#### HOLINESS CONVENTIONS, DISTRICT NO. 1.

The Holiness Conventions on District No. 1 were arranged, after a consultation with several of the pastors of the district, as local conventions, rather than as general gatherings at which each charge should be represented. The purpose of this change of plans was to secure a larger local interest and audience as well as benefit. A schedule was prepared for the conventions in which all of the charges could have been reached with a two-day convention on week days during the month of June, only a single evening's program at Easton and Eskridge. On the advice of Brother Travis, the pastor, these two points were omitted from the schedule as carried out. Due to a revival being in progress at Ottawa and the fact that the pastor at LeRoy could not assist during the week, the plans for these two points were also abandoned. The Conventions were held with the Gage Park Church on June 5, 6; Keene, June 7, 8; Willis, June 11, 12; Kansas City, June 14, 15, and at the First Church, Topeka, June 26, 27.

The weather interfered with the attendance at Gage Park and Willis, delaying the Convention a day at Gage Park and almost raining out an afternoon service at Willis. At other points showers fell between services, but not sufficient to conflict with the meetings. Attendance was satisfactory at all of the points, although very small at Gage Park on account of the service being unannounced. The number of different persons in the services were as follows: Gage Park, 12; Keene, 30; Willis, 40; Kansas City, 50; Topeka, 70; or a total of 202. We feel this is more than we could have reached in a delegated Convention in a central point, which central point is hard to find on the First District.

The same program was carried out at each of the points, at least in part, and consisted of preaching services on the two evenings of the Convention, with informal discussion hours during the day's program; one hour being devoted to Bible Study and Doctrine, another to questions of Present Day Importance to the Holiness Movement, another to the study of the relation of the doctrine and experience of holiness to the various branches of the Church work, and a fourth to the study of the standards of holiness in conduct. These discussion periods were largely presented by the laity of the local churches. Attendance at the day services was not very large and the groups were in the main informal circles.

The District Chairman attended each of these conventions and was assisted by the pastors on the charges in all except Gage Park, Brother DeWitt being unable to remain during the week. Rev. T. Ford, the Conference Evangelist, assisted during the first week of the Conventions and preached at Gage Park and Keene. Rev. F. E. Shivers assisted in the preaching at Kansas City and Topeka, and Rev. A. F. Messer also preached one evening at Topeka. The District Chairman preached at Gage Park, Keene and Willis.

Helpful prayer seasons were had in each of the Conventions and in several places gracious altar services occurred, there being one seeker at the closing night in Topeka, who though not then a finder has since been rewarded in her search.

Fenelon said, "If the crowns of all the kingdoms of the empire were laid down at my feet in exchange for my books and my love of reading, I would spurn them all." Fred T. Fuge writes: "When I entered the Gospel ministry nearly thirty years ago, I had two books, the Bible and a badly worn copy of Sam P. Jones' 'Living Words.' Since that day I have studied nearly two thousand volumes, and as far as I know I have never read one that I would be ashamed for Jesus to go through with me."

What then shall we read? First of all, the Bible. Some one has said, "The Bible was begun in the desert in Arabia ages before Homer sang and flourished in Asia Minor. Millions of books have since gone into oblivion. Empires have risen and fallen. Revolutions have swept over and changed the earth. It has always been subject to criticism and obliquy. Mighty men have sought its overthrow. Works of Greek poets who catered to men's depraved tastes have in spite of everything perished. The Bible is a book of religion and can be tried by no other standard." A knowledge of the Bible is essential to our best culture, refinement, and a guide to everlasting life.

After the Bible, good books and magazines should be found in every home. Cheap, trashy stories should be barred from the home as a viper would be barred. "Twenty-five years ago, when I was a boy," said Rev. J. A. James, a school fellow gave me an infamous book which he lent me for only fifteen minutes. At the end of that time it was returned to him, but that book has haunted me as a spectre ever since. I have asked God on my knees to obliterate that book from my mind, but I believe that I shall carry down with me to the grave the spiritual damage I received during that fifteen minutes." Reading may enrich or ruin.

The Wesleyan Methodist, The Wesleyan Missionary and the Sunday School Banner and Junior Papers are the best for Wesleyan Methodists and should be in every Wesleyan Methodist home. Other religious periodicals should be secondary. Let us read more, let us study more, let us be better informed in all good matters that will elevate, inspire and enrich our work and service for God and the souls of men.

#### MORAL REFORM.

Ever since sin has entered the world there has been need for reformation in action and conduct. The modern trend in religion is to seek human excellence rather than Godlikeness. Morality without spirituality is fatal, while reformation without regeneration is the bane of Christianity. The real fight in the world today is to get men to Jesus, "That they may receive forgiveness of sins and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith which is in Christ."

We believe the Bible to be the only revealed Word of God, and that we as a church should be more zealous in its reading, study, and in teaching it to our children in the home, church and Sunday School. We must fortify our children against the encroachments of modernistic and evolutionary teachings by getting first instruction to them so they may discern truth from error.

We believe that the rules and requirements of the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline as founded on the Bible should be brought to the attention of the people and more carefully and fully followed.

We deplore the seeming growing propaganda to depreciate and defy the enforcement of the Eighteenth Amendment and the effort to nullify or modify the same. And that we as a church should demand, as far as possible, that men and women who seek prominent offices declare where they stand on this issue, that we may vote intelligently.

We still hold that secret and oath-bound societies are a menace to the church and cause of God, and that we prayerfully seek to enlighten whomsoever we may, that they may be delivered from these vanities.

We note with deep concern the manner of attire which calls for extreme forms of fashion among the fair sex of our nation today. May we not exhort the mothers and sisters even as Paul, when he said, "That women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety; not with broided hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array;" "but let it be the hidden man of the heart, in that which is not corruptible, even the ornament of a meek and quiet spirit, which is in the sight of the God of great price."

We view with alarm the awful commercialization and desecration of the Sabbath, and pledge our support to help in keeping this day a day for rest and the worship of God alone. God said, "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy."

The masses that are sweeping into the divorce courts of today are appalling. The home as an institution is being alarmingly undermined by this evil. The great economic changes of the day, the weakening of moral responsibility, and the demand for freedom from the marriage

vow are factors working against the home. We recommend that we as a church do all in our power to check this growing evil, by crying out against it, and by instructing our children and young people in the principles and doctrines of righteousness and godliness, to the end that the home, the church and the nation may be perpetuated in the earth.

#### PLAN OF WORK.

We, the Committee on Plan of Work, here recommend:

#### Division I.

- 1. That October 26th be observed as Harvest Home Day. That each local Society wishing to send cash or making donations to the Dormitory, report the same to the Harvest Home Committee in order to receive credit on the Educational Budget.
- 2. That by recommendation of the General Conference Society, all local dues be sent to our Conference Treasurer, and be divided equally between the General and Conference Treasuries.
- 3. That each Society contribute 10c per member to pay General Conference delegates' expenses. And that the first week in June be Dues Paying time.
- 4. That each Society have a Magazine Committee of one, the same to be considered a permanent officer, whose duty shall be to secure new subscriptions and renewals, and also report quarterly to the Conference Magazine Committee.
  - 5. That we contribute at least \$6 per Society for Home Missions.
- 6. That the Statistical Report of the W. H. & F. M. Society be in the hands of the Committee on Statistics two weeks before Conference, and that the name of the President and Secretary be at the bottom of the report.

7. That we observe one evening of the third week of each month to pray especially for the Mission work, the same to be preceded by a day of fasting.

8. That we have a Prayer Secretary, whose duty shall be to send out special calls to prayer and to correspond with and gather reports from each local Society quarterly. And that the report be sent to the Missionary Magazine for publication.

9. That the Kansas Conference continue the support of Sister Grace Davis, and that a Thank Offering be taken at the monthly prayer service by each Society to provide for the same and sent to the Conference Treasury quarterly.

10. That each Missionary Society have a basket to be filled with such articles as can be sent with outgoing Missionaries or in home work.

11. That the study book, "Friends of Africa," by Jean Kenyon MacKenzie, be used.

12. That our women of the W. H. & F. M. Societies be modest examples in their dress and encourage others to do likewise.

13. That the Plan of Work and the Efficiency Standard be read quarterly in each local Society.

14. That our Society make bandages and send them to Rev. E. F. McCarty, 222 South Clemens Ave., Lansing, Mich., by the first of September, and receive credit of 50c per pound for the same.

15. That our Societies contribute to the support of the Hephzibah

Orphanage.

16. That each local President appoint a Committee of two whose duty shall be to visit the sick and to work in harmony with the pastor in rendering any assistance that will help in reaching souls and building up the kingdom of God.

#### Division II.

17. That our Conference Organizer and Y. M. W. B. Superintendent and the District Leaders arrange two programs for the coming year; the first to be on Home Missions, to be given Thanksgiving week, and the second on Foreign Missions at Convention time.

18. That the President and District Leaders arrange the time and recommend the worker for conventions. Also that they prepare the schedule for the visitation of our worker and report before the close of Conference.

19. That each District be supervised by the District Leader, under direction of the Conference President, and report the condition of their district to the President quarterly.

20. That we instruct our Magazine Committee to gather quarterly

from our local Magazine solicitors their report and forward for publication.

- 21. That the Corresponding Secretary be instructed to supply each local President with a copy of the Efficiency Standard. And that a grade of 7% be given on each item. To be graded by the Committee on Apportionment. A grade of 80% receiving honorable mention. The Society making a grade of 90% or above to be placed on the honor roll.
- 22. That the Gleaners observe the monthly prayer hour, that each member secure at least three subscriptions to the Missionary Magazine. That they furnish ten pounds of bandages, and each member write at least once to each of the Mission fields.
