able at this writing of his acceptance.



The Conference meeting June 27th and 28th, on the Conference grounds in El Monte, heard the Dr. Melvin H. Snyder, General Superintendent of the Western Area, charge the group to a forward move in matters of spiritual life and church activity.

Rev. Joseph Fillmore was named to succeed Mr. Edward C. Bickmore, who served very efficiently for 13 years as District Secretary. fill the District Treasurer's post, Rev. P. Beck

was re-elected.

Selected to serve as advisory Councilmen were Revs. Fred Wells. C. Morgan and L. Smallev.

Dr. Deal stated in his acceptance speech that he hoped to carry on the noble work that his predecessors had done so well. Later he outlined goals for the coming year as a 10% gain in church membership, Sunday School average attendance and in youth societies' membership. He stated that he would strive this year to build up the new works started by Rev. Hamon. It would be probable that no new works would be started this year in the Home Missions field. He will aim to see several Spiritual Life Conventions held in the local churches, this year.

Sunday School Com. Reports

The Sunday School District Committee presented a gracious service on the last Saturday of camp meeting, under the direction of the Promotional Secretary, Martin F. Horine. The presentation of the program offered for the betterment of Sunday school teachers and the forwarding of the Sunday school cause was thrilling.

this fall.
