Journal of Daily Proceedings

The Lockport Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened for its fifty-seventh annual session in the Hess Road Wesleyan Methodist Church, April 10, 1918, at 9 A. M.

On the previous evening a Gospel sermon was preached by Rev. H. R. La Vere.

The Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. J. R. Babcock, and devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. S. W. Jennings, of the Rochester Conference.

Rev. W. W. Rolf was made Committee on Credentials.

Committee on Credentials made partial report and the names were placed on the Roll.

In the absence of credentials from Short Tract, Charles Slade was seated as a delegate from said charge.

The President appointed as Committee on Nominations for temporary organization, G. H. Clarke, W. W. Rolf, Charles Sicard.

The bar of the Conference was made to include the first five slips across the body of the church.

After a brief recess the Conference was again called to order and the Committee on Nominations for temporary organization reported. The report was considered item by item and adopted. See Report No. 1.

Rev. Charles Sicard was called to the chair while the President made his official report, which was considered item by item and adopted as read. See Report No. 2.

The time for opening and closing Conference meetings was fixed as follows: Morning meetings to open at 9 A. M. and close at 11:30 A. M. The afternoon meetings to begin at 1:30 P. M. and close by vote. Rev. James Elliott was made Conference Reporter.

The election of Conference officers was made the order of the day for Thursday morning immediately following the devotional exercises.

A recess was taken for committee work.

Conference adjourned by limitation of time.

First Day-Afternoon Meeting-April 10

The Conference was called to order by the President. Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. G. H. Clarke.

After the calling of the roll the minutes were read and approved. Rev. J. S. Willett, Connectional Agent and Treasurer; Rev. David Greene, of the North Michigan Conference; Rev. and Mrs. C. B. Harvey, Missionaries to India, and Rev. J. D. Russell, of the Rochester Conference, were introduced and made appropriate remarks.

All special orders were referred to the Committee on Religious Services.

A recess was taken for committee work, after which the Conference was again called to order, and the Committee on Credentials presented names, which were added to the roll.

Committee on Religious Services announced as special orders: Connectional Interests, Rev. J. S. Willett, Friday afternoon after devotional exercises; Education, J. S. Luckey, Saturday afternoon, after devotional exercises.

Conference adjourned by vote.

Second Day-Morning Meeting-April 11

The Conference was called to order by the President and devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. J. S. Willett.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

The order of the day having arrived, the President appointed G. H. Clarke and E. L. Carnahan tellers.

The whole number of votes cast for President was twenty-eight, of which Rev. J. R. Babcock received twenty-eight and was declared elected.

The whole number of votes cast for Vice-President was thirty, of which Rev. Charles Sicard received eighteen and was declared elected.

The whole number of votes cast for Secretary was thirty-one, of which Dean S. Bedford received twenty-eight and was declared elected.

The whole number of votes cast for Treasurer was thirty-three, of which H. R. La Vere received thirty-two and was declared elected.

The Secretary was instructed to cast the ballot of the Confer-

ence for W. W. Rolf for Tithing Secretary, and he was declared elected.

The Secretary was instructed to cast the ballot of the Conference for G. H. Clarke for Sunday School Secretary, and he was declared elected.

Three Trustees were to be elected, each for a term of three years. On the first ballot the whole number of votes cast was thirty-two, of which Walter Readett received twenty-six and was declared elected.

On the second ballot the whole number of votes cast was thirty-two, of which Dean S. Bedford received twenty-five and was declared elected.

On the third ballot the whole number of votes cast was thirtythree, of which Ernest B. Houghton received twenty-nine and was declared elected.

On motion the President was authorized to appoint a committee on nominations for the standing committees. The President appointed G. H. Clarke, W. W. Rolf and Charles Sicard.

On motion the Secretary was instructed to cast the ballot of the Conference for James Elliott for Assistant Secretary, and he was declared elected.

The Judiciary Committee presented a report which was adopted as read. See Report No. 3. See also Official Ledger, page 343.

The report of the Committee on Evangelism was received and adopted. See Report No. 4.

The Committee on Credentials reported two names, which were placed on the roll.

The Committee on Nominations reported through Rev. W. W. Rolf. The report was considered item by item and adopted as read. See lists.

The advisability of the purchase of a tent by the Conference was discussed at some length.

The Conference adjourned by limitation of time.

Second Day-Afternoon Meeting-April 11

The Conference was called to order by the President and devotional exercises were conducted by Charles Sicard.

The roll was called and the minutes were read and approved.

Rev. J. F. Brown, of Michigan, was introduced to the Conference.

The statistical report from Cameron charge was presented by Rev. J. D. Russell.

An invitation was received from Levant charge to hold the next session of the Conference at that place. On motion the invitation

was accepted.

Reports concerning Holiness and Sunday School Conventions were called for by districts. Rev. W. W. Rolf reported for the first district, that three conventions were held, with good interest and results. H. R. La Vere reported for the second district that no conventions were held. D. H. Scott reported for the third district that no conventions were held. The fourth district was represented by L. C. Mattoon; no convention was held.

Rev. C. B. Harvey made stirring remarks, appealing for interest and definite effort in behalf of the soldier boys in our training camps.

The Conference ordered the publication and distribution of 300 copies of the Conference minutes.

Adjourned by vote

Third Day-Morning Meeting-April 12

Report No. 2.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

Through the tender mercies of our Heavenly Father we are privileged to meet again in our annual gathering for the purpose of reviewing the work of the past year and laying our plans for the activities of the future.

As we recall the past, there are some things for which we have reason to be very grateful to Him whom we serve and has given us a place to work in His vineyard. One of which is the fact that

none of our workers have been taken from us by death. Another is, that the Holy Spiirt has been setting His seal of approbation upon our efforts in the conversion of sinners and the sanctification of believers so that we may be encouraged, knowing that our labors have not been in vain. Death has claimed some of our laity and no doubt the world, the flesh and the devil has captured others; but we believe that the statistics will show some gain in church membership.

Undoubtedly the experiences of the past will suggest the need of improvement along some lines, and I trust that ere this session closes, steps will be taken to effect more aggressive work on some of our charges.

1. At your last Conference, your Committee on Traveling President recommended that if arrangements could be made, your President should devote all his time in traveling the Conference; but if such arrangements could not be made, then he should devote such a portion of his time as he could.

We have been able only to comply with the second part of this recommendation, and in doing so have labored seven Sundays and thirty-one week days.

- The following charges were left under the care of the President: Cameron, Holland, and Napoli. The last two charges not being able to support a pastor have been left unsupplied.
- 3. Delevan and Machias were placed in care of Francis B. Markell by appointment of President. On account of school duties Francis B. Markell resigned and Earl Barrett was appointed pastor of this charge October 1.
- 4. Roulett Charge was placed in care of Rev. O. Glen Mc-Kinley by appointment of President, and on July 5th he tendered his resignation and it was accepted. This work was investigated, and in our judgment it was not thought wise to invest any more Conference money in that place under existing conditions. Therefore the work has not been supplied since that date.
- 5. The Rev. J. D. Russell was appointed pastor of the Cameron charge and his services have been very acceptable.
- 6. On request the Rev. E. S. Davidson tendered his resignation as pastor of the Ellicott charge, and the Rev. J. A. Mann and wife weer appointed pastors of said charge.
 - 7. Granted letters of standing to the Rev. H. W. McDowell.
 - 8. The Rev. C. B. Whitaker, on account of having taken work

in the Michigan Conference, resigned all his offices in the Lockport Conference.

The Rev. J. J. Coleman was appointed to fill the offices of Sunday School Secretary and member of the Sunday School Board.

The Rev. Charles Sicard was appointed to fill the vacancy in the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

- 9. Mr. James Robinson and Mr. E. L. Carnahan were appointed lay members of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.
- 10. The Rev. E. H. Johnson was granted a letter of transfer to the Rochester Conference.
- 11. The following persons have been authorized to administer the Sacraments and solemnize matrimony: E. S. Davidson, D. H. Scott, William Donaldson, A. J. Taylor and James Elliott.
- 12. At the time of our annual camp meeting the Rev. Sarah C. Wilcox was taken sick and for a time the work at Short Tract was supplied by Rev. H. J. Bullock and students from Houghton Seminary; but for about four months that charge has been without authorized preaching.

COMMITTEE ON TRAVELING PRESIDENT.

Your Committee to whom was referred the matter of defining the salary and duties of the traveling President, begs leave to submit the following report:

We recommend:

1. That the salary shall be \$800.00 and traveling expenses.

2. That this salary shall be paid from the Conference Budget, but that the President shall be authorized to raise as much as possible of this when he visits the charges. The President shall receipt to the pastors for all money thus received, and the pastors may present these receipts to the Conference Treasurer in payment of the Conference Budget.

3. The President shall be paid monthly and may draw on the Conference Treasurer for balance not received from the charges.

4. The President shall visit each charge at least once during the year.

5. The President may have two weeks' vacation and shall

spend the remainder of his time other than already specified, visiting the charges, and in evangelistic work within the bounds of the Conference, under the direction of a Committee composed of the Standing Committee on Evangelism and the Advisory Board.

COMMITTEE ON ORDER OF BUSINESS.

Your Committee on Order of Business begs leave to submit the following report:

Whereas, much time is unnecessarily consumed by our present method of handling the credentials of Delegates; and, whereas, we consider that a fundamental principle of our Church policy is slightly violated by Elders taking upon themselves the authority to say who shall be seated as delegates, when the Discipline, Article 94, states that duly elected delegates are as much members of the Conference by election as are the Elders. Therefore, we recommend that hereafter the credentials of all delegates be forwarded by the pastors immediately to the Conference Secretary, and by him be placed on the Conference roll without Conference action, except in cases of irregularity.

We also recommend that no financial reports be presented to this Conference until passed by the Auditing Committee.

We also recommend that the pastors be required to have their statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee not later than the second day of Conference session, and that our present custom of reading statistical reports be omitted.

We also recommend that the Conference President be authorized to appoint in the interim of Conference a Committee on Nominations for Temporary Organization; such Committee to report immediately following the first roll call.

COMMITTEE ON BUDGET.

- 1. The part of the Budget for Education is \$1,000.00, and all money paid for current expenses of Houghton Seminary, all paid on Educational pledges for Houghton Seminary, and all interest (but not principal) paid on Educational notes for Houghton Seminary, and all money raised on Educational Day by the Y. M. W. B. may count toward this Budget.
- 2. The part of the Budget for Home and Foreign Missions is \$1,000.00, and all money paid for current expenses for Home and Foreign Missions, all money appropriated for this purpose by the W. H. & F. M. Society, and all money paid by the Y. M. W. B. may be counted toward this Budget.
- 3. We recommend that the part of the Budget for Conference be \$1,500.00, that nothing but cash may count toward this Budget, and that this amount shall cover all .Conference expenses, except the funds for Superannuated Ministers.

- 4. We recommend that the charges raise all three parts of the Budget as a whole; that this total Budget shall be raised and paid over quarterly; that for all money not paid to the Conference Treasurer a duplicate receipt shall be given, which receipt shall be given to the Conference Treasurer; that it shall be optional with each charge to divide this total Budget or to pay it over undivided, and that undivided parts must be paid to the Conference Treasurer.
- 5. If a charge divided its total Budget, we recommend that this rule be followed: All money designed by the donor shall be placed in the fund designated, but all money not designated by the donor shall be so distributed that, so far as possible, each fund, including the sums designated for that fund, shall have the same per cent of its apportionment. This rule shall apply until each fund is complete; after that the charge shall divide as it sees fit.
- 6. We recommend that the Conference Treasurer be instructed to remit to the Connectional Treasurer at least quarterly all money received definitely for Educational, or definitely for Missionary work, but that undivided Budget may be retained until it is evident where it will be needed to maintain a balance between the benevolences, and should then be distributed so as to maintain this balance.
- 7. We recommend that no charge shall receive credit on its Budget except for cash or receipts sent to the Conference Treasurer.
- 8. We recommend that each pastor shall include in his statistical report these items: Total Budget assigned, and total Budget raised; that the second item shall not be filled in till the pastor has settled with the Conference Treasurer, and that the account placed in this second item shall be the amount reported to the pastor by the Conference Treasurer.
- 9. We recommend that the Conference authorize each pastor to hand the Budget Committee at the next Annual Conference a list of the members of his charge under sixteen years of age, provided he declares that he knows personally each one on the list is under sixteen. This list shall then be deducted from the number determining Budget apportionment on that charge.
- 10. We recommend that Ellicott, Higgins, and Olean be rated at three-fourths membership; that Bradford, Cameron, Wyoming, and Short Tract be rated at one-half membership; that Delevan and Machias, Holland and Napoli be rated at one-fourth membership, and that the total Budget be then apportioned pro rata. On this basis the apportionment is as follows:

Our findings are as follows:

1. The Chestnut Ridge Church has not fulfilled its financial

obligation to the pastor.

2. The Chestnut Ridge Church having referred to the Committee on Pastoral Relations at Conference held at Houghton, N. Y., in the month of April, 1917, matters involving the deficit in the pastor's salary for the year 1916 and 1917, the following agreement was entered into by the Committee and Henry R. Barnett to adjust the situation:

- 1. H. R. Barnett agreed to pay the deficit of \$122.61 due on salary of year 1916-1917. This amount has been paid.
- 2. Henry R. Barnett agreed to pay \$200.00 on pastor's salary for the year 1917 and 1918. Fifty dollars (\$50.00) of this amount has been paid, leaving \$150.00 yet unpaid.

The Conference President has faithfully endeavored to secure the payment of this pledge in full, but without avail.

The President of the Conference requested Henry R. Barnett to appear at this Conference for the settlement of this matter, but he refused to comply with the request. The present Committee on Pastoral Relations sent to Henry R. Barnett a telephone message requesting him to appear at a meeting of the Committee, not later than Friday, April 12, 1918. This request he also declined.

In our judgment Henry R. Barnett is under moral and legal obligations to pay the balance of this pledge as above noted. Therefore we recommend that the Conference request him to pay this pledge in full without further delay.

3. We have discovered in our investigation that a deplorable situation exists in the Chestnut Ridge Church, which demands immediate attention by this Conference.

We recommend that your Committee on Pastoral Relations be constituted a Committee to thoroughly investigate this matter and deal with this church as provided for by our Judiciary Rules.

Rate of room rental for season of ten days, \$3.00. Rate of one-half the season, \$1.75. Rate for one day, 35 cents.

Room may be occupied by one or more persons.

All linen and toilet articles is to be furnished by parties renting rooms.

An additional charge of 25c will be made for furnishing these articles.

All roomers are expected to be as quiet and orderly as possible.

Occupants of rooms shall be responsible for their care during the season, and are expected to leave them in good order, disposing of all water and waste.

Rooms may be secured a year in advance by the payment of 50c. Said amount to be applied for rental if room is used, but to be forfeited unless the Matron is notified at least two weeks before the meeting that the room is not wanted.

When a room is rented for the season and the occupant leaves before the close, the Matron shall be free to rerent the room for the remaining period at the regular day rates, unless said occupant shall state to the Matron that they desire some special persons to have the use of the room. No occupant shall permit another to use said room without the knowledge and consent of the Matron.

We further recommend that the above Rules and Regulations be printed on suitable cards and a copy of same placed in each room.
