# STANDING RULES

- I. The Standing Rules of Conference shall be printed in the Conference Minutes each year.
- II. All visiting members of our own, or other churches in harmony with our principles, shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.
- III. The Conference President shall receive twenty dollars (\$20) per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.
- IV. The Conference Secretary shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his labor and incidental expenses.
- V. The Conference Treasurer shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his services in caring for the funds.
- VI. In making his report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books one week before the Conference session. The Treasurer of the Superannuated Ministers' Relief Association also shall close his books one week before the Conference session.
- VII. In our Camp Meeting work, after the expense of the Camp Meeting has been paid by the Camp Meeting Committee, or by the person whom they may designate, any unexpected balance shall be turned over to the Conference Treasurer.
- VIII. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice-President. It is understood, of course, that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.
- IX. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference, or by consent of the President and his Advisory Board.

#### STANDING RULES-Continued

- X. Each elder shall make his engagement as pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released in his pastoral engagement.
- XI. The first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday, and the Sunday School offerings shall be given to Home Missions, and should be sent to the Conference Treasurer.
- XII. In securing Evangelists for the Camp Meeting work, those of the Wesleyan Methodist Church shall be secured, if this can be done.
- XIII. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be composed of the Conference President as Chairman, and three ministers, and three laymen, all to be elected by ballot after the Conference of 1923, the term of office to be three years, the time of one minister and one layman expiring each year.
- XIV. Pastors shall state financial items in their statistical reports in even dollars, except in items affecting the Budget, and so far as possible are requested to report all budget items in even dollars. When such rule is not followed, the Statistical Secretaries are authorized to drop decimals, except as provided above.
- XV. The offerings for Superannuated Ministers shall be taken within sixty days after Conference, and forwarded to the Treasurer of Superannuate Society.

# Work of Conference President

- 1. We recommend that the President travel the Conference, with duties as follows:
- 2. To hold one quarterly meeting on each charge during the year, unless the work on some of the weaker fields or new fields should so fully take his time and attention that this could not well be done. In such case the holding of such meeting on the strongest fields may be omitted, but this would not release any charge from paying their proportion of the Conference Budget.
- 3. To spend the time of our annual Camp Meeting at the Meeting, and if necessary in order to perfect arrangements for the Camp Meeting more time is needful to be given to that work, it shall be so devoted.
- 4. To open in some place or places new work, if possible and feasible.
- 5. To spend as much time as he may find available in helping to build up the work on some of our weaker fields, such as Stony Creek, Acorn Hill and Burke.
- 6. The amount of salary to be twenty-three dollars (\$23) per week, and traveling expenses for the year, and have three weeks' vacation.

We, as a Conference, will pray that the gracious blessing of the Lord may rest on our President, giving him health, strength and wisdom, and we will coöperate with him in a united effort to make 1930-1931 the best year in upbuilding results in our history, and to God we will give the glory.

# Daily Journal of Conference Business

### Tuesday Evening

On Tuesday evening, July 1st, 1930, the Champlain Annual Conference convened on the Camp Ground at West Chazy, N. Y., for its eighty-ninth session. The President, Rev. C. L. Hill, had charge of the meeting. Hymns No. 30, 68 and 95 were sung, after which Rev. F. Bradley led in prayer. Several earnest prayers were offered and much of the presence of the Lord was felt. A duet was then given by two young ladies from Medford, Mass. Following this a Bible reading was given by Rev. H. R. LaVere. The congregation repeated together the 19th Psalm. The leader gave twelve Bible rules for holy living. Bible verses were given out and read by the congregation, remarks and comments being given by the leader, which were very helpful to all. This service was brought to a close by singing "Praise God from whom all blessings flow." Benediction by Rev. O. G. Wyman.

### Wednesday Morning

Devotionals.—This service was in charge of S. H. Miller. Singing hymn No. 85. Scripture reading, John 17. A precious season of prayer followed, in which several prayers were offered and much of the presence of the Lord was felt. No. 118 was sung, bringing to a close this service.

Eusiness.—Conference was called to order by the President, promptly at 9 o'clock.

Roll Call.—Seven Elders, four Licentiates, and two Deaconesses responded.

The Committee on Delegates' credentials made a partial report. Eleven Delegates answered to the roll call.

Motion was made and carried that other names be added as reported by the Committee.

Motion carried that the bar of Conference be made to include the first five rows of seats in the center slips.

Motion was passed to fix the time for Conference sessions as follows: Morning—Devotional service, 8:30. Business, 9 to 11:30. Afternoon—Devotional, 1:30. Business, 2 to 3. Preaching, 3 to 4. Business, 4 to 5:30.

Committee on Passage of Ministerial Character was elected as follows: O. G. Wyman, Mrs. Ella Sexton.

The President of the Conference gave his annual report. See Report No. 1. Report was accepted as read.

Revs. Floyd Banker, Floyd Bradley, W. L. Braman and Mrs. Braman were introduced to the Conference, each making appropriate remarks.

Election of Committee on Pastoral Relations resulted in the following being elected: Elders—C. L. Hill, A. J. Allen, E. D. Carpenter, H. R. LaVere. Laymen—R. J. Johnston, W. G. Olney, R. S. Wetmore.

Motion made and carried that Conference adjourn for Committee work.

Benediction by Rev. Floyd Bradley.

### Wednesday Afternoon

Devotions.—G. D. Jock was the leader of this service. Song "Happy Day" was sung. Also "Marching to Zion." Rev. O. G. Wyman and Rev. Floyd Bradley offered prayer, followed by Scripture reading, first chapter of St. John, 1 to 27 verses.

Business.—Roll call: Ten Elders, six Licentiates, twenty-one Delegates and two Deaconesses responded. Minutes of the morning meeting read and approved.

A letter of transfer of Rev. C. R. Stopp was read and accepted.

Tithing Secretary, Rev. G. D. Jock, made his report, which was adopted.

Rev. E. F. McCarty, Connectional representative, was introduced to the Conference, making remarks of greeting.

Time for an order of the day having come, Rev. A. J. Allen preached the Conference sermon. C. L. Hill offered prayer. Singing, "A Charge to Keep I Have." Text, Acts 2:3. A special song was given by Sister Braman.

Business Resumed.—The following names were called and passed: A. J. Allen, E. D. Carpenter.

Motion was made and carried to adjourn. Benediction by O. M. Finch.

### Wednesday Evening Service

This service opened with a song service. Nos. 124, 91 and 29 were sung. Prayer by F. C. Taylor. Rev. E. F. McCarty read for his scripture lesson, Luke 11:1-13. Special number in song by Rev. Floyd Banker, "Sweet Peace the Gift of God's Love." "The Ministry of Prayer" was the subject, with the text from St. Matthew 37:38.

### Thursday Morning

Devotional Service.—This service was in charge of O. G. Wyman. "Rock of Ages" was sung and a portion of scripture was read from St. John, first chapter, verses 1 to 14. Some time was spent in earnest prayer for God's blessing upon the business of the day.

Time for an order of the day having come, the election of Conference officers, Conference proceeded to take up that business.

### Thursday Afternoon

The devotional service was conducted by Dennis Osgood. Nos. 95 and 89 were sung. Prayer by C. R. Stopp and others. Singing No. 26 and reading scripture from the 125th Psalm.

Business.—Roll call: Two Elders, seven Licentiates, two Deaconesses and twelve Delegates were present. Minutes of the morning meeting were read and approved, as corrected.

The Conference Sunday School Secretary gave his report. It was adopted. See Report No. 2.

Unfinished business came before the Conference at this time, the election of Lay Alternate Delegate to the General Conference. Lester Jenkins was elected.

Motion was made and carried that the Conference continue the Sunday School and Y. M. W. B. Conventions as in the past.

Motion was carried that an offering be taken on each charge to help defray the expense of entertaining the Convention. Motion made and carried that C. R. Stopp be Chairman of the Convention, with the Conference Y. M. W. B. Superintendent and Sunday School Secretary as assistants.

The request of George Osgood for a transfer to the Lockport Conference was granted.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave a partial report. See Report No. 3. Report was adopted.

Time for an order of the day having come, Conference business gives way. No. 18, "Close to Thee," was sung. Scripture reading, Eph. 2:1-10. Prayer by C. I. Armstrong. A special song was given by Messrs. Hill, Banker, Chapman and Stopp, after which Rev. E. F. McCarty preached the Word. Text, Judges 15:20 and First John 1:9. Subject, "Spiritual Declension."

The following names were called and characters passed: S. A. Green, G. D. Jock, A. E. and T. A. Moses, O. G. Wyman and F. H. Wright.

Motion to adjourn was carried. Benediction by D. Chadwick.

### Thursday Evening Service

Songs No. 29, 46 and 10 were sung. Scripture reading, St. Luke 14:25. Prayer by L. M. Hayes. No. 15 was then sung. A special song was brought by Brother Stopp. Brother McCarty brought a very helpful message from Philippians 2:15, also First Corinthians 2:16. Subject, "Some Tests of True Discipleship."

### Friday Morning

Devotions.-Brother Chadwick was the leader for this service. After the singing of No. 148, all enjoyed a very precious season of prayer, led by Sister Florence Baxter. Much of the presence of the Spirit was felt. The Scripture read was Ephesians 6.

# Friday Afternoon

Devotionals by Dennis Osgood.

Business.-Roll call, to which fifteen Elders, nine Licentiates, two Deaconesses and nineteen Delegates answered.

Time for an order of the day having arrived, Conference business gave way to a meeting of the Superannuated Relief Association. See

Report No. 4.

Immediately at the close of this service followed an order of the day, the 3 o'clock preaching service. This service was opened by singing No. 122. Scripture reading from the 9th chapter of St. Mark's Gospel. Prayer by Brother Sumner, of the Mooers M. E. church. Rev. Floyd Banker, returned Missionary from India, sang "Jesus Lover of My Soul." Brother Finch preached at this time, using for his text Mark 9: 5.

- 4. At least 10 cents per member shall be sent annually to the Conference Treasurer for the running of her office, including \$5.00 to the Conference President, \$3.00 to the Treasurer, and \$2.00 to the Secretary to help defray the expense in connection with their official duties.
- 5. The annual meeting shall be composed of Conference missionary officers, Presidents of Locals, one Delegate for each Local Society, Y. M. W. B. Superintendents, Pastors' wives and Lady-Pastors.

#### Report No. 4

#### PLAN OF WORK FOR LOCAL SOCIETIES

We recommend that the following Plan of Work be followed:

- 1. That each Local Society shall have some Missionary Study or Program at each meeting to enlighten our minds, broaden our vision and inspire our hearts to pray definitely for the missionary work in all its branches.
- 2. That each Society shall have a Solicitor, who will earnestly endeavor to get new subscribers and keep account of renewals to the Weslevan Missionary.

3. That all money raised by the Society shall be used for Missionary work, and no money is to be paid out without a vote of the

Society.

- 4. That one of the two Statistical blanks sent to each Society, after being carefully filled out, is to be given to the Statistical Committee at the beginning of Conference, the other to be retained by the Delegate and later read to the Local Society. Receipts and disbursements must be made to balance before being placed in the hands of the Statistical Committee.
- 5. That all Missionary Boxes are to be given proper credit, but not in the column with cash receipts and disbursements.
- 6. That we continue our efforts to help in the maintenance of the Hephzibah Orphanage.
- 7. That all goods sent to our mission fields shall be sent to the Pastors in charge of said work.
- 8. That the use of the Thank Offering Boxes be continued in each Local Society.
- 9. That the Local Societies or individuals can fruit or vegetables to help out at the Boarding House in feeding the people at Conference and Camp Meeting.
- 10. Also that we keep in mind the furnishing of the bed in the Houghton Dormitory by each Local Society. Also the sending of supplies to the Foreign Missionary fields, such as bandages, religious books, pictures, or calendars.
- 11. Our General Conference meets in Houghton, N. Y., in June, 1931, and each Local Society is requested to send the sum of 20 cents per member before April 15, 1931, to the Conference Treasurer to defray our part of the expense.
