Resolved: That the Board of Conference Trustees, together with the President, be and they are hereby empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, etc., in order to secure loans for any church needing funds to liquidate church property indebtedness.

Resolved: That this Conference require all deeds of houses of worship and parsonages built from this time forth, to be made to the Alabama Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America. All property held by said Conference is to be used by our ministry and membership, according to our Book of Discipline.

Resolved: Second, That we, as preachers and laymen of said Conference, recognize no request for help to build any church-house where deeds are not made as above required.

Resolved: Third, That the President and his Advisory Board be made a Deed Examining Committee for the Conference, and that as soon as a deed is made, before it is recorded, it be sent to this Committee for its approval and for the insertion of such disciplinary clauses and matter that may be needed to make it safe for our Connection.

A resolution was also adopted petitioning the General Conference to instruct its Committee on the Course of Study to seek a substitute for Miley's Theology.

A resolution was adopted petitioning the General Conference to reaffirm its belief in the doctrine of entire sanctification as a separate definite second work of Grace.

A resolution was also adopted requesting the Secretary to send a petition to our government, asking that we require the Turkish Government to cease their cruel treatment of the Armenians.

A resolution was adopted asking the Conference to observe the nights of December 1st, and September 1st, from 8:30 to 12:00 P. M.
