THE JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS.

Fairmount, Indiana, Aug. 13, 1912.

The sixty-fourth session of the Indiana Conference assembled on the Camp Ground at 2 P. M., and with the manifest presence of the Lord, Elder Aaron Worth led the devotional services.

The roll of Elders and Licentiates was called, and 36 Elders and 10 Licentiates answered to their names. On motion, Conference was to convene at 8:30 A. M. and 2 P. M. and adjourn upon motion both forenoon and afternoon.

RESOLUTIONS.

Resolution No. 1.

Whereas, upon some of our charges no provisions are made for a home in which our pastors can provide for the welfare and comfort of their families and that at times undue embarrassment is placed upon these pastors because of the failure of these charges to properly care for their pastors in this respect; be it Resolved, that all charges with a membership of twenty-five or more shall, in addition to the regularly stipulated salary, assume the responsibility of providing a suitable home in which the pastor may live.

THE INDIANA CONFERENCE.

Resolution No. 2.

Resolved, That the membership, as much as possible, pay all their contributions for the Conference and Connectional interests to the pastors, who shall receipt them for the same and see that it is paid to the proper authorities. Where money is paid direct to the Conference Treasurer by the membership, he shall send a duplicate receipt to the pastor of the charge where such persons are members.

Resolution No. 3.

Whereas, the last General Conference apportioned the number of Wesleyan Methodists to be taken from each Conference and the Annual Conferences were put under obligations to apportion to the various charges the number they were to secure; be it Resolved, that we hereby authorize the President of the Conference to publish in the Wesleyan Methodist every three months a list of Wesleyan Methodists taken and the apportionment due from each charge.

Resolution No. 4.

Whereas, the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America believes in and advocates tithing as a scriptural obligation upon all believers in and followers of Jesus Christ, our Lord; and, whereas, we, the members of the Indiana Conference, believe the tithing system to be the solution of relieving the continual deficiency in Conference benevolences, pastors' and evangelists' salaries and incidentals; and, whereas, the Discipline requires each Annual Conference to elect a Tithing Secretary, whose duties involve the theoretical and practical propagation of the tithing system; and, whereas, we require every pastor in the Indiana Conference to tithe his income, and believe it inconsistent with our high standards of holiness as well as with good judgment thus to do and tolerate the laity of the Church in neglecting to tithe their income and in failing to receive the blessings accruing therefrom; be it Resolved, that we hereby yield our moral and authoritative influence in emphasizing the biblical obligation of tithing and its individual presentation to our membership; and that every pastor strive to secure every member of his or her charge upon a tithing list, and thereon keep, as near as possible, a financial status of the approximate income and tithe of the membership for each Annual Conference year. Be it further Resolved, that this Conference elect an Annual Conference

Tithing Secretary, whose duty it shall be to co-operate with the pastors in securing every member of their charges upon their tithing lists and thus give relief to the present financial stress and establish an adequate system whereby the charges of the Conference shall be able to pay their pastors ample salaries, the Conference evangelists a plentiful remuneration for services rendered, to the Church benevolence funds sufficient to advance our school interests that we may more nearly meet the pressing demands of our young people along educational lines, and support the other interests of the Church and bring to our Zion the outpouring of those blessings which will elevate her in the world and make her attractive as a moral power in the propagation of scriptural and practical holiness unto all men.

Resolution No. 5.

Whereas, the instruction to be derived from the pursuit of the Teacher's Training Course is of incalculable value, not only to the teachers of the Sunday School, but to our ministers as well, be it Resolved, that this Conference instruct the Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders to, in connection with the Institute work, conduct a drill in said course. In case said committee's regular work consumes the allotted time for drills in the Institute, they shall have the authority to appoint some person who can attend the Institute and conduct said drill.

Resolution No. 6.

Inasmuch as our pastors are not receiving salaries sufficient to remunerate them for their services, we recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to the salary; provided that this shall not interfere with previous arrangements between pastors and charges.

No. 4. Committee on Investigating the Course of Study.

We, your committee to investigate and report on certain books placed in the course of study by the last General Conference, would respectfully submit the following report:

First. The work entitled "System of Christian Doctrine," by Sheldon, placed in the first and second years in the course, we believe to be dangerous, because the work undermines the faith of the Church on the inspiration of the Scriptures, original sin, the divine person and work of Jesus Christ, and the divine character and work of the Holy Ghost, the vital doctrine of regeneration and entire sanctification. The author frankly states in the preface of his work that he is not deterred "from giving hospitality to relatively new views," from "freeing his mind or departing from the traditional basis," yet this is the leading work in the first two years course of study for the training of our young men and women for the future ministry of the Church.

Second. The work entitled "Ethical Principles," by Seth, we believe to be unsafe and dangerous to the faith of the Church and our articles of religion, in that it teaches that God is the "Father of our spirits," "our origin and our destiny and that in essence God and man must be one," making all mankind children of God naturally without the necessity of the new birth. This error leading to the fatal doctrine of universal salvation, or in the language of the author in the closing words of his work, speaking of God and man, "our origin and our destiny are one: it is because we came from God that we **must** go to Him and can only rest in fellowship with him, who is the Father of our spirits"; that "the fellowship is the fellowship of will with will"; "God is the home of his children's spirits, and he would not be God if he banished any from his presence; nor would man be man if he could reconcile himself to the thought of such an exile."

Third. The book entitled "The Bible, Its Origin and Nature," by Dodd, we believe to be injurious to our faith in the fundamental doctrines and our long cherished belief in the supernatural revela-

tion of God in his word. He says revelation is internal and natural and proceeds hand-in-hand with human development.

Fourth. Another work of the course it is stated is not in harmony with our faith and standards, but as no copy of the work is present we make no report regarding the same.

Fifth. We hereby petition the President of the General Conference to examine these various books and if found to revoke or change or contravene our articles or religion or established standards of faith and doctrine, to exercise his official authority in declaring the action of the General Conference null and void in placing these works in the course.

No. 5. Conference Sunday School Secretary.

The Sunday School is one of the most elastic agencies now seeking the building up of the kingdom of our Lord Jesus Christ. As the Bible is a potent factor in the work of seeking the salvation of the lost, and all the effort of the Church is to be directed toward this purpose, the Sunday School is thus to be seen as the Church engaged in a most vital and important work. The Sunday School work is pregnant with the greatest possibilities. Every resource that can be utilized in any sphere of service can be used here, and evidently no service enlists a greater percentage from all classes than does the Sunday School.

With the great prospect and possibilities of the work thus apparent, this is an agency well worthy of the fullest measure of our support.

With the freedom and authority now given our pastors in directing the organization and work of the school, they can see that persons with some measure of executive ability are elected as superintendents. Interest and enthusiasm should possess the superintendent of the school, and be manifest from his announcement of the opening exercises until the close of the hour's work. This spirit will largely determine the atmosphere of the school; and the pastor and Sunday School Board must utilize the best possible material to obtain what is needed.

There is no excuse for the pastor's absence from the Sunday

School, only in rare instances, and while the interest being manifest is commendable, there is room for much improvement upon the part of our pastors in being present during the Sunday School hour, and aiding to increase enthusiasm in the work.

There are conditions where the Teacher's Training work cannot be successfully conducted, owing to the pastor's time being divided with so many different appointments, and there being no one else on the charge who can conduct the work. Several classes are now in successful operation in our schools, and the number will be gradually increased. Your committee recommends that the Institute management arrange for a few drills in the teacher's training work in our next Institute.

The importance of the teacher as a factor in the making of the Sunday School is supreme. His work is second only to that of the pastor, both in opportunity and responsibility. Men should be called of God to this work. We would therefore urge our denomination to so fully emphasize the importance and dignity of our Sunday School work, that many of our zealous young people will feel the call of God, and devote their energies to this sphere of service for Christ. Many, it is feared, being zealous to work for Christ, have thought their call was to preach, or to go into mission work abroad, when, if they had fully appreciated the opportunity and elasticity of our Sunday School work, as an agency for saving souls and building them up in Christian character, they would have given their life energies to this sphere of service, with far greater consistency and success. In this they were not so much at fault as we, in failing to give to the Sunday School in thought and support that consideration which would make it a more inviting and powerful agency for the development of the latent forces that need to be utilized in the work of our Master.

The need of teacher's meetings in our Sunday School work is very apparent, though in some instances difficult to adjust. Where the charge consists of only one or two appointments, the pastor can well take hold of this work, and should not fail to do so. In the few instances where teacher's meetings cannot be successfully arranged for, let the pastor give diligence to circulate the best helps possible upon the Sunday School work, and the need will thus be partially met.

Our schools are growing in interest and in numbers. We will watch for next year's statistics, expecting a healthful and encouraging gain.

No. 10. Committee On Resolutions.

1. Moral Reform.

We are thankful to God for the onward progress that is being made in the world of science, invention, and of educational and religious culture. Great victories have been won, which bring to the righteous encouragement. But on the other hand we are confronted with some conditions which are calculated to bring very great concern to the minds of those who love God and humanity.

If there ever was a time when the rank and file of temperance forces needed to stand together, true to humanity and to our God, ignore every compromise measure and support no measure but utter annihilation of the liquor traffic, that time is now. Therefore we pledge ourselves to stand firmly together, and as American citizens at the polls to support the political party based upon principles of righteousness and standing for the overthrow of the liquor traffic with all of its attaches; the party which has the courage of its convictions and which will place men in office who will enforce the law in the Prohibition party, national, state, county and municipal.

2. Labor.

We deplore the increasing power of capital and the consequent oppression of laboring men and women, and demand the protection of helpless people from the exploitation of selfishness and greed by the inauguration and enforcement of such laws as shall guarantee to every one the just fruits of their toil.

3. Romanism.

We denounce the political intrigue of national government officials with Romanism, and call men everywhere to awaken to the

grave danger that threatens not only American freedom, but the Church of Jesus Christ.

4. Secrecy.

Whereas, in accordance with the principles of our separation from the world and in view of the efforts of lodge men to oppose and if possible control anti-secret churches, break down and banish their barriers of separation from the world; therefore be it, Resolved that while we will not make anti-secrecy a hobby, we will not remove our ancient landmarks nor retreat a single inch from this distinguishing tenet of our Church, but request every one of our pastors to preach a sermon definitely upon the subject at least once a year, or have it done, and to strive to instruct all our people in regard to the insidious paralyzing and deadening effect of all compromising connections with worldly organizations.

5. Divorce.

Believing the divorce problem to be the greatest evil confronting the world, especially the American nation, destroying the sacredness of the marriage vow, thereby ruining the American home, we as a people insist that there should be rigid and uniform divorce laws for all the commonwealths of the United States, thus relieving the situation that confronts us today, viz, a few states having such loose divorce laws that they become a refuge for those who have no regard for social purity.
