A resolution pertaining to the report of the Pastor to the Quarterly Conference was presented and upon motion was adopted and instructions given to place it in the Resolutions and Laws of the Conference.

Rev. Demsey Howard of the Kentucky Conference and Rev. James A. Bain of the Lockport Conference were introduced to the Conference.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave the second reading of its report.

The Conference Treasurer read his report. Upon motion the report was adopted. See Report No. 19.

The Committee on Finance and Appropriation gave the third reading of its report. The report was adopted by the Conference. See Report No. 2.

The Committee on Elder's Orders gave its report. A motion prevailed to adopt the report. See Report No. 3.

The Southern and Northern Districts presented nominations for members of the Advisory Boards of the Superintendents of the Districts and upon motion they were elected. See names on page of Standing Committees.

Moved and supported that F. M. Foulke be elected as Conference Treasurer. Vestal VanMatre was elected as Superintendent of the Young People's Work in the Southern District and Glenn Appleman was elected to the same position in the Northern District.

A request from Anna Pike for a letter of standing was received. A motion prevailed that if Sister Pike finally decided to leave the Conference, that the President is authorized to grant her a letter.

Upon motion the amount of money left in the Group Insurance Fund, \$40.84, be applied on the \$500 which the Conference owes the Superannuated Fund.

Upon motion the two District Superintendents of the Y. P. work were elected on the Executive Committees of the Boards.

A motion prevailed that when we adjourn we adjourn to meet at the call of the Chair.

George B. Clay was elected to preach the opening sermon of the Conference next year. D. C. Dooley was chosen alternate.

A motion prevailed that the helper of the Treasurer shall receive \$10.00 for labor.

Upon motion the time of the next Annual Conference was fixed as August 17, 1931, the Tuesday nearest the middle of the month.

The following resolution was presented and upon motion was adopted:

Whereas, Since, during the year, circuits may wish to sell or exchange parsonage properties and it may be needful to exchange church properties; therefore be it

Resolved, That the Board of Trustees be and are hereby empowered to make and execute all such deeds, and that when ordered the President and Secretary of the Conference are empowered to sign and transfer such deeds, and the Secretary shall record the sale of such properties in the journal after the words: "The Indiana Yearly Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church (or Connection) of America has ordered the sale of the following."

A motion prevailed that the Treasurer be authorized to purchase a journal for the use of the Secretary in recording the minutes.

J. J. Coleman resigned as Camp Meeting Reporter and the resignation was accepted and Harold Sloan was elected in his place.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave final report. The report was adopted. See Report No. 13.

The minutes were read and approved. Adjournment upon motion. After a few remarks by the President and Vice-President the Conference closed with a general hand-shaking.

## RESOLUTIONS AND LAWS OF THE INDIANA CONFERENCE

---

1. It is contrary to the spirit of the Discipline and our principles for our preachers to assist in any service with oath-bound societies.
2. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be open to any evangelist or minister of any other church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments. Any waiving of the above resolution by a contract or lease of building must be obtained through the Board of Trustees of the Indiana Conference.
3. Whereas, We have a scholastic standard for our preachers, and whereas those saved, sanctified and called among our own numbers are compelled to meet these requirements before ordination: Be it resolved, That the Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders shall require all those desiring to unite with us from any other denomination or Annual Conference to present credits equivalent to our Conference Course of Study, regardless of their standing in the body of which they have been a member, and if they cannot do this they shall be required to meet the same conditions as our local preachers before ordination.
4. That any candidate for Elder's Orders or traveling under the direction of the Conference, who fails to attend the Institutes and the examinations of the Committee, without sufficient cause, shall be deemed unworthy of the trust and care of souls, and refused a place among us as a minister of the Gospel, and when they shall fail to attend the Institute for two successive years they shall be dropped from the roll.
5. The Committee on Elder's Orders is hereby to transfer all persons to the study list who may have been recommended to travel and may not have been given work.
6. Whereas, The Discipline requires that the Stewards must meet the Pastors and agree as to the amount necessary for their support; Be it resolved, That the circuits may at the same time enter into an agreement in writing with the Pastor as to the service he is to render to the church. In case the Pastor shall fail to render such services,

unless providentially hindered or released by the circuit, said failure shall be considered a sufficient cause to make an adjustment of the amount originally agreed upon. Otherwise the contract shall be binding upon both parties the same as any other financial obligation entered into by contracting parties.

7. The membership, so far as possible, shall pay all their contributions for the Conference and Connectional interests to the Pastors, who shall receipt them for the same and see that it is paid to the proper authorities. Where money is paid direct to the Conference Treasurer by the membership, he shall send a duplicate receipt to the pastor of the charge where such persons are members.

8. All charges with a membership of twenty-five or more shall in addition to the regular stipulated salary, assume the responsibility of providing a suitable home in which the Pastor may live.

9. Be it resolved, That it shall be the duty of the Pastors to look after the insurance of our church and parsonage properties. All insurance shall provide for losses caused by fire and lightning, hail and tornado. A failure on the part of the Pastor shall be a censurable offense. If the church fails to insure their property upon reasonable effort of the Pastor to secure the same, then said failure shall be reported to the President of the Conference who shall then have the property insured. In such case all insurance monies received from losses by fire, lightning, hail and tornado shall be used in Church Extension work as the Conference Board of Trustees deems best.

10. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the Pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said Pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary; provided this shall not interfere with the previous arrangements between Pastors and charges. That where the Conference demands the services of any one, that it shall bear the moving expenses, if any expense shall thus be incurred.

11. Each Pastor shall file a duplicate statistical report with the Committee before the close of the second day of Conference, said report to be kept on file one year, and hereafter these reports shall not be read in open Conference. The official character of no Pastor shall be passed until he shall have submitted a satisfactory report, including statistics.

12. All unaccounted for members appearing in the statistics in the membership list shall be transferred to the discontinued list. All

members in excess of the number reported shall be reported received. The roll of all the classes upon the charges shall be put in the hands of the Pastors and they shall have charge of the same and make all entries therein.

13. It shall be a standing rule of this Conference until revoked by vote that the President shall receive \$35.00, the Secretary \$50.00, the Assistant Secretary \$25.00, and each member of the Statistical Committee \$25.00, each member of the Auditing Committee \$10.00, Assistant to the Treasurer \$10.00, the same to be apportioned pro rata among the various funds of the Conference.

14. It shall be a standing rule until revoked by this body that the President shall nominate his Advisory Board and the Conference shall elect his nominations.

15. It shall be a standing rule of this Conference that in the examination of character the Conference officials shall be called first.

16. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be elected as follows: One for three years, one for two years, and one for one year, and that the person elected for three years be chairman of the Committee, and that hereafter each member be elected for a term of three years.

17. It shall be a standing rule of this Conference until revoked by vote that the Conference Sunday School Secretary receive \$50.00, and each of the other members of the Conference Sunday School Board receive \$25.00, the same to be paid out of the Conference Sunday School Treasury.

18. Be it resolved, That if any lay-member of the church shall be guilty of immorality, and later be brought to repentance; that they shall not be put into any position of public leadership in the church, either by election or appointment, until after at least two consecutive years of exemplary Christian life.

19. The Pastor shall bring to each Quarterly Meeting a fully itemized report of his labors during the quarter. The report shall be itemized as follows: 1. Number of sermons preached. 2. Number of prayer meetings attended. 3. Number of other services held. 4. Amount of cash salary received. 5. Amount of gifts and donations. 6. Number of pastoral calls. 7. Number of members received in full relationship, in associate relationship.

## REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE

### No. 2

Your Committee on Finance and Appropriation respectfully submit the following recommendations:

1. That the present plan of District Superintendents and Advisory Committees be continued.
2. That the President shall have general oversight of the work of the Conference and coöperate with the District Superintendents in planning and carrying on their work.
3. We recommend that the President hold at least one Quarterly Meeting on each Charge during the year and that each District Superintendent with the Pastors shall arrange for the remaining Quarterly Meetings, providing that a Conference Official hold the first and fourth Quarterly Meeting on each Charge.
4. The salary of the Conference President shall be \$1600.00 and expenses incident to his work. The salary of each District Superintendent shall be \$1400.00 and their expenses, which shall not exceed \$200.00. These salaries to be paid monthly.
5. That the District Superintendents so arrange their quarterly Meetings that part of their time can be given to Evangelistic Work in their respective districts. They shall also coöperate with the Pastors in raising their apportionment on Conference Claims, which, with

all funds received by them, shall be turned to the Conference Treasurer, who shall disburse all funds.

6. We recommend that all Charges which have not raised the 15 cents per member apportionment for General Conference Delegate Fund shall do so and send to the Conference Treasurer by January 1, 1931.

7. We recommend that the amount of \$1.50 per member be apportioned to each charge on Conference Claims, this amount to be forwarded monthly to the Conference Treasurer. Charges that do not adopt the monthly payment plan shall raise the amount of Quarterly Meeting Appointment as per schedule, this amount to apply on Conference Claims.

8. We recommend that all Pastors take a liberal offering for the Superannuated Minister's Fund to take care of the present needs. We further recommend that the Conference Treasurer proceed to collect outstanding obligations to this fund.

9. We recommend that our churches adopt the tithing or budget plan in raising of funds and that the Connectional apportionments be paid quarterly.

10. We recommend that each General Conference Delegate shall receive \$20.00 to defray expenses to the General Conference.

## REPORT OF THE GENERAL SECRETARY OF THE BURIAL ASSOCIATION

### No. 4

It affords me great pleasure to make the first report of our Burial Association. By order of the Board of Directors our books were closed July 31, 1930, to allow a little time to get out our annual report. Under the blessings of God we have functioned ten months, with fourteen deaths, for which assessments have been sent out. The total paid out by those who have been paying from the beginning has been two dollars and eighty cents (\$2.80). This makes approximately twenty-eight cents (28 cts) a month, or about seven cents a week.

Your Secretary has mailed more than eight thousand (8,000) postal card notices, written and sent out more than twelve hundred letters. We have worked more than two hundred eight-hour days. Fifteen hundred and twenty-four (1524) have joined the Association during the

year. One hundred and fifty-seven (157) have been dropped by request, failure to pay assessments, or for leaving the church. Thirty-three are on probation, who have promised to pay soon. This leaves the splendid total of thirteen hundred and twenty (1320) active paid up members after further subtracting the names of the fourteen who have died during this time.

## BURIAL ASSOCIATION

### No. 6

Constitution and By-Laws of the Burial Association of the Wesleyan  
Methodist Connection (or Church) of America of 1929  
and Amended of 1930

#### Article I.—Name of Association

This Association shall be known as the Burial Association of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America.

#### Article II.—Object

The object and purpose of this Association shall be to provide a burial for the members of this Association, according to the By-laws of the Association.

#### Article III.—Officers and Their Duties

1. This Association shall have a Board of seven Directors, elected by the members of the Association, to care for the business of the Association. Each Director to serve for a term of two years, or until their successors are elected.

2. As soon as said Board is elected by the Association, they shall meet and elect a President, Vice-President, General Secretary, Treasurer and Field Representative. The President so elected shall be Chairman of the Board and shall have the power at any time to call a meeting of the Board to transact business for the Association.

3. It shall be the duty of the Vice-President to act as President in the case of the death or resignation of the President.

4. It shall be the duty of the General Secretary of said Board to keep a record of the membership of the Association, of its meetings, etc., and upon the death of any of its members, he shall notify all the members of the Association by mail, giving the amount of assessment each member shall pay for burial of said member. Postage, receiving cards, traveling expense for special service, to be paid out of the Association treasury.

5. The Treasurer of said Board shall give bond to the penal sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000), said bond to be conditioned for the well and faithful handling of all money by said Treasurer, and for his prompt and faithful accounting thereof, and paying of all money truly and promptly to his successor in office. The General Secretary and Treasurer shall each make a full and detailed report to the Association and the Annual Conference.

6. All the officers of said Association are to serve without compensation, except the General Secretary and Treasurer. The amount to be paid the General Secretary shall be determined and fixed by the Association. The Treasurer and the eligible members of his family shall be exempt from all assessments in said Association during his term of office.

### Article IV.—Local Secretary

1. It shall be the duty of the churches to see that competent local Secretaries are elected.

2. It shall be the duty of the local Secretary to keep a correct list of all members of his or her local church, in the Burial Association, and collect assessments and send same to the General Secretary of the Association, with names of those who pay and those who fail to pay.

3. He shall also send certificate of deceased member, with notification and date of death and name of person to whom money is to be paid, to the General Secretary. The General Secretary shall draft notices of death, and send them to all members, and at the expiration of thirty days (30) shall notify the President of the Board, the total amount collected under each assessment. The President will immediately issue an order to the Treasurer, to pay the amount of said claim to the beneficiary.

4. The local Secretary shall pay postage and cost of money order from the assessment money, said expense must be specified in the report to the General Secretary.

5. All local burial Association Secretaries shall report in full at each quarterly meeting of their local church.



## WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

### Article V.—Membership

The condition of membership in this Burial Association, shall be as follows:

1. No person shall be eligible to membership, who is above seventy years of age.

2. Unmarried children of the members of the Wesleyan Methodist Church over the age of six months and under twenty-one years of age.

3. The husband or wife of a member of the Wesleyan Methodist Church.

4. No one will be accepted as a member of this Association, who is afflicted by, or closely affiliated with a contagious disease.

5. If a member of this Association be such member by virtue of being a child of a member of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, his membership in this Association shall cease upon his or her marriage to one who is not a member of said church, or upon his or her attaining the age of twenty-years, unless he or she is at that time a member of said church.

6. If a member of this Association is such member by the virtue of the membership in said church of his or her husband or wife such membership in this Association shall cease upon the death of such husband or wife, who is a member of the said church.

7. If a member of this Association is member by virtue of his membership in the Wesleyan Methodist Church, and thereafter his or her relation with such church is severed for any cause, his or her membership in this Association shall thereupon cease at the time his relation with the church is severed. It shall be the duty of the Advisory Board of each local church to furnish a list of the names of all members of the Association dropped from the local church, for any cause, which list shall be certified to by the pastor and the church clerk, and shall be sent to the General Secretary of the Burial Association, immediately following the action of the church body.

8. Persons being received to membership in this Burial Association shall pay entrance fees as follows:

- a. Between the ages of six months and ten years twenty-five cents (25 cts).
- b. Between the ages of eleven years and twenty years, fifty cents (50 cts).
- c. Between the ages of twenty-one years and thirty years, seventy-five cents (75 cts).
- d. Between the ages of thirty-one years and forty years, one dollar (\$1).

- e. Between the ages of 41 years and fifty years, one dollar and twenty-five cents (\$1.25).
- f. Between the ages of fifty-one years, and sixty years, two dollars (\$2).
- g. Between the ages of sixty-one years and seventy years, three dollars (\$3).

These fees shall constitute a fund for the necessary expenses in carrying on the work of the Association, and for use in case of epidemics.

### Article VI.—Death Benefits

1. Upon the death of a member of this Association in good standing there shall be paid to the surviving husband, wife, or beneficiary a funeral benefit of an amount equal to twenty dollars (\$20) for each one hundred (100) members of this Association, who fully pay their assessments less the expense of collecting, provided the maximum benefit shall not exceed three hundred dollars (\$300).

### Article VII.—Assessment of Members

1. Upon the death of a member of this Association an amount of twenty cents (20 cts) shall be levied upon each member of this Association for funeral benefits of such deceased member. This amount of assessment shall continue until the number of members shall become large enough to warrant the Directors in reducing it. All assessments shall be sent to the General Secretary of this Association, who will give proper credits, and shall turn all money so collected over to the Treasurer of this Association.

2. All assessments, where there is a local Secretary, shall be paid to such local Secretary.

3. If a member of this Association fails to pay any assessment within thirty days after receiving notice of such assessment, his or her membership in this Association shall thereupon cease, and he or she shall not be entitled to receive any funeral benefits from this Association.

4. Postage stamps shall not be accepted for membership fees or any assessment of this Association.

### Article VIII.—Change of Address or Beneficiary

1. It shall be the duty of each member of this Association to notify the General Secretary of any change of his or her postoffice address, and if such member changes his or her postoffice address and fails to so notify such Secretary his or her membership in this Association shall thereupon cease.

2. Persons being received into membership of this Association shall name the beneficiary, to whom the funeral benefits shall be paid. In event of changing the name of the beneficiary, a fee of ten cents (10 cts) shall be paid to the General Secretary, to cover the cost of making changes on the records.

### Article IX.—Meetings of the Association

1. There shall be a meeting of the members of this Association for the election of Directors, and any other business that may demand attention held every two years, beginning with August 1930, at the time and place of the annual session of the Indiana Conference, of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America. Said meeting shall consist of all the members of the Association who are present and voting. Special meetings may be called by the President, or two Directors at any time when the interests of the Association shall require.

2. In the case of a vacancy in the Board of Directors, said vacancy shall be filled by the remaining members of the Board, at a meeting called for said purpose.

3. An executive Committee of the Board of Directors shall be elected by the full Board, for the transaction of such business as shall be proper for them to transact, and in harmony with the authorization of the full Board.

### Article X

1. The Constitution and By-laws of this Association, shall be subject to change and amendment by a majority vote of the members of the Association present and voting, at any of the regular or specially called meeting for that purpose, due notice having been given through the Wesleyan Methodist.

2. All members of this Association, accept this Constitution and By-laws subject to any changes that may be made.

### REPORT OF CONFERENCE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD

#### No. 11

First. We have found that the plan of organizing the Sunday School Board for work into three parts and each member of the Board specializing for work in his department has proven more satisfactory than the old plan. Therefore we recommend its continuance. Rev. H. T. Hawkins as Superintendent of those ranging in age up to thirteen. F. O. Spitler from thirteen up to twenty-five, and E. J. Pitts from twenty-five on up.

Second. The two districts were divided into two sections each, viz., Eastern and Western sections. This plan seems quite satisfactory. Splendid conventions were held in each of the sections, with the presence of the Spirit manifestly present. Splendid interest was shown in each convention.

Third. Offerings were taken at each convention to defray the traveling expenses of the Board.

Fourth. Two classes in teacher training work are now proceeding toward the finish, one at Plymouth and one at Larwill. We wish to encourage this work and ask that it be pushed in each district.

Fifth. We recommend that the divisions remain as they were last year, only placing a separate Superintendent of the work in each division as follows:

Northern District—Eastern Division, C. G. Payne; Western Division, Amos Jackson.

Southern District—Eastern Division, J. J. Coleman; Western Division, Vestal VanMatre.

Sixth. We recommend that the Sunday Schools continue to pay ten cents per member of the total enrollment, to be divided as before for Conference and General Conference work.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

No. 14

We, your Committee on Resolutions, desire to submit the following report:

We deplore the awful crime wave of immorality and Sabbath desecration that is sweeping over the land. Since the prevailing fashions in dress are immodest and have a tendency to immorality, we insist that our people dress as becometh women professing holiness, and that our ministers preach against this great evil. Since the Sabbath day was set apart and hallowed by our Lord and Saviour as a day of rest and worship, be it resolved that our people refrain from all social gatherings that do not tend to the worship of God.

In view of the fact that there might be a possibility of some of our people being deceived as to the doctrine of Regeneration and Entire Sanctification by the preaching about these doctrines, instead of actually preaching them we urge our people to a careful study of the Word of God, for the Bible is the only text-book for teaching and preaching.

The Bible is the Word of God. It contains a complete revelation of His will to all mankind, and it gives the only rational account of man and his origin. We should note the wonderful influence the Bible has had upon the world. It is sufficient for every need of mankind. It has manifested its inherent energy to regenerate human lives and lead them into the likeness and image of God, and only He who made man and knew perfectly his heart could have made a book suited to his every need. Therefore we urge the daily devotional reading of the Word of God, which highly exalts the human heart and life.

We firmly believe that the laws of our land have a restraining influence upon the actions of men and that there would be more crime committed were it not for the law. Yet we do believe in a great measure lawlessness and crime, and a lack of law enforcement, are due to the fact that men do not come under the preaching of the Gospel, which Gospel is opposed to all sin. Therefore be it our aim to nominate and elect men to office who will seek earnestly to enforce our laws, including the Eighteenth Amendment, to secure peace and safety to our people.

We urge that dues be brought in as early in the year as possible and disbursements be made to the Conference Treasurer either monthly or quarterly.

We insist on the Mission Study or an interesting program at least once a month in the homes, and urge four public meetings during the year.

Members should give or lay aside a free-will offering for each meeting during the year, whether present or absent.

If desired, work meetings may be held between study meetings, each Society adopting plan of work suitable to its community.

We recommend that a liberal donation of fruits and vegetables be sent from each Society to Marion College on Harvest Day.

We urge the use of thank offering and self-denial boxes, the same to be opened as designated on boxes or at public meetings.

We recommend the giving of birthday and spiritual birthday offerings.

We desire that this Plan of Work be read in each Society and prayerfully carried out.
