Journal of Daily Proceedings

Monday Night

The Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. J. M. Merrell.

After the song service led by Frank Henry Harris, the opening message of the Conference was brought by Rev. F. H. Harris. He brought an inspiring message on "Children of the King." Both the sermon and a special song were dedicated to our Conference President.

Tuesday Morning

The devotionals were conducted by H. R. Gunby. The Lord's Supper was observed.

The President, J. M. Merrell, called the Conference to order. The secretary called the roll. The roll of Eders and Annual Conference preachers was corrected and following names were transferred to the newly organized Florida Conference: Elders—C. E. Shaw, Mrs. C. E. Shaw, L. E. Francisco, J. T. Strickland, R. M. Henkle. Annual Conference Preachers—Mrs. Ruth Rogers, G. C. Gilliard, W. H. Bouington, Foster Piatt, C. V. Earnhart.

A motion prevailed that the name of Mrs. Nina Deen be referred to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

The Conference Bar was fixed to include the first three seats across the front and on the side.

The Committee on Nominations made their report which was adopted. (See Reports)

The Committee on Courtesy reported and Dr. F. R. Birch, Foreign Missionary Secretary, was introduced to the Conference, and spoke words of greetings. Rev. R. G. Cudd of the South Carolina Conference was introduced to the Conference and gave his testimony.

A motion was made and carried that Brother F. R. Birch, our denominational representative, be asked to preside during the remainder of the Conference.

A motion prevailed that W. A. Sapp be seated as delegate for H. R. Gunby, an elder of the Brunswick Church.

On th strength of Paragraph 80 of the discipline, the names of Jack C. Osborn and James Miller were not legally dropped from the Cordele Church roll, so Johnny Tarrer of Cordele was elected by the Conference and seated as delegate for Jack C. Osborn. Mrs. Pearl Sapp of Brunswick was elected and seated as delegate for James Miller.

The Committee on Credentials reported and the roll of delegates were called. The name of Mrs. Valene Bennett was substituted for that of Will Moore on the Mt. Pleasant Charge. The roll was adopted, as corrected.

The report of the President was given and adopted. (See Reports)
The hours of the Conference were adopted as follows; to convene at
90'clock until 11:45, to meet again at 1 o'clock and to adjourn by motion.
Adjourned by limitation of time.

Tuesday Afternoon

After a song was sung and prayer was led by C. M. Payne, the Conference was called to order by the chair. The roll was called. The minutes of the morning meeting were read and approved.

The name of W. T. Brinson was added to the roll of elders.

The report of the Treasurer of Ashburn Camp Meeting Committee was given and adopted. (See Reports.)

The Orders of the Day were fixed as follows: The denominational address by Rev. F. R. Birch will be given Tuesday Night. The election of officers will be held immediately following the approval of the minutes in the Wednesday afternoon meeting. The Educational address will be given by Rev. R. C. Mullinax at 10:30 Wednesday Morning. The ladies public Missionary service will be held Wednesday Night.

A motion was carried that the ladies be given from 1:45 to 2:30 for the Missionary business meeting.

The report of the Committee on Memorials was given and adopted. (See Reports). The time for a public memorial service was set for Thursday morning following the approval of the minutes.

A recess from 1:45 to 2:30 was taken.

The Conference was called to order by the Chairman.

The Committee on Education gave a report, which was adopted. (See Reports)

The Committee on Moral Reform gave a report which was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Committee on Characters was given and adopted. (See Reports.)

The following names were called and their reports were given: J. M. Merrell, F. H. Harris, C. M. Payne, Mack Thompson, E. C. Moon, Dennis Carter, E. C. Hord, L. C. Douthit, D. W. Williams.

The evangelistic reports of A. C. Legg, Jack C. Osborn, and James Miller were given.

A letter from R. C. Crossman was read by the secretary.

H. R. Gunby gave a report of his activities.

A letter from Rev. R. M. Henkle was read by the secretary who was instructed to answer in a letter of greetings from the Conference. The name of R. M. Henkle was added to the list of those transferred to the Florida Conference.

A communication was read from the Tifton Church recommending Brother and Sister Willard Parrish as suitable persons for the work of song evangelism to work under the direction of the annual conference. This recommendation was voted to be referred to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

A communication was read from the Wayne Charge, recommending Sister Lala Sports as a suitable person to be received as a preacher, to study, preparatory to travel under the direction of the annual conference. This recommendation was voted to be referred to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

A recommendation was read from the Brunswick Church, recommending Brother and Sister W. C. Wright as suitable persons for the work of song evangelism to work under the direction of the Annual Conference. This recommendation was referred to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

A recommendation that the Conference elect the nominating Committee instead of its being appointed by the president, was discussed and voted to be tabled for the present time.

A motion prevailed to adjourn.

Wednesday Morning

The devotionals were led by W. M. Sigafoes.

The Chairman called the Conference to order. The roll was called. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The first reading of the Committee on Pastoral Relations report was read.

The Committee on Courtesy reported and Dr. R. C. Mullinax, President of Central College was introduced to the Conference and spoke words of testimony.

The report of the Auditing Committee was given and referred back for completion.

A motion, that the bringing of Church Record Books to conference for inspection be discontinued, was lost.

A motion prevailed that uniform Church record books be purchased by all churches.

A motion that the president hold all four quarterly conferences at every church on a week-end, was lost.

The Committee on Characters gave an additional report and the name of W. W. Wigglesworth, who came in late, was added to the list of those whose character had been passed. Brother Wigglesworth gave his report.

The Committee on Tithing gave their report which was adopted, and voted to be offered to "The Wesleyan Methodist" for publication. (See Reports.)

The Committee on Nominations made an additional report and Mrs.

Valene Bennett was elected a Committee on Post Office addresses.

A short recess was taken.

The President called the Conference to order. After a song and prayer, a special song was sung by Frank Henry Harris.

Dr. R. C. Mullinax, President of Central College, brought the Educational address, after which several former students and others express-

ed their appreciation of Central College.

Wednesday Afternoon

The devotionals were conducted by Brother Cudd.

The Chairman called the Conference to order. The roll was called. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Committee on Courtesy reported. Brother and Sister Palmer of the Savannah Nazarene Church were introduced to the Conference and spoke words of testimony.

The time of the election of officers arrived. L. C. Douthit, and Dennis Carter were appointed distributing tellers. Elton Strickland and C. M. Payne were appointed receiving tellers. Brother J. M. Merrell expressed his desire not to be considered for re-election to the presidency, due to his age and failing health. The Conference expressed their appreciation of the long and faithful service of Brother Merrell by giving him a rising vote of appreciation and a love offering amounting to \$32.12.

The report of the Committee on Sunday Schools was given and adopted. (See Reports.)

The Committee on Thanks gave a report which was adopted after additions were made. (See Reports.)

The conference gave Brother R. C. Harrell a rising vote of thanks for his work in helping to entertain the conference. The conference gave "Aunt Lu" and her co-worker a rising vote of thanks for their faithful work in the kitchen. Sister Nellie Long was given a rising vote of appreciation for her splendid work in the dining hall.

The report of the Apportionment Committee was given and adopted after correction. (See Reports.)

A motion was carried that the secretary have 300 copies of the minutes published.

By common consent it was decided to leave the assessment of minutes at 50¢ per member with the understanding that part of the money may be used in the entertainment of the conference.

The W. Y. P. S. nominated W. C. Wright as their President. He was elected by the conference.

The report of the Statistical Committee was given and adopted. (See Reports.) Brother Parrish was given a rising vote of thanks in preparing this report.

Adjourned by limitation of time.

COMMITTEE ON TITHING

Our conference does not have enough tithing members, and in the prophet Malachi's day there was a need for more people to tithe. In failing to tithe, Malachi called it robbing God. Such an indictment should awaken any people and cause them to face facts about themselves. Malachi was specific in his charge against his people—you have robbed God in tithe and offerings. For all our members to bring into God's church His rightful-owned tithes, we believe that we would soon see our conference go forward in a fashion that would make us both to wonder and to rejoice.
