

CONFERENCE SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 25th annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in session at El Monte, California, June 27th 1947, greetings!

We have had one year of blessed unity and fellowship and no storms have arisen of sufficient intensity to mar our matrimonial bliss. Last year we stated that real unity does not depend on wearing the same label and subscribing to the same set of doctrinal principles; these are earthly things and may or may not be of the Spirit. For example the atonement is a fundamental doctrine to be subscribed to but never yet has doctrine been able to realize oneness—unity is only obtainable on the basis of experience in-wrought by the power of the Holy Spirit—this is heavenly and effectual and we have proven that the virtue and power of the blood of Christ is sufficient against all the fiery darts of the enemy.

We further stated that we trusted that God would grant that we New Churches. as a united body want to be of greater usefulness in the gospel ministry, and if we were to be successful as He counts success, then we must be a holy people—separated from the world unto God in loving fellowship and service for Him. This must have been true least in part for to this union has been born triplets-three healthy, bouncing baby churches have been added to the church this year. Cottonwood with a small but enthusastic group of saints, with Rev. and Mrs. Walter O'Harra as the pastors; West Phoenix has a charter membership of 16, Rev. R. C. Hines is the pastor; and Eloy Arizona with a membership of 10 and a new church building. Rev. Byron Sallade is the

Spiritual Manifestations. We are glad to report that there are indications of

the presence of the Spirit of God in our churches. Not only does this apply to the occasional shout in camp and other spiritual demonistrations, but the out pouring of the Spirit in unusual ways in salvation. Let me give you an example or two; on one occasion a your glady stood up weeping and saying, "I am crying because of my sins and don't know v hat to do". That hight four were converted. And again, one of our pastors had the pri flege of leading a lady to Christ who is over 76 years of age, these are wonderful manifestations of the power of the Spirit of God.

Numerical Growth. We will show approximately a 16% gain in members and a 25% gain in Sunday School attendance.

Finances. We are showing an all time high financial gain according to the 35,000 dollars shown on the treasurer report. Three new church buildings have been added and one new parsonage.

Missionary Work. We have organized the Filipino work in Pasadena into a missionary neeting every Sunday afternoon with the emphasis on missionary work in the Philipine Islands, and also an evangelistic effort to reach the Filipinos in this area.

Press. The print shop has been operating for several months and since the first month has been more than paying its way. A new press is on order and will be delivered about the middle of August.

Youth. Our young people have a heart to follow the Lord and support the work of the Pilgrim Church. The fall convention of last year, with 185 young people in attendance, was a real spiritual success and the Young People's Committee has been responsible for profitable zone rallies this year and are manifesting a real interest in the Conference and Camp Meeting. Be it resolved that the District Conference recommend to the Idaho-Washington and Pacific Northwest District that they elect their members to the School Board as follows: one for two years and one for four years, and that at the expiration of their tenure of office that the subsequent elections shall be for a full four year term of office.

(13)

Be it resolved that the Superintendents of the three Conferences be additional members of the School Board for the first year and that the other Conferences be so notified.

(14)

Be it resolved that all subsequent elections to the School Board shall be on the following basis: the District Council shall be the nominating committee. The School Board may submit to the council a list of names they recommend for said election. Such nominees to be voted upon by the Annual Conference.

(15)

Be it resolved that all the camp-ground property used by the school shall remain the property of the California-Arizona Conference and shall be leased to the School Board as here-to-fore on a yearly basis.

(16)

Be it resolved that the School Board, to formulate school policy, shall have at least two meetings during the school year and that the administration of the School be delegated to the Executive Committee of said Board in cooperation with the President of the School. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President of the School Board, the Vice-President, the Secretary and the Treasurer, the same to be duly elected by the School Board.

(17)

Whereas Miss Othelia Bach having faithfully served H. E. I. for the past fourteen years, and whereas she having made application to our General Foreign Missionary Board for educational service on the Foreign Field, and whereas she having tendered her resignation as President of H. E. I., therefore, be it resolved that this Conference petition the General Board to use their good offices to place Miss Bach in the field to which she feels God is calling her.

(18)

Be it resolved that the Conference send a representative to the other Conferences of the School Zone to promote the interests of P. E. I.

(19)

Be it resolved that the new School Board shall take off ce when the members of said board have been elected by the respective Conferences and have met to organize.

(20)

Be it resolved that the Board of trustees be enlarged to seven members, 3 to be elected for 3 years, 2 for 2 years 2 for 1 year, and at the expiration of their term of office the election shall be for a full 3 year term.

(22)

Be it resolved that the local churches pay the traveling expenses and entertainmen of their delegates for the Conference business sessions. This does not include Camp Meeting.

(23)

Be it resolved that the local churches pay the traveling expenses and room rent of their pastor for the Conference and Camp.

(24)

Be it resolved that the various standing committees gather their material during the year and forward their resolutions to the District Office 30 days before Conference printing and distribution to the Conference delegates.

(25)

Be it resolved that the Conference establish an office and share secretarial expense with the California Pilgrim Publishers.

(26)

Whereas the Pacific Northwest and Idaho-Washington I istricts are now represented in our Bible school zone, therefore be it resolved that they he advised of the action taken by this Conference concerning the school and that they be asked to take action at their next Conference, and develop some plan to assist with the financing of the school.

(27)

Whereas there is a great need for 5,000 quarts of canned fruit for the school, therefore be it resolved that the churches pledge during this Conference and Can p to give as much as possible to this need.

(28)

Be it resolved that the Conference send greetings to Bro. A. L. Whiting.

Be it resolved that the Conference send greetings to the wife of our former General Superintendent, Mrs. Seth C. Rees.

(30)

Whereas Rev. F. W. Henry has faithfully served the Conference for a number of years and whereas he has accepted a church on another District and will be leaving us, therefore be it resolved that we give him a rising vote of appreciation for his labors among us.

(31)

Be it resolved that this Conference give its presiding efficer, General Superintendent Rev. L. W. Sturk, a rising vote of thanks for his labor of love among us.

(32)

Inasmuch as we have been so graciously entertained during this Conference, he it resolved that this Conference give the cooks, dinning room and kitchen help, dishwashers and custodians a rising vote of appreciation for their untiling efforts to make it a comfortable camp.

(33)

Be it resolved that resolution No. 5 on page 13 of the 1946 Minutes be deleted.

RESOLUTIONS IN EFFECT FROM PREVIOUS CONFERENCES

(1)

Be it resolved that all conference rulings regulating the financial affairs of the conference be brought forward and spread on the pages of the Minutes.

(2

Be it resolved that the emphasis being placed on the work among the children of the Sunday schools shall not be lessened but that a greater stress shall be placed on the work among our young married folk and adults, thus building into our Sunday school program a definite place for the family as a complete unit.

(3)

We recommend that our Conference Superintendent or his Assistant shall, when possible, conduct Quarterly Meetings at each church, at which time he shall preach a gospel sermon and administer the sacraments.

(4)

We recommend that, Whereas we now have a standing Statistical Committee to function during the Conference Year, Be it resolved that all reports be made in full and sent to the Statistical Committee not later than one week before the Conference date.

(5)

Resolved that since some of our Churches seem to have no definite system of raising their General, Conference and Local expenses, therefore be it resolved that each Church adopt the Budget System and make an effort to raise the same.

(6)

Resolved that no Pastor employ an evangelist without the endorsement of the Conference Superintendent.

(7

Resolved that love offering be taken monthly for the Pastor of each Church, and that the delegate see that this is done.

(8)

Resolved that before Licensed or Ordained Ministers, coming from other Churches shall be received into the local churches, that the pastor shall consult with the Conference Superintendent and Council regarding said Minister.

(9)

We recommend that each self-supporting Church put forth a home missionary campaign and try to establish at least one new church.

(10)

Whereas it is already our practice to alternate our Home and Foreign Missionary offerings throughout the year, We recommend that the months of August, October, December, February, April and June be designated as our Home Missionary offering months.

(11)

Resolved that we have a Camp Meeting Association with membership dues of \$1.00 per year, and that our Conference Superintendent present this Association to the people on his first visit to every church in the Conference, and get as many members as possible.

(12)

It is recommended that the Conference create the office of Conference Sunday School Secretary, which person is to be nominated by the Conference Sunday School Committee, the non-ination to be ratified by the Conference Council, and said secretary shall be an ex-officio men.ber and responsible to the Sunday School Committee.

(13)

Be it resolved that all plans for the construction or remodeling of church buildings bi presented to a committee on which there shall be an architect, a builder, and a financier for their suggestions.

(14)

Whereas the stress and strain of the times in which we live are such as to tax the strength of the busy pastors of our conference, be it resolved that each church of the Conference give their pastor a two weeks' vacation with pay.

(15)

Whereas our Conference is scattered geographically, be it resolved that the Conference Superintendent edit a Conference Bulletin, to be published monthly at the expense of the Conference.

(16)

Resolved that when recommendation for credentials is presented to the Conference the candidate be present, or send a written testimony to accompany the recommendation.

(17)

Whereas the devastating influence of the liquor traffic in America is gaining such momentum, Be it resolved our church and ministry take a more militant stand against the sale of same.

(18)

Resolved that an offering be taken when Conference Minutes are distributed at the various churches that will be equivalent to the amount of 15c per copy.

(19)

Be it resolved that the conference council and all committees meet for final preparation on the Wednesday preceeding conference; and that the annual conference convene on the Thursday and Friday preceeding camp meeting; and that the Conference Young People's Society conduct its annual business meeting and hold its annual election and installation of the officers on the Saturday following Conference; and camp meeting begin on the Sunday following the Young People's Conference continuing for eight days.

(20)

Be it resolved that our Conference Superintendent appoint an editing committee comprised of the Conference Secretary and one or two other members to edit and publish our Conference Minutes in order to expedite publishing of same.

(21)

Inasmuch as the Ministerial Directory in the Conference Minutes does not differentiate between missionaries in foreign lands and ministers in the homeland, therefore, be it resolved that in the future these be shown in two separate lists.

(22)

Be it resolved that the necessary data for the General Statistician be placed in our Conference Minutes.

(23)

Be it resolved that the 6:30 p.m. service of the Conference Camp be devoted to a young people's service, to be arranged for by the Young People's Council.

(24)

Be it resolved that the Conference Superintendent be given a month's vacation with pay.

Resolutions Concerning Certain Financial Oblications

(25)

Resolved that ten per cent of church offerings after deducting Building Fund, rent for church or payment for purchase of church building, be sent to Conference Treasurer.

(26)

 $_{eff}$ -Resolved that each member pay the amount of \$1.50 to the support of the Conference Superintendent per year.

(27)

Resolved that the Sunday School, Birthday and Thank Offerings be used for Conference Home Missions.

(28)

Resolved that 10% of Sunday school offerings be sent to the Conference Treasurer.

(29)

All assessments are based on total membership with exceptions provided for regularly engaged christian workers on the church roll who are in active missionary evangelistic work elsewhere. In no case is this exemption to exceed 10% of total reported membership.

(30)

Be it resolved that the "Pilgrim News" be placed on a subscription basis.
