Christian groutings and a sincere velcome to our presiding officer, Dr. R. C. Hawkins, the clergy, delagates and friends of the Atlantic Southeast District.

It is impossible to estimate the power of holy enthusiasm. As every paster and layman enters joyfully-enthusiastically into the full church program - a program conceived of a burden, born in prayer alrected of God and dedicated to his Glory; we will sow enthusiascally and water not sparingly, trusting God to give the increase..
