The forty-seventh annual session of the South Georgia Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America, met with the Savannah Church, October 8, 1942.

Religious services were held the evening before with the Conference President, Rev. J. M. Merrell, bringing the message, which was deeply appreciated and well received.

Conference opened with devotional services conducted by R. W. Gray after which a commemoration of the Lord's Supper was conducted by Brothers J. M. Merrell, H. R. Gunby and W. W. Wigglesworth.
