# FIRST SITTING

The Twelfth Annual Conference of the Alabama Northwest Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in the Magnolia Springs Pilgrim Church at 8:30 a.m., June 21, 1960.

Rev. C. A. Simmons led the congregation in singing "He Is So Precious To Me" and "Joy Unspeakable", after which Rev. and Mrs. W. O. Kirkes were presented to the conference. Rev. H. K. Huff led the conference in prayer.

Mrs. Kittle was appointed to serve on the Auditing Committee.

The statistical report was read and accepted.

The auditing committee reported verbally that the books were in order to the best of their knowledge.

The treasurer's report was read and acc accepted.

The resolutions committee gave a partial report:

Resolution No. 1---delete the last sentence to read "and one filed in records of local church". Adopted.

Resolution No. 6---delete the last clause. Adopted.

Resolution No. 11---change the wording "each visit" to read "his visit". Also to insert the word "may" after the word churches. Adopted.

Conference recessed until the 11:00 a.m. Ordination service.

The Minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

The resolutions committee again reported.

Resolution numbers 17, 18, 19, 20, 21 were

adopted. (See resolutions).

The Ways and Means Committee report was given.

Recommendation No. 3, add the words "and meals" be included. Carried.

Recommendation No. 5, deleted. Carried.

Recommended- the statistision be paid a salary of \$20.00 per year. Carried.

Recommended- penny a day program for district church extension. Carried.

Recommended- to adopt the General Board Resolution relating to the Ministerial Benefit Association. Carried.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins announced the General Board appointments of the district officers:

Conference was adjourned with prayer by Bro. Cruthirds.

### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Hawkins, Ministers of the District, lay delegate and friends: I greet you in the name of our wonderful Lord, who has called us to be saints, commanded us to preach the Gospel to every creature and assured us that we can be more than conquerors thru Him!

As we give this report to the Conference, one word has gripped our thinking, that word is "time' Time as it applies to children is seemingly exaustless and meaningless. To youth it presents unlimited possibilities and challenge. To the middle aged it's realities are first faced and appraised. To those who are older it becomes infinitely precious.

- A. In Luke 21:24 we read these sobering words, "until the times of the Gentiles shall be fulfilled. It is of course a prophetical utterance but is surrounded by unmistakable signs that we clearly understand characterizes our day.
- B. In Eph. 5:16 we read these words "redeeming the time because the days are evil". As we see the measure of iniquity and evil in the world today it should certainly help us to properly evaluate and appropriate time on an eternal basis.
- C. In II Tim. 3:1 "This know also that in the last days perilous times shall come." Mr. Moffat renders the word perilous as hard---Hard times shall come. Epitaph--"Here lies Robert Shirley, He did the best of things in the worst of times."

Assuming that we are in the LAST days, Assuming the Hard times are here, Assuming that the times of the Gentiles are Almost at an end,

Assuming that CUR time is limited, What shall be our response in our duty to God in the need of the people?

#### I. INDIVIDUALLY---C:

Can'I say I am determined to win souls? Can I say I am determined to do what God has called me to do?

Can I say I am determined to be a success!

Figure are cold hard facts yet they speak a truth. All progress starts locally and individually. Our day demands our best.

II. MATERIALLY: All of the Churches have made some improvements.

Birmingham has paid the indebtedness on their Church furniture.

Warrington has put a new roof on the parsonage and ceramic tile in the bathroom. The parsonage and put a steeple on the church.

Lynn Haven has completed a very fine parsonage with a minimum of outside finance. Rev. Huff and some of his laymen have worked untiringly to make this possible, at the same time Bro. Huff was on a very small salary. Several of our District preachers rendered valuable help on this project.

Mobile has painted the outside of their church and done some interior decorating in the parsonage.

Huntsville has completed extensive redocrating.

Magnolia Springs has done extensive redecorating on the parsonage, also inside finishing, and has added some recreational facilities to the grounds.

Selma has beautified their grouns with shrubbery and flowers, also some redecorating.

### III. SPIRITUALLY:

I feel we are in grave need of a district wide revival. We are not reaching the people!!! Consequently we are not seeing the converts. Not having converts we are not gaining members. We are an Evangelical Church depending on revival fervor rather than religious education. I know that this is a matter of great concern to all of you, and I stand ready to help you secure some good workers who are interested in Church extension work, and this without prohibitive expense. Perhaps we need to carefully review and evaluate our evangelistic efforts. In the light of the ever increasing pressure of Lay Evangelism. Lay Evangelism is the contact, the door opener but GOSPEL EVANGELISM brings the harvest ant the increase.

### IV. STATISTICALLY:

We will show a loss in some departments, some have made commendable gains, some have had regretable losses. Here again figures give no more than cold facts, some of your inheritances have resulted in your losses. Some losses may have come from a lack of preparedness, some from monotonous programs, some from lack of talent, but still they are losses, and we must correct them. Excuses are not enough. If we are called to do a task for God, we have every reason to expect Him to help us to be successful and there is no excuse for continued losses. For you or for me! The statistical reports will give us the true picture.

# V. RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Believing that we must as a District feel our responsibility in starting new Churches in this District and knowing that after 12 years of help from the General Church, we cannot expect

continued help in this department therefor; I recommend that we adopt the penny a day per member plan. All money to be used in founding new churches in this district, and that this Conference enact this legislation.

- 2. I recommend that each pastor on the District be responsible for the assigned financial obligation of the District on a monthly basis, this to be a sacred obligation on his part.
- 3. I recommend that each pastor make clear to the members of his congregation the financial plan adopted by this conference the first Sunday following this Conference.
- 4. I recommend that one prayer meeting a month be given over to praying for souls, new churches and revivals.
- 5. I further recommend that the first day of each month be known as a day of fasting and prayer, a time of soul searching as to our fervor, soul burden and consecration.

# WAYS AND MEANS RECOMMENDATIONS

#### 1. CHURCH

- A. We recommend that all money be sent to the District Treasurer not later than the tenth of each month in order that the monthly obligations might be met.
  - B. We recommend that each church pay fifty cents (.50) per member per year, the same to be applied on General Conference expenses.
  - C. We recommend that each church pay ten dollars (\$10.00) per year for the District Conference expenses. We further recommend that this amount be paid not later than sixty days prior to the Conference.

### 2. DISTRICT BUDGET.

- A. We recommend that all birthday offerings be sent to the Conference Treasurer to be applied on District Budget.
- B. We recommend that each church pay fifty cents (.50) per member per month, and that this amount be applied on District Budget.

# DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT.

- A. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid five cents per mile and meals, while traveling in the interest of the District.
- B. We further recommend that his District correspondence, communications, and utilities be paid by the Conference Treasurer.

### 4. . MINISTERIAL TITHE:

A. We recommend that all licensed and Ordained Ministers pay their Ministerial tithes to the Conference Treasurer to be applied on the District Budget.

A. We recommend that the District continue the Pilgrim Pension Plan; and that each church pay to the District Treasurer monthly four percent of the sum of their pastor's salary. (Manual, Sec. 70; Par. 1)

# 6. SALARIES

- A. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$50-00 per year for his services, same to be paid from District Funds.
  - B. We recommend that the District Secretary be paid \$35.00 per year for his services, same to be paid from District funds.
- C. We recommend that the District Statistician be paid \$20,00 per year for his services, same to be paid from District funds.

# 7. SUNDAY SCHOOL PROMOTIONAL SECY.

A. We recommend that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary's expenses be paid for the mailing of all Sunday School reports. Same ' shall mail a quarterly statement to the District Treasurer. l'reasurer. SPECIAL

We recommend that the District adopt a PENNY A DAY OR MORE PLAN" for the constiuancy of the local church, all money to be used in founding new churches in the District. 16

### RESOLUTIONS

### 1. BUDGETS

A. Resolved: That the District Treasurer send each church a quarterly financial report of all resolves and dead have the same

### 2. CHURCHES

- A. Resolved: That each church pay their Pastor's and Delegates travel expense to the Conference and Ministerial Convention.
- B. Resolved: That each church shall endeavor to start a Branch Sunday School of prayer meeting in a nearby community.
- C. Resolved: That each church install and practice the envelope system of collecting the tithe and offerings.
- D. Resolved: That each pastor send in a monthly report to the District Superintendent, and the Secretary of Church Extension, not later than the tenth of each month.
- E. Resolved: That any church desiring to call an evangelist of another denomination should first consult the District Superintendent.
- F. Resolved: That one prayer-meeting a month be given over to the praying for souls, new churches, and revivals.
- G. Resolved: That the first day of each month be known as a day of fasting and prayer; a day and time of soul searching as to our fervor, soul-burden, consecretion.

### 3. CONFERENCE.

- A. Resolved: That the time and place of the District Conference shall be set by the District Council in consultation with the Secretary of Church Extension.
- B. Be it further resolved: That the matter of a Youth Camp be left in the hands of the council.

### 4. CONFERENCE YEAR.

- A. Resolved that our Conference year close on May 31.
- B. Be it also resolved: That the District Treasurer books close at noon (12 o'clock) June 9.

### 5. LICENTIATES.

A. Resolved: That all persons applying for license appear in person before the Examining and Educational Board, unless the applicant is sick or otherwise unable to appear in person, and in that case some member of the Conference shall certify as to his character and location.

# 6. MINISTERIAL CONVENTION.

- A. Resolved: That we have a special Convention open to our pastors and their wives.
- B. Be it further resolved: That the time, and place of the Convention be decided upon by the District Council in conjunction with the Secretary of Church Extension. Be it also resolved: That the evening services be open to the public.

### 7. PASTORS.

- A. Resolved: That each pastor have the privilege of holding two revivals a year.
- B. Resolved that each pastor on the district be responsible for the financial obligations of the district on a monthly basis as far as possible. Be it further resolved: That he assume this as a sacred obligation on his part.
- C. Resolved that each pastor, or conference delegate, make clear to the members of his congregation the financial plan adopted by this conference the first week following conference.
- D. Resolved: That each pastor be given a two weeks vacation with pay.

### 8. REPORTS.

A. Resolved: That the yearly reports be made in triplicate. One copy to be mailed within ten days of the close of the conference year to the District Statistician; One copy to the District Superintendent; And one copy to be filled with the local church.

# 9. SUNDAY SCHOOL.

A. Resolved: That each Sunday School of the District have a set time for the numerical count, and that this time be set by this conference as being half the time of the Sunday School period.

### 10. SUPERINTENDENT.

- A. Resolved: That the District Superintendent on his visits to the churches may meet with the board, question the pastor. I. Whether or not the churches are paying their District obligations. 2. Whether or not the pastor is sending his Ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer.
- B. Be it further resolved: That if he find any church coming short, he is to impress upon them the importance of meeting their District obligations. Be it also resolved? That he impress upon the congregation their duty to their pastor.
- C. Resolved: That the District Superintendent be consulted, and present if possible, when drawing up deeds in the District, and that all deeds be abstracted.

### 11. ZONES.

- A. Inasmuch as the several churches of this state fall into two distinct sections, Be it resolved: That these sections be known as The Northern Zone and The Southern Zone.
- B. Be it further resolved that the Northern Zone be made up of the Huntsville, Birmingham, and Selma churches. That the Southern Zone be made up of the Mobile, Magnolia Springs, Brownsville, Warrington, Lynn Haven, and Crestview Churches.

### 12. APPRECIATION.

- A. Resolved: That we express our appreciation to the host church by a rising vote of thanks.
- B. Resolved: That we express our appreciation for the presence and leadership of our Secretary of Church Extension by standing and singing a verse of "Blest Be The Tie That Binds."
- C. Resolved: That we express our appreciation to our District Superintendent for his leadership and inspiring messages throughout the year by standing and saying "God Bless You".
