## STANDING RULES

- No. 1 On Literature: Inasmuch as our denominational literature, because of its loyalty to the doctrines of our Church and because of its position on all questions of reform, is of such a nature as to promote and more fully establish-our principles; and inasmuch as we consider it the duty and privilege of pastors and lay members of our denomination to extend its distribution: Therefore be it Resolved, That we as a Conference pledge ourselves to extend our literature as much as possible, that we use our best endeavor to place our lesson helps and papers in all our Sabbath Schools.
- No. 2 Board of Trustees Report for Final Action: Resolved, That all matters involving the expenditure of money to be appropriated from the Conference Treasuries, be referred to the Board of Trustees for their consideration and to be reported back by them to the Conference for final action.
- No. 3 General Conference Delegate: Resolved, That it is the sense of the Lockport Conference that no person should accept the position as delegate to the General Conference unless he expects to be present during the entire session. The President is requested to communicate this resolution to the delegates three weeks before the General Conference begins.
- No. 4 Evangelists' Report: Resolved, That it is the sense of this Conference that all Conference and General Evangelists be requested to report their work and financial receipts to each Annual Conference.
- No. 5 Closing Treasurer's Books: The Conference Treasurer is hereby authorized to close his books two weeks before the Annual Conference convenes, therefore all receipts and monies should be in his hands by that time if credit on Statistical Report is desired.
- No. 6 Salary: Resolved, That it is the sense of the Lockport Conference that the minimum salary of an ordained minister on one of our Charges shall be parsonage and one thousand dollars.
- No. 7 Temperance, Sabbath Observance, and Public Morals: Resolved, 1. That we are definitely committed to the prohibition of the liquor traffic rather than its regulation. 2. That we hereby affirm our belief and conviction that the Christian Sabbath was appointed as a day of rest and

worship and should be so observed with resolute consistency. 3. That we believe that the highest and noblest conception of public morals is to be achieved through the regeneration of individuals rather than through the collective reformation of society. 4. That for the successful maintenance of the positions above indicated we are fully committed to the support of every valid effort for the preservation of our democratic rights of free speech, a free press, and free religion against all encroachments of dictatorial regimentation of thought and action whether in State or Church.

- No. 8 Pastor's Finance: Resolved, That a pastor is justified in refusing to accept a call to any Charge refusing to assume financial obligations.
- No. 9 Reporting Sunday School Statistics: The pastors in reporting the Sunday School Statistics under item IV shall give actual number of officers, teachers and scholars on lines 2, 3, 4; on line 5 the total number of persons in the school, exclusive of the Cradle Roll and Home Department; on line 9 the sum of lines 5, 7 and 8.
- No. 10 Reading of Reports: Resolved, That in the reading of the Pastor's Statistical Report it is obligatory to read only items 3, 9 and 10.
- No. 11 Adjustment of Pastor's Salary: Resolved, That churches which enter into a financial agreement with the pastor shall when needful, make adjustment of this obligation at each quarterly meeting. A full settlement of the pastor's salary shall be made before the time of the Annual Conference.
- No. 12 Delegates' Credentials: It shall be the duty of the pastors to forward to the Conference Secretary not later than one week before the Annual Conference convenes the church (not missionary) delegates' credentials from his charge.

## JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

#### Wednesday Evening Meeting, April 6, 1938

The Lockport Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened for its Seventy-seventh Annual Session at the Fillmore Wesleyan Methodist Church in Fillmore, N. Y. on April 6, 1938, at 7:00 p. m.

Opening.—The President, Rev. Edward L. Elliott, called the Conference to order. Rev. A. J. Taylor Ied in the singing of "Keep Me Near the Cross," Rev. A. A. Hickok led in prayer.

Roll Call.—The roll of ministers was called and 17 were marked present.

Credentials.—The Committee on Credentials made a partial report which was adopted as read.

Roll Call.—The roll of delegates was called and 11 were marked present.

Bar of Conference.—The bar of Conference was fixed as the first five rows of seats across the front of the church.

Time of Meetings.—The time for opening and closing of the meetings of Conference was fixed as follows: Morning meeting opening at nine o'clock and closing at noon; the afternoon meeting opening at one-thirty and closing by vote of Conference.

Temporary Organization.—The Committee on Temporary Organization made its report which was adopted after the substitution of the name of Bessie Willett for that of Mae McClenahan. (See Report No. 1.)

Committee on Religious Services.—The Committee on Religious Services made its report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 2.)

**Petition.**—A petition was presented to the Conference from the Driftwood Church which was referred to the Committee on Boundaries. (See Report No. 3.)

Adjournment.—Adjourned by vote of the Conference.

#### Wednesday Evening Service

The religious service which followed was led by the President, Rev. Edward L. Elliott. After a short testimony meeting, Rev. Adrian Everts brought a message from 1 Peter 1:19.

#### Thursday Morning Meeting, April 7, 1938

Opening.—The President called the meeting to order and the devotions were conducted by the Rev. Arthur Osgood.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and a partial report of the Committee on Credentials was made which was accepted.

Order of the Day Made.—The election of Conference Officials was made an Order of the Day for Thursday afternoon following devotions.

Report Made.—The Committee on Ministerial Character made a partial report which was accepted.

President's Report.—The President called Rev. David Anderson to the Chair and Brother Elliott gave his report as President of the Conference. It was adopted as read. (See Report No. 4.)

Names Called.—The names of James R. Redstone, David Anderson, A. A. Hickok, Adrian Everts, N. R. Shaffer, Mae K. Shaffer, George Failing and J. R. Pitt were called and their characters passed.

Name Added.—The name of E. W. Black was added to the Committee on Evangelism and Church Extension.

Names called.—The names of George Osgood, E. W. Black, Maurice A. Gibbs, G. I. Norman and William Osgood were called and their characters passed.

Name Called.—The President called Brother Anderson to the Chair. The name of E. L. Elliott was called and his character passed.

**Courtesies.**—The Committee on Courtesies introduced Rev. E. F. Mc-Carty to the Conference.

Recess.—A recess was voted.

Name Called.—The Conference was called to order at 11:50 a.m. The name of C. I. Armstrong was called and his character was passed. (For his Evangelistic Report see Report No. 5.)

Courtesies. — The Committee on Courtesies introduced Mr. Hugh Paine, Dr. Stephen Paine and Hr. Henry Elliott to the Conference and they made a few remarks.

Time Extended.—The time for closing was extended.

Resignation.—J. R. Pitt resigned as Chairman of the Auditing Committee.

**Election.**—Walter Readett was elected to fill the vacancy on the Auditing Committee.

**Adjournment.**—Adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction by Rev. C. I. Armstrong.

#### Thursday Afternoon Meeting, April 7, 1938

Opening.—The meeting was called to order by the President and devotions were led by Rev. C. I. Armstrong.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Committee Reports.—The Committee on Boundaries gave their report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 6.)

Report Given.—Miss Marietta Fancher gave a report of the work which she is doing near Buffalo.

Election.—The Orders of the Day having arrived the President appointed Adrian Everts, Arthur Osgood, Theodore Pagett and Elmer Hudson tellers and the Conference proceeded with the election which resulted as follows:

President.—On the first ballot for President E. L. Elliott received 27 of 43 votes cast and was declared elected.

Vice-President.—On the first ballot for Vice-President Arthur J. Taylor received 23 of 43 votes cast and was declared elected.

Secretary.—On the first ballot for Secretary James R. Redstone received 41 of 43 votes cast and was declared elected.

Treasurer.—On the first ballot for Treasurer George N. Osgood received 35 of 43 votes cast and was declared elected.

Sunday School Secretary.—On the first ballot for Sunday School Secretary Adrian Everts received 35 of 41 votes cast and was declared elected.

Tithing Secretary.—On the first ballot for Tithing Secretary Maurice A. Gibbs received 32 of 43 votes cast and was declared elected.

Statistical Secretary.—On the ballot for Statistical Secretary George Failing received 29 of 40 votes cast and was declared elected.

Committee on Itineracy and Orders.—On the first ballot for member of Committee on Itineracy and Orders J. R. Pitt received 25 of 37 votes cast and was declared elected.

Educational Secretary.—On the first ballot for Educational Secretary Arthur Osgood received 21 of 40 votes cast and was declared elected.

Trustees.—For the Ministerial Member of the Board of Trustees E. L. Elliott received 33 of 41 votes cast and was declared elected.

For lay members of the Board of Trustees Millard E. Cornelius received 39 of 40 votes cast, Clayton F. Ball received 29 of 40 votes cast and they were declared elected.

Assistant Secretary.—It was voted that the Secretary nominate his own assistant. He nominated Walter Readett who was elected.

Standing Committees.—The nominating of Standing Committees was referred to the Committee on Temporary Organization.

Courtesies.—The Committee on Courtesies introduced Rev. Poland of the Short Track Methodist Episcopal Church who made a few remarks.

Communion Service.—The Orders of the Day having arrived the meeting was turned over to the Rev. M. A. Gibbs who conducted the Communion Service.

#### Communion Service

The Service was opened by the singing of "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross," Scripture was read by Brother Gibbs followed by the administering of the Lord's Supper.

Message Sent.—The Conference resumed business following the Communion Service. It was voted to send a telegram of sympathy to the bereaved family of Rev. P. B. Campbell.

Standing Rule Made.—It was voted that the following be made Standing Rule No. 12: "It shall be the duty of the pastors to forward to the Conference Secretary not later than one week before the Annual Conference convenes the church (not Missionary) delegates' credentials from his charge."

Resignation.—Rev. E. L. Elliott offered his resignation as a trustee of the Annual Conference which was accepted.

**Excused from Conference.**—Rev. C. I. Armstrong was excused from Conference.

Election.—The Conference proceeded to elect a ministerial member the Board of Trustees. The election resulted in Noah R. Shaffer receiving 21 of 33 votes cast and was declared elected.

Resignation.—The President, E. L. Elliott, offered his resignation as President, which was accepted.

Election.—The Conference proceeded to elect a President. The election resulted in Arthur J. Taylor receiving 25 of 35 votes cast and was declared elected.

Election.—G. I. Norman having received 22 of 35 votes cast was declared elected to the office of Vice-President.

Excused from Conference.—David Anderson was excused from Conference.

**Adjournment.**—Adjourned by vote of the Conference. Benediction by Rev. E. F. McCarty.

#### Thursday Evening Service

At the evening service Rev. E. W. Black brought the evening message on "God in Search of a Man" from Jer. 5:1.

#### Friday Morning Meeting, April 8, 1938

Opening.—The President, Rev. A. J. Taylor, called the meeting to order and devotions were led by Rev. Noah R. Shaffer. The President, A. J. Taylor, asked Brother Elliott to preside temporarily.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Sunday School Secretary's Report.—The Sunday School Secretary made his report which was accepted as read. (See Report No. 7.)

Treasurer's Report.—The Treasurer made his report which was accepted as read. (See Report No. 8.)

Names Called.—The names of Arthur Osgood, Walter Readett, Charles Sicard, A. J. Taylor and O. G. Wyman were called and their characters were passed.

Communication.—A communication was read from Peter Miller and his character passed.

Courtesies.—The Committee on Courtesies introduced Rev. and Mrs. John Mann who made a few remarks.

Communications.—Communications were read from C. H. Dow, M. A. Bateman, C. M. Dudley and their characters were passed.

Treasurer of Board of Trustees Reports.—The Treasurer of the Board of Trustees gave his report which was accepted as read. (See Report No. 9.)

Recess.—A recess was voted till the Orders of the Day.

Orders of the Day.—The Conference was called to order by the President, A. J. Taylor. The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived, the Rev. E. F. McCarty gave the Connectional Address.

Adjournment.—Adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction by Rev. Charles Sicard.

#### Friday Afternoon Meeting, April 8, 1938

Opening.—After devotions conducted by Rev. Maurice A. Gibbs, the Conference was called to order by Brother Elliott.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Courtesies.—The Committee on Courtesies introduced Rev. J. F. Wright, William Plants and Rev. and Mrs. Ralph Fuller who made a few remarks.

Offering Taken.—It was voted to take an offering for Brother J. F. Wright. It amounted to \$7.50.

Courtesies.—The Committee on Courtesies introduced Rev. Babcock, a District Superintendent; Rev. Milehoff, pastor at Batavia; Rev. Mac-Pherson, pastor at Rochester; all of the Church of the Nazarene, to the Conference. They made a few remarks.

Committee Reports.—The Committee on Temperance, Sabbath Observance and Public Morals made its report which was accepted and made the Standing Rule No. 7. (For the Report see Standing Rule No. 7.)
