EASLEY, SOUTH CAROLINA

July 17, 1965

The first sitting of the Annual Conference of the Atlantic-Southeast District of Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 10:30 A.M., July 17, at the Easley, South Carolina Church.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Given to the Atlantic Southeast District Conference

July 17, 1965

A WORD OF GREETING:

As christians we are gathered together in the name "That is above every name". This immediately makes our meeting together worthwhile, even though our primary concerns and interests are those of administration, it is always right that christian leaders sanctify their deliberations by the firm conviction that "We are labourers together with God".

This is an age that demands leadership with courage. No battle was ever won by people who merely wept because of tragedy. However, the victory belongs to those who are willing to take up the battle standard and fight in the forefront. This is the type of spirit that God chooses to bless and will make most useful.

The fine leadership that is continually being manifested by the pastors of this district is revealed in the steady growth of our churches numerically and spiritually. Especially, has this leadership revealed itself in the attitude toward the many problems that faces small churches today. Many times these problems can only be met by deliberately seeming to take one step backward in order to take two steps forward.

It is essential that every church undertake frequent check-ups in order to remain healthy. In order to maintain a healthy church we must have a willingness to recognize symptons of weakness before the church develops a spiritual "hardening of the arteries". It requires facing up to realities and many times a sustained corrective action.

Waiting things out or holding doggedly to the old order of things will not strengthen our churches for the future.

We can determine whether our churches have--or is headed for--unhealthy rigidity and we can prepare the way for treatment by asking ourselves four questions:

- 1. What are the symptoms?
- 2. Where does the ailment originate?
- 3. How bad is it?
- 4. How can we get back our churches good health?

Many times when there is a tendency in our church to choke off new ideas, and seek the status quo, or perhaps some past experience of glory, it could be a symptom of a more serious malady.

We find many times that the aging process has set in because of certain individuals—a rigid bureaucrat, a lone wolf operator, a dictator in his own world with policies which are not necessarily in keeping with the over—all policies of the Kingdom, or it may be the individual who maintains that it is too late in life to undertake any—thing new or different. It may be the man whose mind is clouded with prejudices or biases. Many times this person passes as a strong disciplinarian. This person is the obstructionist who damages the church by choking off ideas, plans, and decisions and by blocking the use of the talents and abilities of others. As pastor leaders we need to prayfully counsel and guide our people around these pitfalls.

To achieve any goal requires paying some price. So, it would be unrealistic to design a plan which required a price higher than the pastor or people is willing to pay. It is, also, essential that the pastor understand his plan and be prepared to do what he must do to make the plan a success. If he does not carry out his part resistance and inertia down the line will increase. In such cases it would definitely have been better never to have undertaken the plan at all.

Whenever a church is on dead center everyone looks for someone on whom to lay the blame. If we are not moving forward as we ought there is a tendency to blame Indianapolis, the wickedness of the times, the lack of spiritual descernment, and the carelessness of people. All of these together can not hold up for one instant the spiritually motivated church who is in the center of the will of God.

It is in this frame of mind that I want to say that the past four years have certainly been blessed ones. Our problems have been healthy ones and our fellowship has certainly been of the highest. The pastors have been most busy - working full time to support their families, pastoring, and preparing messages and finding time to attend promotional meetings and revivals. I never cease to be amazed at how much can be accomplished by dedicated men under the guidance and direction of the Holy Spirit. We all know that this is not the best way to build the Kingdom. However, for us, it is either this way or not go at all. Again, I say thank God for dedicated pastors, and for dedicated pastors wives and families who are only too willing to do anything in order that the Kingdom might go forward.

My report, of necessity, will be brief. In fact, it is only half a report. I certainly would not presume to lay down a program for my successor. Brother Walker will have his own plans to present and his own talents to present these plans with. Our church is certainly fortunate in having men of this caliber, able and willing, to step in when the call presents itself.

I am happy to say in conclusion that our district obligations to the general church have been met in full. I pray that the year ahead, God helping us, shall be the greatest in the history of the Atlantic Southeast District. Amen.

District Superintendent's personal report.

During the past year I have preached 109 times. I have conducted six annual meetings I have attended the board meetings at Southern Pilgrim College. I have attended the Church Leaders Conference in Indianapolis. I attended a Church Leaders Conference in Florida. I met with the pasters on several occasions and have done my best to help with the problems of the churches as they presented themselves. I supervised the construction of the parsonage at Winnsboro. We have enjoyed the fellowship of the pasters and laymen of this district. And, we have especially appreciated the ministry of Brother Hawkins at our ministerial. We are, again, grateful that we were able as a district to pay our U.S.F. in full.

I have left the Progress Reports for the pasters. I have traveled 36,000 miles in the interest of God's work. My salary has been paid in full.

STANDING RULES

- 1. Be it resolved that the Conference year shall end May 31 and that all reports and funds shall be in the hands of the district statistician and district treasurer by June 15.
 Be it further resolved that the record shall close June 30 and that the annual conference shall be held on the last Saturday in June.
- 2. Be it resolved that the district superintendent shall appoint all committees.
- 3. Be it resolved that the district council shall serve as campmeeting board and that they be responsible for the engaging of the camp workers. Be it further resolved that the date and place of the campmeeting and the names of the workers be placed in the Minutes each year.
- 4. Be it resolved that an annual ministerial convention be held, the time and place of said convention to be determined by the district council.
- 5. Be it resolved that each pastor make a monthly report of Sunday school attendance to the district Sunday school promotional secretary within 5 days following the last Sunday of the month.

 Be it further resolved that the secretary publish a news sheet showing attendance and news items of the Sunday school.
- 6. Be it resolved that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.
- 7. Be it resolved that each local church set aside one day a week for fasting and prayer.

 Be it further resolved that we pray for the leadership of the Holy Ghost in all matters and that we intercede for a revival in the churches of our district.
- 8. Be it resolved that the total amount of the district budget and United Stewardship Fund be 15% of all regular church and Sunday school offerings. That the first payment of this amount be made in July and on the first day of each month thereafter. That all funds be sent to the district treasurer by the end of April of each fiscal year.
- 9. Be it resolved that the local church treasurers balance their books at the close of each month and all district and general funds be sent to the district treasurer immediately.
- 10. Be it resolved that all monies raised for district and general interest be handled through the local and district treasurers.
- ll. Be it resolved that the executive officers of the Atlantic Southeast Conference, Pilgrim Churches be the district trustees.
- 12. Be it resolved that the first consideration concerning the support of a pastor shall be the supplying of his parsonage and full maintenance.

STANDING RULES CON'T.

Bo it further resolved that the financial condition of the church be examined quarterly concerning its ability to support the pastor.

Be it further resolved that the pastor's salary be raised consistently in keeping with the ability of the local church to pay.

Be it further resolved that the pastor be permitted to work full time until his salary reaches the amount of \$40.00 per week plus full maintenance. The pastor shall then be expected to give part time in secular employment to support of his family. This part time not to exceed 20 hours per week.

Be it further resolved that the pastor be permitted to work 20 hours per week or part time until his church support reaches the total of \$60.00 per week plus full maintenance. The pastor then shall be expected to give his full time to his calling and shall not enter into secular employment.

Be it further resolved that the local church treasurer see to it that the pastor's salary be in keeping with the ability of the local church to pay.

- 13. Be it resolved that the Conference be divided into three zones for the furtherance and benefit of the district youth program.
 - 1. Zone 1 shall consist of the Easley and Greenville churches.
 - 2. Zone 2 shall consist of Winnsboro, Columbia and Killian churches.
 - 3. Zone 3 shall consist of the Atlanta and Americus churches.

Be it further resolved that the churches in these zones be encouraged to work together for the benefit of the youth and their spiritual welfare. Be it further resolved that a quarterly meeting be held in each zone and that an annual meeting be held after the first of the year.

- 14. Be it resolved that each pastor be permitted to hold 30 days of revival effort off his charge each year.
- 15. Be it resolved that a Revolving fund be established in the Atlantic Southeast District.
 - 1. That 20% of the district tithe be placed in this fund each month.
 - 2. That this fund be held in a Savings account.
 - 3. That this fund be administered by the district council and that 3% be the rate of interest charged.
- 16. Be it resolved that each district project be organized to stand on its own financial Foundation and that district funds, if borrowed, be refunded promptly to the district treasurer.
