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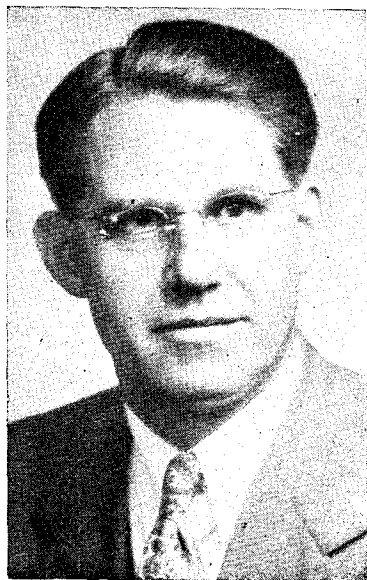

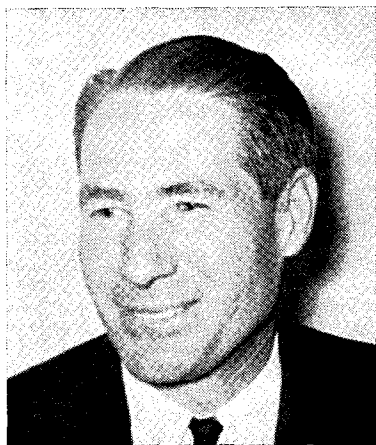

Proceedings

FIRST SITTING

The Twenty-fifth Annual Conference of the California-Arizona District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church met at El Monte, California, at 9:30 a. m., Thursday, June 26, 1947, with Rev. L. W. Sturk, our General Superintendent, in the chair.

Rev. C. A. Nicola favored the Conference with a special song. Rev. L. W. Sturk, General Superintendent, opened the devotional service, reading from the second chapter of Acts.

The roll call was taken with 84 responding from the ministerial directory and 37 from among the lay delegates.

It was moved and seconded that the first 10 rows of seats shall constitute the Conference Bar. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that Rev. Roy Morgan, District Superintendent of the Pacific North West District be granted a seat in the Conference.

It was moved and Seconded that the sessions be set for 9:00 a. m. to noon, 1:30 p. m. to 4:00 p. m., and 7:00 p. m. to 9:00 p. m.

The following ministers, coming to us from other districts or churches were received into the Conference, Thomas A. McClain, Byron E. Sallade, Milton Harrington, Doyle Dorrance, R. C. Bentley and R. C. Hines.

Rev. Spitler of the United Brethern was introduced to the Conference.

Three new churches, situated respectively at Cottonwood, Eloy, and West Phoenix, Arizona, were presented by the District Superintendent and upon motion were received into the Conference.

It was moved and carried that the District Superintendent appoint a reporter for the Conference. Rev. C. A. Nicola was appointed.

A motion carried that each stationed pastor and active evangelist be given 2 or 3 minutes for a brief verbal report of his year's work.

The following pastors reported:

Adjournment at 12:00 noon.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting of the Conference opened at 1:30 p.m. with songs of praise.

Rev. Robert Moran led in prayer. Rev. Milton Harrington sang a solo.

The Secretary proceeded with the roll call that it might be completed.

The minutes of the morning sitting were read and approved.

Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary of Home Missions, was introduced and spoke words of greeting. He introduced Rev. Roy Morgan, Superintendent of the Pacific Northwest District, who spoke briefly.

Rev. R. A. Beltz then gave an interesting report of the work in the four home missionary districts of the church, also concerning the work in Washington D. C., and among the Pueblo Indians of New Mexico.

General Superintendent L. W. Sturk led in prayer preceeding a cash offering for General Home Missions. The amount given was \$60.78.

Moved, seconded and carried that Brother E. C. Bickmore, by reason of his office as District property custodian, be seated as a member of the Conference.

The report of the Auditing committee was read and upon motion was received.

Elmer R. Hall, District Treasurer, read his report, and on motion it was received.

Bro. Elmer R. Hall was accorded a rising vote of thanks for his fourteen years of faithful service as District Treasurer.

A partial report of the Committee on Resolutions was read. (see reports)

The report of the Committee on Ways and Means was read.

The report of the Sunday School Committee was read.

FOURTH SITTING

The fourth sitting convened at 9:00 a. m. Friday, June 27, with Rev. L. W. Sturk in the chair.

Rev. William Mays led the Conference in singing "Heavenly Sunlight".

Bro. M. T. Buflin led in prayer.

Rev. Charles Slater sang the song "The Open Window" to the enjoyment of all.

The devotions were conducted by Rev. Fred K. Wells, our Assistant District Superintendent, reading from the second chapter of Acts, and emphasizing our need of Pentecost today.

Our District Superintendent commended Brother Wells to the churches of the district for revival meetings and missionary conventions.

Upon motion the roll call was dispersed with.

The minutes of the third sitting were read and approved.

FIFTH SITTING

The fifth sitting opened at 1:30 p. m. by singing the song "He Adides" led by Rev. William Mays.

Rev. L. W. Sturk spoke to the Conference concerning the Ministerial Benefit Plan.

The minutes of the morning sitting were read and approved.

The chair called for the report of the District Superintendent, and any other business which should necessarily precede the election of officers.

The Resolutions Committee presented resolution regarding the Pcard of Trustees. A motion carried that resolution No. 17 on page 14 of the 1946 Conference minutes be

rescinded.

Resolution No. 20. Adopted.

Upon motion, the District Superintendent appointed the Board of Tellers. The following were appointed: Scribe: E. C. Bickmore; Tellers: D. W. Brown, W. C. Mays F. T. Benner, and R. W. Josey.

Rev. John Kiehl led the Conference to the throne of grace in prayer for Divine direction in the election of officers.

A motion to rescind the action limiting the bar of the Conference to the first ten rows of seats was made and seconded. Carried.

Upon motion the bar of the Conference was set as the first six rows of seats.

The Conference proceeded to the election of the District Superintendent. Rev. George A. Moran was reelected.

Rev. Moran responded by accepting the office of Superintendent.

The Conference proceeded to the election of the Assistant Superintendent. Rev. Fred K. Wells was reelected.

Rev. Wells responded by accepting the office of Assistant Superintendent.

The entire Conference, by a standing vote, gave assurance to both the newly elected Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent of their whole-hearted cooperation.

A motion was made and seconded that the sitting be continued till 6:00 p. m. Carried.

A motion was made and seconded, at the suggestion of the chair, that the Conference recess for about five minutes. Carried.

The Reception Committee introduced Rev. S. H. Erwin, Nazarene minister from La Crescenta, to the Conference.

The Conference proceeded to the election of the District Secretary. Rev. Donald R. Washburn was reelected.

Rev. Moran introduced Rev. M. C. Kettle, one of our Camp Meeting Evangelists to the Conference. Upon motion Rev. Kettle was granted a seat within the Conference bar.

The Conference proceeded to the election of the District Treasurer. The Secretary read the nomination of the District Council: E. C. Bickmore. A motion was made and carried unanimously that we ratify the nomination of the Council.

Upon motion the Conference proceeded to the election of the three additional members of the District Council, the tellers to count the ballots after adjournment. Carried.

A motion prevailed that the three names be placed on the ballot.

The sitting was adjourned at 5:00 p. m. with prayer by Rev. Charles Slater.

SIXTH SITTING

The sixth sitting of the Conference opened at 7:00 p. m. with Rev. William Mays leading the congregation in singing "The Lily of the Valley". Rev. Fred K. Wells led in prayer.

The minutes of the last sitting were read and approved as amended.

The results of the balloting on the three council members were as follows: Rev. E. R. Hall was elected. Upon motion the following four names were retained for the second ballot: Bros. Dooley, Morgan, Beck, and Benner.

Bro. Beck declined the nomination, and the name of D. Wayne Brown was added in his place.

By request of the Superintendent the Council was dismissed to meet in the Council room.

The report of the tellers was given on the election of the remaining two members of the Council. Rev. J. M. Dooley and Rev. Clifford Morgan were elected.

A motion prevailed that this Conference ratify the following action of the General

Board: Whereas the general budget of \$3.00 per member falls far short of meeting the Foreign Missionary, Home Missionary and General Administrative expense, and whereas the general conference failed to make any provision for same, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we ask our District Conferences to pass a resolution providing for the increase of our missionary budget to \$3.00 per member, same to be divided \$2.00 for Foreign Missions, 1.00 for home missions, and that an additional \$1.00 per member be raised separately from missions for General Administrative Expense".

Rev. and Mrs. William Rugh sang a beautiful duet. Rev. William Mays led the Congregation in singing, "A charge to Keep I Have."

The council returned and the secretary was asked to read the names of the candidates for ordination. The following names were read:

A motion was made and seconded that the time of the sitting be extended to 10:30 p. m. Motion lost.

A substitute motion prevailed to continue the sitting to 10:00 p. m.

Upon suggestion of the chair the Conference recessed for a few minutes.

The Council presented the following nominees: For the Examining Board; Rev. M. Dooley and Rev. H. J. Olsen. Rev. H. J. Olsen was elected.

To fill the unexpired 2 year term of Ray W. Chamberlain on the Educational Board; William H. Neff and Clifford Thomas. Clifford Thomas was elected.

For a three year term on the Educational Board, Alex Krag and Rev. Thomas Lee Bro. Krag was elected.

A motion was made and seconded from the floor that the Secretary cast a unanimous ballot for the first three incumbents on the Board of Trustees. E. C. Bickmore, W. L. Troyer, and M. T. Bufkin, for a three year term.

CONFERENCE SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 25th annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in session at El Monte, California, June 27th 1947, greetings!

We have had one year of blessed unity and fellowship and no storms have arisen of sufficient intensity to mar our matrimonial bliss. Last year we stated that real unity does not depend on wearing the same label and subscribing to the same set of doctrinal principles; these are earthly things and may or may not be of the Spirit. For example the atonement is a fundamental doctrine to be subscribed to but never yet has doctrine been able to realize oneness—unity is only obtainable on the basis of experience wrought by the power of the Holy Spirit—this is heavenly and effectual and we have proven that the virtue and power of the blood of Christ is sufficient against all the fiery darts of the enemy.

New Churches. We further stated that we trusted that God would grant that we as a united body want to be of greater usefulness in the gospel ministry, and if we were to be successful as He counts success, then we must be a holy people—separated from the world unto God in loving fellowship and service for Him. This must have been true least in part for to this union has been born triplets—three healthy, bouncing baby churches have been added to the church this year. Cottonwood with a small but enthusiastic group of saints, with Rev. and Mrs. Walter O'Harra as the pastors; West Phoenix has a charter membership of 16, Rev. R. C. Hines is the pastor; and Eloy Arizona with a membership of 10 and a new church building. Rev. Byron Sallade is the pastor.

Spiritual Manifestations. We are glad to report that there are indications of

the presence of the Spirit of God in our churches. Not only does this apply to the occasional shout in camp and other spiritual demonstrations, but the out pouring of the Spirit in unusual ways in salvation. Let me give you an example or two; on one occasion a young lady stood up weeping and saying, "I am crying because of my sins and don't know what to do". That night four were converted. And again, one of our pastors had the privilege of leading a lady to Christ who is over 76 years of age, these are wonderful manifestations of the power of the Spirit of God.

Numerical Growth. We will show approximately a 16% gain in members and a 25% gain in Sunday School attendance.

Finances. We are showing an all time high financial gain according to the \$5,000 dollars shown on the treasurer report. Three new church buildings have been added and one new parsonage.

Missionary Work. We have organized the Filipino work in Pasadena into a missionary meeting every Sunday afternoon with the emphasis on missionary work in the Philippine Islands, and also an evangelistic effort to reach the Filipinos in this area.

Press. The print shop has been operating for several months and since the first month has been more than paying its way. A new press is on order and will be delivered about the middle of August.

Youth. Our young people have a heart to follow the Lord and support the work of the Pilgrim Church. The fall convention of last year, with 185 young people in attendance, was a real spiritual success and the Young People's Committee has been responsible for profitable zone rallies this year and are manifesting a real interest in the Conference and Camp Meeting.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

(1)

Be it resolved that the distribution of the 10% tithe of the local church offerings be revised as follows:

- 20% for General Budget
- 25% for Conference Expense
- 55% for Conference Superintendent

(2)

Be it resolved that the assessment for the General Conference Expense be fifteen cents (15c) per member per year.

Be it resolved that the following items be paid out of the Conference Expense Fund.

Where-as the revised plan of paying our Conference Superintendent a stated salary may leave a small surplus: therefore, be it resolved that this surplus be transferred to Conference Expense Fund as needed.

Resolved that before Licensed or Ordained Ministers, coming from other Churches shall be received into the local churches, that the pastor shall consult with the Conference Superintendent and Council regarding said Minister.

(9)

We recommend that each self-supporting Church put forth a home missionary campaign and try to establish at least one new church.

(10)

Whereas it is already our practice to alternate our Home and Foreign Missionary offerings throughout the year, We recommend that the months of August, October, December, February, April and June be designated as our Home Missionary offering months.

(11)

Resolved that we have a Camp Meeting Association with membership dues of \$1.00 per year, and that our Conference Superintendent present this Association to the people on his first visit to every church in the Conference, and get as many members as possible.

(12)

It is recommended that the Conference create the office of Conference Sunday School Secretary, which person is to be nominated by the Conference Sunday School Committee, the nomination to be ratified by the Conference Council, and said secretary shall be an ex-officio member and responsible to the Sunday School Committee.

(13)

Be it resolved that all plans for the construction or remodeling of church buildings be presented to a committee on which there shall be an architect, a builder, and a financier for their suggestions.

(14)

Whereas the stress and strain of the times in which we live are such as to tax the strength of the busy pastors of our conference, be it resolved that each church of the Conference give their pastor a two weeks' vacation with pay.

(15)

Whereas our Conference is scattered geographically, be it resolved that the Conference Superintendent edit a Conference Bulletin, to be published monthly at the expense of the Conference.

(16)

Resolved that when recommendation for credentials is presented to the Conference the candidate be present, or send a written testimony to accompany the recommendation.

(17)

Whereas the devastating influence of the liquor traffic in America is gaining such momentum, Be it resolved our church and ministry take a more militant stand against the sale of same.

(18)

Resolved that an offering be taken when Conference Minutes are distributed at the various churches that will be equivalent to the amount of 15c per copy.

(19)

Be it resolved that the conference council and all committees meet for final preparation on the Wednesday preceeding conference; and that the annual conference convene on the Thursday and Friday preceeding camp meeting; and that the Conference Young People's Society conduct its annual business meeting and hold its annual election and installation of the officers on the Saturday following Conference; and camp meeting begin on the Sunday following the Young People's Conference continuing for eight days.

(20)

Be it resolved that our Conference Superintendent appoint an editing committee comprised of the Conference Secretary and one or two other members to edit and publish our Conference Minutes in order to expedite publishing of same.

(21)

Inasmuch as the Ministerial Directory in the Conference Minutes does not differentiate between missionaries in foreign lands and ministers in the homeland, therefore, be it resolved that in the future these be shown in two separate lists.

(22)

Be it resolved that the necessary data for the General Statistician be placed in our Conference Minutes.

(23)

Be it resolved that the 6:30 p.m. service of the Conference Camp be devoted to a young people's service, to be arranged for by the Young People's Council.

(24)

Be it resolved that the Conference Superintendent be given a month's vacation with pay.

Resolutions Concerning Certain Financial Obligations

(25)

Resolved that ten per cent of church offerings after deducting Building Fund, rent for church or payment for purchase of church building, be sent to Conference Treasurer.

(26)

Resolved that each member pay the amount of \$1.50 to the support of the Conference Superintendent per year.

(27)

Resolved that the Sunday School, Birthday and Thank Offerings be used for Conference Home Missions.

(28)

Resolved that 10% of Sunday school offerings be sent to the Conference Treasurer.

(29)

All assessments are based on total membership with exceptions provided for regularly engaged christian workers on the church roll who are in active missionary evangelistic work elsewhere. In no case is this exemption to exceed 10% of total reported membership.

(30)

Be it resolved that the "Pilgrim News" be placed on a subscription basis.
