JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

First Day-Morning Meeting

The forty-seventh annual session of the South Georgia Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America, met with the Savannah Church, October 8, 1942.

Conference opened with devotional services conducted by R. W. Gray after which a commemoration of the Lord's Supper was conducted by Brothers J. M. Merrell, H. R. Gunby and W. W. Wigglesworth.
