficulties arose, due to the closing of the oil fields, God has met with them and some souls have been won to the Lord.

Moved and supported the report be accepted. Carried.

Rev. Hugh Elliott, of Rialto, reported the best year of his life. Some gain in membership and the blessing of the Lord on the struggling church at Rialto. He gratefully acknowledged the help given them by the Pasadena First Church.

Moved and supported the report be accepted. Carried.

Rev. Andrus, of Olinda, reported for the first time and praised the Lord for his blessings in the work at Olinda.

Moved and supported the report be accepted. Carried.

Rev. Gilliam, of Medford, Oregon, reports for a new church organized less than a year ago. Organized with 15 members and have added 12 more during the year.

Moved and supported the report be accepted. Carried.

Meeting adjourned by expiration of time.

The session was dismissed with prayer by Rev. Blake.

SECOND SITTING, WEDNESDAY, JUNE 7TH

Second sitting opened at 9:30 A. M. Wednesday, June 7th, with Chairman Seth C. Rees in chair.

After singing, the scripture was read by Rev. J. P. Coleman.

Rev. and Mrs. Weaver of Klamath Falls, presented.

Minutes of the previous sitting read and approved.

Rev. J. W. Henry, of the Nazarene Church, was presented and welcomed into our midst.

Moved and supported that he be given a seat within the Assembly bar. Carried.

Moved and supported they be accepted. Carried.

Mrs. Hepler welcomed and granted a seat in the Assembly bar.

Rev. Paul Thomas, the General Secretary-Treasurer of the Pilgrim Church, then brought the assembly an inspirational address, presenting some aspects of the General work of our church, laying stress on some of the essentials to organization; such as (a) need of well defined ob-

jectives, (b) need of recognized central authority, (c) need of faithful observance of instructions. He also presented the assembly with some facts regarding the subscription list of the Advocate and the General Budget.

We then proceeded with business.

FOURTH SITTING, JUNE 9TH, 9:30 A. M.

Devotional exercises in charge of Rev. Hugh C. Elliott, after congregational singing, 1st Cor. 13 chapter was read, then all joined in singing, "Love Divine All Love Excelling."

Reading of minutes of previous meeting. Approved.

After reading of minutes, Bro. Rees addressed the Assembly on the subject: "Fundamentals and Standards of the Pilgrim Holiness Church," which was very instructive and helpful to all.

Tellers named by Brother Cain: Paul Elliott, Stanley Weber, G. F. Tyrrell, and Alexander Kraig.

Moved and supported that Mrs. Marvian Gilliam being a licensed minister, be accepted into the Assembly bar. z

After a few minutes of silent prayer, the Assembly then proceeded to vote, with the following results:

SIXTH SITTING, JUNE 10TH, 9:30 A. M.

Superintendent Rees in the chair.

Brother Ernest Albright in charge of the devotional exercises. Opening song: "Crown Him Lord of All." Scripture reading, 11th Psalm.

Special song by Sister Dixon, "Dig Deep Until You Strike the Rock." Prayer by Brother Troyer.

Following prayer, Brother Coleman was anointed and prayed with for healing.

Minutes of previous sitting read and approved.

Brother Rees gives words of encouragement in regard to the feeling of tenderness and fellowship among the Brethren at this Assembly, acknowledging the power of The Holy Ghost to untangle problems that it is impossible for man to do.

Rev. Wills of the Holiness Church introduced to the Assembly and given a seat within the Assembly bar.

Brother Neff, chairman of the committee on resolutions, submits additional resolutions to the Assembly which were adopted. (See reports on resolutions.)

At this time our Senior Elder Brother Coleman, expresses appreciation and love for faithfulness and sacrifices made to be with us in this Assembly, and in response Brother Rees expresses appreciation for cooperation and fellowship of the Brethren throughout the Assembly.

Resolution given by Brother Steelhead in regard to the matter of setting the date of our next District Assembly. Discussed and withdrawn.

Report of Foreign Missionary Board given and accepted. (See reports.)

Statistical committee reports and their report accepted.

Moved that minutes of this Assembly be printed, and as to number be referred to District Council, after which the following churches stated amounts each would take: Medford, Oregon, 10; Fresno, 6; Elsinore, 10; San Diego, 10; Keno, 5; Brother Edwards, 10; Sierra Madre, 4; Klamath Falls, 5; Ventura, 5; East Los Angeles, 10; East Pasadena, 5; Alta Loma, 5; Pasadena First Church, 75; Brother Coleman, 10.

Moved and supported that the expense of our District Secretary be paid.

Moved and supported that an offering be taken for expenses of buying stationery, postage, etc., amount of \$7.97 taken at this time.

Educational and Examining Boards continue their reports. Accepted.

Moved that 40 cents be charged for minutes of this Assembly. All above amount of printing of same to go to District Secretary to defray his expenses. Carried.

Moved and supported that District Superintendent appoint a committee of three to handle the editing of the minutes. Brother Paul Elliott, Brother Palmer and Brother Edwards, appointed.

Moved that each pastor upon returning home, take a special offering to cover deficit in District Superintendent's support for past year. Carried.

Motion amended that this Sunday morning an offering be taken at Pasadena First Church, as a district offering to meet a part of this amount.

Substitute motion that all pastors get together now, and each assume an amount sufficient to cover the deficit in former superintendent's support. Carried.

After conference motion presented to amend first motion made to the effect that each pastor return to their churches and within the next two weeks take a love offering to make up as much as possible on the salary of our former District Superintendent. Carried.

Account of expiration of time, motion to extend time for business. Carried.

Brother Edwards, present District Superintendent, makes a short talk.

Assembly closed by all gathering around the Altar, hearing words of exhortation and comfort from General Superintendent. All joined in singing "Blest Be the Tie that Binds," and Assembly closed with prayer by Brother Rees.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Tenth Annual District Assembly of the California District, we respectfully submit the following brief and comprehensive report. It is with profound gratitude to God and His faithful children that we can exclaim, VICTORY by faith through the blood of Christ. In a multiplicity of ways we have been kept exceedingly busy the past nine months and chiefly concerning the welfare of immortal souls. Being president of the school and teaching six branches which necessitated giving fifteen hours per week, I could not visit Newberg, Medford, and Kenosha, Oregon, and Phoenix, Arizona, but kept in touch with and advised with them. Have worked continuously on the district, visiting all the other points, and with one or two exceptions held all the Quarterly Meetings, remaining in each place from one to four nights. We have traveled over 5000 miles, conducted seven revival meetings for our own Pilgrim Holiness churches as follows: First Church, Pasadena, East Pasadena, Sierra Madre, San Diego, Rialto, Ventura and Fresno. Preached 207 times, besides conducting daily chapel services in the school, dealt with approximately 225 souls, many of them praying through to definite victory, either for pardon, reclamation, or sanctification. Possibly 40 or more were healed of their physical maladies. Through the co-operation of the District Secretary, Rev. Roper, and the Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. Edwards, we added two new churches, one in Medford, Oregon, which has a present membership of 25. The other in Klamath Falls, Oregon, with a membership of 16. In addition to these there have been 25 or 30 other members added, ten of them in Fresno and six at San Diego. Others have doubtless been added to the various churches over the district. Three revival meetings on the district were conducted by Evangelist Jack Donovan, the other meeting by Brother Chas. Slater. These meetings were fraught with good results. One of the most hope-

ful signs on the district is the noticeable increase in interest and attendance in our Sunday Schools. We have especially urged the importance of Home and Foreign Missions, also our Pilgrim Holiness Advocate subscriptions. My wife has accompanied and ably assisted me in all our labors on the district. We have received from the district a total of \$416.44. If the district had not been in the throes of financial depression we could have accomplished more, for verily "there remaineth yet very much land to be possessed." My personal experience is the best I have ever enjoyed. The pastors and others on the district extended every possible courtesy and have proved again and again both their congeniality and liberality. We do not believe more earnest, tireless, sacrificing men and women could be found. May the benediction of Heaven rest upon one and all.

Knowing our work is suffering because of lack of vision among the people in general, and on account of unemployment among our men, and in order that there be no retrenchment; be it hereby resolved that a plan under God's directing hand be devised whereby the people will be awakened to their own responsibility.

We suggest that once a month there be an especially appointed meeting in behalf of missions. Furthermore, whereas our General Secretary, Brother Paul Thomas, has been urging us to hold an extra prayer service each week for the work of foreign missions, we propose that this prayer service be held at six thirty or seven P. M., just previous to the weekly prayer meeting on Wednesday night, at which time intercessory prayer shall be offered for missionary interests. We also propose that the meal on the same evening be sacrificed, and that the amount thought to be saved be set aside for missions.

Realizing the great spiritual and financial benefit to foreign missionary work by organized activity among the women within the church, we recommend that each church on our district encourage the organization of a local Womens' Foreign Missionary Society.

Therefore, let us not close our ears to the millions who are crying for the bread of life. We must meet the challenging need by PRAYER, GIVING, SENDING, AND GOING.

3.—WHEREAS: The HOLINESS Church and The Pilgrim Holiness Church are similar in Doctrinal positions, usages, interests. Be It Resolved, That this Assembly authorize the District Council to confer with them at once with reference to matters of mutual interest. Carried.

4.—WHEREAS: To avoid delay, confusion and misunderstanding, Be It Resolved, That all our ministers and Christian workers handling Church funds shall forward required amounts of money directly to District Treasurer. Carried.

5.—RESOLVED: That in order for mutual benefit and better understanding of the needs of our work, that there be held within the boundaries of the California District, two Ministerial Conventions, at which we urge all our preachers to attend. Carried.

6.—WHEREAS: A better plan has been devised for the care of District Superintendent. Be It Resolved, That the previous action that the District Superintendent be paid \$600.00 be recended. Carried.

7.—RESOLVED: That the support of the District Superintendent consist of all quarterly meeting offerings and all money raised in evangelistic meetings. Carried.

8.—RESOLVED: That we assume and pay as an apportionment to the General Budget \$800.00, same to be paid in porportion monthly. Carried.

9.—RESOLVED: That we set our Foreign Missionary Budget at \$1,200.00 and our Home Mission Budget at \$400.00; and that we have regular monthly missionary meetings. One for Foreign and one for Home Missions and yearly we shall welcome a representative from the general headquarters, at which time we shall take offerings for these essential interests. Carried.

10.—AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That we bow with graittude and thankfulness to our Heavenly Father for the recovery of our dear Sister Rees from a severe operation, that we commend her to the God of all Grace, praying for her complete restoration to health and strength. Resolve: That we extend to Brother Rees our sorrowful regret that through inability she was not able to accompany him on his journey to California. Resolved: That we as a District Assembly send hearty greetings to "The best woman in the world."

11.—WHEREAS: The coming of Rev. P. W. Thomas, our General Secretary-Treasurer, has been an agreeable surprise, notwithstanding we have been gladdened and cheered with his presence.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That we are greatly obligated to him for his kindness in serving the Assembly as Secretary protem that we highly appreciate his very able and instructive address given in explanation of the workers of the General Church Board. Resolved: That we extend to him a generous and whole hearted invitation to come again, that he will always find a welcome among our people.

12.—WHEREAS: In the good providence of God we are favored again with the presence of our General Superintendent, Rev. Seth C. Rees, who, having recently returned from an Apostolic tour to the West Indian Islands and South America, bringing to us inspiring messages of the wonderful work of God among these benighted people. Therefore Be It Resolved: That we highly appreciate his wise council and impartial decisions as well as unstinted efforts to serve us in presiding over the Assembly.

RESOLVED: That we hereby pledge our prayers for the lengthening of his days of usefulness, that we extend to him a kind invitation to hold our Assembly again, and assure him a warm welcome.
