#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### Report No. 1

To the thirty-ninth annual session of the Alabama Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America now assembled at Camp Eden, I respectfully submit the following report.

This has been one of the busiest years in all my experience but one in which we have been very conscious of the blessings of God. From my observations I believe this has been one of the greatest years of definite progress that the Alabama Conference has ever experienced. Three new churches have been organized, and the evangelistic spirit seems to prevail generally among our churches. Let us give praise and glory to God, and prepare to GO FORWARD as He leads.

Through His gracious Providence, the Lord has spared us so that no parsonage or preacher's home has been visited this year by the Death Angel. For this again we thank God.

#### Improvements

For your information and encouragement I feel that mention should be made of some of the steps of progress which some of our churches have made. A splendid parsonage has been built at Anniston and the church there is going forward. Much needed Sunday School rooms have been built in the Ada Chapel church which are a great asset to the work there. Through the untiring labors of Bro. O. S. Benton and co-workers, a new church has been built at Harpersville which is free of debt. The East Lake church has made definite plans for the erection of a parsonage in the very near future. Brent church is planning and raising money for the erection of a new church building. Birmingham church has recently purchased a splendid new location for a future church. Selma church has put a new roof on their building and Mrs. Day of that church is donating another nice lot to the church there which will greatly improve the value and appearance of their property. Tuscaloosa is raising funds for the remodeling of their church building. The new class at Cordova has purchased a good lot and plan to start building their church as soon as possible. I am sure we all appreciate the improvements made on the camp and I wish personally to thank the W. M. S. and the W. Y. P. S. for their fine contribution to the camp.

#### Services Rendered

The Lord has graciously blessed me with good health and enabled me to stay in His service, for which I thank him. I have conducted 113 Quarterly Conferences, preached approximately 183 times, held two tent revivals and one church revival besides several week-end meetings. I have attended the W. M. S. and W. Y. P. S. Conventions, of the year and have assisted whenever possible in their work. I attended all the meetings of the Local Board of Managers for Central College as your representative, and have endeavored to be a fair representative of this conference and of all

causes of God in the school. At the call of the President and General Conference, I attended a meeting of Church Leaders at Marion, Ind. I have made several trips to Mobile and other points in connection with pioneer efforts.

In closing I would recommend that special attention be given to the needs of the possibilities of some of our new and struggling works, by the

Missionary Board.

I have enjoyed and greatly appreciate the fellowship and cooperation of the bretheren of the conference during my administration, but I feel that a change at this time will be wholesome for the work, and therefore I am asking that you select another to take the responsibilities as president of the conference, and may my successor in office be assured of the same loyal support and cooperation which you have given me.

#### REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL SECRETARY

#### Report No. 14

As Sunday School Secretary it has been my privilege to personally endeavor to promote the interest of the Sunday School in seven of the churches of the conference, including a one-week Teacher Training Course at the Pell City church.

The greatest challenge and opportunity with which the Church is confronted today is that of reaching, winning to Christ and training the children. The most qualified organization of the church for the accomplishment of this task is the Sunday School. In the light of these facts we feel that the time is here for a real advancement in the Sunday Schools of the Alabama Conference. The Jewish child is provided 325 hours of religious instruction per year; the Catholic Church provides 200 hours per year; the Protestant child is provided only 52 hours per year—this through the Sunday School. How vitally important and urgent that we make our Sunday Schools the most effective possible for Christ and the childhood of America. As a step in this direction the Sunday School Board recommends the following as a basis for a real Sunday School advancement in the Alabama Conference.

First, that we adopt as a standard of achievement for our Sunday Schools the following: a ten per cent increase in enrollment; ten per cent increase in attendance; conversion of scholars; offerings for missions; workers meetings at least quarterly; two teacher training units each year or 80% of teachers holding Foundation Course diploma. Each school achieving these goals shall be given a Standard Sunday School Pennant, to be kept for one year and reawarded each year as the school continues to meet the standard set up by the Conference Sunday School Department. To the school making the most outstanding record along the lines set forth in the Standard shall be awarded a banner as the Banner Sunday School of the Conference, to be kept for one year.

Second, that we adopt a Teacher Training program with courses as follows: Foundational Course; Basic Bible Survey, Bible Study by Books, Sunday School Methods, Sunday School Teaching. Each unit shall be composed of 12 lessons of 45 minutes each. A certificate shall be awarded for each unit completed and a diploma when the entire Course has been completed. The texts for these courses to be selected by the Sunday School Board. The Advance Course to be prepared by the Sunday School Board.

# REPORT OF PLANNING COMMITTEE Spiritual Side of the Goals and Means

We, the Planning Committee, wish to sumbit the following report: Resolved: That the president and the Executive Committee plan and execute one State-wide Youth Convention to be held during Thanksgiving holidays.

Resolved: That the W. Y. P. S. Executive Committee appoint the District Chairmen, and that each district have at least three district conventions.

#### Manual Work

We recommend that the W. Y. P. S. install showers when the water supply is adequate.

We recommend that each active member be assessed \$1.25 to be divided as follows: \$.50 General Convention dues; \$.50 Pioneer Evangelism; and \$.25 State Convention work. The associate members be assessed \$.75 to be divided as follows: \$.50 Pioneer Evangelism and \$.25 State Convention work.

We recommend that the W. Y. P. S. pay the salary of a single missionary for the next conference year. The salary amounts to \$900.00.

We recommend that the Treasurer's report be closed ten days before Conference, and that all local annual reports be sent to the Treasurer ten days before Conference, and that the Treasurer send all local reports to the Chairman of the Statistical Committee five days before Conference.

#### Amendment

We recommend that a pioneer revival be planned for Summer of 1949. That the Alabama young people be used as far as possible. President to be responsible.
