CONFERENCE RESOLUTIONS

1. All committee reports shall be copied neatly and in such form that the secretary can submit them to the printer without recopying.

2. All statistical reports shall be filed with the committee not

later than the second day.

3. Every pastor shall make a duplicate of his statistical report and shall read the same to his charge at the first meeting after the conference.

4. Pastors shall equalize the amounts required by budget before overreaching any one item and it shall be the pastor's duty to inform his people at the beginning of the year concerning the amount to be raised and he shall at once proceed to raise the amount apportioned to his charge.

5. Inasmuch as the work of the conference demands the attention and the attendance of all its elders and licentiates, therefore we will not employ as pastor or evangelist any elder or licentiate or pass the character of any elder or licentiate, except by vote, who does not at-

tend the entire session of Conference.

Any member leaving Conference must present his excuse to Conference.

7. The Conference Treasurer, with all persons introduced to the Conference, shall be honorary members of the Conference, and shall be accorded a seat within the Conference Bar.

8. No preacher or licentiate who fails to attend the Ministerial Association shall have his character passed at the next Annual Conference except by vote.

9. Any minister accepting work on a charge at the hands of this Conference who resigns or abandons it before the year is out without a good excuse or lawful reason, shall be considered by said Conference and it shall take a vote of Conference to pass his character.

10. All candidates taking the Conference course of study shall appear before the Committee on Itinerary and Orders, some member of the committee, or someone whom the committee may designate.

11. Ministers who are not pastors shall be asked the following numbered questions on examination of character. 1, 6, 11, 13, 15 and 16.

12. Candidates for the ministry may take examination before Conference officers or nearest pastor.

13. When an elder resides outside the bounds of the Conferenc but retains his membership with a church within the bounds of the Conference, a delegate shall be elected from this church to represent said elder, the seating of said delegate in the Annual Conference depending upon the attendance of said elder at the Annual Conference,

14. Friday preceding Conference shall be set aside as a day of prayer for the Conference.

15. Roberts' Rules of Order shall be the parliamentary guide of

this body.

- We recommend that pastors, Sunday Schools, W. H. and F.
 M. societies and Y. M. W. B.'s remit all funds raised quarterly.
- 17. Pastors shall preach on the subject of church benevolences at least once a year.
- 18. The first Sunday in October shall be set apart as a day for special prayer to be offered, and for efforts to be made to interest and enlist the young people of our church in its work.
- 19. All charges receiving a new pastor pay the moving expense, the matter being agreed upon by the pastor and the church.
- 20. We order that no money be paid from the Conference Missionary Fund except by written order of the Missionary Board.
- 21. Be it required that all pastors of the Ohio Conference attend all the sessions of the Camp-meeting unless providentially hindered.
- 22 The Secretary shall send a Statistical blank to the clerk of each charge having no pastor, requesting that the same be filled out with all available statistics and returned to the Conference Secretary.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Brethren and Sisters of the Conference:

Under your direction I have traveled the conference during the past year. In some particulars the work has been the most arduous of any year in which I have served in this capacity. More vexatious problems and spiritual burdens have been my lot than were ever experienced in any previous year. Yet withal there has been the abounding grace of God and the abiding and comforting of the Holy Spirit. The fellowship and sympathy of the brethren has more than compensated your servant for all the things of this nature. I take this opportunity to speak my appreciation for your loyalty to the church, the conference and its officials. That you have been often compelled to grow in the grace of forbearance because of my many weaknesses, I am fully assured. For this I am deeply grateful and trust to profit by my observance of this grace in you. The work of the conference as a whole is on the up-grade. This is manifest more in the deepening of our spiritual tide than in numerical increase. To me, the increase of spiritual life and power is the most encouraging token that might come our way. Our pastors are men of piety and vision. The truth is preached in sincerity and the beauty of holiness is exalted in the pulpit and in their private lives. However, I am convinced that some of our pastors need to stir up the gift of pastoral calling and personal visitation that is latent within them. There are some points in the conference that would greatly profit by seeing more real aggressive pastoral work. In the opinion of your President, if the pastor cannot preach great sermons and be an aggressive personal worker among his people he may well afford to preach less scholarly sermons

and find personal inspiration and material for his discourse in a prayerful and constant visitation among his people. I trust that this next year will see a great awakening among us, along this much needed line of work. There is in the bounds of our conference much needy missionary ground that should be occupied at once. This is especially true in our cities. Presently there is a call from a good residential district of Cincinnati for the organization of a Wesleyan church. I trust that we shall soon be able to fill that need.

My official actions have been few. In the month of December I received the resignation of Rev. Paul Marshall of Dayton and took personal charge of that work until a permanent pastor could be secured in early February. In the month of January I received Rev. Harold Falor and Rev. Irene Falor into the Conference as Annual Conference preachers on recommendation of their Quarterly Conference and appointed them to Belmont church. Dayton, under the direction of the Missionary Board. In January I also gave to Rev. R. C. Crossman a letter of standing.

Under the direction of the Board of Conference Trustees, I have sold the unused church buildings at Bellefontaine and at Findlay. The particulars of these transactions will appear in the report of the Board of Trustees to this body.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CONFERENCE BUDGET

Your Committee on Conference Budget submits the following report:

First, that the conference budget shall be \$1500, divided as follows:

1st, That 80 per cent of above amount be for President's Salary plus 35c per member for deficit.

2nd. That the remaining 20 per cent be disbursed as follows:

- (a) That 65 per cent be for Conference Incidentals.
- (b) That 20 per cent be for Conference Missions.
- (c) That 10 per cent be for Superannuated Elders' Fund.
- (d) That 21/2 per cent be for Conference Sunday School Work.
- (e) That 21/2 per cent be for General Conference Fund.

Second, that the Connectional Budget shall be \$3531.00, divided as follows.

1st, Foreign Missions shall be \$1605.00.

2nd, Home Missions shall be \$963.00.

3rd, Education shall be \$963.00.

Third, that the budget shall be distributed among the churches as follows:

Fourth, that we recommend that the Conference President, Rev. A. W. Smith, be paid the sum of \$50.00 from the Church Extension Fund, in relation to sale of Findley church building, \$40 for trips, ond \$10 for cash paid out.
