JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Louisville, Ky., August 13, 1930.

The eighth session of the Kentucky Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection convened at the Atwood Street Church, August 13, at 7:30 P. M. The opening sermon, delivered by G. C. Harrington, was full of timely and wholesome admonitions.

A short business session was then called by the President. At this time the roll was called and the following items of business transacted:

Upon motion, Jacob Hunter and W. J. Griffin were constituted the Committee on Credentials.

A motion prevailed that the Conference convene at 9:00 A. M. and 3:00 P. M. and adjourn at 11:45 A. M. and upon motion in the evening.

The following named persons presented proper credentials and were enrolled as Delegates:

Susie Britton, Anna Brewer, Susie Melton, Ida Tevis, John Brown, Edgar Harrington, Nettie Burch, Winnie Rothrock, Madelene McKay.

Upon motion the bar of the Conference was fixed as the first four seats in front, on either side and including the rostrum.

Upon motion, the Committee on Committees was filled by the election of T. P. Baker, W. B. Dunkum and G. C. Harrington.

Upon motion the Conference adjourned at 9:10 P. M. Benediction.

Thursday, 9:00 A. M.

Devotions were conducted by T. P. Baker. The roll was called and the minutes read and approved.

The following named persons presented proper credentials and were enrolled as Delegates: Ora M. Nanna, Emma Bright, Minnie Hodgin, A. W. Bines.

The Committee on the Formation of Committees submitted the following report, which was adopted:

That the Committee on Resolutions be filled by the election of W. B. Dunkum, Charles L. Blanchard and Dempsey Fossit.

That the Committee on Statistics be constituted by the election of James C. Zuch and Ella V. Zuch.

That the Committee on Courtesies be filled by the election of E. J. Hodgin and Carl Darbo.

That the Committee on Finances be filled by the election of T. P. Baker, Flora A. Pitts, E. J. Hodgin, Irvin Smith, Anna Brewer and Emma Bright.

That the Committee on Thanks be filled by the election of Ella V. Zuch.

That the Committee on Religious Services be constituted by the election of W. B. Dunkum, E. J. Hodgin and Flora A. Pitts.

That Ora M. Nanna be elected as Conference Reporter.

The President then read his annual report, and a motion prevailed to adopt his report. See Report No. 1.

A communication was received from Revs. Lewis and Mary L. Pratt. Upon motion Flora A. Pitts was appointed to send the greetings of the Conference to them.

Communications were received from Dempsey Howard and E. H. Farris and by order of the Conference are to receive greetings of the body through its Secretary.

L. A. Singer, of Cincinnati, Ohio; Vera Lippold, of Bunker Hill, Ind.; Ella V. Zuch, of Brooksburg, Ind.; Prof. and Mrs. C. O. Bush, of Taylor University, Upland, Ind., were introduced to the Conference and as per order were accorded honorary privileges.

Upon motion we adjourned at 11:00 A. M., with the benediction.

Thursday, 3:00 P. M.

The devotions were conducted by Esther E. Hunter. The roll was then called and the minutes read and adopted.

Rev. Knepper, Pastor of the Free Methodist Church of Louisville, Ky.; Mrs. Larimore and Madelene McKay, of Brooksburg, Ind., were introduced and were accorded proper relations to the body.

The Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders made further recommendations to the Conference which were adopted. See Report No. 2.

The Committee on Resolutions made their report. The first six resolutions to be Standing Resolutions or Laws of the Kentucky Conference. See Resolutions and Laws of the Kentucky Conference and Report No. 3.

The regular order was called and the following named persons were called and their characters passed: T. P. Baker, W. B. Dunkum,

Alberta Dunkum, Carl Darbo, G. C. Harrington, E. J. Hodgin, Jacob E. Hunter, Irvin Smith and M. C. Hash.

The time for the election of Conference officials was set to be Friday morning immediately after devotions.

Adjournment upon motion. Benediction.

Friday, 9:00 A. M.

Devotions were conducted by Irvin Smith. Roll was called and the minutes read and adopted.

The following named persons presented proper credentials and were enrolled as Delegates: W. G. Stocton and Lester Smith.

The order of the day was called and the Conference proceeded to the election of Conference officials.

T. P. Baker received a majority of all votes cast for President and was declared elected.

W. B. Dunkum received a majority of all votes cast for Vice-President and was declared elected.

G. C. Harrington and Flora A. Pitts were nominated for Secretary and upon motion the nominations were closed. Flora A. Pitts was elected by majority ballot.

Karl E. Rothrock was duly elected to succeed himself as Treasurer of the Conference.

By ballot T. P. Baker was elected Ministerial Delegate to the General Conference.

By ballot W. B. Dunkum was elected Ministerial Alternate.

By ballot Ora M. Nanna was elected Lay Delegate to the General Conference, and Helen Firth by ballot as Lay Alternate.

W. B. Dunkum and John Brown were then elected to constitute the Advisory Board.

The Judiciary Committee was filled by the election of W. B. Dunkum, G. C. Harrington, E. J. Hodgin and James C. Zuch.

W. B. Dunkum's term of office expiring, he was duly elected to a term of four years on the Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders.

The following persons were elected to constitute the Committee on Vacancies: E. J. Hodgin, G. C. Harrington, Carl Darbo, Edgar Harrington and John Brown.

Upon motion the Conference Trustees were elected to constitute the Missionary Board also.

The Auditing Committee was filled by the election of W. J. Griffin and Jacob E. Hunter.

The following named persons were called and their characters passed: Flora A. Pitts, James C. Zuch, Ella V. Zuch and W. J. Griffin. Adjournment by limitation. Benediction.

Friday, 3:00 P. M.

Devotions were conducted by Esther E. Hunter. The roll was called and the minutes read and adopted.

Rev. Burnett, of Chicago, and T. W. Comadoll, of Cincinnati, Ohio, were introduced and extended proper courtesies.

The Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders made recommendations, which were adopted. See Report No. 2.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave the first reading of their report.

The following names were called and their characters passed: Louis Baumgartel and Dempsey Fossit.

By common consent decision was made to devote the first hour of the Conference sessions Saturday morning and afternoon to preaching services.

Adjournment upon motion and benediction.

Saturday, 9:00 A. M.

The special order for the day was called and Rev. Noah Shaffer, of Dixonville, Pa., brought a most helpful and inspiring message.

The roll was then called and the minutes read and adopted.

Ross L. Dugger and wife of Bloomington, Ind., and Rev. Noah Shaffer's family of Dixonville, Pa., were introduced and proper courtesies extended them.

The regular order was called and the following named persons called and their characters passed: Charles L. Blanchard and D. R. Dooley.

Adjournment upon motion and benediction.

Saturday, 3:00 P. M.

The special order of the day was called and Rev. L. A. Singer brought a message of good cheer under the melting, mellowing power of the Spirit.

The Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders made a full report and upon motion the same was adopted. See Report No. 2.

The last reading of the report of the Committee on Pastoral Relations was heard and the Conference voted its adoption. See Report No. 4.

The Finance Committee's report was then read and upon motion it was adopted. See Report No. 5.

The Conference Treasurer then gave his Annual Report, which was adopted by vote of the body. See Report No. 6.

WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

At this time the annual offering favoring the Secretary of the Conference, and which he received gratefully, was taken.

The Statistical Committee then gave their report, which was adopted by vote of the body. See Report No. 7.

By vote of the Conference the Secretary was instructed to send the Minutes to our Publishing House for printing.

Conference adjourned at 4:45 to meet at 7:00 P. M.

Saturday, 7:00 P. M.

The roll was called and the minutes read and adopted. At this time the W. H. & F. M. Society's Treasurer and Finance and Statistical Committees gave their reports, which were adopted.

Rev. E. J. Hodgin, Pastor of the Atwood Street Church, extended an invitation to the Conference to return for the next Annual Session. By vote of the Conference this invitation was accepted.

The Conference adjourned upon motion, and was succeeded by an evangelistic service.

RESOLUTIONS AND LAWS OF KENTUCKY CONFERENCE

- 1. We heartily approve the action of the General Conference in requesting our Sabbath Schools to give one offering a month to Home Missions, and that the Birthday offerings of each school be appropriated to the same interest.
- 2. We, the members of the Kentucky Conference, agree that there shall be an offering taken at each preaching service, both Sunday morning and Sunday night, in all of our churches, and that the Pastor be paid in full each month as nearly as possible. Also that each Pastor receive a fixed salary.
- 3. We recommend that our Churches should call members of our own Conference as their pastors to supply the pulpits before going outside the Conference, so long as we have preachers qualified for the same.
- 4. Our Stewards are required to meet their Pastors and reach an agreement as to pastoral support. And we insist on every Pastor receiving a respectable living so that he will not be financially embarrassed.
- 5. It shall be the duty of our Pastors to see that all our churches and parsonages have sufficient insurance and report the same at the first Quarterly Meeting each year. Churches absolutely incapacitated to insure property, should report the same to the Conference, and if no satisfactory adjustment can be made otherwise, the property will be insured by Conference, and in the event such property should be destroyed, the Conference will collect the insurance.
- 6. We take a unanimous stand for loyalty to the Church and our Book of Discipline by supporting Paragraph 168, Sub Paragraph B, which reads as follows: "All pastors and churches wishing to employ evangelists who are not members of any Wesleyan Methodist Conference shall consult the President of the Annual Conference, who shall have the authority, if his Advisory Board shall agree thereto, to refuse to permit such employment."

We recommend that the following named persons receive Annual Conference License: W. J. Griffin, Louis Baumgartel, Irvin Smith, D. R. Dooley, M. C. Hash, Dempsey Fossit, Ross L. Dugger, L. A. Singer, T. W. Comadoll, Ella V. Zuch, Vera Lippold, Esther Hunter and Ora M. Nanna.

We recommend the following named persons to pursue the Course of Study as prescribed by the Discipline: Leona Griffin, Esther Hunter, Ora M. Nanna, Ada Baumgartel, Ella V. Zuch, W. J. Griffin, Louis Baumgartel, Irvin Smith, D. R. Dooley, M. C. Hash, Dempsey Fossit, L. A. Singer, T. W. Comadoll and Ross L. Dugger.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

No. 3

We, your Committee on Resolutions, submit the following report:

- 1. We purpose by the Grace of God to walk circumspectly before all men, that we will not reproach the Cause for which we are giving our lives, and as Wesleyan Methodists we will endeavor to keep in the unity of the Spirit and the bond of peace. We agree by Grace Divine to abstain from all sinful amusements, such as circus, Sunday baseball, dancing, picture shows, fairs, horse racing, theatrical performances, every form of gambling, and all forms of Sabbath desecration. We covenant as Christians professing the highest standards of Christian experience to dress as those should dress who profess the blessing of holiness, to maintain secret and family devotion, to contribute liberally as the Lord hath prospered us, not less than one-tenth of our income, and free-will offerings as the Lord may prosper us.
- 2. While we believe in and practice ministerial courtesies, yet we will not open our churches for other denominations to maintain a regular appointment, as such will likely cause a division among us and scatter our flock.
- 3. We recommend that all charges as early as possible provide a suitable home in which the Pastor may live.
- 4. We heartily recommend that all charges to which our Pastors move should pay transportation expenses. And that all our churches make quarterly donations to their Pastors, which has proven a source of help in time of need; and that such should not be deducted from the Pastor's cash salary. Hence let each church have a Donation Steward, whose business it is to see that the donations are regular and systematic.
- 5. We would suggest that every Wesleyan Methodist Church organize a Sunday School for the purpose of leading its pupils to the knowledge of Salvation. Let every Church see to it that they have an enthusiastic Missionary Society. Also let us strive to get the Wesleyan Methodist and the Wesleyan Missionary into every home, and every Wesleyan Methodist home should have a family altar.
- 6. We agree that the modern tongue movement is unscriptural and a delusion, therefore we warn our members to beware of such.
- 7. We agree that members coming to us from other churches, even by letter, having vows different from ours, must take our vows. We heartily recommend that where it is possible, Wesleyan Methodists should teach in our Sunday Schools; and at any time when it is known

that a teacher is teaching doctrine contrary to John Wesley and our Book of Discipline, said teacher may be removed from office by the Sunday School Board, the Pastor being chairman.

8. We agree with the Discipline that the use of tobacco is a great evil, therefore we object to our churches or people receiving members who use, sell or manufacture the filthy weed. We also urge upon our Pastors and churches to use all their moral influence to oppose this great evil, both by example and precept, in and out of the pulpit.

9. The Quarterly Conference has power to grant license to preach, providing the person has first secured a recommendation from the church of which he is a member, and passed all necessary examinations

as provided in our Book of Discipline. See Paragraph 365.

But to receive license to preach in the Kentucky Wesleyan Methodist Church, we recommend that the candidate must have a Discipline, pay one dollar a year to the Minute Fund, take the Wesleyan Methodist, tithe his income and put one-half of his tithe into the church where he holds his membership, and conduct no less than one service a month under the direction and in harmony with the Pastor.

We recommend that no one receive license to preach who does not

come up to the above requirements.

And we further recommend that no Quarterly Conference be allowed to renew the license of any one who fails to come to the above standard.

We recommend that all Annual Conference preachers and elders come to the above standard.

10. We recommend that every Pastor in the Kentucky Conference must be a member of the W. H. & F. M. S., and the Y. M. W. B., as these are legitimate arms of the work, and that he is to encourage and work in harmony with them and should be careful in his oversight of the work and seek to direct the activities of these organizations, in harmony with Wesleyan Methodist doctrine and our Book of Discipline.

11. We agree that no Pastor should hold more than two revival meetings off his charge during any conference year, and that only by

consent of a two-thirds vote of his membership.

12. We agree that persons applying for membership in the churches of the Kentucky Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection on profession of faith, or without a letter of good standing from some other church, shall be received into an associate relationship, which relationship shall not be shorter than three months, which is the minimum period in our Book of Discipline. See Paragraph 73, Sub Paragraph 2.

13. All persons making application in our churches for membership bearing letters of dismissal, shall be refused membership by the church to which said letter of dismissal is presented, until the impediments in the way of granting a letter of standing have been removed by proper adjustment.

- 14. As no Wesleyan Methodist Church is compelled to receive a member from any other denomination on the presentation of a letter of good standing, we shall require all our churches to examine persons coming with such letters, through the agency of the Church Membership Committee, before receiving them, and in the event of any doubt as to the eligibility of said candidate, said candidate shall be placed in an Associate Relationship for a period of not less than three months.
- 15. We recommend that all persons received into membership in the churches of our Conference, excepting those whose life of Christian fidelity has been of sufficient long standing, shall be received at first as associate members only.
- 16. As it is a fact that many who have their names on the Church Record neglect to support the church with their presence and finance during the year, and then come in at the close of the year and expect to have a vote:

We recommend that a ruling be made in the Kentucky Conference that the revision of the Church Roll of membership take place before the time of voting (annually) for any church officials, for the ensuing year.

17. Since the wearing of gold, and the use of tobacco, and membership in secret orders are strictly forbidden in our Book of Discipline:

Therefore be it resolved, That the Kentucky Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection will receive no persons into the Church who are not conformed to the Discipline in these requirements.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

No. 5

We, the Committee on Finance, submit the following report:

- 1. We recommend that all charges paying less than \$700 salary a year seek earnestly to raise the salary of their Pastor to that amount as soon as possible.
- In order to support our Foreign Missionary work it is necessary that \$2.50 per member be raised throughout our Conference.
- 3. We also recommend that this Conference pay a budget of \$2.50 per member for Home Missions.
- 4. And we further recommend that each member pay \$1.50 per year for Education.
- 5. We recommend the Storehouse Plan as the general financial plan of the Church. The difficult financial problem of the church will never be solved properly until every member of the church becomes a tither.

Tithe is a tenth, that part we owe to God, and should be put into the church treasury.

It is like interest, in that the rate is fixed. We do not give the land-lord rent, but pay it. It is a debt we owe to God, and must (or should) be paid, and no one should be complimented or puffed up over paying their honest debts. Where the Storehouse Plan has been adopted every demand has been met, and the Treasury is full to overflowing. If God ever required a tithe, He does now. Jesus changed man's center of gravity; instead of self, it is others. "It is more blessed to give than to receive." Instead of being served, it is serving.

The Church does not go begging when the tithes are brought in. But in many places it has become a begging institution, because the tithes have been withheld.

God's plan is the Storehouse Plan, which is workable in every age and country. Tithing is a means of grace. We gain spiritually and the church gains financially.

6. We recommend that every charge or station in the Kentucky Conference paying less than \$1,000.00 salary shall pay \$3.00 per year to the minute fund, and every charge paying \$1,000.00 or more a year shall pay \$5.00 a year to this fund, and every licensed minister in the Conference must pay one dollar a year each to said fund, the Pastor is responsible to see that the proper amount is collected from his charge, and it must be in the hands of the Conference Treasurer not later than September 1st.
