STANDING RULES

1. The Committee on Audit shall be a Standing Committee

2. The offering taken on the evenings of Conference and Sunday morning shall be applied to the expenses and entertaining of Conference.

3. The Conference President and his Advisory Board shall be a Committee on Religious Services during Conference.

4. That the Conference Fiscal Year begin on July 1 and end on June 30. Local church treasurers's books shall close on June 30, and funds for Budget will receive credit on Conference Treasurer's books if received by July 5.

5. That the Conference Secretary mail one copy of the Pastor's Statistical Report for each charge with the budget assessment from the Senior Conference and auxiliary organizations to the Conference Treasurer. The Conference Treasurer will fill in the total budget receipts paid for each assessed item from each church, sign each Pastor's Statistical Report and mail it to the pastors of each charge eight days before the Annual Conference begins. The pastor shall complete this report and mail it to the chairman of the Statistical Committee five days before Conference.

6. That this Canada Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, having become part of the Superannuate Pension Plan of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, will not feel any obligation to any of the Conference Ministers or their families, when such ministers retire because of physical inability, or, in case of death, to support their widows or children, if said ministers have neglected to become members of the Superannuate Plan, whose laity make provision for such periods of need. All members of the Superannuate Pension Plan are to make their payments on assessed incomes, and file reports according to regulation.

7. That the Conference President be Record Clerk.

8. That the Ministerial Member of the Houghton College Board of Trustees also be Conference Educational Secretary.

9. That the Pastoral Vote be completed by June 1.

10 That the third Sunday in August be the final Sunday for all pastors who are moving from their present charge.

11. That the churches grant each pastor two weeks vacation with pay at a time agreeable to the pastor and congregation.

12. That only the following items of the Pastor's Statistical Report be read on the Conference Floor:—Item 1—Appointments; Item 2—Wesleyan Methodists; Wesleyan Missionaries, Wesleyan Youth; Item 3—Present number, loss or gain, number of family altars; Item 4—Total Number in Main School, average attendance, Wesleyan Youth Societies—both parts; Items 5 and 6 to be read in full; Item 7—Total for Church; Item 8—To be read in full; Item 9—Total for Benevolences; Item 10—To be read in full.

13. Those who travel on Conference Assignments, or to Conference gatherings where travelling expenses are remunerated, the following will be observed :—

(a) Where possible and convenient clergy rates will be paid.

- (b) The expenses of meals, room, and when necessary travel to and from trains.
- (c) When it is judged best to travel by train, where one has come by car, clergy rates be paid.
- (d) When travelling by car, a basis of five cents per mile will be paid
14. That the Committee on Itinerary and Orders decide on those who shall receive the benefit of payment of our Conference Educational Budget.
15. The Secretary of the Canada Conference be the Committee on Credentials, and all Lay Delegates' parchments to the Conference be mailed to him one week previous to the opening session of the Conference.
16. The ex-officio members of the Board of Directors and Conference Trustees of the Corporate Body shall be the Conference President, the Vice-President, the Conference Treasurer, and two elders, namely, the Conference Secretary, and the Wesleyan Youth President if an Elder.
17. The Conference Treasurer be given \$100 per year, and the Conference Secretary be given \$50 per year for their services.
18. Churches calling pastors are to pay their moving expenses.
19. Churches having business with the Board of Directors and Conference Trustees requiring a visit of that body in their church, shall be responsible for the expense attached to such calls, unless released by the Board.

REPORT NO. 1

CONFERENCE PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

To the members of the Canada Conference in its Sixty-first annual session: Greetings in the name of our all conquering Christ!

We are privileged to meet on these grounds and in this attractive building to work and worship together as a Conference. This has been a vision of many long since gone to their eternal rest. We believe God in His kind providence has given this to us, and we earnestly pray and diligently plan for this place to be a spiritual oasis for pilgrims on their way to the City of God. To God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit be all the praise! We have had strenuous times in plodding to reach this point, and the financing one of stress and strain as reports will show, but nothing to disturb or undermine us in the overall purposes of the work.

We are glad for the help and blessing of the Lord upon the work of the Conference. We have progressed in new church buildings to an extent that a decade ago would have caused many of us to doubt such a possibility, as well as carry a financial responsibility that may have seemed to be the collapse of all our hopes. Yet these new structures speak well for our cause and have opened up for pastors and people avenues of approach that are enlarging their fields of activity for Christ and souls.

It is our purpose to accept every opportunity to push ahead to see the work enlarged. To falter on the threshold of any open door because it demands some personal sacrifice or responsibility will spell defeat.

During this Conference our first missionary, in the person of Miss Bertha Major, R. N. has gone to London, England, for special training before she goes to Africa. May we not fail her in prayers and finances in her path of obedience to Christ.

Our prayers and sympathy are extended to the Rev. I. C. McIntyre in the loss of his wife, Mrs Myra McIntyre. She was a deaconess of our Conference, and was a devoted wife and mother, and a faithful partner in the service of

Christ. Ill health forced both to become located. Her kind spirit and Christian bearing added much to our cause in North Bay.

We have endeavoured to do our best to supply the work at Brockville and to give as much oversight and counsel as possible in the building of their church. Our pioneer field at Madoc has shown excellent progress in its first year of activity, and there are good hopes for better things for this work.

The Leaders of the various denominations have met several times and a report of their recommendations to this Conference will be presented to you for consideration and decision.

We appreciated the privilege of having the Rev. V. Mitchell from our Home Mission Department visit our churches, and we are sure this personal contact will mean much in a better understanding of our position and need. We do trust that such visits may be our privilege in the future, as we do feel it has meant much to us as well as to the Home Mission Department.

We have sought to give our best to see our Canada Conference move forward to meet the challenge of our unsettled times. We admit there have been occasions when our feet seemingly would not proceed further, but the gentle rebuke for our lack of faith, or some token of His intimate knowledge of our situation, eased the pressures and we knew He would not fail us. We desire His presence always and seek only His will. We appreciate our fellow brethren in the ministry and our loyal laity, and believe God has richer seasons of victory for us as we move ahead in Him.

Moved, seconded and unanimously approved that the Toronto Church be given Collateral from the Corporate Body of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in Canada/the maximum amount to be \$30,000.00 for the building of their new church and the local church be responsible for the principal and interest, over a period of Fifteen years if needed.

There being no further business it was unanimously resolved to adjourn.

The Board of Directors and Conference Trustees of the Corporate Body of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in Canada met with the local Trustees of the Brockville Wesleyan Methodist Church on November 21, 1957 at 8. p.m.

Present: Rev. Henry Kielty; Rev. Wilbert Roy Schamehorn; Rev. Jacob Hamilton Weaver; Rev. James Samuel Alpia Spearman; Rev. Mervyn Earl Summers; Rev. Russell Leonard LeRoy; Mr. Hibbert Isaac Vipond.

The Local Trustee Board read "Minutes of the change of properties and request for sale of Brockville Wesleyan Methodist Church as follows:

On February 13, 1957 the Brockville Wesleyan Methodist Church met and on ballot vote rejected the Lot on Crawford Ave. as given to the Local Church by the Corporate Body as being unsuitable for the building of their Church.

On March 4, 1957 the Brockville Wesleyan Methodist Church met and made suggestion of two probable locations for their church. A motion prevailed that the lot on Ferguson Drive and Central Ave., size 150 feet by 125 feet at a cost of Five Thousand Dollars was their final choice.

Description of Lot:—

"All and singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate and lying being composed of Parcel "A" according to a plan filed in the Registry Division of the County of Leeds, as No. 254 more particularly described as follows:—

Commencing at a point at the Eastern limit of Ferguson Drive distant Northerly thereon One Hundred and twenty-nine feet, four inches (129 ft. 4 in.) from the South West angle of said parcel.

Thence Easterly parallel to the Southern limit of Central Avenue One Hundred and Twenty-five feet (125 ft.)

Thence Northerly parallel to the Eastern limit of Ferguson Drive One Hundred and Fifty feet (150 ft) to the Southern limit of Central Ave;

Thence Westerly along Southern limit of Central and Southerly along said limit of Ferguson Drive Two Hundred and Sixty-six feet, five inches. (266 ft. 5 in.) more or less to the point of commencement."

On July 17, 1957 the Brockville Wesleyan Church met and a motion prevailed that the Conference Board of Directors and Conference Trustees be asked the privilege of selling the property on Crawford Avenue and that they may apply the money from the said sale on the purchase of the new lot on Ferguson Drive and Central Ave."

It was moved, seconded and unanimously resolved:—Moved by Rev. James Samuel Alpia Spearman, seconded by Rev. Jacob Hamilton Weaver that we accept the proposed plan for said Church; the maximum price not to exceed \$40,000. and that we give collateral to the extent of \$14,000. The Local Church to pay principal and interest.

Moved, seconded and unanimously resolved that we insure the "Tabernacle, Motel, and Dining Hall at Silver Lake Camp Ground in the Economical Mutual Insurance Co.

Moved, seconded and unanimously resolved that Rev. Jacob Weaver secure the service of a man to occasionally inspect Camp Ground at Silver Lake especially the snow on all the buildings.

Moved, seconded and unanimously approved the following lot selections;

Lot No. 18: Rev. W. A. Smith.

Lot No. 20: Rev. F. S. Irish.

Lot No. 22: Formerly assigned to Dr. E. W.

Dow, now assigned to R. Mitts.

Moved, seconded and unanimously approved:—Moved by Rev. James Samuel Alpia Spearman and seconded by Rev. Russell Leonard LeRoy that we change the location of the Headquarters of our Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in Canada from 296 King St. East Brockville, Ontario to 56 Grosvenor Avenue, Ottawa, Ontario.

There being no further business it was unanimously approved to adjourn.

Present:—Rev. Henry Kielty; Rev. Wilbert Roy Schamehorn; Rev. Jacob Hamilton Weaver; Rev. Russell Leonard LeRoy; Rev. Mervyn Earl Summers; Rev. James Samuel Alpia Spearman; Mr. Hibbert Isaac Vipond.

Moved, seconded and unanimously resolved;—Moved by Rev. Russell Leonard LeRoy, seconded by Mr. Hibbert Isaac Vipond that we use the water

out of the lake, chlorinate the same and use a pressure system with a main line to run from West to East, North of leased lots; said water system to consist of a 2 inch intake with appropriate screen at a depth of ten feet with an appropriate pier to hold intake pipe at a distance of 12 inches from the bottom of the lake. Chlorinator as specified by Board of Health. Suitable pressure system with building to house these.

The main line to consist of galvanized pipe 1½ inches with five-eighths inch outlet at each lot—or every 50 feet. A line of plastic pipe One and a half inches running North to dining hall and to toilets.

Pipe to be laid 6 inches deep and that necessary drain cocks be installed, and that we call for tenders to be submitted to the President not later than June 21, and work to be completed by July 15.

Moved, seconded and unanimously resolved that the President investigate the cost of purchasing a Bronze Plaque for the Dedication of the Camp Ground.

Moved, seconded and unanimously resolved that we allow the Gideons to hold a meeting on the Silver Lake Camp Ground on Saturday September 13, 1958.

Moved, seconded and unanimously resolved that we buy 100 chairs and 25 tables for the dining hall.

Moved, seconded and unanimously resolved that Rev. J. S. A. Spearman contact Mrs. B. Elliott and engage her for a cook for Conference and Camp.

Moved, seconded and unanimously resolved that the President be supervisor during Camp period—July 23 to August 17.

Moved, seconded and unanimously resolved:—Moved by Rev. James Samuel Alpia Spearman, seconded by Rev. Russell Leonard LeRoy, that we borrow the sum of \$3000. from the Bank of Montreal at Morrisburg, Ontario for a period of three years. Payments to be \$1000. per year with interest.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES

The Sunday afternoon service of the Annual Conference was held in the spacious new tabernacle at Silver Lake, Ont. The service was opened with the singing of the hymn "Work for the Night is Coming" led by Mr. Carl Green of Belleville, Ont. Mrs. Sheets led in prayer.

The report of the Committee on Thanks was read by Mrs. Walker.

Mrs. Rae Helmer presented the Y. M. W. B. of Belleville with the Honor Award and books to the Inkerman, Shawville and Powassan Bands.

Mrs. Murray McKnight favoured us with a solo, "Let Me Burn Out for Thee."

Rev. Pelfry, missionary on furlough from Jamaica gave the address of the afternoon taking his text from Acts, thirteenth chapter, verses, two, four, and nine. We can all be missionaries and the Lord is depending on us but what a difference if we are filled with the Holy Ghost. Mr. Pelfry then went on to tell of his own experiences, when as a very small child he fell ill, and his father told the Lord if He would spare his life he would give his heart to the Lord. Mr. Pelfry was brought up in a Christian home and at the age of twelve years gave his heart to the Lord. Sometime later he was sanctified and after finishing High School, went to Bible School for four years then on to Asbury Seminary. The Lord called him to preach so he took a pastorate in Western Ontario but felt called to the Mission field so made contact with the Mission Bands of the World. Said Mr. Pelfry, the Holy Ghost calls missionaries and the Holy Ghost leads missionaries. The Lord supplied the needed funds and they went to Jamaica, an island fifteen hundred to two thousand miles south of Toronto. It is one hundred and fifty miles long and fifty miles wide with a population of one hundred and fifty million people mostly Negro, some White and some Chinese.

The Mission Bands of the World have missionaries in India and Jamaica and came to Jamaica in 1925. They have twenty-three Congregations, sixty-six Sunday Schools, thirty-two pastors, six missionaries and six hundred and fifty members. As of July 1st, 1958 this work was taken over by our church, the Wesleyan Methodist Church. Mr. Pelfry told of the wonderful opportunities for missionary work in Jamaica. The Roman Catholics are in the minority and there are no Communists there. The people's hearts are tender and open to the truth. Communities have changed since the coming of the gospel and he told us it was up to us to take advantage of these opportunities. He closed his message with a plea for us to pray much for our newest mission field.

The hymn "Far and Near" was sung and Rev. McFarlane of the Holiness Movement church at Smiths Falls, closed with prayer. Offering amounted to \$62.
