CONFERENCE RULES AND RESOLUTIONS

Section 1 - Conference Officers

- 1. The Missionary Board shall meet at the beginning of each year and at the beginning of each quarter thereafter as necessary, to formulate policies and lay general plans for the conduct of the work of Conference Missions during the year.
- 2. During the interim of Annual Conference, the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference work and Conference Missions as it deems best for the interest of the Conference and the Conference Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one half the other members of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.
- 3. Activities of the Missionary Board shall be reported to the Conference annually.
- 4. The Conference President shall be required to visit each church annually to counsel and advise with the churches in matters of doctrine, finances, and other affairs that affact the spiritual and temporal welfare of the work. After consulting with the pastors he may confer with the stewards if necessary with the purpose in mind to increase the pastor's salary.
- 5. All conference monies must be in the hands of the Conference freasurer before June 5. The Conference Treasurer's books will close June 20.

Section 2 - Annual Conference

- 1. It is recommended that persons elected as lay delegates to conference shall be able to attend the entire session.
- 2. It is recommended that all elders and conference preachers attend all sessions of the Annual Conference.

- 3. The fiscal year for churches shall be from June 1 to May 31. All financial reports shall conform to this schedule.
- 4. All conference statistical blanks shall be in the hand of the statistician no later than June 5.

Section 3 - Churches and Pastors

- 1. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves, help pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.
- 2. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on the last Sunday of Annual Conference.
- 3. Each church is to give its pastor a two weeks vacation each year with salary paid.
- 4. We recommend that each pastor have the privilege of holding two weeks revival services during the year outside the bounds of his charge or circuit.
- 5. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a parsonage, church building or lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed is requested to have the plans approved by the Conference Board of Trustees.
- 6. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one half of the estimated cost of the project must be on hand before said project is undertaken, unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Conference Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.
- 7. Every charge or circuit shall be entitled to one delagate to the Annual Conference. Each charge or circuit shall be entitled to one additional delegate for each elder who is a member, other than the pastor, not sustaining pastoral

relations to any other charge or circuit. (See Wesleyan Methodist Discipline, Paragraph 113).

- 8. We recommend each church send as many associated delegates or visitors as desired, but they will not have voting priviledges.
- 9. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his Advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.

The sixty-ninth annual session of the South Ohio Conference was opened by the President, Rev. Eugene Ramsey.

Devotions were led by Rev. H.H. Sanders, Sr. of Purdy, Tennessee, Vice President of the conference. Congregation sang "I want to Be Like Jesus". Scripture was read from the 12th Chapter of Romans. Rev. Sanders led us in prayer. Dedication service followed, led by our President, Rev. Ramsey and the song "Blessed Assurance" was sung, and a few testimonies were giver.

The business session was opened by the President, who outlined the morning program and it was adopted. The minutes of the last session were read by the Secretary, Volorus Chandler. Roll call of elders and ministers. Appointment of committees by the President and Vice President. We then recessed for one hour so that committees could organize and work. Business session reconvened at 11:30 A.M.

Call to order by the President, Rev. Ramsey, congregation sang "Jesus Keep Me Near the Cross". The Committee's were not finished with their work at this time and the morning session was recessed for lunch.

Wednesday, June 20, 1962 - Afternoon Session

Devotions were led by Rev. J.A. Cassidy of Bethel Springs, Tennessee. Congregation sang "More About Jesus" and "Irust and Obey". The 23rd Psalm was read as the scripture text and Rev. Cassidy exhorted on the same, followed by prayer. We then sang "Is My Name Written There?"

The business session was opened by a discussion on the printed program and the agenda was adopted. The Courtesy Committee gave a brief report by Mrs. Clarence Croston and introduced Rev. Highsmith of Weirton, Vest Virginia and he brought greetings from his Sunday School Convention which

is being held at another camp ground at this time.

The minutes of the morring session was read and adopted.

The Committee on Rules and Orders gave their report. It was read by Susie Hurst. It was adopted.

The Committee on Examination of Character Blanks was given by Mrs. Thelma Adams. It was adopted.

The Committee on <u>Credentials and Membership</u> was given by Mary Howell. It was adopted.

Rev. f.P. Sanderson was elected as acting treasurer in the absence of Rev. C.A. Pauley due to illness, and Ruth Sanderson was appointed to be his assistant.

The Committee on Iternancy and Elders was given by Maxine Smith. She gave a partial report at this time.

The Ordination of Rev. H.M. Sanders, Jr., and Rev. F.P. Sanderson was put before the body and everyone was in favor. It was reported that Mary Howell is to complete her studies.

Rev. H.H. Sanders, Sr., took the chair and Rev. Ramsey gave his President's report.

A report from the Vice President was received.

The Committee on State of Country was given by Elsa Strictland and adopted. We recessed for further committee work at 2:45 P.M.

Wednesday, June 20, 1962 - Evering Session

Devotions were led by Rev. Mary Howell. Song "Have Ihine Own Way" was sung followed by Mrs. Ruth Sanderson rendering the prayer. Song "Pass Me Not". Rev. Sanderson presented Rev. Sheets of the General connection to the Conference and

he brought greetings from his co-workers and gave a few words of encourgement and appreciation of the people of the South Ohio Conference.

Scripture - Romans 6:1-16. Rev. Ralph fate brought the message from Matthew 28: 10-19 his text was "Go Ye therefore and teach all nations". Thought - The Great Commission. He brought a worderful message on the duties and responsibility of the ministers and christians of this present day church, and woe be unto us if we fail to do our duties. The walls have been torn down by sin and need to be built up. Let us rise up to the need and live a good clean life before God". Prayer was led by nev. Ramsey and he also gave the altar call. Song, "Softly and Tenderly" was sung and service closed with prayer around the altar. Collection was lifted by Duane Hill and Rev. Sanders, Jr. Offering was \$12.83. Rev. Ramsey made the announcements and we were dismissed by Rev. William Dugger.

Thursday morning, June 21, 1962

Devotions were led by Sister Elva Johnson. Song, "Jesus I Come". Prayer was led by Rev. Mary Howell followed by reading of the scriptures by Thelma Adams. She read the 91st Psalm. Song, "Irust and Obey".

The Business Session opened at 9:30 A.M. and roll call of ministers was read. Roll call of delegates was read. Rev. Ramsey presented Rev. Sheets who again brought greetings from the church family of the connection and the message on Acts 2:41-47: Acts 4:37; Acts 5:24 Acts 9:31; Acts 12:24. In Acts the great commission was burned on the people's hearts that they lived it before it even was written. It is time we should search our hearts and make sure we keep away corosion that has caused us to become hard and unconcerned and unpliable, but we must build our churches and our individual lives on a solid foundation and messages from the pulpit must be full of the Spirit and firmly denouncing the works of evil and awfulness of sin and its

consequences. He showed how necessary and fruitful witnessing and personal work can be. He told how they have been blessed in their work this year in the connectional field, he also explained the pension plan.

Dr. Sheets spoke to the body about the merger with the Pilgrim Holiness Church and this was discussed very freely.

Dr. Sheets took the chair and presided at this time.

A resolution was brought that the ministers to be ordained be given the right to be elected to offices held by elders.

Election of Officers was had at this time. A motion to adjourn was entertained at this time and it was supported. Closed by singing, "My Jesus I Love Thee", dismissed by Rev. Rita Lee.

Thursday, June 21, 1962 - Afternoon Session

Devotions led by Rev. Glen Tabler. Prayer by Rev. Fabler. Song, "The Church in the Wildwood" and "Fothing But the Blood". Rev. Tabler spoke about how people will have to prove themselves in this Christian walk of life.

The Business Session was opened by Rev. Sheets and continued with election of officers.

Another discussion on the merger with the Pilgrim Holiness movement and a vote was taken, 19 yes and 1 no.

Rev. Eugene Ramsey was elected the Ministerial Delegate to General Conference. Ralph Tate elected as alternate. Lay Delegate Rev. Mary Howell. Alternate, Herbert Gates. Announcements were made by Rev. Ramsey. Motion to adjourn.

Thursday, June 21, 1962 - Evening Session

Devotions were led by Rev. T.P. Sanderson. Song "A Shelter in the Fime of Storm". Prayer by Rev. Sanders, Jr. Song, "Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus". Special song by Rev. Mary Howell, "Wonderful Peace". Rev. Ramsey presented Dr. Sheets who brought the message on 1 Timothy 4:12-16. Subject "Three great essentials of Life".

Take heed to the doctrine and to thyself and cause worth living for. Will there be faith on the earth when Jesus comes? Take courage God is still on the throne, ruling and reigning. We should strive for a self worth living with, strive for the cause that settles us in Christ and gives us strength to fight this battle against Satan and Sin.

Dr. Sheets gave the altar call. Song, "Lead me Guide Me". We had prayer around the altar and Jesus came in a mighty way and we all rejoiced. Song, "Just Tell Jesus" by Louis Miller. The offering was taken by Mrs. Orvil Davis and Elsie Strickland. Offering \$17.00. Announcements were made. Song, "Blest Be the Tie That Binds. Dismissed by Rev. Sheets. The conference was recessed Friday for Missionary Day.

Saturday, June 22, 1962 - Morning Session

Devotions were led by Rev. Anna Gilmer. Song, "The Solid Rock". Prayer by Thelma Adams. Scripture by Sister Gilmer on the 1st Epistle of John. We had a few remarks from Brother Sheets as he is leaving at this time.

He spoke of the great need of workers on the field and for the Conference to pray to the Lord of harvest to send workers into the fields and watch and be vigilart and commended us to Gods watchcare.

The business session was opened at 9:30 A.M. Roll call of ministers and delegates. Minutes of the last session were

read and adopted.

Rev. Herbert Gates gave the Treasurer's Report for Rev. C.A. Pauley, Conference Treasurer, who is ailing at this time. A letter from Rev. Pauley was read by the Secretary. Election of officers continued.

The Memorial Service was conducted at 11:00 A.M. by the Committee Song, "Asleep in Jesus" was sung followed with prayer by Rev. Sanderson. Song, "In the Sweet Bye and Bye". Reading of the deceased by Wrs. Orvil Davis. Rev. H.H. Sanders, Sr., brought the Eulogy. Song, "God Will Take Care of You", and "Pass Me Not". Rev. Sanderson dismissed the session.

Saturday, June 22, 1962 - Afternoon Session

Devotions were led by Rev. T.P. Sanderson. Song, "Faith is the Victory" was sung, followed with prayer by Rev. Sanders, Jr. Song, "Close to Thee".

The Eusiness Session was opened by the roll call of ministers and delegates. Minutes of the last session were read and adopted. A resolution was read from the Sunday School Board. The officers of the W.Y. were radified. A committee was elected to study the pension plan.

The Auditing Committee gave their report.

Rev. J.A. Cassidy is leaving the Tennessee work and going back to his own conference. The conference gave a rising vote of appreciation for his labor there.

It was decided to dedicate the 1962 conference minutes to Rev. and Sister Gilmer and their picture will be in them.

Rev. and Mrs. Manning and their son were presented to the conference and they brought greetings from Cadillac, Michigan. Seng, "Showers of Blessings".

The Committee on Moral Reform's Report was given by Herbert Gates.

The Fastor's gave their reports.

Bartlett, Ohio. - Rav. Ralph Tate also gave a report on the dining hall and the purchasing of ground for the dormitory.

The Committee on Pastorial Relations report was given in part by Brother Duare Hill.

Report from Bethel Springs, Tennessee was given by H.H. Sanders, Sr.

Dayton, Ohio had no report because of the illness of Rev. Fauley. He will report to the conference advisory board.

Hillsboro, Ohio report was given by Rev. Rita Les.

The Committee on Courtesy presented Ferrell fate and Phyllis Ramsey.

Long, Ohio report was given by Rev. Glen labler and he had a wonderful testimony.

Marietta, Ohio report was given by Rev. A.M. Gilmer.

Zanesville, Ohio report was given by Rav. P.P. Sandarson.

Pleasant Hill, Pennessee report was given by Rev. H.H. Sanders, Jr.

Indianapolis, Indiana report was given by Rev. Eugene Ramsey.

Parkersburg, West Virginia report was given by Rev. Mary Howell.

Cutler, Ohio report was given by Rev. Odbert Mayle.

Rev. Anna Gilmer gave a report on her work as assistant to Rev. Gilmer.

Afternoon Session was adjourned at 4:45 P.M. for supper.

Morning Service opened at 10:45 with devotions led by Mrs. Eugene Ramsey. Songs, "Jesus Saves" and "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart" were sung with prayer following and led by Rev. Ralph Tate. Song by the children of the church "Pass Me Not". Song, "We're Marching To Zion". Offering taken was \$37.11.

Rev. Ramsey presented Rev. H.H. Sanders, Jr. who brought the message on Job 3:12-16. Popic was "The Day of Decision. The day of decision is here, the multitudes are halted between two opinions. He brought a wonderful and inspiring message. The alter call was given by Rev. H.H. Sanders, Jr. Song, "In The Sweet Bye and Bye". Dismissed by Rev. Ralph Tate.

Sunday, June 23, 1962 - Afternoon Session Devotions were led by Rev. Mary Howell. Songs "Jesus I Love Thee" and Jesus is All the World to Me". Prayer by Rev. Odbert Mayle. Song, "We're Marching to Zion:

Rev. A.M. Gilmer presented Rev. Ramsey who brought the message from 2nd Kings. He spoke on our needs. We must have an anointed life and push on to the second work of grace, so our anchor will hold. We need to know we are a child of God.

Rev. H.H. Sanders, Jr. and Rev. T.P. Sanderson were ordained at this time. Song, "Blest Be the Fie That Binds", and the congregation gave the hand of fellowship. Song, "Leaning On Jesus". We had a few remarks of appreciation by Rev. Sanders, Sr. Offering was taken by Herbert Gates and

Rev. Glen Tabler. Offering was 59.00.

Appointment of Ministers and Deconesses. Dedication of conference officers. Rev. Tate announced the Sunday School Convention would be held August 16th through August 19th. Dismissed by Rev. F.P. Sanderson.
