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CONFERENCE RESOLUTIONS

1. All committee reports shall be copied neatly and in such form that the secretary can submit them to the printer without recopying.

2. All statistical reports shall be filed with the committee not later than the second day.

3. Every pastor shall make a duplicate of his statistical report and shall read the same to his charge at the first meeting after the conference.

4. Pastors shall equalize the amounts required by budget before overreaching any one item and it shall be the pastor's duty to inform his people at the beginning of the year concerning the amount to be raised and he shall at once proceed to raise the amount apportioned to his charge.

5. Inasmuch as the work of the conference demands the attention and the attendance of all its elders and licentiates, therefore we will not employ as pastor or evangelist any elder or licentiate or pass the character of any elder or licentiate, except by vote, who does not attend the entire session of conference.

6. Any member leaving Conference must present his excuse to Conference.

7. The Conference Treasurer, with all persons introduced to the Conference, shall be honorary members of the Conference, and shall be accorded a seat within the Conference Bar.

8. No preacher or licentiate who fails to attend the Ministerial Association shall have his character passed at the next Annual Conference except by vote.

9. Any minister accepting work on a charge at the hands of this conference who resigns or abandons it before the year is out without a good excuse or lawful reason, shall be considered by said Conference and it shall take a vote of Conference to pass his character.

10. All candidates taking the Conference course of study shall appear before the Committee on Itineracy and Orders, some member of the committee or someone whom the committee may designate.

11. Ministers who are not pastors shall be asked the following numbered questions on examination of character, 1, 6, 11, 13, 15, and 16.

12. Candidates for the ministry may take examination before Conference officers or nearest pastor.

13. When an elder resides outside the bounds of the Conference but retains his membership with a church within the bounds of the Conference, a delegate shall be elected from this church to represent said elder, the seating of said delegate in the Annual Conference depending upon the attendance of said elder at the Annual Conference.

14. Friday preceeding Conference shall be set aside as a day of prayer for the Conference.

15. Robert's Rules of Order shall be the parliamentary guide of this body.

16. We recommend that pastors, Sunday Schools, W.H. and F.M. societies and Y.M.W.B.'s remit all funds raised quarterly.

17. Pastors shall preach on the subject of church benevolences at least once a year.

18. The first Sunday in October shall be set apart as a day for special prayer to be offered and for efforts to be made to interest and enlist the young people of our church in its work.

19. All charges receiving a new pastor pay the moving expense, the matter being agreed upon by the pastor and the church.

20. We order that no money be paid from the Conference Missionary Fund except by written order of the Missionary Board.

21. Be it required that all pastors of the Ohio Conference attend all the sessions of the Camp-meeting unless providentially hindered.

22. The secretary shall send a Statistical blank to the clerk of each charge having no pastor, requesting that the same be filled out with all

available statistics and returned to the Conference Secretary.

23. We interpret Rule 5 to mean, that the Committee on Pastoral Relations shall not give appointment to any preacher who does not meet the requirements of this standing rule without bringing his excuse before the conference for its action in the matter.

24. Inasmuch as the work of the Conference demands the attendance of delegates as well as preachers, therefore we discourage the election as delegate to Annual Conference of any person who does not intend to attend the entire session. Furthermore, the committee on credentials shall inquire of each delegate who presents credentials to them, as to their purpose to attend the entire session of Conference and shall report to the body the names of any who do not so purpose, for its consideration and action.

Memorial to General Conference.

We, the members of the Ohio Conference, do hereby, in behalf of the advancement of the best interests of the Connection, request the revisal and bringing-up-to-date of the History of the Church.

No. 2.

Report of Conference President.

I have travelled the conference under your direction during the past year. It has been a pleasure to meet with the pastors and people and the fellowship has been all that might have been desired.

The year has been one of hardship to many of our churches because of weather and work conditions. In some of our churches there has been much unemployment and in the farming communities drought and low prices have combined to make the work of the church difficult. Spiritually, the churches have seen much prosperity. The quarterly meetings have been times of great refreshing and to me better than at any other time since I entered the field. There has been a good evangelistic spirit in all our churches and the promise of coming revivals, is good. I have been especially blessed in putting the Storehouse Tithing Plan before our people and have found some of them ready to accept the plan for the ensuing year. The Sunday Schools of the conference are in thrifty condition altho some of them might adopt improved methods with profit. The work among our young people is receiving more attention than formerly but there is a great and fertile field here that yet remains ready to enter.

I have attended the Sunday School convention and one of the Young People's conventions and found both to be most inspiring. I bespeak a larger attendance at these gatherings during the coming year. I recommend that there be a day set apart early in the year when especial prayer be offered that God may give our work among the young people a mighty impetus.

My official actions have been as follows:

In the month of Sept I received Rev. Charles L. Wright, an annual conference preacher from the Christian Union Church and issued him credentials as an Annual Conference Preacher in the Ohio Conference.

In the month of December, I received the transfer given in the previous year to Rev. R.C. Crossman of Smyrna, Mich.

In the month of May I received Rev. Kenneth M. Lewis of Wauseon, Ohio, an elder in the Nazarene church, into the Conference as an elder.

July 21, 1930 I granted a transfer to Arthur J. Calhoun to the Dakota Conference.

After much careful thought and anxious prayer, I desire to make the following recommendations:

1. Because of the great financial stringency that is upon us, making the raising of the budget and other church finances the most difficult that it has been in the thirty-two years of my relation to the conference, I recommend that the order of this conference authorizing the President to travel the territory be suspended until such time as the conference is financially able to keep him in the field. That such a step is necessary is revealed by the treasurer's report that there is now a deficit of \$420.07 in the Conference President's salary and that the prospects of a much larger deficit looms before the coming year.

I also recommend that a committee be elected from this body to draft plans for such provision as the President may make without traveling full time.

2. I recommend that the Conference Board of Trustees be made the Camp Meeting Committee with full authority to provide for the camp meetings of the future. This recommendation is made in the light of the fact that under the present plan there is no possibility of planning for more than a year at a time and that the camp ground is held and governed by the Trustees.

3. I recommend that a more strenuous effort be put forth to make our Sunday School and Young People's Conventions times of general coming together of all our people and that the first Sunday of October be continued as a day when special prayer be made to this end.

4. I recommend that the Store House Tithing Plan be stressed by our pastors and churches and that we strive this year to put the conference on that plan of church finance. The committee on religious services for this conference should, in my judgment provide an hour in which this matter should receive the attention of the conference.

** 5. I recommend that no evangelists of our own church or other churches be employed by our churches without the advice of the Conference President and his Advisory board.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON DUTIES OF CONFERENCE PRESIDENT.

We your committee on duties of Conference President submit the following report:

The duties of the President of the Ohio Conference for 1930-31 in addition to the duties as defined by the Discipline shall be as follows:

1. To exercise general oversight of the spiritual and temporal welfare of the conference.
2. To hold one Quarterly Conference on each charge during the year, such conference to be held during the week, day or night, as agreeable to pastor and church and the compensation shall be a flat rate of \$5.00 per meeting and expenses to be paid from the conference fund.
3. To receive offering and give receipt for the same to the pastor, such receipt to apply on Conference budget.

4. To submit to the conference an itemized statement of expense for any additional Conference services, such expense to be paid from Conference fund.

5. To direct the attention of the Quarterly Conference to the general interests of the Conference and Denomination, to see that the Conference and Denominational budget is being raised and to suggest ways and means of doing it.

6. To urge the use of our church literature on every charge and the reading of the Wesleyan Methodist in every home.

Report of Work Committee.

WE recommend first that our W.H. & F.M. societies devote about one half of their funds to our foreign missionary work in Africa, India and Japan.

Second, that we devote one half of our funds to Home missionary work, assisting in our denominational Home missionary enterprises, including our Blue Ridge mountain work, Alabama Mission School, the Hephizabah orphanage at Macon, Ga., the Mt. work in Kentucky, the Onondaga Indian Reservation near Syracuse, N.Y. and the work among the Mexicans in southern California.

Third, we would be pleased to see our conference entering new fields within our bounds, and for this purpose, we would devote 70% of all Home missionary money. Pioneer work in the home territory is vital to our growth and should be encouraged by our prayers and gifts.

We your committee on plan of work also recommend that each society do the work assigned them as follows:

Africa - Blue Ridge Mountain work
