STANDING RULES.

- I. The Standing Rules of Conference shall be printed in the Conference Minutes each year.
- II. All visiting members of our own, or other churches in harmony with our principles, shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.
- III. The Conference President shall receive twenty dollars (\$20) per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.
- IV. The Conference Secretary shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his labor and incidental expenses.
- V. The Conference Treasurer shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his services in caring for the funds.
- VI. In making his report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books one week before the Conference session. The Treasurer of the Superannuated Ministers' Relief Association also shall close his books one week before the Conference session.
- VII. In our Camp Meeting work, after the expense of the Camp Meeting has been paid by the Camp Meeting Committee, or by the person whom they may designate, any unexpended balance shall be turned over to the Conference Treasurer.
- VIII. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice-President. It is understood, of course, that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.
- IX. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference, or by consent of the President and his Advisory Board.

STANDING RULES-Continued

- X. Each elder shall make his engagement as pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released in his pastoral engagement.
- XI. The first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday, and the Sunday School offerings shall be given to Home Missions, and should be sent to the Conference Treasurer.
- XII. In securing Evangelists for the Camp Meeting work, those of the Wesleyan Methodist Church shall be secured, if this can be done.
- XIII. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be composed of the Conference President as Chairman, and three ministers, and three laymen, all to be elected by ballot after the Conference of 1923, the term of office to be three years, the time of one minister and one layman expiring each year.
- XIV. Pastors shall state financial items in their statistical reports in even dollars, except in items affecting the Budget, and so far as possible are requested to report all budget items in even dollars. When such rule is not followed, the Statistical Secretaries are authorized to drop decimals, except as provided above.
- XV. The offerings for Superannuated Ministers shall be taken within sixty days after Conference, and forwarded to the Treasurer of Superannuate Society.

Work of Conference President.

- 1. We recommend that the President travel the Conference, with duties as follows:
- 2. To hold one quarterly meeting on each charge during the year, unless the work on some of the weaker fields or new fields should so fully take his time and attention that this could not well be done. In such case the holding of such meeting on the strongest fields may be omitted, but this would not release any charge from paying their proportion of the Conference Budget.
- 3. To spend the time of our annual Camp Meeting at the Meeting, and if necessary in order to perfect arrangements for the Camp Meeting more time is needful to be given to that work, it shall be so devoted.
- 4. To open in some place or places new work, if possible and feasible.
- 5. To spend as much time as he may find available in helping to build up the work on some of our weaker fields, such as Stony Creek, Acorn Hill and Burke.
- 6. The amount of salary to be twenty dollars (\$20) per week, and traveling expenses for the year, and have three weeks' vacation.

We, as a Conference, will pray that the gracious blessing of the Lord may rest on our President, giving him health, strength and wisdom, and we will co-operate with him in a united effort to make 1928-1929 the best year in upbuilding results in our history; and to God we will give the glory.

DAILY PROCEEDINGS.

Tuesday Evening.

On Tuesday evening, July 3rd, the Champlain Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection met on the West Chazy, N. Y., Camp Ground for the first service of its eighty-seventh session. Rev. A. J. Allen, President, was in charge and led in the opening song service.

In remarks he noted that this is the first time the Conference ever

met on the Camp Ground.

Evangelist Jesse Whitecotton led in prayer. Song Leader, Robert Conley sang as a special number, "The Beautiful Garden of Prayer."

The opening sermon was preached by Rev. Leonard Hayes of Glens Falls, N. Y. Sermon theme: "The Christian's Warfare," based on text at 2 Cor. 10:4. Thoughts of special mention follow:

"The Christian is fighting a winning battle. It is not a sham, but a real warfare." The political situation was touched upon, and the speaker said: "We need to rise up in defense of the right. The challenge to us is to employ the weapons which are mighty. If God assigns to us a task, He gives us effective weapons."

A closing song followed. The song book "New Songs of The Old Faith" is being employed. Closing prayer by Rev. E. D. Carpenter.

The attendance was very good for the first service.

Wednesday Forenoon.

Devotional Service.—After singing, Rev. Harry Miller being in charge, read the 17th chapter of John. The leader made a few pertinent remarks, and there followed a season of prayer.

Business Session.—President A. J. Allen called the Conference to order. Roll call: 11 elders, 6 licentiates, 2 deaconesses in attendance.

It was voted that the first six seats—front center tiers—constitute the bar of the Conference.

Report on Delegates' Credentials was accepted by vote. See Roll of Delegates. Roll Call of Delegates: 15 present.

Voted that the order of services be as follows: Forenoon, Devotional service at eight; Business at eight-thirty; Adjournment at eleventhirty. Afternoon, Devotional service at one-thirty; Business at two; Preaching at three; Adjournment by vote.

Voted that H. C. Shares be Ministerial member, and Fred West be Lay member of Committee on Passage of Character.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations was elected as follows: Elders, H. R. LaVere, E. D. Carpenter, Stanley Lawrence. Lay members, Royal Wetmore, Edith Stevenson, Ruth Murray.

The Vice-President, Rev. L. M. Hayes, occupied the Chair while President Allen read his annual report. Report accepted as read. See Report No. 1.

A few incidental matters were considered informally. Rev. Burgess of the Nazarene Church was introduced to the Conference.

Voted to adjourn to give place for Committee work.

Dismissal by Brother George Osgood.

Wednesday Afternoon.

Devotional Service.—Rev. H. R. LaVere in charge. The song service was followed by reading of the 19th Psalm in concert. The leader then read Psalm 91. Rev. J. F. Wright offered prayer, followed by others.

Business.—Roll call, 13 elders, 6 licentiates, 1 deaconess, and 19 delegates in Conference. Minutes of previous session read and adopted.

It was voted to adopt the following report on Orders of the Day:

Saturday at 2 P. M., Memorial Service.

Saturday at 7:30 P. M., Young People's Service.

Report of Committee on Itineracy and Orders was adopted. See Report No. 2.

Order of the Day.—Rev. W. F. Lewis, the Conference Sunday School Secretary, addressed the body on interests of the Sunday School, and read his report. Same was adopted as read. See Report No. 3. He also read a recommendation for Conference Sunday School Standard, which was adopted. See Standard in Report No. 3.

The name of W. F. Lewis was called and character passed.

Preaching Service.—Opened with singing. Prayer by Rev. H. C. Shares. Scripture lesson read, Romans 15:1-13. Solo by Brother Robert Conley. The message was brought by Rev. E. D. Carpenter, President of the General Conference, on the theme, "Consecrated Strength." Text, Psalm 43:2. Prominent Points: "Some folks stress their weaknesses. When God has a great work to do, He calls the strong to do it. Our greatest danger is not in our weaknesses, but in our power. Man does not sin most in his weak points, but in his strength unconsecrated. If we have any strength, it ought to be consecrated to God."

Singing, "Lead Me Higher." Voted to adjourn.

Dismissal by Rev. S. Lawrence.

Wednesday Evening Service.

The preliminary praise and prayer service was led by Rev. W. F. Lewis. Following song and prayer, about 25 testimonies were given. After several congregational songs, Brother Conley played "Sweet Hour of Prayer" on his musical saw. Special features of the preaching service were: A vocal solo by Mr. Conley, and preaching by Evangelist Whitecotton. The text was at John 15:26. The message was a most helpful interpretation of the work of The Comforter in the human heart and life.

Thursday Forenoon.

Devotional Service.—Rev. William Osgood conducted the devotional service. Several offered earnest prayer. The leader spoke of this day being his spiritual anniversary, and he read the 32nd chapter of Jeremiah for Scripture lesson.

Business.—Roll call: 12 elders, 6 licentiates, 1 deaconess, and 20 delegates present.

Minutes of last session read and corrected.

It was voted that the next (1929) Annual Conference begin the Tuesday evening preceding the Annual Camp Meeting.

Voted that Rev. C. L. Hill preach the Conference sermon on Wednesday afternoon next year (1929), and that Rev. O. M. Finch be alternate.

Voted that the Conference President be authorized to appoint the Chairmen of the Committees to report to this body.

The following names were called and characters passed: A. J. Allen, E. D. Carpenter, Mrs. S. A. Green, G. D. Jock.

Rev. A. J. Allen was nominated by Conference vote as a member of the Board of Managers of Houghton College.

It was voted to adjourn for Committee work.

Dismissal by Rev. E. D. Carpenter.

Thursday Afternoon.

Devotional Service.—Brother Howard Rollman read 2 Cor. 6: 14-18, and Sister Florence Baxter led in prayer.

Business.—Roll call: 11 elders, 5 licentiates, 1 deaconess, and 21 delegates present. Minutes of forenoon session read and adopted.

President J. S. Luckey of Houghton College was introduced to the Conference and spoke briefly.

Order of the Day.—The Tithing Secretary, Rev. E. D. Carpenter, addressed the Conference on the subject of "Tithing."

Preaching Service.—Singing and prayer. Solo, "I Know That He Is Divine," by the song leader. Scripture reading, Psalm 85. The verse 6 was used as a text by Rev. I. F. McLeister, who brought the

message on the subject of "Revival." It was a timely and suggestive sermon. Prayer by Brother Whitecotton. Singing, "Revive Us Again."

The Conference voted to adjourn for Committee work. Dismissal by Brother Hayes.

Thursday Evening Meeting.

Prayer was a prominent part of the preliminary service, with Rev. O. G. Wyman as leader. For a scripture lesson he read from the 3rd chapter of First John. Opportunity was given for testimony, to which a number responded.

The preaching service consisted of singing, a "musical saw" solo, prayer, vocal solo, "My! Didn't It Rain?" by Brother Robert Conley, and Evangelist Whitecotton preached on the text, "THEN the fire of the Lord fell." 1 Kings 18:38. It was a searching presentation of vital truth, delivered in the power of the Spirit. An altar service followed.

Friday Forenoon.

Devotional Service.—Rev. Dennis Osgood directed the devotional service. Several offered prayer, and "it was good for us to be here." The lesson was read from the 27th Psalm.

Business.—Roll call: 10 elders, 8 licentiates, 1 deaconess, and 17 delegates on hand for business. Minutes of last session read and approved.

The following names were called and characters passed: A. E. Moses, T. A. Moses, E. Trowbridge, F. H. Wright, O. G. Wyman, F. E. Wood, W. N. Osgood, L. M. Hayes.

It was voted that the Secretary be directed to write to those of the Superannuated Ministers not present at Conference.

During the session the following were introduced to the body: Sister Lulu Tanner, Missionary; Rev. Price, of Plattsburg M. E. Church.

The report from Long Lake Charge was read, and Church interests considered.

After a short intermission, President J. S. Luckey of Houghton College addressed the Conference on "The Secret of Success." The steps as given are: 1. Preparation; 2. Concentration; 3. Perspiration (Work); 4. Co-operation; 5. Consecration. This was a splendid address, filled with helpful facts. In addition, he gave a report of the year's work, prospects, etc., which are encouraging indeed.

Having previously considered the matter of the Glens Falls Church Property, the following plan was read and adopted:

The condition of the Church Property in Glens Falls, N. Y., (the title of which is in the Champlain Conference) is such that it seems needful that there should be an immediate outlay of \$2,000 or more to put the property in a reasonable degree of repair; but even then it will mean a large continued expense to maintain. In view of these conditions, and the unanimous action of the Glens Falls Church requesting sale of said property, we, the Champlain Annual Conference, hereby authorize and direct the President of the Conference, if opportunity for sale comes, to secure a court order for the sale of said property, and also to execute the proper legal papers to convey the same, under the following conditions:

1st. This sale is authorized on the condition that the proceeds be used for building a church and parsonage on a newly located lot fairly central of location in Glens Falls;

2nd. The newly selected location to be deeded to the Champlain Annual Conference;

3rd. The new buildings to be completed without indebtedness remaining on the property;

4th. If it shall be found necessary to incur any indebtedness in the construction of new building, said indebtedness shall be assumed by the Glens Falls Church, and we recommend that they shall not incur an expense to exceed (\$1,000) one thousand dollars:

5th. In the sale of said property, the President of the Conference shall be associated with a committee of the Church, and the sale shall be consummated only on the agreement of the committee of the Church and the President of the Conference.

Voted to adjourn. Dismissal by Rev. William Osgood.

Friday Afternoon.

The Discipline of the Wesleyan Methodist Church says: "We believe the only true and proper remedy for the gigantic evil of the liquor traffic is its entire suppression."

Our nation has already entered on a campaign in which moral issues of vital importance occupy a prominent place. We hereby place ourselves on record as opposed to the removal of the Eighteenth Amendment from the Constitution, and the lessening in any way the Volstead Law for enforcement of the Prohibition of the liquor traffic; we are also opposed to by law raising the limit of intoxicating content of liquors above the one-half of one per cent.

Therefore, we pledge ourselves as a Conference to work and vote against any candidate who advocates repeal of the Eighteenth Amendment or the modification of the laws for the enforcement of the Prohibition of the liquor traffic.

"PLAN OF WORK."

Plan of Work for Local Societies of Champlain Conference.

We recommend that the following definite plan of work be followed:

- 1. That each society take up a definite course of study, preferably the one selected by the General Society, so that we may profit by the programs printed for our use in the Wesleyan Missionary; and that equal time at least be given to prayer for our mission work and workers.
- 2. That each Society make full proof of their missionary zeal and loyalty by being 100% subscribers to the Wesleyan Missionary and that they appoint a member whose office shall be to keep account of dates for renewals and to push outside the society for new subscribers.
- 3. That we shall not forget to send annually \$6 to the Conference Society Treasurer to be forwarded to the General Treasurer for Southern Mountain work. Also same amount to Conference Society for running expenses of same.

- 4. To remember that the Home and Foreign Missionary Society supports missionary work and is not to use funds for local church work, and no money is to be paid out without the majority vote of the local society.
- 5. It is most important that careful attention be given the filling out of two statistical reports which will be sent to each society annually. One is to be filled out and given to the Statistical Committee at the beginning of Conference, the other is to be retained by the Delegate and later read to the local society. Receipts and disbursements must be made to balance before sending to the Conference.
- 6. Also all money and receipts must be in the hands of the Treasurer one week before the Conference convenes. This extension of time has been found to be essential in order for the Treasurer to complete her work and give due credit.
- 7. That "Thank Offering" boxes, which have been so great a help both spiritually and financially to some societies, be used in each local society. Full particulars may be obtained from Mrs. Mae LaVere, Morley, N. Y.
- 8. Following the suggestions made by the General Conference Society that we hold conventions as a whole or in groups, we recommend that at least one convention in each district be held during the year and that a leader for each district be elected by the Annual Conference Society.
- 9. That each local society devote a portion of their time during the year to planning and making supplies needed for foreign fields, such as bandages, books, religious magazines, etc.
- 10. That during the next four years each local society furnish 2 sheets, 2 pillow slips, 2 comfortables, 2 pillows for Houghton Dormitory.
