2. That all Conference Church Treasurers send a report of all Budget Money raised on their charges to their pastors by July 10th. preceeding Conference.
3. That all pastors be required to have their Statistical reports ready to report on the first day of the Annual Conference.
4. That all Conference Mission Money be paid to the Conf. Treas.
5. That the Conf. President turn all money received by him over to the Conference Treas. and the Conference Treas. pay him his salary monthly.
6. That each pastor be urged to comply with the discipline and bring up his budget in full for missions, education and the \$ 2.50 for Conference Missions.
7. That our pastors employ our own evangelist unless permission to do otherwise be granted by the President and his board.
8. In these days when modernism and higher criticism have crept into so many of the schools of the country; Be it resolved that we give our own denominational schools and our missions our loyal support since we know these to be free from these destructive elements.
9. That the Annual Conference and Churches refuse all denominational and undenominational representatives from holding meetings in our churches for the purposes of soliciting funds.
10. That the Tithing Secretary send an official notice to all pastors during the month of August, of the 12¢ per member to be raised for General Conf. Fund.
11. That the offering for Superannuated Ministers be taken on or near the time of the second Quarterly meeting; the amount to agree with the requirements of the discipline, page 82, paragraph 146.
12. That the Conf. Treas. send notice at some convient time during the year that a sum equal to 15¢ per member be raised for Conference General Fund.
13. Knowing that the world is bidding for the patronage of the younger generation and that many talented boys and girls are being lead astray by the agencies of sin: Be it resolved that each pastor provide activities for the young that will help them save their lives for God and the benefit of the Church.

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON ITINERACY & ORDERS.
