BY-LAWS

Section 1: The Conference fiscal year shall close June 30 of each year and that of the local church on May 31. All money for which credit is to be given must be postmarked not later than June 15, and the Auxiliary Conference Treasurers' reports shall be in the hands of the Conference Treasurer on or before June 25. pastor shall submit to the Conference Treasurer. prior to the close of the Conference year, his budget check sheet with receipts covering same, and his statistical blank completed, except for the budget section; the Conference Treasurer. upon completion of the budget section, shall forward the statistical forms to the Statistical Secretary - said form not to be returned to the pastors until the Conference Session. Any pastor not complying with the above ruling will fail to have his character passed by the Character Committee.

Section 2: The principal office of the Conference shall be located in the city of Rau Claire, Eau Claire County, Wisconsin.

Section 3: The President of the Woman's Missionary Society and the President of the Wesleyan Youth shall be members of the Missionary Board by virtue of their office.

Section 43 A Mominating Committee composed of four elders and the President, ex-officie, shall be elected by ballot and this group upon arrival at the Conference shall select 2 properly elected delegates elect to serve with them; and they shall bring their report at the first session of the ensuing annual conference.

Section 5: The Annual Conference of The Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America shall convene on the Third Tuesday in July at 9:00 a.m. in the Tabernacle of the Burr Wesleyan Methodist Campground located 7 miles west of Hillsboro, Wisconsin, on Highway 33.

- (d) Treasurer: The Conference Treasurer, by wirtue of his office, shall be the treasurer of said Board. He shall receive all funds and disburse the same at the direction of the Campmeeting Board or the Executive Committee of said Board, as the case may be.
- (e) Maintenance Superintendent: The Maintenance Superintendent shall be elected annually by the Conference from a list of two names submitted by the nominating committee. His duties shall be: The oversight of the building and grounds at the Campmeeting grounds; he shall have charge of all repairs and maintenance and of the upkeep of buildings and grounds under the direction of the Conference or of said Board as the case may be. He shall be foreman of all building projects.
- (f) Duties and Powers of the Campmeeting
 Board: Said Board shall secure the workers for

 for the carrying on of Campmeetings. The Board
 shall also take care of all business of the
 Campmeeting between meetings of the Annual Conference. The Campmeeting Board shall have
 authority to borrow money for Campmeeting purposes and to bind The Wisconsin Conference of the
 Wesleyan Methodist Church of America therefor and
 to execute the necessary agreements and promissory

notes to effect such borrowing. However, the Campuesting Board shall not have authority to mortgage or encumber any of the property, real or personal, of The Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. The Campmeeting Board shall have authority to rent Campmeeting property out for such periods of time as will not interfere with the use of the camp grounds by the State Conference and its auxiliary organizations. The Board shall have the authority to enter into agreements with private individuals who have, or may in the future, construct cottages or other buildings on said campgrounds regarding construction, use and removal of such buildings but shall have no authority to convey a fee interest in, or deed any such land. The Campmeating Board shall submit a summary report and accounting each year at the annual meeting of the Conference. Said Campmeeting Board shall at all times be subject to directions and limitations placed on it by the Annual Conference of The Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

(g) Executive Committee: The Executive Committee of said Board shall consist of the Conference President, the Conference Secretary, and the Maintenance Superintendent, and shall have full authority to act for and on behalf of said Board when authorized by said Board by motion duly passed by the Board and certified to in writing by the Secretary of said Campmeeting Board.
