The Sixth Annual Meeting of the Rochester Conference, commenced its session in the Wesleyan Chapel at Jamestown Chautauque [sic] Co. N. Y—April 24<sup>th</sup> 1850. and adjourned on the Saturday evening following at 11 O. Clock, 1850—

Defered [sic] acting for a short time when Br L. C. Matlack, our Book Agent, from New York City, was introduced and by vote of the Conference invited to an honorary seat in that body with priviledge [sic] of speaking.

<u>Voted.</u> To adopt the <u>report</u> of the Committee on <u>Reforms</u> which is as follows, Viz.

That we adopt the Pledge of the "League of Universal Brotherhood"

Pledge "Believing all war to be inconsistant [sic] with the spirit of christianity [sic] and destructive of the best interests of mankind. I do hereby pledge myself never to enlist or enter any Army or navy, or to yield any voluntary support or sanction to the preparation for or the prosecution of any war, by whomsoever or for whatsoever purpose declared or waged.

And I do hereby associate myself with all persons, of whatsoever country, condition, or color, will have signed, or shall hereafter sign, this pledge, in a "League of Universal Brotherhood;" whose object shall be to employ all legitimate and moral means for the abolition of all war, and all the spirit, and all the manifestations of war through the world; for the abolition of all restrictions upon international correspondence and friendly intercourse, and of whatever else tends to make enemies of nations or prevent their fusion into one peaceful brotherhood; for the abolition of all institutions and customs which

do not recognize and respect the image of God and a human brother in every man, of whatsoever, color, or condition of humanity."

Conference assembled at 8, A, M\_ Reading the Scriptures, Singing, and prayer conducted by Br S. Philips

Roll called, Minutes read and approved, The order of the day being the Resolution on Secret Societies, but by consent of the Conference, other business was attended to first.

Committee on Obituaries report.

Report received and adopted,

as follows.

<u>Elijah P. Rowe</u>: --A notice of this brother's death appeared in the Wesleyan, soon after the session of the Rochester Conference on Sunday evening on Monday morning complained of illness, and before the week closed died. His end was peace, He was a member of the Rochester Conference but a short time and of his pervious history your committee know nothing.

John R. Spoor. – This brother attended the Conference at Senecal Falls in 1849. – but his health was feble, [sic] and on the 8th day of June following, he died in great peace, This brother embraced religion in early life, and at the age of 23, commenced preaching the Gospel of Christ, He was successful as a Minister in wining [sic] souls to the Saviour, [sic] He entered the Rochester Conference in 1845.—and continued in the regular work till his health failed in 1849. – When on his death bed he remarked that it afforded him great consolation that he was not a member of a pro Slavery Church.

The Conference deeply sympathise [sic] with Sis Spoor in her bereavement, and our prayer is that God may fulfill to her his gracious promises

The Committee reccommend [sic] that a funeral sermon be preached in this house on Sunday afternoon next or the death of these two brethren by some brother appointed by the Conference. All of which is respectfully submitted.

Voted. That the committee on Ministerial Qualifications have liberty to retire

Voted That a funeral sermon be preached to morrow [sic] afternoon by the President on the death of brethren Elijah. P. Rowe and John. R. Spoor.

Conference assembled according to adjournment Devotional services conducted by Bro J. Broadhead.

The Resolution on Secret Societies, which was laid on the table yesterday, was called for and again read, when a spirited discussion ensued.

The hour of 3 having arrived when the conference were to hear the report of L. C. Matlack on our <u>Book Concern</u> it was again:

<u>Voted</u> To lay the above resolution on the table.

It was not deemed necessary by the conference to transcribe the report of our Book Agent upon the records of Conference.

Bro L. C. Matlack offered a resolution requesting the conference to act upon a proposition four in <u>True Wesleyan</u> of May 4<sup>th</sup> 1850. Vol 8<sup>th</sup> for publishing a volume of sermons by Wesleyan Ministers, which was adopted. The resolution was not retained by the Secretary.

<u>Voted</u>. That the conference proceed to ballot for four Elders, members of this body, to write each a sermon for publication in the volume above refered [sic] to and that the four having the highest number of votes at the first balloting be declared elected.

<u>Voted</u> That the Secretary be the <u>teller</u>.

After balloting, the following persons were declared elected. <u>viz</u> Samuel, Salsbury, 17. Votes Samuel, Philips. 14. Votes

John. Watson 17. " Marshall. Frink. 10. "

Sixty two subscribers were immediately obtained for the above mentioned volume.

Report of the committee on Sugar Grove church, presented, accepted and adopted.

Report as follows viz. – The committee agree and report, that taking the whole circumstances into consideration that the charges against Sugar Grove Church by Br G. Pegler, are not sustained, for want of satisfactory evidence.

Voted That the request of Bro. H. Benson to be appointed to the Cazenovia Free church be granted

Voted, The we have an evening session to commence at 7. O. clock.

<u>Voted.</u> That F. R. Mastin serve as Sec. p<u>ro</u> tem on account of the Secretary's appointment to preach.

Committee on Ministerial character report

As follows

That Arthur Hughs is sensurable [sic] for leaving his charge before the conference year had closed after receiving what was pledged to him by the circuit. Also, for not meeting his engagements in borrowing money.

# Fourth day. Evening Session.

Conference opened by the usual religious services. Roll called. Minutes read, corrected, and adopted.

<u>Voted</u>. To grant the request of Samuel Gail, to have his name placed on the Superanuated [sic] List.

The committee, of Minsterial [sic] character, to whom was refered [sic] the case of A. Hughs, report the following resolution which was read and <u>adopted</u>.

Resolved. That from facts and circumstances coming to the knowledge of this body in relation to the character of A. Hughs. in respect to his leaving his pastoral duties, and as to borrowed money. it is now improper to pass his character.

<u>Voted.</u> That E. M. High. M. Q. M<sup>©</sup>Farland. and Keeler. Hoyt. Be a committee to investigate the case of Arthur, Hughs, and report to the next Session of this body,

The committee on Ministerial character, farther [sic] report, which was accepted and adopted,

That from testimony which came before them they think it necessary, that a committee be appointed to investigate the case of Richard Chapin and take immediate action.

On motion.

<u>Voted.</u> To refer the case of Richard. Chapin. To the Minister to be in charge of the Jamestown church, this conference year, for investigation.

<u>Committee</u> on Pastoral relations presented their report in part, which was received, when conference adjourned for half an hour. After the expiration of half an hour conference resumed business

<u>Committee</u> on Pastoral relations presented their report entire.

Report <u>accepted</u> and <u>adopted</u> without opposition. <u>See Report on Page</u>. 23. It was a time of deep solemnity. Each brother seemed to realize something of the responsibilities of the relations he had voluntarily assumed. Much brotherly love and mutual interest in our common cause seemed to characterise [sic] the occasion.

The reccommed [sic] of Isaac Johnston, a licentiate was read when it was:

Voted, That his name be received and placed on the Reserve List.

<u>Voted</u>, That the request of John. Broadhead. To be left without an appointment be granted.

<u>Voted</u>, That Benjamin, Rider, D. E. Baker. And Peter, S, Slauson, be a committee to make arrangements for a Conference Camp. Meeting.

<u>Voted</u>. That the thanks of this conference be tendered to the friends of Jamestown, for their hospitality extended to the members of this Conference, during its present Session.

<u>Voted</u>. That the request of Peter Norris to have his name placed on the superanuated [sic] List be granted.

<u>Voted</u>. That the names of those on the stationed List who remain unemployed be returned on the Reserve List.

After a season of united prayer for a continuation of God's blessings, and of thanksgiving for his mercies past, by singing the Doxology "Praise God from whom all blessings flow" – Conference adjourned. Sine die.

Thus ended a very peaceful and harmonious Session of the Rochester Yearly Conference at Eleven O, Clock. on Saturday evening, with the business complete, except the Ordination of those reccommended, [sic] which is to take place tomorrow morning.
