#### PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

To the members of the Alabama Conference:

It is with joy and gratitude to God, that we assemble for this, the thirty-sixth annual session of the Alabama Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. With the secession of hostilities and the returning of our young men we have experienced joys and hopes beyond expression but the second characteristics and the second content of the second conten sion, but there is, and should be, also a consciousness of our great obliga-tion to those who were our enemies but are now our neighbors. Let us pray and work that this period of peace may be a time of great ingathering of souls and of spreading the gospel of full salvation throughout the world.

This has been a year of definite progress with many of our churches. Good revivals have been reported with goodly numbers seeking and obtaining holiness of heart. I have greatly enjoyed the fellowship and mutual understanding with the pastors and churches, which the more frequent contacts have made possible. I have held the four quarterly conferences of the various charges. I have assisted some of the pastors in planning pioneer tent meetings and have held four revivals. In connection with this work I have preached 227 times. The fellowing is a report

of my official acts during the year.

December 11, 1944, I received the resignation of H. F. Pair as pastor of Nixon Chapel church, and on January 29, 1945, I appointed E.

L. Shigley, Jr., pastor of that church. February 23, 1945, I received the resignation of Harry D. Clark

as pastor of Ada Chapel church.

March 14, 1945, I received the resignation of L. A. Bamburg as pastor of the Akron church, and on April 15, 1945, I appointed W. B.

Hill as pastor of that church,
May 2, 1945, I received the resignation of Mrs. Frances Ray Allred
as pastor of the Bessemer church, and on June 1, 1945, I appointed
Wardner Medders pastor of that church.

June 15, 1945, I received the resignation of Frank W. Warren of

Springdale church because of his entry into the service of his country as an army chaplain.

June 21, 1945, I received the resignation of C. H. Pickel as pastor of Jasper church.

July 1, 1945, I received the resignation of E. L. Shigley, Jr., as pastor of Nixon Chapel church.

August 14, 1945, I appointed Woodrow Crews as pastor of the Jasper

church.

September 8, 1945, I appointed Charles R. Tegen pastor of Nixon Chapel church.

September 28, 1945, I appointed the chairmen of the various session

October 1, 1945, granted a letter of transfer to E. L. Shigley, Jr., to

the South Carolina conference.

October 5, 1945, I appointed members of the Nominating Committee and called the committee to meet Oct. 24, 1945, at 8:00 a.m. at the Pell City church.

Finances are as follows: Salary, \$1,600.00; travel expense, \$300.00; Gifts and Evangelistic receipts, \$267.10; Rent, \$270.00; Total receipts,

\$2,437.10.

#### FINANCE COMMITTEE

We, your Committee on Finance, submit the following report: We recommend that the President hold the four quarterly meetings and that he be given four months time for church extension and evange-listic work with a salary of \$1600.00, and an additional \$500.00 for travel expense, and the item of travel expense be paid \$200.00 of the assessed President's salary and \$300.00 paid from the Conference Missions fund. We also recommend the salary to be paid monthly and that no gifts or offerings be applied on quarterly meeting salary. We also recom-mend that churches be assessed \$2.50 pe rchurch more than the last year's amount. We recommend that the conference and connectional budget be assigned on the basis per member as follows: Foreign Mis-sions, \$2.00; Home Missions, \$1.00; Orphanage, \$25c; Education, \$1.50; Conference Missions, \$1.00; Minutes, 7c; Superannuated Ministers, 50c. We also recommend that the President's Home be assessed \$1.00 per member so this indebtedness may be liquidated during this conference and that he be given four months time for church extension and evangemember so this indebtedness may be liquidated during this conference year to save the enormous amount of interest. We further recommend the churches be assessed 5c per member for General Conference traveling expense.

#### TITHING SECRETARY

In view of the blessing and benefit resulting from this initial effort it is recommended that a similar practice of observing a conference Stewardship Sunday be continued each year and that it be the duty of future tithing secretaries to secure an up-to-date yearly tithing roll of the conference and that this roll be posted at Conference. It is suggested that membership in the Tithing League not be confined to members of our churches but be open to any members of our congregations who will pledge to tithe.

It shall be the duty of each retiring Tithing Secretary to present a copy of the tithing roll to his successor and inform him of the duties mentioned above.
