DAILY PROCEEDINGS.

FIRST DAY—MORNING MEETING.

The Kansas Conference convened for its 30th annual session with the Wesleyan Methodist church at Excelsior, near Saxman, Rice County, Kansas, Wednesday, September 12th, 1900.

Religious services conducted by Rev. L. Wing who read the first chapter of Colossians and offered prayer.

Conference called to order by the president, Rev. T. Ford, who declared the body open for the transaction of business.

The secretary called the roll, eight elders responding. C. P. Carkuff was elected a committee on credentials. Committee on credentials reported the following names as delegates-elect to the body: Kinsley Morgan from Ames; I. N. Vories from Evergreen, O. T.; Wesley I. Hibler from Chapman; Mrs. M. A. Jackson from Lawrence; Alice E. Lienard from Easton; J. C. Maze, Margerett Maze, Ruby M. McNeely and Bertha Nelson

from Topeka and Jas. Allen from Excelsior.

The following committees were filled: Statistics, A. P. Lienard and W. I. Hibler; Moral Reform, H. W. Hampe, J. Carnahan and Kinsley Morgan. Books and Periodicals, H. Jennie Talioferro and Bertha Nelson. Religious Services, Rev. T. Ford, Rev. R. A. French and Jas. Allen. Pastoral Relations, T. Ford, ex-officio, C. P. Carcuff, V. C. Talioferro, J. A. Williams, J. C. Maze, Kinsley Morgan and Mrs. M. A. Jackson. Boundaries, R. A. French and Jas. Allen. Judiciary, L. Wing, E. S. Higgins, T. Ford and R. A. French. Presidency, L. Wing, E. S. Higgins and

The bar of conference was fixed as the first five rows

of seats.

E. S. Higgins was elected tithing secretary.

A. P. Lienard was elected to succeed himself as the retiring member of the committee on Itinerancy and Orders.

T. Ford resigned his position as a member of the committee on Itinerancy and Orders, and R. A. French was elected to succeed him.

The hours of opening and closing were fixed as follows: Opening at 9 a. m. and at 2 p. m. To close by vote.

The hour for the election of permanent officers was fixed for Thursday afternoon immediately after religious services.

The hour for selecting the time and place of our next annual session was fixed at Thursday morning immediately after opening.

Communications were read from B. F. Hester, H. B. Parsons, Ira Gray, P. N. Martin, W. C. Boardman and E. J. Franklin and referred to the committee on Pastoral Relations.

On motion the name of H. H. Gane was dropped from the roll.

Conference proceeded to the examination of character. A. P. Lienard, M. McPhee and Ira E. Bradley were called, answered disciplinary questions and characters passed.

Rev. E. Teter, President of the Indiana, and also of the General Conference, was introduced.

On motion all visiting members were invited to honorary seats.

Confe. ence adjourned for committee work.

AFTERNOON MEETING.

Devotional exercises conducted by J. Carnahan. Lesson 6th chapter of 1st Corinthians.

The committee on Itinerancy and Orders was filled by

Committee on Credentials reported the names of John Day from Lyons, H. G. Martin from Bonner Springs, Wm. Braddy from Osage, Fred Sewart from Hollis and Mrs. L. Bailey from Topeka.

Rev. A. W. Hall, Connectional Agent and Secretary of Syracuse, N. Y., was introduced to the conference.

Rev. W. H. Kennedy, General Missionary Superintendent, of Syracuse, N. Y. was introduced to the conference.

On motion the hour of 10 a. m. Thursday was given Brethren Hall and Kennedy to present Connectional interests.

Papers recommending the following persons as suitable to tra vel were read and referred to the committee on Itinerancy: R. W. Gage, Porter Willis, E. E. Bryant, J. W. Godsey, Wm. Braddy, Geo. Little and Clara R. Pence.

A letter from Sister Campbell was read conveying the intelligence that her husband had passed to his eternal reward.

A committee consisting of J. Carnahan, L. Wing and H. W. Hampe were appointed to arrange for a memorial service and draft resolutions of sympathy to Sister Campbell.

Conference resumed the examination of character. M. C. Kendrick, J. H. Mead, H. Jennie Taliaferro, C. P. Carkuff, T. Ford, C. M. Bamford, D. D. Cole, L. Wing, V. C. Taliaferro and J. A. Williams were called, answered disciplinary questions and their characters passed. Conference adjourned.

SECOND DAY—MORNING MEETING.
Religious services conducted by Rev- J. A. Williams.

Lesson, 46th Psalm.

G. B. Howard, through Bro. Lienard, requested a

letter of his standing and a transfer to the Willamette conference. On motion his request was granted.

A partial report from the committee on Itinerancy and Orders was read, recommending C. M. Bamford as a suitable person to be ordained Elder. The report was adopted.

Committee on Credentials reported the names of R. James from Chapman, John Reimer from Raymond, and Mrs. Allie Wrench from Laban, as delegates-elect to this body. Report adopted.

A communication from J. N. Davis was read and re-

ferred to the committee on Pastoral Relations.

Rev. D. T. Grout, pastor of the U. B. church at Lost Springs, Kansas, was introduced to the conference and made a few remarks signifying a desire to unite with us.

The order of the day was called and Bro. Hall gave the conference a very interesting and instructive talk. concluding his remarks by taking subscriptions to relieve the indebtedness of Houghton Seminary, to the amount of \$57.00.

Conference adjourned. Benediction by Rev. L. Wing. AFTERNOON MEETING.

Religious services conducted by Rev. A. P. Lienard. Committee on Credentials reported the name of E. H. Sewart as a suitable person to be ordained. T. S. Walter to travel and J. W. Frager as delegate-elect from Morrowville. Report adopted.

The hour for the election of conference officers having arrived, an informal ballot was taken for president, resulting in the selection of T. Ford. The secretary was instructed to cast the vote of the conference for Bro.

Ford's election.

E. S. Higgins was elected conference Secretary.

Rev. L. Wing was elected conference Treasurer by acclamation.

On motion it was decided to have two conference Evangelists. Rev. T. Ford was elected as one, and V. C. Taliaferro as the other.

The conference Evangelists were instructed to travel over the conference and fill or arrange to have filled, the quarterly meetings of each charge and circuit.

On motion the conference tabernacle was placed in the hands of the president, to be used as he may deem best.

The remainder of the old conference tabernacle was left in the hands of Bro. Taliaferro to dispose of at will.

Letters from O. W. Cooper and M. Watkins were read and and referred to the committee on Pastoral Relations.

THIRD DAY-MORNING MEETING.

Devotional services conducted by Rev. E. Teter. Lesson, a part of the 20th chapter of Acts.

Roll called. Minutes read and approved.

A partial report of the committee on Credentials was read and adopted. Delegates, T. J. Hunter, Mark Dolsby, James Cullen and W. S. Miller. W. C. Elliot to be ordained and John Dimmit and J. M. Davidson to travel.

On motion it was decided to leave the place of holding our next annual session with the president and his advisory board.

A committee was elected to select a central location where a tabernacle can be used for conference purposes. T. Ford, V. C. Talliaferro and F. C. Hill were constituted the committee.

The date of holding our annual sessions was fixed as a permanent date. During the week of September 12th.

tion for subscriptions.

Conference adjourned for Missionary meeting. Conference came to order at the call of the chair.

Letters were read from Sister Dellinger and Robert Daugherty, the latter being referred to the committee on Pastoral Relations.

Subscriptions to the amount of \$52.50 were taken for the support of Sister Dellinger at Houghton.

E. S. Higgins was voted \$10.00 for his missionary work in Oklahoma.

T. Ford was voted \$10.00 to meet his expenses in correspondence and otherwise.

Committee on Itinerancy and Orders made their re-

port which was adopted. (See Report No. 1.)

A request from the delegate of the Elevation church asking to be united with the Topeka charge was referred to the committee on boundaries. (See Report No. 2)

The committee to draft resolutions of sympathy to be

sent to father Campbell's widow made their report. Report adopted. (See Report No. 3.)

Conference adjourned, benediction by Rev. Taliaferro.

FOURTH DAY—MORNING MEETING.

Roll called, Minutes read, corrected and approved. E. S. Higgins was called answered disciplinary ques-

tions and character passed.

The president of the conference was elected to preach the opening sermon at the opening of conference next year.

On motion it was decided that where serious objections were made to a preacher's character any time during the year, that immediate steps be taken to deal with the

case, according to Discipline.
