PARTIAL REPORT OF BOARD OF ELDERS

Los Angeles, Calif., April 16, 1929

To the General Assembly met in Semi-Annual session, greetings in Jesus' name.

We, the Board of Elders, wish to submit the following partial report. Owing to the failure of the committee to make arrangements for the meeting at Eastmont, it became necessary to transfer the meeting to the mission.

The local churches in a general sense are in good condition. There have been revivals held in some of them, with good results, several having been added to the roll.

A new church has been organized at Oak View Gardens, and a charter applied for with Sister King as pastor, and is just now enlarging its new church building to accommodate the Sunday school.

The church at Santa Ana has been re-opened and is being cared for by Sister Louise Mercer.

San Fernando is building a parsonage and needs our help both financially and in labor. The church that have not held revivals are making preparations for them.

The Los Angeles Mission under the able leadership of Brother Bieczynski is still holding forth and preaching both by word of mouth and open door that Christ is able to save. Improvements

in painting and papering add to the respectability of the place.

The work in Kentucky is doing well under the leadership of Assistant Superintendents Brother and Sister DeYoung. While the winter has been most severe, yet God has brought them through, and they report a goodly number saved.

FOREIGN FIELDS

Work in South America under Brother and Sister Vasquez, is very encouraging. Our new missionaries, Brother and Sister Spencer, have gone to work in real earnest. Also the school and work at headquarters is very satisfactory. The blessed help and benefit of trusting and obeying God was truly shown in the effective and prompt way in which the place was made ready and the new equipments were installed and gotten into such helpful service. It also shows how God does make things count for good when He has willing hearts and hands to work freely through.

The work in Palestine is very gratifying and shows also that God is being honored and is honoring the dear workers in a blessed way. We also feel certain that God will truly honor his Holy Word that is being carried to hungry hearts by the dear workers in China.

Brother Getso is still pressing his way toward Alaska and sowing by the way. His faithful heart will get its reward.

Although Sister Grubb is encountering difficulties we feel she is one of the few who dare to go through with God in the face of apparent impossibilities. Surely there is a battle in each field but we believe God is leading on to victory. Praise His holy name.
