There is so much attraction in the world, that is taking our youth from the church; but we should try to get into the church and show them that there is much joy, and happiness in serving the Lord.

We feel that there is one way and that is the "Jesus Way" as he says, "I am the way, the truth, and the light."

#### FREE MASONRY

Although the topic of my paper is Free Masonry, the statements that I make can be applied to all forms of Secret Societies. Since Masonry is acknowledge the largest, the oldest the most powerful of all secret societies. I will center my remarks on it with the understanding that all secret societies may be included in this denunciation with a few minor adjustments. I will just try to give a few details on its history, rites and claims. As for history some ambitious Masons dare to trace the origin of Masonry back to Solomon and his temple while others go even farther and claim that Noah, who built the ark, was a Mason. Of course all straight thinking people know better than that. The true fact is that Masonry like many other things was a gradual evolution which would make it difficult to say just where the beginning was, however, in 1717 certain gentlemen in London, who were not Masons by trade and were not allowed to take all the degrees, decided the operative Masonry was too narrow in its teachings for men who were not operatives so they undertook to broaden the teachings and elevate the morals of the fraternity. At this time four lodges of London went into the organization of the first Grand Lodge. The ritual was revised and elaborated and the legend of the third degree, which is the essence of Masonry was adopted from the Ancient Mysteries, or ancient Secret Sun Worship, by a Scotch Presbyterian Preacher by the name of James Anderson. Like most American organizations, our Free Masonry copies from the mother country England. The Masons believe in the brotherhood of mankind and so not to ffend any of its members it accepts the religion of its members, and uses whatever book they worship from its rituals. A Jew denouncing the Lord Jesus Christ may be as good a Mason as a Christian and the Mohammed with Allah as his "God" and Mohammed the Left Handed as his Prophet can also be a good Mason. They have their emblems, secret signs and gaudy insignia which appeal to most people. They acknowledge a "Supreme Being" and call him "The Great Architect of the Universe" which does not offend any one regardless of his religion. One of the symbols used is an open book (in most lodges the Bible) a compass and a square.

In most American Lodges the Bible is so interwoven with the ritual a Christian can easily become confused and involved. In fact, some Masons advocate it is more than a lodge or a fraternity but rather a religion seeking facts and truths. I shall not go into detail on how the lodge is operated but will give fifteen (15) reasons that a Christian should not be a member of any secret society.

- 1. A true Christian should use all available time in Christ's work and cannot share it with any lodge.
- 2. Lodges are man-made and will perish but the Church and the king-dom of God will endure forever. It speaks of Christ's marriage to the Church in the Bible.
- 3. Lodges are composed of both Christian and sinner and most of their activities lean toward the world. In the Bible it states a Christian should be in the world but not of the world and to come out from among them.
- 4. Lodges promote dances, card parties, carnivals, shows, raffles and other things that a Christian should neither favor or support.
- 5. Money spent for initiations, dues, special assessments, degrees etc., could be put to more profitable uses.
  - 6. A Christian will get no reward in heaven for good works done in the

name of a lodge. Heavenly rewards are given only to Christians for acts done in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

- 7. No lodge is out for Jesus. It may use His name or quote His words, but their aims are worldly, carnal and selfish. In the Bible it states that anyone not altogether for Jesus is against Him. All lodges leave out the most important parts of the Boble such as repentence, new birth, the power of the blood of Jesus, and the fact that good works alone is insufficient for salvation.
- 8. Many people believe that keeping the vows of their will take them to heaven. Thus, they substitute the lodge for the Church as it is much more to their liking and illustrates the personal sacrifices which your Bible demands. This makes the lodges become an enemy of the Church and of Christ.
- 9. The mere belief in a supreme being and having a high moral code does not bring salvation to a soul. Jesus said, I am the way, the truth and the light and no man cometh to the Father except by me.
- 10. Jesus did not belong to any lodge. He does not like things done in secret. His works are not confined to any special group. He did not ask for advantages or favors but offered them instead. He is our example, go therefore and do likewise.
- 11. Any allegiance, pledges or sacrifices for a lodge divides one's duties and interest and weakens his ability to work for the Church and for Christ.
- 12. A Christian does not need the prestige or pull that a lodge has. All he needs is prayer and faith. The Bible states if God is for you he is more than all against you.
- 13. A Christian is admitting his lack of faith in the power of God when he unites himself with an organization in order to get certain breaks in life or in order to acquire certain positions.
- 14. Lodges use terms such as "Brother", "Prophet", "Priest", etc., in unscriptural ways and assign to their officers many silly, preposterous and sometimes blasphemous titles.
- 15. Lodges are anti-Christian in many of their teachings despite the fact that they use the Bible in their rituals. They teach the brotherhood of mankind and the universal fatherhood of God. Now all Christians know that God is their Creator but does not become their Father except by faith and a new birth. This makes them a child of God. All lodges dabble in politics and use their influence whenever possible. They cause their members to swear, make vows and take oaths. This is against the teachings of Jesus who says, "swear not at all neither by heaven for it is God's throne now by the earth for it is his footstool neither by Jerusalem for it is the city of the great kings, etc."

In conclusion, I will say that Jesus teaches us that before the end of time many shall come in His name and fool the very elect were it possible. Be not deceived God is not mocked neither does he show favoritism toward any man, men o organizations but will judge all men by their works whether they be good or bad. Do not waste your time in lodges but consecrate it to God. Pledge not yourselves to Masonry but pledge yourself to your Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.
