## IN MEMORIAM



REV. J. R. GEORGE

Rev. J. R. George was born October 12, 1870, and was called to his heavenly reward April 29, 1941. He spent thirty-three years in active service as a minister in the South Carolina Conference, having served as pastor of the following churches: Glendale, Gaffney, Pelzer, Piedmont, Greenville, Spartanburg, Landrum, Greer, Union, Easley, Pickens View, Davis Chapel, Anderson, Iva, Fellowship, Walhalla, Westminster, Mount Olivet, Conestee and Central Second Church. He was ordained to Elders Orders in the Wesleyan Methodist Church in 1910. He was Vice-President of the Conference for ten years, also President of the Conference Camp Meeting for a number of years.

Rev. W. B. Clubb was born April 12, 1886, and was called to his heavenly reward March 2, 1941. It is understood that these are the maximum amounts and dependent of course upon whether or not sufficient money may be available from the fund for Superannuated Ministers.

Resolution—The following resolution regarding Anderson Church property was unanimously adopted:

Resolution: Whereas, the members of the Anderson, S. C., Wesleyan Methodist Church find it necessary to enlarge and otherwise rearrange their plant; and whereas, to do so makes necessary the securing of additional funds; and whereas, the title to the property now occupied is vested in the Parent Missionary Board of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America; Now therefore be it Resolved, by the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, now in 49th annual session, That we do hereby petition the Parent Missonary Board of the said Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America to transfer the title to the said Anderson, South Carolina, Wesleyan Methodist Church property to the Board of Conference Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church.

Said South Carolina Conference agrees with the Parent Missionary Board that if this request is granted that it will defray all costs connected with the said transfer.

Missionary Board—The Missionary Board reported its actions for the past year and recommendations for the New Year. Reports adopted. See Reports Nos. 3 and 4.

Advisory Board—The President nominated, and the Conference elected Rev. R. C. Mullinax and Talmage Evatt as the President's Advisory Board.

The committees were appointed as follows: Central District—R. C. Kendrick (Ex-Officio), R. C. Mullinax, T. Evatt. Spartanburg District—R. C. Kendrick (Ex-Officio), J. B. Hilson, C. E. Henderson.

Pastoral Relations—The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its third reading. Report adopted. See Report No. 2.

Minutes—The Minutes were read and by vote the Minutes for the entire session were adopted.

## STANDING RULES AND RESOLUTIONS

- 1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.
- 2. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents or teachers of any Sunday schools that are held in our churches if they hold membership in secret societies.
- 3. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and also to hold if possible a two weeks revival during the year.
- 4. That the Committee on Public Worship consist of the President of the Conference, the pastor of the charge where the Conference is held, and the pastor's delegate.
- 5. That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.
- 6. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other Church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.
- 7. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.
- 8. That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conference Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.
- 9. That this Conference elect a Tithing Secretary, as provided for in our Discipline, whose duty it shall be to visit each charge at least once a year, if possible. Each church visited shall raise at least the traveling expenses of the Secretary at the time of his visitation.
  - 10. That each local church or charge elect a Tithing Secretary,

whose duty it shall be to thoroughly canvass the membership of the church or charge each quarter and labor most earnestly to induce each member to strictly tithe his income and to place the same in the church treasury for the purpose of meeting all the claims of the church, both locally and generally. This Secretary shall report at each Quarterly Conference the percentage of the membership who are tithing in keeping with this plan, the percentage who are giving in other ways, and the percentage who are not giving at all. Each pastor and church shall coöperate with these Secretaries in every possible way in order to make the entire membership of this Conference strict tithers.

- 11. That we as a conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.
- That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (and this writing is to become a part of the permanent record of the Trustees), and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. And the Trustees of said South Carolina Annual Conference are also hereby empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of his entire Advisory Board.
- 13. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Church Extension and Conference Evangelism, and General Conference Travel, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payment from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one half the other members of the Missionary Board.
- 14. Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church

and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

- 15. Any Superannuated Elder shall receive not more than fifty cents (.50) per month for each year of service he has given in the Conference. The widow of an Elder shall receive, not more than twenty-five cents (\$.25) per month for each year of service which she and her husband have rendered together in the Conference. It is understood that these are the maximum amounts and dependent of course upon whether of not sufficient money may be available from the fund for Superannuated Ministers.
- 16. All pastors shall have their Statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a. m. Thursday of Conference.
- 17. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is required to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.

## REPORTS

#### Report No. 1

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the members of the South Carolina Annual Conference: As we are now assembled in our forty-ninth annual session, I especially desire that Christ, the great Head of the Church, shall be pleased with all deliberations, and that in all our problems we will be governed by divine love.

As your Conference President I have endeavored to push every arm of the work, serving in every capacity possible without partially; watching over each of you with a jealous care. I have enjoyed splendid health and a degree of the favors of the Lord upon my labors.

We feel very keenly the loss of three of our ministers, who passed away during the Conference year. On Sunday, March 2, 1941, Rev. W. B. Clubb was suddenly called to his final reward. He attended the morning worship, manifesting his usual Christ-like spirit while his pastor preached, then passed away in the early afternoon.

On April 6, 1941, Rev. J. F. Mason, an outstanding local preacher of the Oakway Church, answered his final call. He was a man with a strong personality, great faith in God and was mighty in prayer.

On April 28, 1941, Rev. J. R. George finished his labors and suffering on earth and went to be with the Lord whom he loved and served. He gave thirty odd years of ministry to the Wesleyan Methodist Church. Through his efforts many churches and parsonages have been built. In the final reckoning day, I believe, that there will be many that will rise up and call him blessed.

We shall miss the fellowship of these who have gone. We trust that the gap made by their going will be filled by young men and women who have God and a vision for our Church.

As we have supervised the work of our Conference, we note with a great pleasure any progress that is made. The Carlisle folks have built a five room parsonage and paid for it during the Conference year. This will help to meet the needs of their good community.

The Rev. F. H. Pressley and his good people of Fountain Inn are adding more Sunday-school rooms to their church.

The new church and parsonage at Glenville are quite an asset to our Conference. The church was dedicated Sunday, May 3, 1941. This work is in a fine condition.

Due to the untiring efforts of pastor and people the debt has been lifted from the parsonage at Glendale.

Since the last Annual Conference there has been a church built at Laurens. The work is progressing nicely under the leadership of its pastor, Rev. M. C. King.

The Greenville Church, since building their Sunday-school Department, has made some commendable improvements on the main auditorium.

The Glenwood Church has the principle part of the funds layed by to install a heating system in the near future.

Miller Memorial Church has had a splendid year. They had one gracious revival, paid a full budget, reduced the church debt from \$1100.00 to \$227.00.

The Spartanburg Church is launching a building project. A more desirable location has been purchased on Magnolia Street and the plans are now being perfected for a new building that will be in keeping with its surroundings.

The Tucapau Church has just completed a new building. They held the opening service Sunday, June 8, 1941, at 3:00 p. m. The building has a basement with Sunday-school rooms and it is located in one of the most desirable places in town.

Whitmire has added two rooms to the parsonage, brick veneered the church, enlarged the auditorium, having done the interior with celotex. This adds to the beauty as well as to the value of the building; they have also installed a gas heating system.

No doubt other pastors and churches are making progress worthy of note that I am not mentioning here. I say God bless you and may you not lose your reward in that final reckoning day.

My beloved fellow laborers as I mature in years and experience I am learning to appreciate more and more the Wesleyan Methodist Church and the principles for which she stands

### Report No. 6

#### THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

We, the Trustees of the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America, met July 16, 1941 at the Campgrounds at Greer, S. C. and transacted such business as came before us.

- 1. On August 8, 1940, we received title to the Laurens Church property. This was a transfer from the local church trustees to the Conference trustees.
- 2. On August 30, 1940, we signed a note and mortgage to the Bank of Greer for \$500.00. This money was borrowed to use in building the church at Laurens, S. C.
- 3. On August 30, 1940, we signed a note and mortgage to R. C. Kendrick and J. B. Hilson for \$500.00. This is similar to the one to Bank of Greer and was made to secure Brothers Kendrick and Hilson for personally endorsing the note to Bank of Greer.
- 4. On September 4, 1940, we signed a deed to right-of-way to Duke Power Company to run a power line to the Wesleyan Methodist Church at Laurens, S. C.
- 5. On September 12, 1940, we signed a deed for the Glenville, N. C. Church and parsonage property to the Nantahala Power and Light Company, in exchange for which we received deed to property in a new loca-

tion with new church and parsonage built thereon according to plans given by Conference officials.

- 6. On September 27, 1940, we signed a note and mortgage to the First Federal Savings and Loan Company of Spartanburg, S. C. This money was used by the Spartanburg Church to purchase the house and lot, beside the church, to be used as a parsonage. Location, 536 Magnolia St.
- 7. On May 3, 1941, we signed deed to Hoyt Wilson for Spartanburg Church parsonage located at 536 Magnolia St. This was sold that the church might purchase property at the corner of Magnolia and Pearl Streets to be used as location for the new church they plan to build. It contains a house to be used for a parsonage.
- 8. On June 2, 1941, we signed a note and mortgage for \$1300.00 to Easley Building and Loan Association for the First Church at Central for the purpose of refinancing their indebtedness.
- 9. On September 19, 1940, we received deed for property near Pickens View church in Pickens County, said property to be used for a cemetery under the control of the Pickens View Church.
- 10. On March 8, 1941, we received deed to the Morgan Chapel property in Oconee County.
- 11. We recommend that the Conference Treasurer pay all obligations now due by the Conference and collect notes and interest due the Conference.
- 12. We recommend that the Board of Trustees be authorized to purchase a book suitable for permanent records of the Board. This money to be taken out of the fund for Conference Work.

#### Report No. 13

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL SECRETARY

Our people are beginning to realize the importance of the Sunday school and this enabled us to do a splendid piece of work this past year; and causes us to anticipate greater things in the future. It has been our privilege to work with our people in the interest of our Sunday schools and the Lord has blessed us as we labored in this capacity.

#### Report of Activities

I traveled 284 miles and delivered six messages to our Sunday-school workers. By grouping the Sunday schools we contacted one half of our Sunday schools in the five rallies we held during the year. This arrangement made it possible for all Sunday schools to be contacted, but for various excuses one half failed to avail themselves of this opportunity. We sent out several pieces of mail to our pastors. We received \$6.20 to help defray our expenses.

#### Some Accomplishments of the Year

During this Conference year two new Sunday schools were organized. We had a fair response from the Sunday schools for the Thanksgiving offering for our Orphanage but trust we will do better next year. Central, Second Church sent the largest offering of any Sunday school in the Connection. For the first time in the History of our Conference two of our Sunday schools, Central First, and Second, conducted a D. V. B. S. and report much good accomplished. We hope to see others follow this example.

#### Recommendations

Our Connectional Sunday-school Board has adopted a Five-point Program that will put new life in our Sunday schools if put in operation. I recommend that we put forth every effort possible to reach this goal. For our benefit I shall briefly state that goal:

- 1. Increase our attendance by 10%.
- 2. Conduct a D. V. B. S. in each Sunday school.
- 3. Further training for each teacher by taking a course in Teacher Training.
  - 4. A definite evangelistic effort to win more for Christ.
- 5. Lead more into the Church. I further recommend and urge all our pastors and Sunday-school workers to put forth special endeavor to raise our Standard of Efficiency.

It has been a pleasure to serve you, and if I can be of service to you in the future, I shall be glad to do so.
