be a good one, we respectfully ask your attention to the following plan, 1<sup>st</sup> Let one hundred or more churches enter into an agreement that if a church is destroyed by fire or storm, they will agree to pay \$10, to \$40, to replace the building.

2<sup>nd</sup> That an association of Churches uniting in this plan be formed with head quarters at Syracuse, N.Y.

3<sup>rd</sup> That there be no moneys collected except in case of loss.

This plan is only a suggestion, We would offer it with a petition that you take such measures as may be deemed advisable to form and execute a wise and safe plan of insurance, which will be in the line of economy and pleasing to God; thereby commending itself to the good will and patronage of all our churches,

Rev. Peter S. Slauson was born in Orange Co. N.Y. May 21,<sup>st</sup> 1811: died in Seneca Falls, N.Y. May 10<sup>th</sup> 1886.

In 1824 he moved to Rushville N.Y. At nineteen years of age he was converted to Christ, and united with the M. E. church,

In January 1835, he was married to Miss Almira Legg, of Milo, Yates Co, N.Y. This union of heart and life, continued fifty-three years in mutual benefit and happiness, until death severed the ties God had joined. In 1843 brother and sister Slauson, in company with other choice and kindred spirits, withdrew from the fellowship and communion of the M. E. Church in Penn Yan, N.Y. This was before the organization of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, and while the abolition christians [sic] were persecuted and tormented by the proslavery leaders in all the churches.

After a time the little band of faithful disciples in Penn Yan united in organizing the first Wesleyan Methodist church of that place, brother and sister Slauson being charter members.

The history of this action of our brother which had so much influence upon his subsequent life and work, could be duplicated in thousands of instances. The lay members of the church who felt to obey the command which says, "Remember them that are in bonds as bound with them." often prayed for the slave. The proslavery leaders, echoing the voice of annual and general conferences, and urged forward by their pastor, commanded silence on all such agilatiory [sic] questions. When the arrogance, and intolerant abuse could no

longer be endured, secession was the only relief. No act of a lifetime could bear more distinguishing marks of divine approval than that of withdrawal from such unfruitful works of darkness as were to be found in the M E church in 1843.

The secession took place at the time of a quarterly meeting, when presiding elder chase [sic] was present. He urged them to return, offering to get on his knees to the least of them. The pastor Rev F. G. Hibbard, however remarked 'that his cloak of charity had burst open behind and all run out."

In 1844 brother Slauson received a license to preach, signed by Wm. Brain. He continued to preach as a licentiate, gathering some precious fruitage, till 1849, when he joined the Rochester Conference at Seneca Falls N.Y. and took the Ornge [sic] Circuit, & was ordained the following year at Jamestown.

His pastoral work has been as follows: 1848-1851, Orange; 1851-1854, Tioga: 1854-1858 Odessa: 1858-1858, Hopewell: 1859-1860, Watkins: 1860-1862, Eagle Harbor: 1862-1865 Farmington; 1865-1866, -- Odessa; 1866-1867, Haskinville: 1867-1869, North Bradford; 1869-1870 Conference evangelist: 1871-1874, South Bradford: 1874 did not take work, thinking to go west, but did not go, and in July took work at South Creek Pa: remaining two years, In 1876 went to Westfield; remained here (except one year spent with the Farmington church) until June 19, 1882

At many of these points most blessed and extensive revivals of religion were enjoyed.

On March 16, 1879, while about his duties preparatory to preaching later in the day, he was stricken down by paralysis. From the first attack he recovered so as to be about among the people, but never to

engage in active work. He attempted to preach but once after this. May 27, 1882 he received a second shock, which deprived him entirely of his speech: and from that time until death cut loose the voice once so sweet in the praises of God's saving grace. During these years of sickness he was patient and cheerful. At the last he failed rapidly. When the writer arrived in Seneca Falls May 3 1886 from attendance at the Session of the Annual Conference he found brother Slauson eagerly waiting to hear from the dear brethren and work.

Saturday May 8<sup>th</sup> he was taken seriously worse, & continued in great suffering, until Monday evening a little before sunset, his spirit was set free.

He was buried from the Wesleyan Methodist church, in the Restvale cemetery May 13<sup>th</sup>, 1886. The funeral services were conducted by the writer, and Rev S. Bedford, assisted by the village pastors Revs. Fausey, Robson & Rawson.

Bro Slauson was characterized by many noble elements. 1. Earnest determination, 2<sup>nd</sup> Unwavering loyalty to his heart convictions. 3<sup>rd</sup> Unfaltering devotion to the doctrines & principles of the Wesleyan Methodist church, -- 4<sup>th</sup> Complete consecration to his life work.

He was a preacher of sound doctrine and good ability, seeking to arouse the consciences of men to more faithful discharge of duty. In his death we have lost a valiant leader and a safe counsellor.
