JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Monday Night

Rev. J. R. Swauger, Home Missionary Secretary, brought the opening message of the Conference.

Tuesday Morning

The Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. J. M. Merrell. Devotions were in charge of Rev. J. R. Swauger.

The roll of Elders and Conference Preachers was called. The Committee on Credentials reported and the roll of Lay Delegates was called. This report was adopted.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its first reading.

A discussion of the Pension Fund Plan was held.

A motion prevailed to take recess to convene at the call of the Chair.

The Conference was called to order by the Chairman. The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its second reading. A motion prevailed to adjourn.

The third reading of the Pastoral Relations Committee was read and adopted. (See Reports.)

A motion was made to take recess, to convene at the call of the Chair.

The Conference was called to order by the President.

REPORTS

THE PRESIDENT'S OFFICIAL REPORT FOR 1947-1948

To the South Georgia Wesleyan Methodist Conference, now in session in Friendship Church, October 19, 1948.

- (1) On November 27, I received the resignation of Rev. W. M. Osgood, pastor of Mt. Pleasant Church. On a later date, I appointed Rev. W. W. Wigglesworth as pastor of said Church.
- (2) On my first quarterly meeting round, I, in complying with the request of our Annual Conference in regard to buying the Cordele property, received a check from our Home Missionary Secretary, Rev. J. R. Swauger, for \$2,000.00. About the same date I received a check for \$500.00 from the Conference Treasurer, and about the 28th day of November, 1947, I received a loan for \$500.00 from Rev. H. W. Rickard.

On November 28, 1947, I paid to Rev. Jack Osborn and Rev. James Miller the sum of \$3,000.00 and received a deed for the church.

- (3) On December 16, 1947 I organized a class of eight charter members into a Wesleyan Methodist Church in Tampa, Florida, with Rev. Miss Ruth Newton as pastor of said church.
- (4) December 21, 1947 I received a letter of standing from Rev. R. C. Mullinax, President of the South Carolina Conference for the Rev. C. R. Ruppe, also a list of the books passed in the first year's Course of Study.
- (5) February 6, 1948, I gave Rev. Fred Hughes and Rev. Mrs. Fred Hughes a transfer to the South Carolina Conference.
- (6) On August 17, 1948, I gave Rev. W. T. Brinson a transfer to the North Georgia Conference.
- (7) On August 17, 1948, I appointed Rev. F. H. Harris a committee on nominations.
- (8) On October 3, 1948, I organized a class at Apalachicola, Florida, with nine members, and declared it to be a Wesleyan Methodist Church, with Rev. W. H. Bouington as pastor and Rev. R. M. Henkle as an assistant.

We recommend that Brother and Sister Jacob Hunter be received, pending the reception of their transfer from the Kentucky Conference.

We recommend each applicant pass each six books, as outlined by the discipline.

We recommend that Brother J. T. Strickland and Brother R. M. Henkle be received as elders and work under the direction of the President.

We recommend that Brother E. C. Moon and C. R. Porter be received as licensed preachers and work under the direction of the President.

MORAL REFORM

Your Committee on Moral Reform begs to submit the following report:

Be it resolved that we call our membership to a closer study of the rules laid down in the Bible and in our church discipline as to the manner in which we should dress, and when we say "we," we mean both men and women. We think that men and women should adorn themselves in modest apparel. There is much said about the way women should dress modest, but we do not hear much, or anything said about the way men should dress or do, but we think that if we will study God's Word prayerfully and ask God's help to guide us, we won't have any trouble following the rules given us in God's Word, or in our church discipline concerning our wearing apparel.

Second, we believe that if we as professed Christians would pray and work and vote as we should, or as we think the Lord would have us do in regard to the liquor traffic that is damning this great country of ours, we believe that there could be something done to stop the sale of it in public

places.

Third, we believe that if we as Christians should only go ourselves, and allow our children to go to places of amusement, or any other place that we would not be willing for the Lord to find us at, should He come for us, we are sure this would be a better place to live. We also believe that if we as Christian parents would teach our children to obey and honor us as parents, like the Bible teaches us to do, that worldly people would have more confidence in us, and it would make them want to follow the example we have set before them.

Fourth, there could be much said about keeping, or breaking the Sabbath Day, but again we refer you to the Word of the Lord where He commands us to "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy," and if we will do this, it will be far better than anything we might say about it.

Last, but not least, we would like to say just a few words about our subject, Moral Reform, and that is, it means much to be called a moral man or woman. We believe that the outward life of a moral man or woman, boy, or girl, is just as clean as that of a Christian. But again re refer you to the Word of our Lord, where the man came to Him while He was on this earth and asked what he might do to be saved. When our Savior began to tell him some of the things he would have to do, he said "all these I have kept from my youth up," but our Lord said to him, "one thing lackest thou," so therefore we see that it's not enough just to be moral, but we must be born again and have our sins covered by the blood.

THE SABBATH SCHOOL

In 2 Timothy 2:15, we read, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

I am sure, we believe the Sunday School is a very vital part of the church, since the Sunday school children of today will be the men and women of the church of tomorrow.

These lives that are entrusted to our care for just a short time can be guided and trained into the right way by having spiritual leaders in our Sunday schools. This being so, we feel it very important that our leaders and teachers should be very spiritual and have a real burden for the work, and with much prayer, strive to bring the children into the light of salvation.

Time has proved, that where there is a real live Sunday school, there are some real live spiritual leaders in the church.

My heart has often been made sad when the Sunday school hour had arrived and a nice group of children had gathered for Sunday school, and there were no capable teachers present to teach them the lesson in a real Christian way.

My Christian friends, it is a sure fact, that what we teach a child in its early life, is what will linger with it through its whole life. The Catholic people say, "Give us a child until it's seven, and then you can have it." That should prove to us that we should earnestly strive to teach it the right way.

We often hear the remark that, "Young people have a certain amount

of wild oats to sow in this life." I disagree with that statement, because some of the greatest Christian men and women we have in the Christian churches of today are those who gave their hearts and lives to God in the early part of their life. (And I'm happy to say we have some of them in our own Wesleyan Methodist Denomination.) The Sunday school had a great influence on them. I'm well aware these are difficult days in which to have Sunday schools, with so many worldly amusements to lure our children away from things that are clean and holy. In these days of so much worldly amusements the problem confronts us as leaders, how to get and keep the children coming to Sunday school. Perhaps we might put on programs of some kind to interest them, and every Sunday have them to sing choruses, and use other various means of interesting them.

We once read of a nine-year-old boy who ran away from home and went with a circus, and after many years he chanced to go into a church where they sang one of the hymns he had learned in Sunday school at home. It so touched his heart that he gave himself to God and afterwards led many others to Christ So then:

If any little word of ours

Can make a life the brighter,

If any little song of ours

Can make a heart the lighter,

Then help us; God, to speak that word

And take our bit of singing

And drop it in some lonely vale,

And set the echoes ringing.

Mr. J. Edgar Hoover, chief of the F. B. I., informs us in some of his writings, that there are more crimes committed by those that do not attend Sunday school, than by those that attend Sunday school.

I'm sure we need a better example of parents attending Sunday school with their children, than we're having now.

In Genesis 4:9 we read where the Lord asked Cain, "where is thy brother, Abel?" And Cain answered, "Am I my brother's keeper?" Friends, we need a greater vision of our responsibility as our brother's keeper.

The greatest need of our day is a real conscience awakening of our responsibility concerning the Sunday school, for where there is no vision the people perish. (Proverbs 29: 18.)

I believe that the Sunday school, given the right type of teachers, can be the greatest of all educational help. The Sunday school that can send out into the world boys and girls who believe with all their hearts in the practical application or the Christian way of life is a Sunday school which will help to make the future history of the world and of mankind.

God gives the world another chance with each generation. There is a greater need today than ever for men and women to give themselves to the task of the teaching and training of youth in the Christian faith as the main spring of life and character. So let us pray and work while it is yet day, for the night cometh when no man can work.

SECRECY

In the approach to this great subject I was struck with wonder, and in my search for the truth I was stirred and thrilled by the very definition of the term "secrecy," which according to Webster, means seclusion, retirement, solitude, hidden things, plans, purposes, desires, and gifts. This led me to believe that we had not only considered one side of the subject, namely secret societies. Yet we know that man is a being of secrecy. There is much about him that the public neither sees nor knows. He serves a God of secrets who has an order of secrecy with blessings and benefits received only by those belonging to this order.

Let us look into the Bible, the only Book that tells of this great order. In Deut. 29:29 we read that the secret things belong to God. We note again from Proverbs 3:32 and 1 Cor. 2:9, 10 that God reveals his secrets to the righteous.

Now let us look at Psalm 27:5, In the time of trouble the Lord hides us in the secret of his tabernacle and sets us up upon a rock.

Again let us look at Psalm 91:1, "He that dwelleth in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty."

Then we note from the teachings of Jesus in Matt. 6:1-6 that our alms should be given in secret and that we should pray in secret that the Father which seeth in secret should reward us openly.

We recall that Jesus went apart with the Father in secret and the Church was born. We recall also that the apostles went in secret for ten days and received the Holy Ghost. Thus the Church was inaugurated, filled and empowered.

Believing these things we urge Christians to unite with this great order of God and receive the benefits thereof, as that is the only place to find God's secrets.

On the other hand, we are strictly opposed to the oath-bound secret orders or societies of the world. To those who ask why, we reply that we are not of the world but are redeemed by the blood of Jesus. In 2 Cor. 4:12 we read "We have renounced the hidden things of dishonesty,

not walking in craftiness, nor handling the word of God deceitfully; but by manifestation of the truth, commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God."

Then in 2 Cor. 6:14-18 we are exhorted not to be unequally yoked together with unbelievers.

In Matt. 5: 33-37 Jesus said, "Swear not at all," and in James 5: 12 we read "Swear not by heaven nor by the earth nor by any other oath."

Many others like Scriptures might be cited, but we believe these will suffice to show that our objections to secret societies of the world are Biblical and we recommend that the members of the Wesleyan Methodist Church refrain from such secret oath-bound orders and teach the same, and stand firm to God's great order or plan.
