Daily Proceedings

Tuesday P.M.

On July first, Tuesday at 2:30 p.m. the Champlain Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America opened its 110th Annual Session, on the West Chazy Camp Ground.

The President, Rev. Chas. Dayton, presided.

The roll was called and 23 Elders, 11 Conference Preachers and 23 delegates were present. More came later in the afternoon.

The song leader, Mr. DeVerne Mullen, was introduced, and led the Conference in singing "Showers of Blessing." Bro. Jock offered prayer. Bro. Mullen then sang a solo—"God Leads His Dear Children Along." This year a Hammond organ was provided for use by Dr. Hollis Stevenson; and it is being played by Miss Ruth Ross.

The Vice President, Rev. Reginald Hewitt, presented the Conference President, and he gave his annual message, based upon the words "Thy King." This was of the nature of an exposition of what it means to have CHRIST reign in the life. Following the message, "Blest Be the Tie that Binds" was sung, as members of the Body clasped hands.

The President read his Annual Report and it was accepted.

The official acts were read and accepted. The Financial Report was read; it was approved. The proposed Orders of the Day were adopted, with the understanding that any necessary change may be made.

It was voted that the Bar of Conference be the first seven center rows of seats.

The time for daily meeting was voted to be—A.M. 8:45 to 11:30; P.M. 1:30 to closing by vote.

Resolved that no new business be introduced to the Conference Body after Friday noon, without a two-thirds vote of the Body; Resolved that this become Standing Rule No. 26, It was voted that we have a 4th of July patriotic service at 2:30 p.m., for one hour. The Committee to arrange this service was elected to be A. O. Northrup, Gerald Hewitt, Kenneth Ross.

The Conference adjourned by vote; and dismissal was by Bro. Shippee.

Wednesday Forenoon

Roll call.

The devotional period was conducted by Bro. Stanley Klob. There was singing, and the Scripture at Acts 3:1-6 was read. Relative remarks were followed by prayer by Bro. Frase.

BUSINESS. The minutes of the Tuesday afternoon business were read and adopted.

The Nominating and Auditing Committees were excused to meet for necessary work.

Devotional: Bro. Maurice Jesmer leader. There was singing and prayer. Bro. Jesmer read the Scripture at Ephes. 3, and gave a brief message.

BUSINESS. The minutes of the Friday afternoon business were read and approved with one minor addition.

The following characters were passed: Diana Miller, Reginald Hewitt, Florence Northrup, Pearl Keysor.

A supplementary report of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders was read. After discussion, it was voted to lay the matter on the Table.

The motion prevailed that we have a Conference Ministerial Institute this Fall, and that the date be fixed by the Institute Committee.

By vote, a rising vote of thanks was given to Bro. W. F. Lewis for his many years of service as a member of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

A motion prevailed that to whatever extent is necessary, the Conference financially stand back of the Conference preachers who will take the Disciplinary Course offered at Houghton College.

It was voted that the Secretary send a letter of good will to Bro. Howard Chapman, and that a love offering be taken for him. The offering was taken and amounted to \$34.25.

A motion relative to building a new dining room, etc., was voted to be laid on the Table.

The matter of a Camp Ground care-taker was discussed. It was voted that the matter be referred to the Camp Meeting Board for final decision.

Sr. Scribner was given a rising vote of thanks for her laundry service to the Camp.

The FINAL READING of the Committee on Pastoral Relations was given. It was voted that the stationing portion of the report be accepted, and that the Recommendations be considered item by item.

Th following recommendations were considered separately and adopted: Recommendation numbers 1 through 13.

Note: At 11:30 an extension of time was voted, and the Assembly adjourned by vote at about 11:55. Prayer by Bro. H. Johnson.

Saturday Afternoon

Characters passed Thomas Boghosian and Herbert Seaman.

The Conference approved Rev. Elton Seaman and Mr. Chester Fiet as the President's Advisory Board.

It was voted that the motion relating to the building of a new dining room and kitchen be taken from the Table.

The following motion was carried: That the Conference authorize the Camp Meeting Board to proceed with plans toward building a new dining room and kitchen, the expense not to exceed forty-five hundred dollars (\$4500), and that the final decision be left to the President and his Advisory Board.

The motion prevailed to take from the Table the supplementary report of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

It was voted that this supplementary report of the Com. on Itineracy and Orders be approved, with the understanding that the Connectional President be referred to for counsel.

It was voted that we have a Conference Calendar, and that Edwin Seaman be the first member of the Committee to prepare it, and that he choose his associate.

It was voted that the 1953 Conference Session begin Tuesday, June 30, at 2:30 p.m.; that the roll be called at that time; that immediately following the roll call, the President address the assembly; that the Conference sermon be preached Tuesday evening at 7:30 by Rev. Ed. Mein, and that Rev. George Jock be alternate; and that there be no preaching services during the day sessions of Conference week unless an urgent need require otherwise.

It was voted that the first official meal be Tuesday noon, June 30.

It was voted that the Statistical Report be placed in the Minutes without the Committee reporting to the Conference Body.

The Auditing Committee report was given and accepted. See reports.

WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

It was voted that Rev. C. C. Murray be permitted to attend the National Sunday School Convention with expenses paid.

The minutes were read and approved.

A rising vote of thanks was given to Bro. Dayton, the retiring Conference President.

It was voted that we have a testimonial dinner for Bro. Dayton, and that the new President, Rev. Reginald Hewitt, be Chairman of the Committee of arrangements.

ORDER OF THE DAY-Y.M.W.B. Rally-50th Anniversary.

Sr. Vina Hewitt was in charge of a fine program, including Band music, a march by a large group of children into the Tabernacle and onto the platform; prayer; Scr. verses with the initial verses C-H-A-M-P-L-A-I-N C-O-N-F-E-R-E-N-C-E Y-M-W-B: the Cadyville "tonettes;" a dialogue; awards given; Camp rhythm band; solo; Skit: 50 years of Y.M.W.B. history; address by Sr. Mary Lane Clark; and offering.

The Conference Body came to order with the new President in the Chair. The election of W.Y.P.S. officers was read to the Conference, and was approved.

It was voted to adjourn, to meet at the call of the Chair. Prayer by Bro. Kenneth Ross.

Wednesday Evening

REPORTS

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dear Brethren of the Champlain Conference:

It is a great honor to address this 110th session of the Champlain Annual Conference and to realize that we are members of a corporation which has stood true to God's Word through a period in history unparalleled along all lines. We are proud, and justly so, of this record of integrity, and resolve that we should emphasize the need of propagating the work and intensifying our zeal and diligence as the lengthening shadows cast their ominous and dark forebodings over the world about us. Thank God, we are not of this world, but we recognize our responsibility of saving men from this world and bringing them into a fellowship which has for its objective the advancement of God's kingdom.

It has been more than my fondest dreams could anticipate to have had the privilege of serving the Conference as president for six years. Words can never express the deep emotions of our soul as we go on the pathway of memory back over the scenes of these fleeting days. Let us pause to see briefly the road of advancement which God has led us over. There was the purchase and renovation of a president's home in West Chazy, N. Y. which you paid for in full within one year. Then there has been the enlargement of the Camp grounds, dining hall, kitchen and facilities; and the liquidation of the entire indebtedness on the properties at Springfield, Ticonderoga, Schenectady and Malone. Also, there has been reduction of the indebtedness very definitely in several other places. Sveral new additions have been made to our older churches and are paid for, such as Corinth, Brant Lake, Lisbon, Heuvelton, Acorn Hill, and Bakers Mills, as well as additions to parsonages and pastor's new garages, viz. Hague, Willow, Springfield, Colton, Morley, West Chazy, and Forestdale. Others have improved their properties very decidedly. Ticonderoga has built a new church and parsonage and paid for the same. We have a new church at Wynantskill, N. Y. In this period a new church and parsonage have been built at Springfield, Mass. conservatively valued at \$50,000.00. Also, a beautiful and commodious parsonage has been obtained at Heuvelton. We have a church building at East Pitcairn, N. Y., and a fine group of people. There are parsonages at Cooks Corners and at Chichester. Canaan Hill has a new church and parsonage.

Our personnel has grown too. We have organizations now in Springfield, Northside, Cohoes, and Canaan Hill. There are preaching appointments in West Sandgate, Vermont and in Cambridge, N. Y. Our membership has increased about 9%. Several fine preachers have

come to join our ranks and are doing good work. They are Ray Morgan, Gerald Matson, Robert Wolcott, Charles and Roberta McCallum, Thomas Boghosian, Otis MacDonald, Stanley Hill, Quentin Hayes and William Otis. Others are looking this way from our schools and course of study. We bow reverently and gratefully, giving God the Glory.

There have been times when it would have been possible to have made a bigger splash; but after prayer and consideration the various committees and boards have deemed it wiser to refrain from plunging into unadvisable projects. To these committees, boards, and individuals we can not fully express proper appreciation. The wonderful personnel of Conference officers has been lavish in their help and cooperation. This is without exception.

There are so many things to thank you all for. Please forgive the unadvisable words and actions of these years. We were in a bad situation six years ago. Rev. Price Stark had sailed for Africa and it was said, "O, there is nobody fit to be president." God has helped us to do together what no individual could do. Now, we are again seeking a president for the Champlain Conference. Let us, after prayer and counsel, choose a man from our number, and assure him as we start him out that he can, through God's grace, do the work whereunto God hath called him. Let us provide, promote, and provoke such an one. We have a number of Godly, sagacious, mature men who are fully fitted and equipped to fulfill the duties of the office of president. May our hearts and eyes be open as we plunge into the days before us.

RESOLUTIONS OF THE CHAMPLAIN CONFERENCE

Probably there never has been a time in the history of the United States of America when honesty, integrity, courage and Christianity was more needed than now. In the beginning the founders of our great country believed in God, said so, and acted as if they believed in the necessity of such a stand. Our Country has gone a long way from that. Progress has been made in the way of invention (for convenience and speed in travel, in lighting, in power, transportation and many other things we call every day needs.) However, somewhere along the way, perhaps only a little at a time, which finally did become noticeable, the people of this great Nation have "FORGOTTEN GOD." It might have been neglect at first. At any rate it is noticed by all thinking people here and now. Great newspaper writers, and magazine editors, and large corporations pay for advertising space to call attention to it; bill boards of the secular world proclaim the necessity of a return to the worship of God. The evangelists have been, and are—with faithful pastors and laymen—telling the world that this is the hour of decision. And we are "being weighed in the balances and found wanting." It is high time we spend more time in prayer, in talking with folks about their need of salvation, in inviting nonchurch goers to church, and then to Christ.

Therefore be it resolved that the Champlain Conference be called to certain days for special prayer for ministers and Christian workers, for those in high places in our Government, for missionaries in this Country and throughout the world. (Perhaps on each Friday.)

Be it also resolved that we exert all our powers as citizens, and see that we are eligible to vote, and then VOTE. Also to let our Congressmen and U. S. Senators know how we feel regarding certain big issues-such as Ambassador to the Vatican, Universal Military Training, selling beer to members of our armed forces, (even letting brewry companies send "free" beer), and kindred evils. God help us if we remain silent on such issues!

Be it further resolved that we as a Conference actually work toward the goals of our general Church program . . . Two new Churches,

two new members per church, and two "won for Christ" by each member. We can if we will!

And, finally, be it resolved that we promote through the Sunday Schools, the Young People's Society, the Missionary Societies, as well as through the regular Church services, a Christian attitude in word and deed to win the people of our communities or constituency, that will draw men to the Church and to Christ.

And that when there are converts they "be added to the Church such as shall be saved," and do it while they are fresh in the glow of their Christian experience, and not wait until they grow cold—or present members grow cold, so that they may be dropped from the roll. So called "back door revivals" are not revivals at all, and generally reveal that someone has failed in their Christian duty to assist these babes in Christ at the crucial time.

Let us then "labor while it is day, for the night soon cometh when no man can work."

## Standing Rules

- 1. The Resolutions of this Conference shall be printed in the Minutes of this Conference each year.
- All visiting members of our own, or other Churches in harmony with our principles, shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.
- 3. The Conference President shall receive twenty dollars (\$20) per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.
- 4. The Conference Secretary shall receive fifty dollars (\$50) per year for his labor and incidental expenses.
- 5. The Conference Treasurer shall receive fifty dollars (\$50) per year for his services in caring for the funds.
- 6. In making his report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books one week before Conference session. The Treasurer of the Superannuate Ministers' Relief Association also shall close his books one week before the Conference session.
- 7. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice President. It is understood that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.
- 8. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference, or by the consent of the President and his Advisory Board.
- 9. Each Elder shall make his engagement as Pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released from his engagement as Pastor within the period of three months following his election.
- 10. The first Sunday of each month shall be known as Missions Sunday, the Sunday School offerings to go alternately to Home Missions and Conference Missions, in that order, and be sent to the Conference Treasurer. (The Committee on Finance defines "Conference Missions" as the establishing of new and (or) subsidizing of the needy fields of the Conference.)
- 11. In securing Evangelists for the Camp meeting, the Camp meeting Committee is privileged to secure not more than one worker outside the Denomination.

- 12. The Camp meeting Committee shall be composed of the Conference President, as Chairman, and three ministers and three laymen, all to be elected by ballot (after the Conference of 1923), the term of office to be three years, the time of one minister and one layman expiring each year.
- 13. Pastors shall state financial items in their statistical reports in even dollars, except in items affecting the Budget; and as far as possible are requested to report all Budget items in even dollars. When such rule is not followed, the Statistical Secretaries are authorized to drop decimals, except as provided above.
- 14. The Committee on Credentials shall secure from each delegate the necessary credentials as provided by our Discipline, with Post Office address of the same.
- 15. The closing Sunday of the Conference year shall be the Sunday following the beginning of the Annual Conference. The Pastor's salary for this closing Sunday shall be paid by the Church of which he is Pastor; and for the Sunday of the new Conference year it shall be paid by the Charge to which he is going.
- 16. Newly elected Conference officers shall take office after the close of the Conference Sunday.
- 17. The Conference shall include in the Orders of the Day a special period to consider Camp meeting business.
- 18. A Nominating Committee shall be elected to consider and nominate all elective officers of the Conference. The Committee shall consist of four Elders and four laymen. The report of the Nominating Committee shall be read to the Conference the day preceding the election.
- 19. Each Church member over fourteen years of age shall be apportioned fifty-two cents per year for Church Extension.
- 20. The Delegate's Credentials shall be sent to the Committee on Credentials BEFORE THE OPENING DAY OF CONFERENCE, and the Conference Secretary shall send printed blanks with the Statistical, Character, etc.
- 21. The Conference recommends that each Charge grant its Pastor two weeks vacation, and also grant him permission to hold a two weeks meeting (over two Sundays) away from his local Charge,—both vacation and meeting to be without loss of pay, and exclusive of attending the Annual Conference and Camp meeting.
  - 22. The first Sunday in May shall be PASTORAL VOTE SUNDAY.
- 23. CHURCH EXTENSION. (1) The Conference President shall act as Pioneer Secretary. (This does not create the office of Pioneer

Secretary.) The Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location shall be the Church Extension Committee.

(2) There shall be at least one Church Extension service on each charge in the Conference this year, at which time all of the Church Extension activities within the Conference shall be presented.

This service shall be under the supervision of the Conference President, or one whom he may appoint. Any person traveling the Conference in the interests of Church Extension must be appointed and under the direction of the Conference President. Those thus appointed to travel the Conference in the interest of Church Extension shall receive not to exceed five cents per mile.

- (3) All offerings taken for Church Extension shall be forwarded to the Conference Treasurer, and credited to Church Extension. The Conference Treasurer, upon recommendation of the Conference President and the Committee on Church Extension, shall disburse these funds. Any designated funds can be disbursed by notice received in writing from the Conference President.
- (4) Whereas the W.Y.P.S. is an organization that is aggressively supporting the Conference Pioneer projects, we recommend that as far as possible all monies for Pioneer work be passed through the local W.Y.P.S. Treasurer to the Treasurer of the Champlain Conference.

We further recommend that the local Church Extension program be sponsored by the local W.Y.P.S. as far as possible.

- 24. During the year each Sunday School shall take an offering for the maintenance of the Conference President's home.
- 25. The Conference President shall be ex-officio member of the Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location; the term of the other four members shall be two years each, the term of two members expiring each year.
- 26. No new business shall be introduced to the Conference Body after Friday noon, without a two-thirds vote of the Body.

## Camp Ground Rules

#### GENERAL RULES

Ever bear in mind that these grounds and buildings are church property, and respect them as such.

The religious services are for your benefit—take advantage of them.

Only young people who come at the recommendation of their pastor will be permitted the benefits of the Young People's Financial Plan.

Each young person is required to attend the regular Young People's Meeting; also—the evening service, and one other service during the day.

#### I. CARE OF GROUNDS

- Place waste paper and garbage only in containers provided.
   Do not throw it on the grounds.
- 2. Waste paper and other refuse may be burned only in drums provided for this purpose.
- 3. Empty waste paper in appointed place—at back of the grounds. Do not throw it out the window or on the grounds.
- 4. Do your part toward keeping the grounds around your cottage or dormitory neat and looking clean.

#### II. PERSONAL CONDUCT

- 1. The use of tobacco, profanity, obscene literature, card playing and gambling are prohibited on the Camp Grounds.
- Wearing apparel must be modest at all times. The wearing of slacks, shorts, gym clothes or bathing suits is prohibited on the grounds. Men are requested to wear shirts, and ladies to wear hose.

#### III. DORMITORY AND COTTAGE RULES

- 1. Campers are requested to be in their rooms for the night at 10:30 unless engaged in the tabernacle.
- 2. The rights of your neighbors must be respected: therefore, quiet must prevail in all rooms and dormitories.
- 3. Remember that there are others who will occupy these rooms after you; therefore, keep them clean, and leave them in good condition.
- 4. Because of fire hazards, there must be no cooking of food in the Dormitories.

- That there shall be a Matron of Dormitories and Cottages appointed annually who shall in conjunction with the Executive Committee assume full responsibility of the Dormitory rooms:
  - a. Receive reservations.
  - b. Admit and dismiss occupants of rooms.
  - c. Receive payment for rooms.

- d. Be responsible for the proper furnishing of each room before the beginning of Conference.
- Be responsible that the rooms be left in proper shape following the close of Conference.
- The funds received and disbursed shall be itemized and be presented to the Annual Conference.
- 3. These funds shall be voted out by the Executive Board of the Woman's Missionary Society of the Champlain Conference for furnishing and maintenance of rooms, a nominal salary for the matron, and should funds permit for the building of additional dormitory facilities.

The Work Shops were discussed for the coming year. It was recommended that we have 2 Missionary District Conventions instead of four, and that the "Work Shop" idea be kept in the background. It was further recommended that we try to secure the Home Missionary Secretary as our speaker, and that we emphasize Men's Fellowship and Church Extension within our Conference. We were adjourned.

#### Report No. 1

To our co-laborers in the Lord, Greetings:

This has been a good year in many ways, not the least of which is the fact that there has come an increased revelation of the high and holy honor of being a co-laborer with our matchless Lord and Savior. True it is that we have a duty to perform, but its heaviness and drudgery fade and disappear in the recognition and enjoyment of the glorious privilege that is ours.

Last fall for a month's deputation work, Rev. and Mrs. Ferdinand Witthuhn of Haiti came to our Conference. Their ministry was blessed and refreshing. This spring in our four district conventions held at Hadley, Schenectady, Mooers and Norfolk, Rev. Hugh Newcomb of the Onondaga Indian Reservation was our guest. We appreciated his humble, sincere and zealous contribution to the enlargement of our vision. At the district conventions were held the Workshops which as a whole were beneficial. #### PLAN OF WORK

#### Report No. 6

For each local W.M.S. we recommend:

- 1. The effort to secure every woman of the congregation as members, and to enlist the men as honorary members unless they have a missionary organization of their own.
- 2. The formation of an active prayer partner group with a prayer partner secretary reporting to the Conference prayer partner secretary by 60 days after Conference. It is also urged that a prayer and fast day be observed monthly.
- 3. The election of officers who are subscribers to and readers of the Wesleyan Methodist and the Wesleyan Missionary and that effort be made to place the Wesleyan Missionary in every home.

- 4. The continuation of sending goods, usable clothing, notions, pictures and medical supplies to our home missionaries.
- 5. That we forward promptly all Sunday School charts and flannel-graph material to our foreign fields, remembering to enclose the charts in their original pasteboard rolls.
- 6. The preparation of exhibits for our home and foreign missionary stations. These exhibits shall be packed for mailing at the close of Conference, the postage being paid from the Conference Treasury.
- 7. The sending of silverware, dish towels and other supplies for the Camp Ground.
- 8. That at a meeting before Conference, officers for the coming year be elected, including a magazine solicitor and a delegate (other than the church delegate, if possible). The room and board of the delegate shall be provided for Conference week and she shall be instructed as to the amount of pledge for missions.
- 9. That each delegate give a complete report to the local society at the first meeting after Conference.
- 10. The sending of equivalent of 10c per member per month to the Conference Treasurer, quarterly, toward the pioneer project.
- 11. The election of a Missionary Study Secretary who will keep a record of all reading done, and reporting the statistics to the Conference Mission Study Secretary by the first of June.
- 12. That each society render an annual program at which time an offering shall be taken for the support of medical missions.
- 13. That the dues of \$1.00 per member be sent directly to the Conference Treasurer, 50c of which shall be divided by her and applied on the budget, half home and half foreign unless otherwise specified, and that all monies and vouchers be sent to the Conference Treasurer at least quarterly.
- 14. That each local society pay annually an amount equal to 25c per active member to be used as general administrative fund, not to apply on budget.
