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DAILY PROCEEDINGS

OPENING OF CONFERENCE

Minutes of the sixtieth annual session of the Dakota Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America for the year of 1940 and 41 held in Aberdeen, S. Dak. June 3-9, 1941.

Conference Sermon—The Conference opened at eight o'clock Tuesday evening, June 3 with a good number of Conference preachers, delegates and laymen present to hear Rev. W. D. Shelor, pastor of the Aberdeen Church, bring a message on "Reaffirming our Faith in the Fundamentals of the Gospel" using as a text, Rom. 1:16.

Wednesday Morning

Devotionals—Devotions were conducted by Rev. R. D. Reisdorph reading from John, the ninth chapter and commenting on verse 4. "The night cometh when no man can work." This was followed by earnest prayer that the Conference work might be in keeping with God's plan for us in the Dakota Conference.

Business—Called to Order by Rev. J. F. Simpson, Conference President, with a few words of appreciation for those who had gone before and left the work to us along with the responsibility we must carry on with our dependence upon the Spirit of God in the Dakota Conference for leadership.

Roll Call—Roll was called to which twenty-four Conference preachers and twenty-one delegates answered.

Report—The report of the Program Committee was read and adopted. **Election**—A Committee on Nominations for Organization of Confer-

ence was elected as follows: Rev. A. M. Wiley, Chairman; Rev. R. D. Reisdorph, August Wegner, Charles Reisdorph.

Conference Bar—The first ten seats in middle section of the tabernacle was the Bar of Conference.

Recess—President declared a recess for the Nominating Committee to prepare their report.

Called to Order-President declared the Conference called to order.

Report—The Nominating Committee read their report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 1.)

Election-The members of committees were elected as nominated.

Courtesies—Rev. Roy Nicholson, Home Missionary Secretary, was introduced and spoke briefly.

Adjournment-Adjourned by vote for committee work.

Wednesday Afternoon

Devotionals—Devotions were conducted by Rev. W. J. Leyh reading from John 9, and commenting thereon.

Roll Call-Roll was called.

Minutes-Minutes read and approved.

Publishing of Minutes—Secretary was instructed to have 300 copies of the minutes printed at our Publishing House. These to be distributed as last year and an offering taken at the time of distribution and sent to the Conference Treasurer.

Appointment—President appointed Harold Yetter and August Wegner to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

Courtesy—Rev. Roy Nicholson was invited to a seat in the Conference body.

Instruction to Secretary—Announcement of Conference and Camp Meeting to appear on the back page of Minutes.

Adjournment-Adjourned to Committee work.

Thursday Morning

Devotionals—Devotions were conducted by Rev. J. E. Spry reading and commenting on scriptures from John 14 and Rev. 7:9 to the end of the chapter.

Roll Call

Minutes-Minutes read and approved.

Courtesies-Rev. O. G. Wilson of Miltonvale, Kans. was introduced and spoke briefly.

Reports-Committee on Auditing read a partial report. (See Report No. 2.)

Ministerial Relief—Secretary-Treasurer read his report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 3.)

Camp Meeting Treasurer—Camp Meeting Treasurer read his report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 4.)

President—Conference President, J. F. Simpson read his report and it was adopted by a unanimous standing vote. (See Report No. 5.)

Greetings—Secretary was instructed to write a letter of greetings to Miss Isla Knight as member of our Conference, now a missionary in India. Recess—President declared a recess to the call of the Chair.

Friday Morning

Devotionals—Devotions were conducted by Rev. Marvin Jones reading the sixty-third Psalm.

Roll Call

Minutes-Minutes read and approved.

Orders of the Day—The President called for the Order of the Day which was the election of officers.

Reports—Committee on Vacancies reported the resignation of Rev. A. M. Wiley as Representative to Miltonvale and the appointment of Rev. W. D. Shelor to take his place. (See Report No. 6.) The appointment was

approved and name forwarded to Book Committee.

Nominating Committee read their report on Standing Committees and it was adopted. (See Report No. 7.)

Election—They were elected as nominated. Thomas Bailie was reelected Secretary-Treasurer of the Ministerial Relief Fund.

President—Motion prevailed that the President travel the Conference. Nomination—President nominated Rev. J. C. McGovern and Frank Martin to the Advisory Board and they were elected.

Treasurer's Report—Treasurer's Report was read and it was received subject to the approval of the Auditing Committee. (See Report No. 8.)

Itineracy and Orders—The Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave their report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 9.)

Passage of Character—The Committee on Passage of Character read their report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 10.)

Statistical Report—The Statistical Committee read their report and it was adopted. (See Statistical Report.)

Appraisement—Motion prevailed to have the Conference Trustees appraise the value of the Camp Meeting property.

On motion all the churches were to be instructed at the beginning of the Conference year, and before the close, of their obligations to the Conference, relative to budget and indebtedness.

Orders of the Day—Orders of the Day was to hear the Educational program and address by Professor O. G. Wilson and a group of Miltonvale students. This was a very good program and an interested audience listened in on it. We heartily pledge our support to Miltonvale College.

Friday Afternoon

Devotionals-Devotions were conducted by Rev. Mrs. Laura Raymer reading and commenting from John 15: 1-8.

Courtesies-Rev. W. W. Jefferies was introduced and gave a few remarks to the Conference. Railroad Expense Report-Committee on Railroad Expense gave their report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 11.)

Resolutions-Committee on Resolutions read their report and it was adopted. (See Report No. 12.)

Motion prevailed that W. D. Shelor, Chairman of the Resolutions Committee convey the resolutions to the Railroads for their passes and the Newspapers for their space contributed to Conference and Camp Meeting programs.

Conference Date—On motion time of next Conference was set to begin on the first Tuesday evening of June, 1942.

Courtesies—Rev. and Mrs. Cretsinger of the Iowa Conference were introduced and gave brief testimonies and greetings to the Conference.

Orders of the Day—A short Sunday-school rally was conducted under the leadership of W. J. Leyh, Sunday-school Secretary.

Tithing—A tithing service was conducted by W. D. Shelor, Tithing Secretary. Rev. Roy S. Nicholson being the speaker brought us a very helpful message on this theme.

Character Passage—Motion prevailed that the passage of character be on the same basis in raising the Superannuated Minister's Fund and working the $7\frac{1}{2}\%$ plan for Conference Fund.

Report No. 5

PRESIDENT

It is with the sense of gratitude to God and those who have assisted in this great work, that I bring a report to you of my official duties and a statement of the condition of our churches in the Conference.

It is difficult to properly value the Daily Intercession prayer chain which has been sponsored by the W. H. & F. M. Society. We feel that the secret of the spirit of revival that is coming to our Conference is in answer to the prevailing prayers of these faithful women?

The following churches have purchased parsonages during this year, Baker, Mont.; Watertown, S. D.; Artesian, S. D.; Aberdeen, S. D. Butte, Mont. has completed a five room apartment in their church.

The following churches, Bushnell, Richland and Redfield, have beautified and made their churches more serviceable and valuable by putting in basements and added repair.

Johnson Corners and Mitchell churches have liquidated their long standing indebtedness by adopting a systematic method of finance.

New fields are beckoning for our Conference to come to them with the Gospel of Light. Our task is increasing, our God is unfailing. We must act quickly or our opportunities will pass not to return.

Our Conference is one of magnificent distances and great possibilities. It is claimed by some to be the largest area in our Denomination. We give praise to God who has sustained us as we have traveled close to forty thousand miles in Conference activities, at a minimum expense to the Conference, which the financial statement will show.

If it had not been for the great courtesy of the Railroad Companies in granting passes for our official work, we would not have been able to have served all our fields as the expense would have been prohibitive.

I am convinced that if our Conference meets the challenge of the hour, it is imperative that the President whom you may elect this year devote full time to this great field which God has entrusted to us as a Conference.

Official Acts

Have conducted three quarterly meetings in most of our churches during the year.

Conducted three revivals in the Conference and assisted in one.

Accepted the resignation of Rev. A. M. Wiley as a member of the Board of Managers of Miltonvale College.

Assisted in four church anniversary services.

Appointed Lester Meyers as pastor of Knobs, Mont. Church.

Appointed Wayne Cretsinger as pastor of the missionary field in Butte, Mont.

Accepted the resignation of Rev. Laura Raymer as pastor of the Bradley Church.

Appointed Marvin Jones as pastor of the new field at Britton, S. D. Appointed Frank Traver to supply the new work at Flandreau.

Appointed George Thomas as supply to the new field at Willow Lake, which is opening to our Conference.

New works have been opened and partial organization affected in the following cities: Forsyth, Mont.; Britton, S. D.; Flandreau, S. D., with prospects of a good work in each place if the field is worked effectively.

Completed the organization of the Watertown Church.

Assisted in the purchase of church buildings for our work at Butte, Mont.; Watertown, S. D.; and a lot for our church at Huron, S. D. A building has been moved in and made into a serviceable church.

Plans for being made for the purchase of a church property at Flandreau, S. D., and Forsyth, Mont. The present value of these properties is gratifying.

MISSIONARY BOARD

We, the Missionary Board, recommend that:

We leave the arrangements for quarterly meetings to the Conference President and that he be paid \$100 per month and traveling expenses for time employed in the Conference.

The churches make special effort to raise as much as possible on Quarterly Meeting visits and revival meetings held by the President and all monies thus raised apply on President's salary.

That we pay ten dollars per month to the Watertown work.

That we pay thirty dollars per month to the Butte work until Jan. 1, 1942, with sixty dollars available at once.

That we elect a Board of Church and Parsonage Building and Location according to disciplinary requirements.

That the Conference Board of Trustees be given specific authority as follows:

To sign all necessary legal papers for the securing of funds with which to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage property indebtedness; or with which to purchase, repair, remodel, or recondition Conference, church, and parsonage property; when such plans are approved by the Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, and the President of the Conference and his Advisory Board.

This paragraph was amended to add "Providing these projects shall not increase Conference Liabilities over \$500.00."

To sign all necessary legal papers for the sale or transfer of Conference, church or parsonage property which may have ceased to be used for religious purposes as outlined in the Book of Discipline and such other Conference, church, or parsonage property, when the written statement of the Conference Board of Trustees and the President and his Advisory Board declares such sale or transfer to be in the best interests of the Conference.

That all deeds to property on which help is desired, be deeded to the Conference.

CONFERENCE STANDING RULES AND RESOLUTIONS

Financial Plan for Conference Fund

Money for Conference Fund shall be obtained by each local church paying $7\frac{1}{2}\%$ of all money raised for all purposes, this to include local treasury, Sunday school, Y. M. W. B., W. Y. P. S., and the W. H. & F. M. S.; onethird of which shall be used for Church Extension within the Dakota Conference, the balance, two-thirds, to constitute the regular Conference Fund.

This amount is to be sent to Conference Treasurer monthly.

Railroad Expense

The amount for Railroad Expense is \$4.96 per charge, this money, to be raised and sent to Conference Treasurer as soon as possible.

Ministerial Relief Fund By-Laws

Purpose: To provide financial assistance for Elders and Conference Preachers in times of serious illness or death in their families.

All Ministers and Licentiates of the Conference shall become members on payment of first assessment. Those who desire to become members later, may do so by paying up all assessments made previous, of the Conference year.

The Secretary-Treasurer shall make four assessments each year, or more if emergency arises, in the following manner: Each Minister on the Conference Roll shall be assessed one dollar on due notice from the Secretary, excepting both husband and wife are preachers. In such case, only one is assessed. Each pastor shall collect one dollar from his church or charge each time an assessment is made, except ministers not serving as pastors in the Conference. These are to pay \$1.50 for each assessment.

Disbursements: The Secretary shall, on receipt of the worthiness of a case, signed by the Conference President, pay out of said fund forty per cent of the amount of the expense incurred, provided the expense is more than twenty dollars, and furthermore providing that no payment shall exceed fifty dollars. (Normal maternity cases excepted). In case of death the maximum of \$75 will be paid to the beneficiaries. That assessments be raised fifty cents in this particular case.

Members who are delinquent in the payment of the last two or more assessments prior to claims for help, shall be ineligible. In case one is delinquent two or more payments, no benefits will be paid in emergencies, by paying of delinquent assessments.

If assessments are paid by check, please add service fee.

Postage and necessary expense shall be deducted from said funds.

That Presidents of W. H. & F. M. S. and W. Y. P. S. be members of the Camp Meeting Board.

That the characters of Pastors will NOT be passed unless the Superannuated Ministers' Fund is paid.

That all the churches will be instructed at the beginning of the Conference year, and before the close of their obligations to the Conference, relative to budget and indebtedness.

That all officers hold office until close of Conference Session in which they are retired.

That Conference Treasurer be authorized to close his books seven days before date of opening of Conference.
