STANDING RULES

- No. 1 On Literature: Inasmuch as our denominational literature, because of its loyalty to the doctrines of our Church and because of its position on all questions of reform, is of such a nature as to promote and more fully establish our principles; and inasmuch as we consider it the duty and privilege of pastors and lay members of our denomination to extend its distribution: Therefore be it Resolved, That we as a Conference pledge ourselves to extend our literature as much as possible, that we use our best endeavor to place our lesson helps and papers in all our Sabbath Schools.
- No. 2 Board of Trustees Report for Final Action: Resolved, That all matters involving the expenditure of money to be appropriated from the Conference Treasuries, be referred to the Board of Trustees for their consideration and to be reported back by them to the Conference for final action.
- No. 3 General Conference Delegate: Resolved, That it is the sense of the Lockport Conference that no person should accept the position as delegate to the General Conference unless he expects to be present during the entire session. The President is requested to communicate this resolution to the delegates three weeks before the General Conference begins.
- No. 4 Evangelists' Report: Resolved, That it is the sense of this Conference that all Conference and General Evangelists be requested to report their work and financial receipts to each Annual Conference.
- No. 5 Closing Treasurer's Books: The Conference Treasurer is hereby authorized to close his books two weeks before the Annual Conference convenes, therefore all receipts and monies should be in his hands by that time if credit on Statistical Report is desired.
- No. 6 Salary: Resolved, That it is the sense of the Lockport Conference that the minimum salary of an ordained minister on one of our Charges shall be parsonage and one thousand dollars.
- No. 7 Temperance: Resolved, That it is the sense of the Lockport Conference that we are definitely committed to the maintenance of the Eighteenth Amendment and to the rigid enforcement of the same according to the Volstead Act.
- No. 8: Resolved, That a pastor is justified in refusing to accept a call to any Charge refusing to assume financial obligations.

WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

- No. 9: Resolved, That the pastors be requested to report the decimal part of their financial items in round numbers, except the Budget Items, which shall be reported in full.
- No. 10: Resolved, That in the reading of the Pastor's Statistical Report it is obligatory to read only items 3, 9, 10.
- No. 11: Resolved, That the members of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders appear in the minutes in a list by themselves the same as in the case of the Board of Trustees. Showing the years in which their term of office expires.

JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Wednesday Morning Meeting, April 8, 1936

The Lockport Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened at the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Bradford, Pa., for its seventy-fifth Annual Session on April 8, 1936 at 9:00 a. m. The evening previous Rev. George I. Norman preached from James 5:7 on "The Precious Fruit of the Earth."

Opening.—The President, Rev. Edward L. Elliott, called the Conference to order and devotionals were conducted by Rev. O. G. Wyman.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and twelve pastors and thirteen delegates were marked present.

Bar of Conference.—The bar of Conference was fixed as the first five rows of seats across the front of the church.

Time of Meetings.—The time for opening and closing of the meetings of Conference was fixed as follows: Morning meeting opening at nine and closing at noon; the afternoon meeting opening at one-thirty and closing by vote of the Conference.

Temporary Organization.—The Committee on Temporary Organization submitted its report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 1.)

Religious Services.—The Committee on Religious Services submitted its report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 2.)

Resignation.—Because of conflicting duties, Rev. James R. Redstone offered his resignation as Statistical Secretary, which was accepted.

Election.—Rev. George N. Osgood was elected to fill the vacancy and it was voted that he be allowed to choose his own assistant.

Conference President reports.—The Vice-President, Rev. A. J. Taylor, was called to the Chair and the President gave his report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 3.)

Orders of the Day.—The election of Conference Officials was made an Order of the Day for Thursday morning following devotionals.

Name Added.—It was voted that the name of Rev. Maurice Gibbs be added to the Committee on Ministerial Character.

Recess.—A recess was voted for Conference work.

Adjournment.—The President called the meeting to order at 11:55 a.m. After a few announcements the meeting was adjourned by limitation of time. After the singing of the "Doxology," benediction was given by Rev. A. A. Hickok.

Wednesday Afternoon Meeting, April 8, 1936

Opening.—The meeting was called to order by the President and devotions were conducted by Rev. N. R. Shaffer.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Communications.—Communications were received from the following: Peter D. Miller, C. H. Dow, and L. J. Sicard. Their characters were passed

Characters Passed.—The name of John E. Bruce was called and his character passed. The Vice-President was called to the Chair and the name of Edward L. Elliott was called and his character passed. The names of Maurice Gibbs, A. A. Hickok and Francis B. Markell were called and their characters passed.

Courtesies.—Rev. C. O. Whetford, pastor of the Free Methodist Church of Bradford, was presented to the Conference and made a few remarks.

Prayer.—A season of prayer was spent in behalf of Rev. F. B. Markell and his family, followed by a love offering amounting to \$17.18.

Appreciation.—It was voted that a letter of appreciation be sent by the President to Brother Markell for the fine grade of work he did as Secretary and Treasurer of the Conference.

Character Passed.—The name of G. I. Norman was called and his character passed.

Communion Service.—The time for the religious service having arrived, business was suspended and Rev. J. R. Pitt took charge of the communion service assisted by various pastors of the Conference.

Adjournment.—At 4:00 p. m. business was resumed. Adjourned by vote of Conference. Benediction by Rev. H. J. Bullock.

Thursday Morning Meeting, April 9, 1936

Opening.—After devotions conducted by Rev. E. W. Rupert, the President called the meeting to order.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes approved as read.

Courtesies.—Rev. F. R. Eddy, Connectional Agent, and Rev. Adam Lenkerd, retired Free Methodist pastor, were presented to the Conference and made a few remarks.

Election.—The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, the President appointed Rev. G. I. Norman, Rev. Price Stark, Clair Phillips and Loyal Baker as tellers and the Conference proceeded with the election, which resulted as follows:

President.—On the first ballot for President, E. L. Elliott received 32 of 34 votes cast and was declared elected.

Vice-President.—On the first ballot for Vice-President, A. J. Taylor received 29 of 35 votes cast and was declared elected.

Secretary.—On the first ballot for Secretary, J. R. Redstone received 31 of 35 votes cast and was declared elected.

Treasurer.—On the ballot for Treasurer, G. N. Osgood received 24 of 35 votes cast and was declared elected.

Courtesies.—Rev. W. P. Hanks, pastor of the United Brethren Church of Bradford, was presented to the Conference and made a few remarks.

Sunday School Secretary.—On the ballot for Sunday School Secretary, Price Stark received 27 of 35 votes cast and was declared elected.

Tithing Secretary.—On the first ballot for Tithing Secretary, Maurice Gibbs received 29 of 34 votes cast and was declared elected.

Educational Secretary.—On the ballot for Educational Secretary, G. I. Norman received 29 of 34 votes cast and was declared elected.

College Board.—On the ballot for nomination for member of the Board of Managers of Houghton College, E. L. Elliott received 27 of 33 votes cast and was declared nominated.

Trustees.—For members of the Conference Board of Trustees, Rev. Walter Readett received 19 of 34 votes cast, Rev. Arthur J. Taylor received 19 of 34 votes cast, Chester E. York received 22 of 34 votes cast and were declared elected.

Vacancy Filled.—On the ballot to fill the vacancy caused by the transfer to the Michigan Conference of Rev. Royal Woodhead, Rev. David Anderson received 17 of 33 votes cast and was declared elected to the Board of Trustees.

Educational Address.—The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, the Educational service was turned over to President James S. Luckey. After presenting Chester E. York, who spoke about Houghton, President Luckey gave the Educational Address. A collection was taken to complete the Educational Budget which amounted to \$15.25.

Election Continued.—On the ballot for member of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders, E. L. Elliott received 26 of 33 votes cast and was declared elected.

Statistical Secretary.—On the ballot for Statistical Secretary George Failing received 28 of 31 votes cast and was declared elected.

Assistant Secretary.—It was voted that the Secretary nominate his own assistant. He nominated Walter Readett. The Secretary was instructed to cast a ballot for Walter Readett as Assistant Secretary.

Standing Committees.—The nomination of Standing Committees was referred to the Committee on Temporary Organization.

Adjournment.—Adjourned by limitation of time.

Thursday Afternoon Meeting, April 9, 1936

Opening.—After devotions conducted by Rev. A. A. Hickok the President called the Conference to order.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes approved as corrected.

Committee Report.—The Committee on Itineracy and Orders submitted its report.

Report to be Revised.—It was voted that the report be referred back for revision.

Sunday School Report.—The report of the Sunday School Secretary was read by Rev. Price Stark in the absence of Rev. Royal Woodhead and was accepted. (See Report No. 4).

Date of Conference.—The Committee on the changing of the date of Conference gave its report which was accepted. (See Report No. 5).

Names Called.—The names of Olga Marie Norman, William Osgood, J. R. Pitt, Walter Readett, James R. Redstone, Charles Sicard, Helen and Price Stark and A. J. Taylor were called and their characters passed.

Prayer.—A request of prayer was received for Sister Eggler and Sister Taylor. A season of prayer was spent in their behalf.

Religious Service.—The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, business was suspended and after a short recess the service was opened by singing "Beulah Land." Rev. B. N. Miner, pastor of the Free Methodist Church at Jamestown, brought an inspiring message from "He shall be a vessel unto honor." A time of refreshing was spent around the altar.

Adjournment.—After a few announcements adjournment by vote of Conference. Benediction by Rev. Mrs. Diana Wyman.

Friday Morning Meeting, April 10, 1936

Opening.—After devotions led by Rev. Walter Readett, the President called the Conference to order.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes approved as read.

Nominations.—The Committee on Temporary Organization submitted its report on nominations of Standing Committees which was elected as read. (See Page 6 for Report.)

Excused from Conference.—Rev. George Failing was excused from Conference.

Transfer granted.—The name of Royal Woodhead was called and character passed and a letter of transfer was granted.

Names Called.—The names of George Failing, O. G. Wyman, Diana Wyman, Adrian Everts were called and their characters passed.

Prayer.—Prayer was offered in behalf of Rev. Adrian Everts during his bereavement.

Names Called.—The names of Mae K. and N. R. Shaffer, C. M. Dudley, W. W. Rolf, H. J. Bullock, M. A. Bateman, C. E. Woodhead, Gilbert Baker, Arthur Osgood, E. W. Rupert were called and characters passed.

Connectional Address.—The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, business was suspended and Rev. F. R. Eddy gave the Connectional Address.

Adjournment.-Adjourned by limitation of time.

Friday Afternoon Meeting, April 10, 1936

Opening.—After devotions led by Rev. Gilbert Baker, the President called the Conference to order.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes approved as corrected.

Ministerial Institute.—Rev. Charles Sicard made an oral report of the

Ministerial Institute for the coming year. The Committee elected are:
Charles Sicard, J. R. Pitt, and Price Stark.

Treasurer's Report.—The Assistant Conference Treasurer submitted his report which was accepted as read. (See Report No. 6.)

Names Called.—The names of G. N. Osgood, E. H. and Zelia Johnson were called and their characters passed.

Recess.—A recess was taken till the time for the Orders of the Day.

Missionary Address.—The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived Sister Mary Lane Clarke gave an address on the Y. M. W. B.

Adjournment.—Adjourned by vote of Conference. Benediction by Charles Sicard.

Saturday Morning Meeting, April 11, 1936

Opening.—After devotions conducted by Rev. Arthur Osgood, the President called the Conference to order.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes approved as read.

Courtesies.—Rev. A. D. Fero, of the Allegheny Conference, and Rev. Chester Osgood, of the Rochester Conference, were presented to Conference and made a few remarks.

Advisory Board.—The President nominated Rev. David Anderson and Millard E. Cornelius as his Advisory Board and they were elected.

Pastoral Relations.—The Committee on Pastoral Relations submitted its report for its first reading.

Ministerial Institute.—The Committee on Ministerial Institute made a partial report suggesting the date of June 30 to July 4, 1936. The Report was adopted.

Committee on Thanks.—The Committee on Thanks gave its report which was adopted after being amended. (See Report No. 7.)

Treasurer of Board of Trustees.—The Treasurer of the Board of Trustees submitted his report through the new Treasurer, Chester A. York, which was accepted. (See Report No. 8.)

Post Office Addresses.—The Committee on Post Office Addresses submitted its report which was accepted as corrected. (See Roll of Preachers, Delegates and Sunday School Superintendents.)

Recess.—A recess was taken.

Excused from Conference.—The meeting was called to order by the President and Rev. Edward Rupert, Rev. G. I. Norman and Rev. J. R. Pitt were excused from Conference.

Memorial Service.—The Orders of the Day having arrived Rev. A. J. Taylor took charge of the Memorial Service which opened by singing "The Home of the Soul." Rev. Edward L. Elliott led in prayer. The names of Rev. George Bathurst who passed away in June, and Rev. Jesse Steves who passed away in July, were called. Both were elders of the Lockport Conference.

Rev. Edward L. Elliott spoke of the passing of the brethren and their work at the task God had assigned them.

Report No. 3

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

In the providence of God we are assembled again in Annual Conference. Some who met with us in the Olean Church a year ago are today with their Lord. I refer, of course, to Rev. George Bathhurst, pastor of the Driftwood Church, and Rev. Jesse Steves, pastor of the Rich Valley Church.

At the time of the Olean Conference Brother Bathurst was ill to the extent that he did not feel able to take part in any public services, although he was present and appeared like himself in many respects. During a period that followed, a few weeks, he was not able to care for his loved work. Then one June Sunday when he was enough improved, it seemed, that he was preparing to preach at the evening service, the Master whom he loved called for him.

Later in the summer in July, while present at the Sunday evening service, our dear Brother Steves also was called home. He had attended General Conference as a guest and was just home from a camp meeting. If he was ill during this period, his friends did not know it. Thus two faithful pastors were removed from our ranks in so brief a space of time.

Early in July, our African missionary, Rev. Price Stark, was appointed to fill the vacancy in the Driftwood Church for the remainder of the year, the church voting unanimous approval.

Through their tears the Rich Valley Church said, "The will of the Lord be done," and asked if they might have their old pastors Rev. E. H. and Zelia Johnson. The request was granted by Brother and Sister Johnson and by the President of the Conference.

In October Rev. Royal Woodhead resigned as pastor of the Fillmore Church. The church arranged promptly for a student in Houghton College to supply that work for the remainder of the year. This was Brother George Failing who brought a transfer from the North Carolina Conference and was received as a member in the licentiate group.

In January, Rev. F. B. Markell pastor at Ransomville, who had been ill for several months, was stricken so completely that it became impossible for him to continue his work. Arrangement was made so that Rev. James R. Redstone has supplied the work on Sunday since the latter part of February. Also Brother Redstone was appointed as assistant treasurer to complete the treasurer's work for the year. This he has done cheerfully and well.

For a short time following last Conference the North Tonawanda appointment was supplied by different preachers. Early in May Brother Eugene Reiger of Akron, Ohio, began preaching there and continued until the middle of August. By this time some families had moved away, others lost interest. Those remaining did not continue to rent the church as formerly and preaching was discontinued.

In June O. G. McKinley was granted a transfer to the Rochester Conference. In March Rev. Noah and Mae Shaffer were received by transfer from the Allegheny Conference.

About a year ago a gospel work was started by Wesleyans in Wellsville. Rev. D. O. Beach labored diligently in the early part of the year. Rev. George Norman also furnished assistance. Rev. Clarence Dudley has been actively promoting the movement. Some progress has been made but the work has not been organized as a church.

By action of the Conference, a part of the President's duties was attendance at the General Conference held at Fairmount, Indiana, June 26 to July 1, 1935. It was a great gathering, the largest general gathering of Wesleyan Methodists ever held. The key note was evangelism at home and in the mission fields. The Conference was vibrant with enthusiasm for the cause of holiness unto the ends of the earth.

The response of the Church in their support of the various budget items has been very commendable during the past year. It reveals a strong loyalty and deep devotion on the part of our pastors.

One condition which exists is to be greatly regretted, however. Too many of our pastors are receiving an altogether insufficient support. Our churches should take this matter to heart and do their utmost to correct it. Our churches should examine their financial plans. The storehouse plan of tithing is the financial plan approved and recommended by our General Conference. Many local Wesleyan Methodist Churches who have put the plan into operation have found it the salvation of their financial problems.

May we go forward in the power of the Holy Spirit in a great soul saving, evangelistic crusade.

BUDGET APPORTIONMENT

- 1. The part of the budget for Foreign Missions is \$1796, and all money paid for current expenses for Foreign Missions, all money appropriated for this purpose by the W. H. & F. M. Society, and all money paid by the Y. M. W. B. for this purpose may count toward this budget.
- 2. The part of the budget for Home Missions is \$449, and all money paid for Home Missions, and all money appropriated for this purpose by the W. H. & F. M. Society or the Y. M. W. B. may count toward this budget.
- 3. The part of the budget for Education is \$1345, and all money paid for current expenses of Houghton College, all money paid on L. S. U. pledges for Houghton College, and all interest (not principal) paid on Educational notes for Houghton College, and all money raised on Educational Day by the Y. M. W. B. and on Harvest Day by the W. H. & F. M. Society may count toward this budget.
- 4. The part of the budget for Hephzibah Orphanage is \$225, and all money paid for the orphanage or appropriated for this purpose shall count on this budget.
- 5. The part of the budget for Connectional Sunday School work is \$81. The part of the budget for Conference Sunday School work is \$18, distributed on the plan adopted by the Conference.
- 6. We recommend that the part of the budget for Conference be \$1759, and nothing but cash may count on this budget. We recommend that this budget be distributed as follows:

- 10. We recommend that the Conference authorize each pastor to hand to the Budget Committee at the next Annual Conference a list of members on his charge under sixteen years of age. This list shall be deducted from the number determining budget apportionment on that charge.
